




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Continuing to favor the rest of the day to stay on the quieter side, a <10% chance of a shower exists closer to sundown.
- Expecting stronger winds to continue into the evening, with sustained winds out of the SE expected at 18-23 MPH, gusting at times up to 25-30 MPH.
- Lows tonight fall back into the lower to mid 70s.
 - *No fog expected this evening*


Sustained Winds (11 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (11 PM CT)




Low Temps this Evening




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A few very light and scattered showers will be possible in the morning hours (~6-9 AM), but favor a good bit of the day on Thursday to stay on the drier side. We will then watch the later evening hours (~7 PM and beyond) for better scattered shower chances. An isolated rumble of thunder or two cannot be ruled out at this time.
- Winds pre-dawn will be sustained at 13-18 MPH with gusts locally higher, but from ~sunrise and beyond, we are favoring 10-15 MPH sustained out of the SE, gusting at times to 15-20 MPH.
 - High temps will hover in the upper 70s.
 - *No fog expected on Thursday right now.*


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 AM CT)




High Temps Thursday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Expecting a cold front to work through the area very very early in the overnight, timing will need to be refined as guidance is a bit split on exactly when this moves through. Latest guidance is hinting at the front weakening as it approaches the area, which can linger precipitation threats into the afternoon and evening hours Fri.
- Winds Friday will be very dependent on the front, however favoring more of a variable wind for most of the day at 5-10 MPH with gusts locally higher.
- Low temps will top out in the lower 70s Friday
 - *No fog expected Friday.*


Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 PM CT)





High Temps Friday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Warmer than normal temps expected over the next week, watching for a cold front later on Thursday for our next precipitation chance (north).
- Temps likely average out close to normal/slight above normal for the week 2 period...as we roll forward here as well, we would anticipate near-normal to slightly below normal moisture chances.
- The above normal temps continue in the weeks 3-4 period, with precipitation chances looking to start to get more active as well above normal at this distance.
