

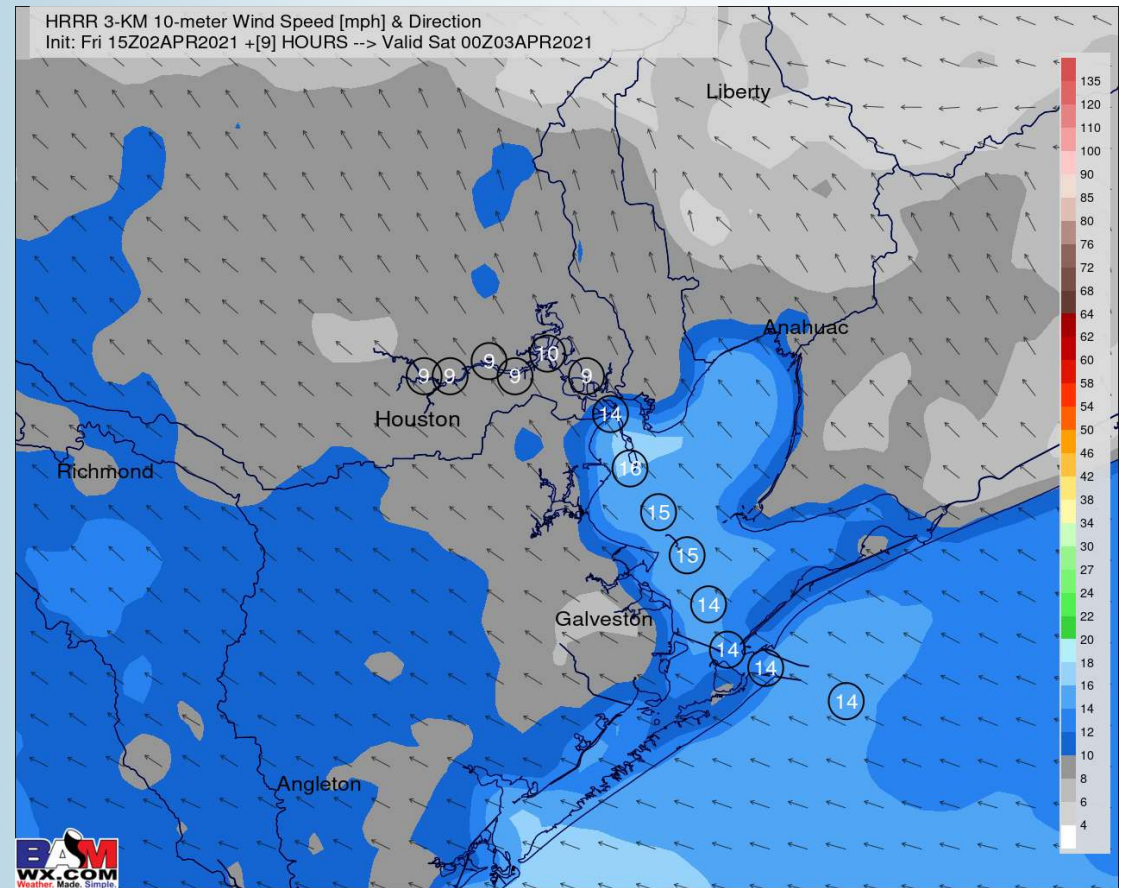

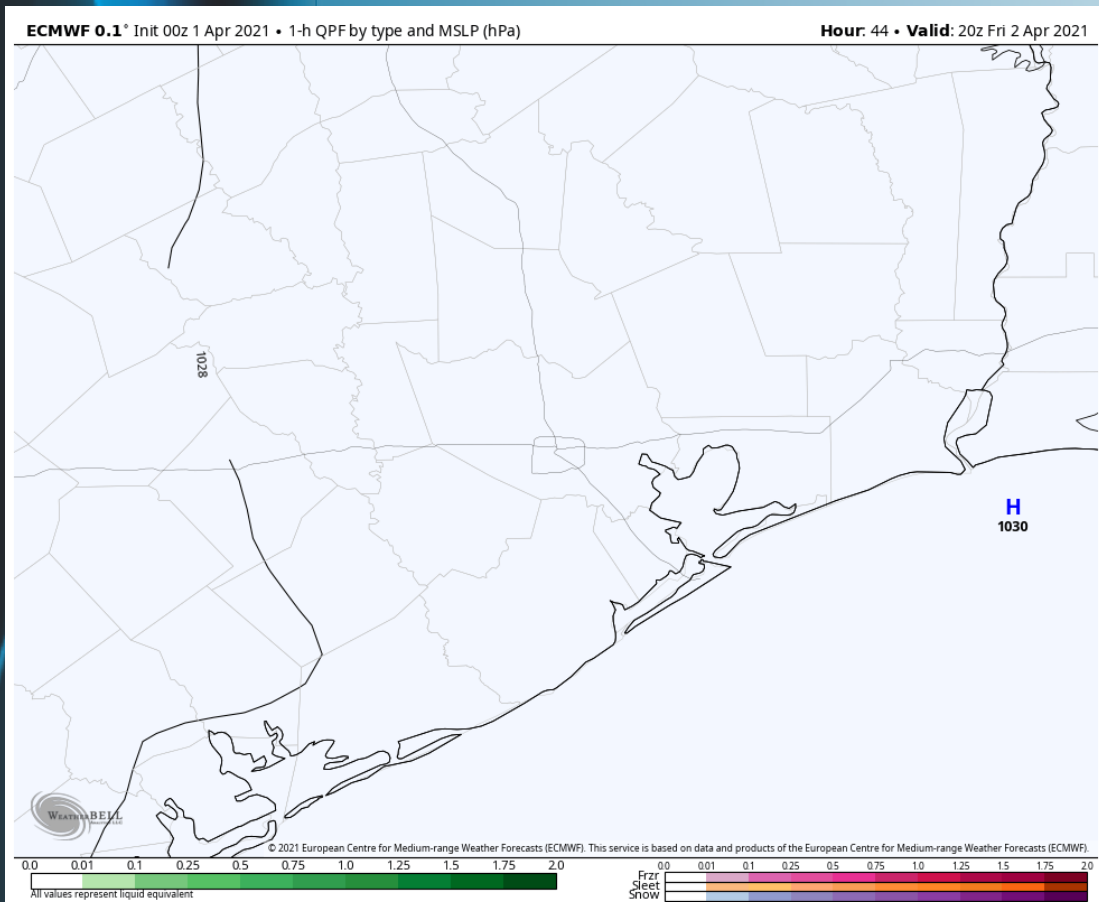
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **A dry day is anticipated for the remainder of the day.**
- **Winds slowly weaken throughout the day as they shift more out of the SE. Winds into the afternoon look to be sustained around 10 – 15 MPH over open waters with gust around 15 – 20 MPH possible. Weaker winds likely into the Buffalo Bayou.**
- **Low Temperatures look to get into the lower 60's F over open water into tomorrow morning.**
- ***Not expecting fog on Friday night/ Saturday morning.***

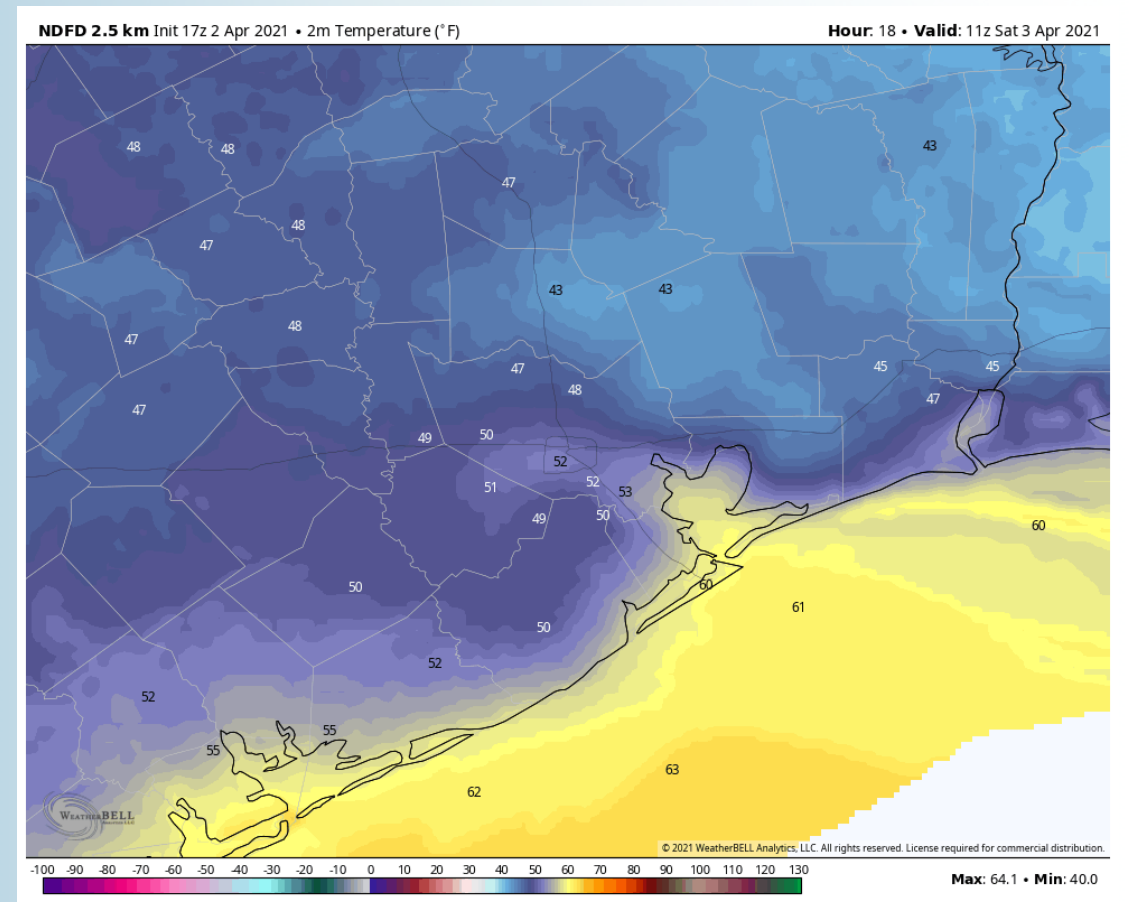
Sustained Winds (7 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)



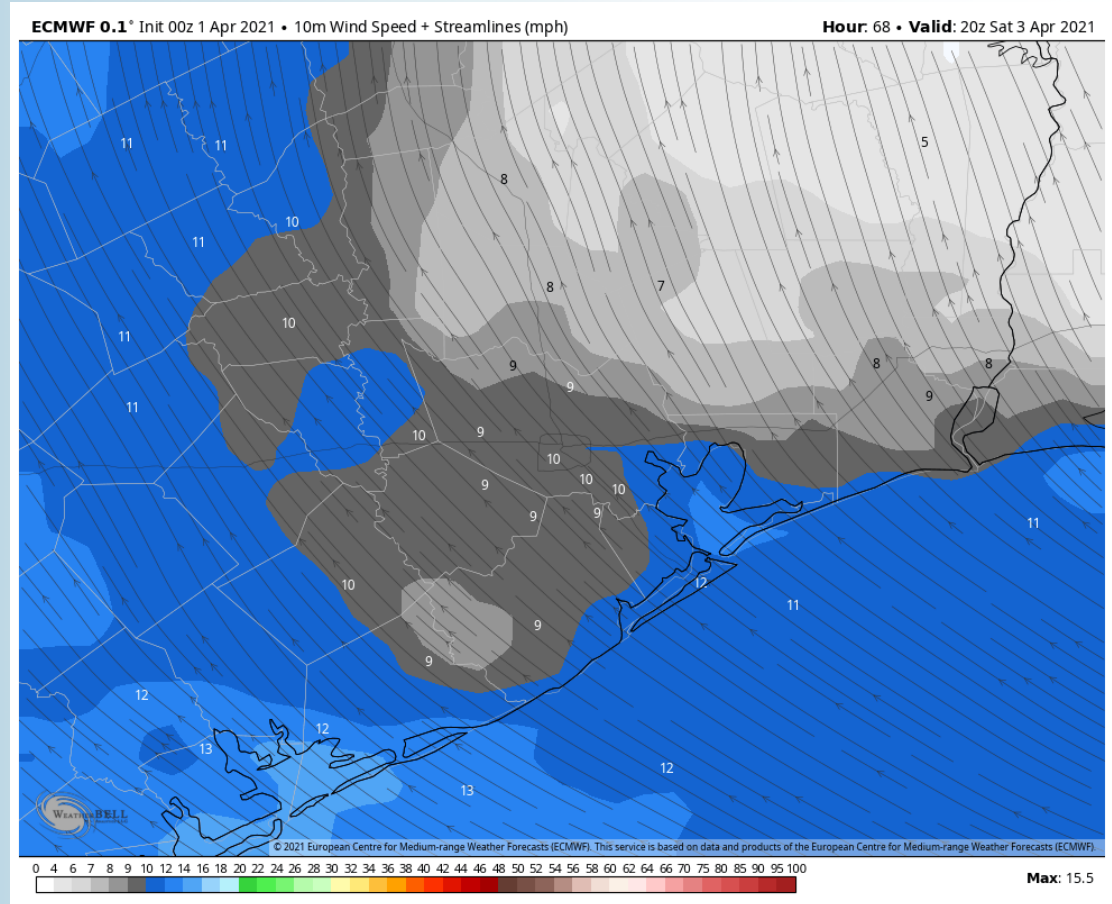
Low Temperatures into Tomorrow Morning



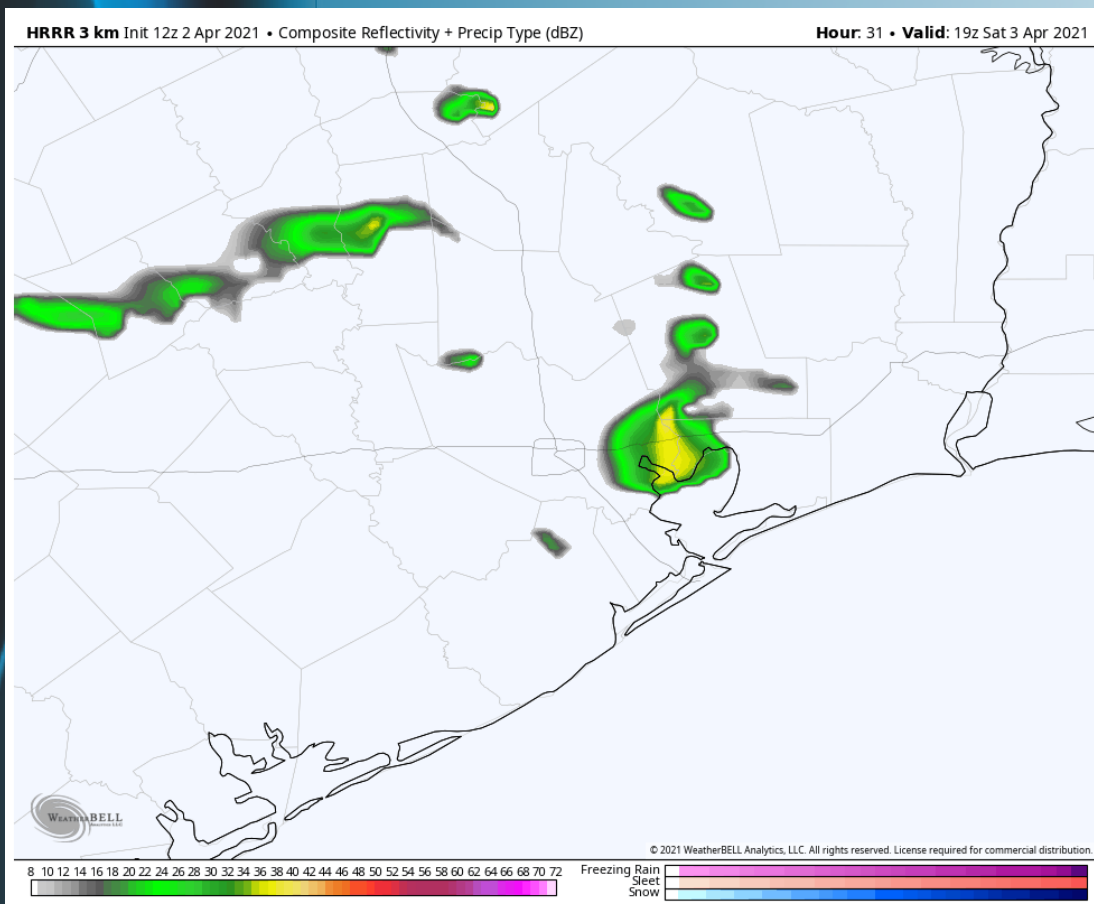
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Saturday is expected to be a dry day. There continues to be small chances (less than 10%) for very light moisture in the PM (2PM – 7 PM), but plenty of dry air should keep this quite limited.
- Winds should continue to remain from the SE, sustained around 8 – 13 with gust around 15 – 20 MPH. After sunset, winds likely weaken to 5 – 10 MPH sustained.
- High temperatures look to dip down to the mid-to-upper 60s F over the Boarding Stations on Saturday.
- *No fog anticipated Sat night/ Sun morning.*

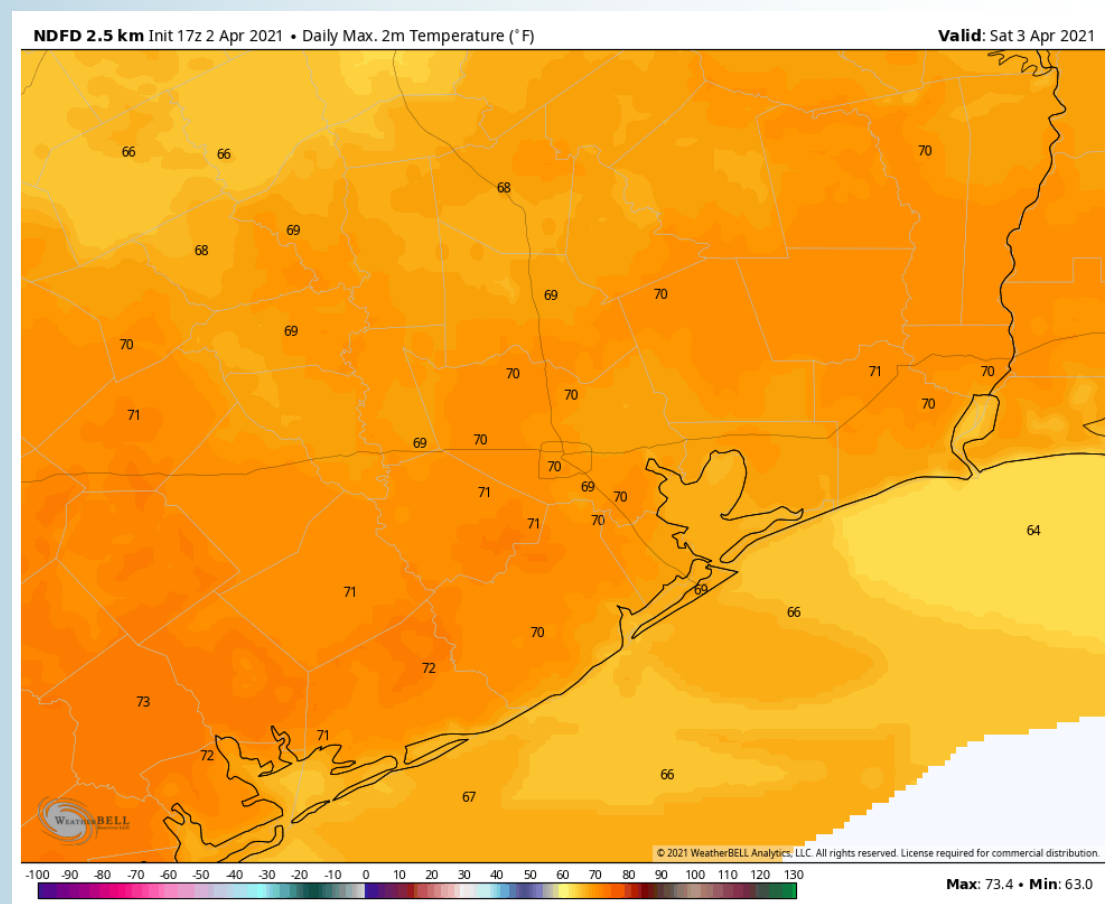
Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)



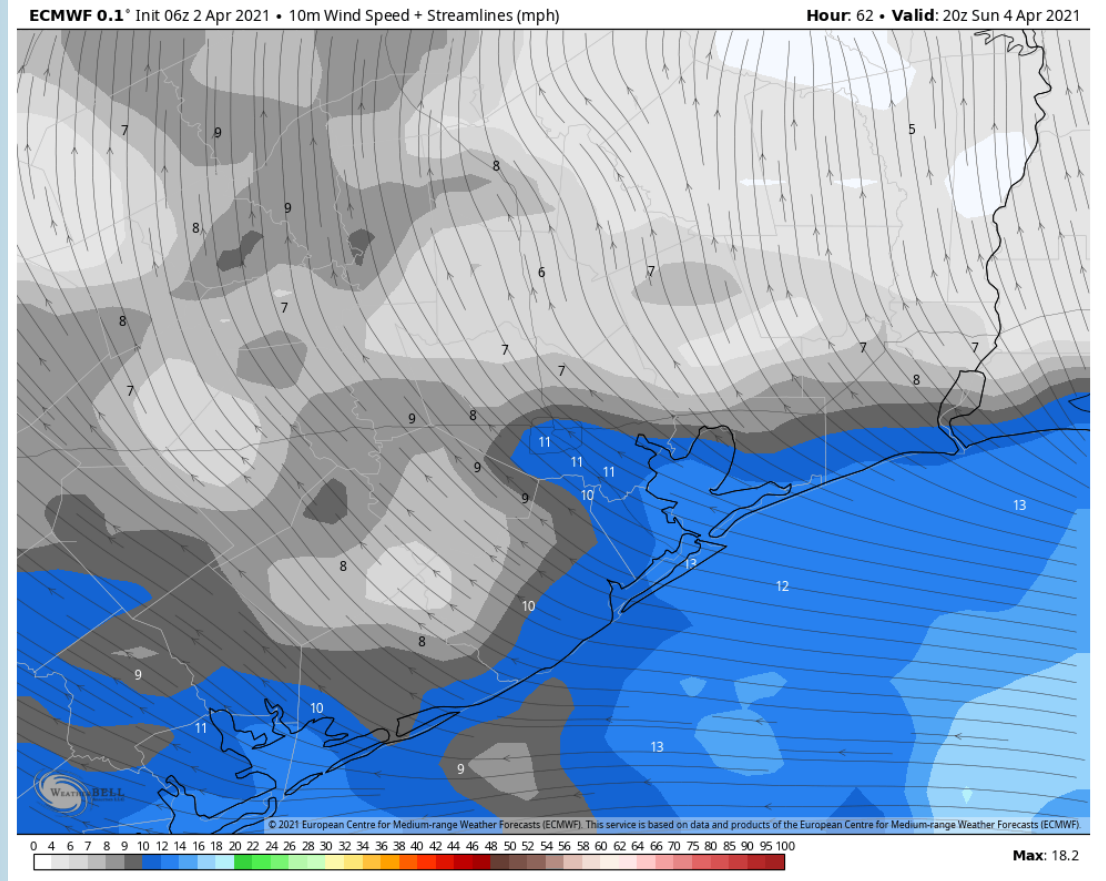
High Temperatures Sat



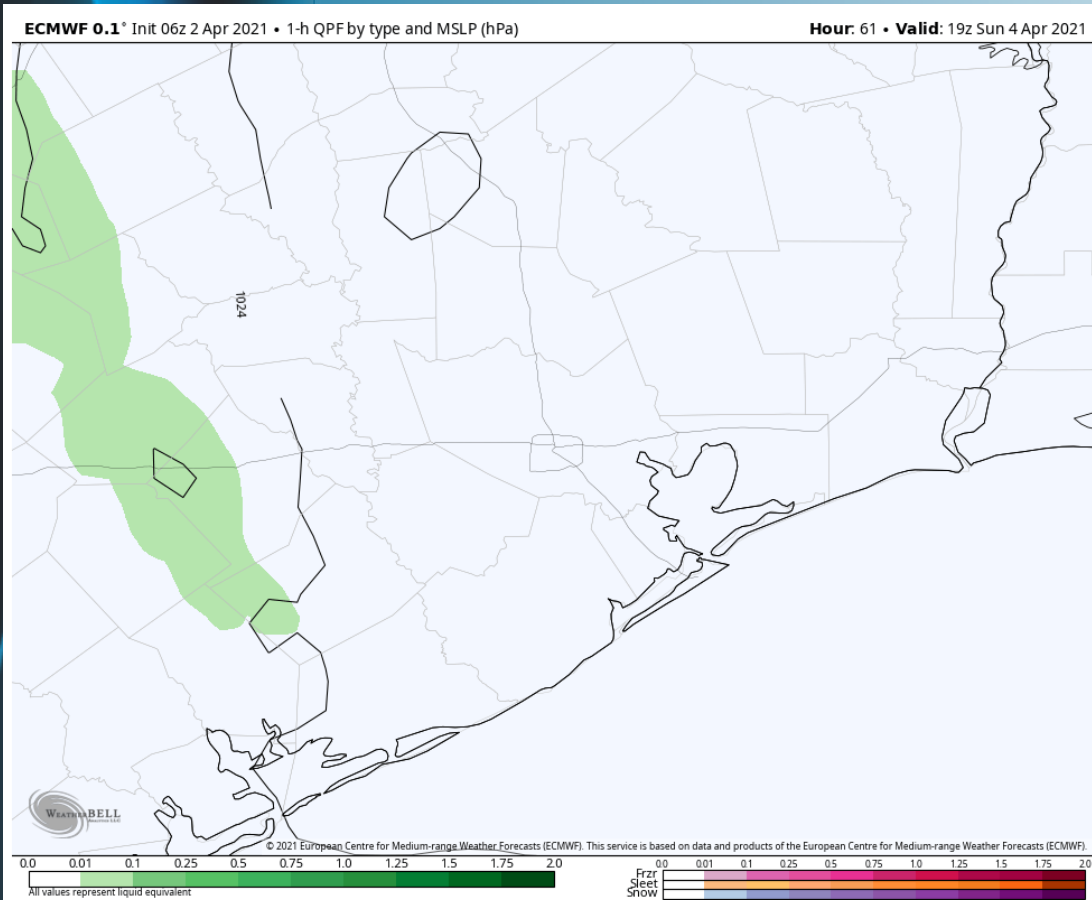
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Sunday is anticipated to be a dry day.
- Generally weak winds in the AM may be a bit out of the east before picking up a bit into the afternoon and shifting more out of the SE. Winds in the PM look to be sustained around 8 – 13 MPH with gust ~ 15 MPH possible.
- High temperatures look to get into the mid to upper 60's F over open waters.
- *Not anticipating fog Sunday night into Monday morning.*

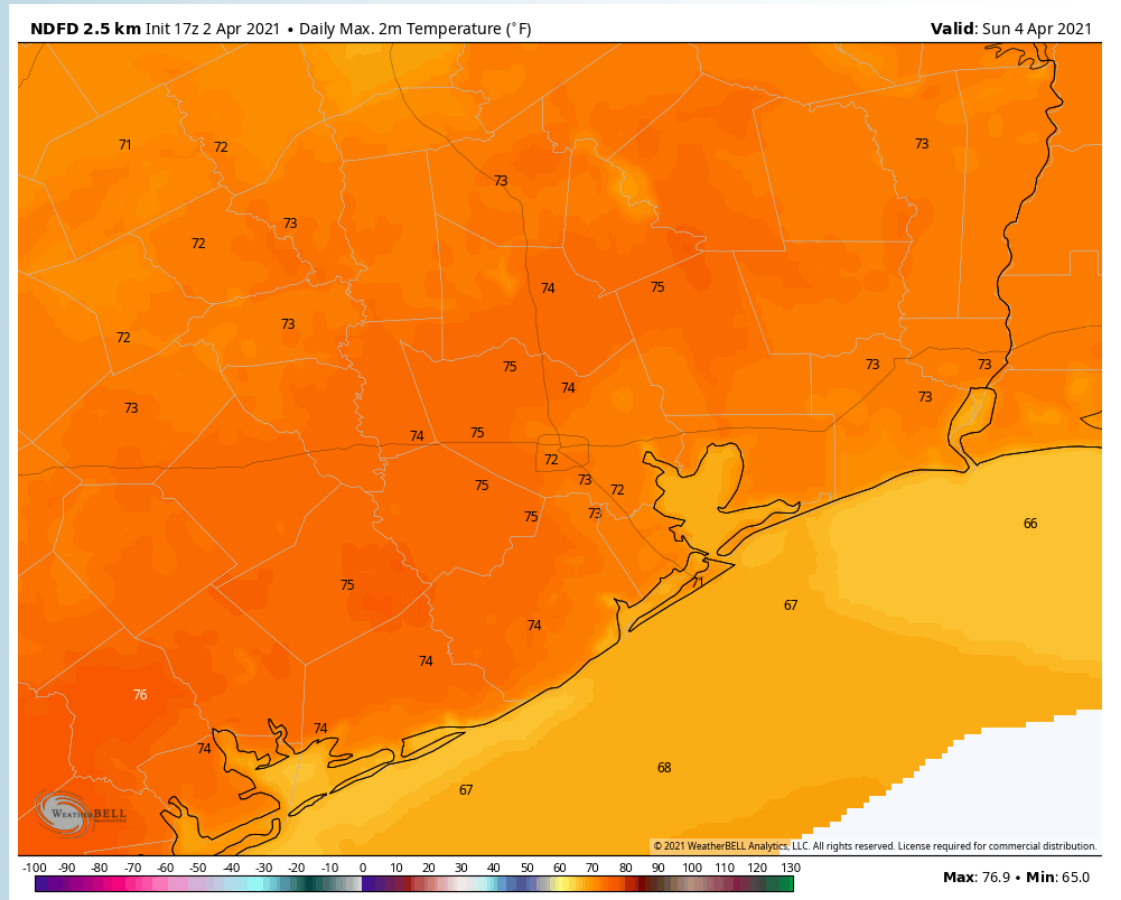
Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)



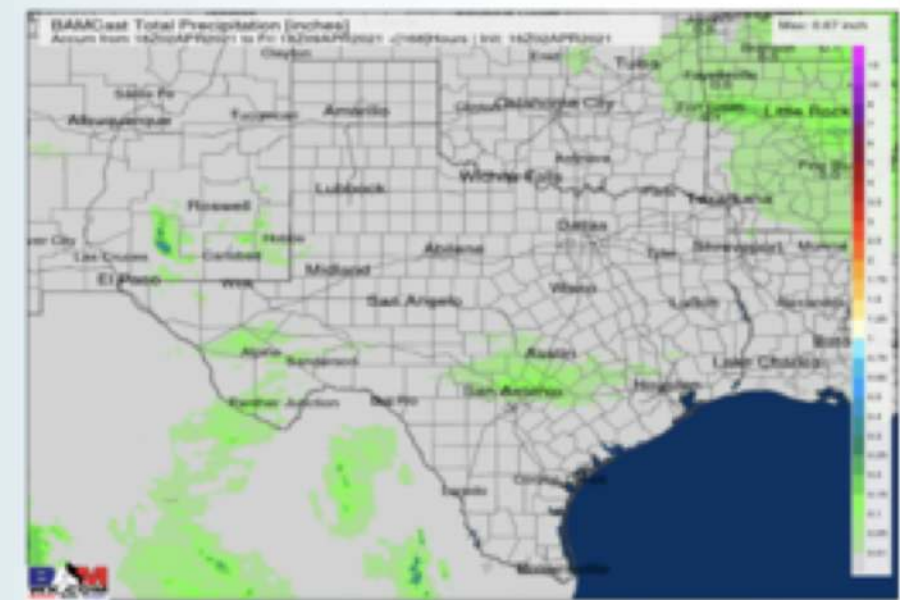
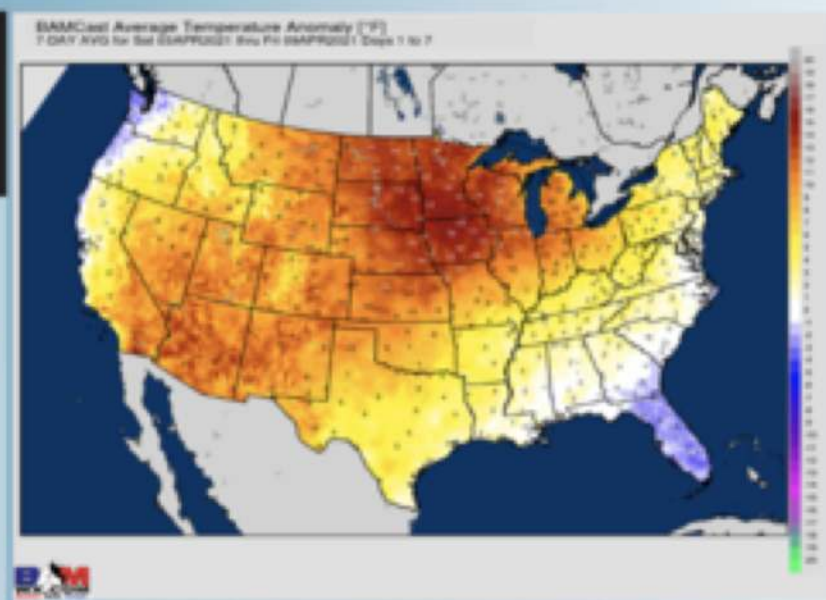
High Temperatures Sunday



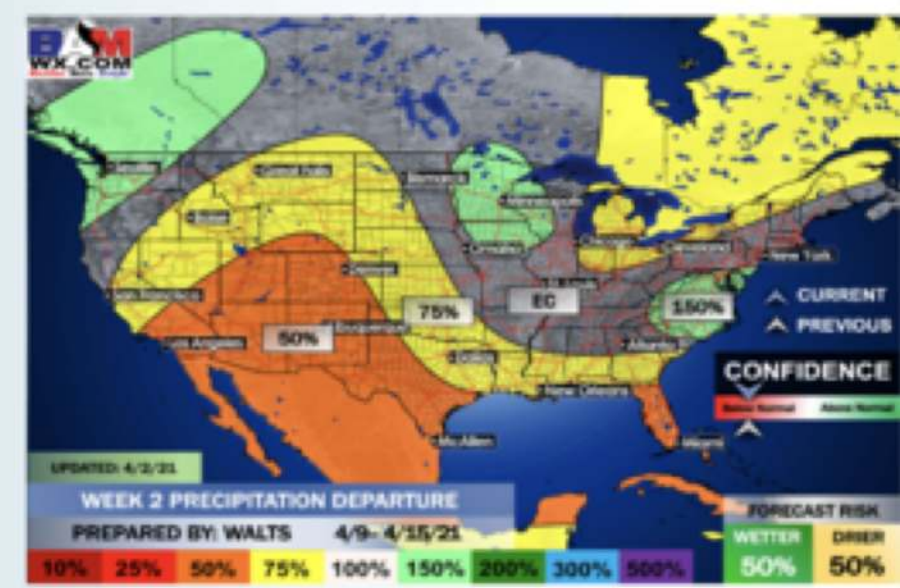
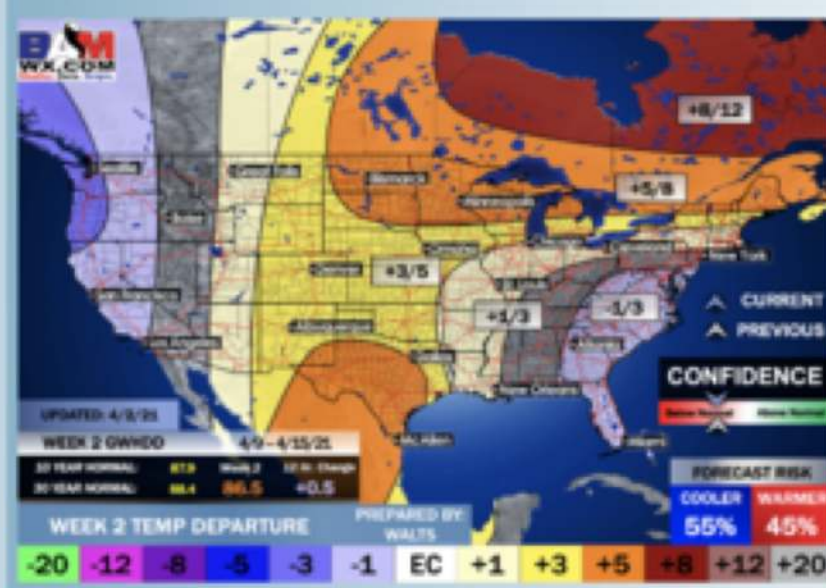
Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Precipitation chances will be little to none over the next week across the area. Temperatures will average out close to normal or slightly above normal as a whole over the next week as well (but increasing each day going forward), but nothing notable.
- Precipitation looks to continue to stay below normal in the week 2 timeframe, temps are still anticipated to be slightly above normal as well.
- Expectations are for a below normal pattern for precipitation risk for the Houston area for weeks 3 + 4. Temperatures are anticipated to average out to near normal for this time frame.
