




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Expecting quieter weather the rest of the day
- Winds will continue coming from the N at 10-15 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH possible. Winds then look to be more Northeasterly by midnight.
- Lows into tomorrow AM across our stations will sit in the mid 60s
 - *No fog expected this evening.*


Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (5 PM CT)




Low Temps this Evening




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **No precipitation favored Sunday**
- **Winds Sunday start out coming from the NE, E by ~Noon, and then SE by ~4 PM. Sustained winds most of the day will be 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 MPH possible, but there does look to be a brief period between 9A – 1P with higher winds (sustained 13-18 MPH)**
- **High temps Sunday look to sit in the upper 70s.**
 - ***No fog expected Sunday.***


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)




High Temperatures Sunday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- ***No fog expected Monday.***


Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)





Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)



High Temps Monday





Week 1 Forecast



Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Warmer than normal temperatures especially as we work into next week with the period averaging out above normal overall though a cold front is possible to end the period.
- Following the cold front to end week 1, cooler air likely lingers for a few days allowing temperatures to average out slightly below normal. Some additional storm activity is possible in this period but heaviest risks remain east.
- Pattern remains relatively seasonable for Mid-May, but perhaps slightly more active with additional severe risks especially to our north.
