Short-Term Forecast Discussion


- No precipitation favored today

- Winds continue to shift more out of the SE later into the afternoon with winds sustained around 8 – 13 MPH and gust around 13 – 18 MPH lasting through the evening. Winds tonight are likely are weaker into the Buffalo Bayou.


- Temperatures into tomorrow morning are anticipated to get into the mid-to-upper 60's F over open waters.

➤ No fog expected.


Sustained Winds (8 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)




Low Temperatures into tomorrow morning




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- *No fog expected Monday.*


Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)




High Temps Monday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **A few isolated pockets of drizzle (10-20%) looks possible mid-day on Tuesday, but this is just outside of our short range guidance. More details in the AM report tomorrow**
- **Tuesday's winds will be out of the SE at 10-15 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH possible. Watching late Tuesday evening/ early Wed AM for winds to increase.**
- **High temps will hover in the mid to upper 70s**
- **No fog expected on Tuesday.**


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)





Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)



High Temps Tuesday





Week 1 Forecast



Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Warmer than normal temperatures especially as we work into next week with the period averaging out above normal overall though a cold front is possible to end the period.
- Following the cold front to end week 1, cooler air likely lingers for a few days allowing temperatures to average out slightly below normal. Some additional storm activity is possible in this period but heaviest risks remain east.
- Pattern remains relatively seasonable for Mid-May, but perhaps slightly more active with additional severe risks especially to our north.
