




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- No precipitation favored today
- Winds will continue coming from the NE, then be E by ~Noon, and then SE by ~3 PM. Sustained winds most of the day will be 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 MPH possible, but there does look to be a brief period between 9A – 1P with higher winds (sustained 13-18 MPH)
- High temps look to sit in the upper 70s.
 - *No fog expected.*


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)




High Temperatures Today




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- *No fog expected Monday.*


Sustained Winds (8 AM CT)

Short-Term Forecast Discussion


- **An isolated pocket of drizzle (~10%) looks possible mid-day, but favoring a mainly dry day**

- **Tuesday's winds will be out of the SE at 10-15 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH possible. Watching late Tuesday evening/ early Wed AM for winds to increase.**


- **High temps will hover in the mid to upper 70s**

- ***No fog expected on Tuesday.***


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)

High Temps Tuesday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Warmer than normal temperatures especially as we work into next week with the period averaging out above normal overall though a cold front is possible to end the period.



- Following the cold front to end week 1, cooler air likely lingers for a few days allowing temperatures to average out slightly below normal. Some additional storm activity is possible in this period but heaviest risks remain east.

- Pattern remains relatively seasonable for Mid-May, but perhaps slightly more active with additional severe risks especially to our north.
