




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Aside from an isolated pocket of drizzle this AM, expecting today to be primarily dry.
- Expecting stronger winds today, with sustained winds out of the SE expected at 18-23 MPH, gusting at times up to 25-35 MPH.
- High temps will hover in the mid to upper 70s.
 - *No fog expected today*


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 PM CT)




High Temps Today




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A few very light and scattered showers will be possible in the morning hours (~6-9 AM), but favor a good bit of the day on Thursday to stay on the drier side. If Thursday trends wetter, it will be because our front mentioned on the next slide speeds up.
- Winds pre-dawn will be similar to Wednesday's wind forecast, but from ~sunrise and beyond, we are favoring 13-18 MPH sustained out of the SSE, gusting at times to 18-23 MPH.
- High temps will hover in the upper 70s.
- *No fog expected on Thursday night right now.*


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 AM CT)




High Temps Thursday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Expecting a cold front to work through the area very very early in the overnight, timing will need to be refined as guidance is a bit split on exactly when this moves through (some guidance brings this through late THU PM). This will bring precip chances with the front. Thunderstorms will be possible with the front.
- Winds Friday will be very dependent on the front, however favoring more of a Northerly wind for most of the day at 5-10 MPH with gusts locally higher.
- Low temps will top out in the lower 70s Friday
 - *No fog expected Friday.*


Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 AM CT)





High Temps Friday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Warmer than normal temps expected over the next week, watching for a cold front later on Thursday for our next precipitation chance (north).
- Temps likely average out close to normal/slight above normal for the week 2 period...as we roll forward here as well, we would anticipate near-normal to slightly below normal moisture chances.
- The above normal temps continue in the weeks 3-4 period, with precipitation chances looking to start to get more active as well above normal at this distance.
