




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- The threat of a few isolated showers (~20%) will continue out through the evening hours (~9 PM). Any precipitation to reach the surface will likely be on the lighter side and non-severe. Continuing to favor a quieter overnight
- Winds should continue to remain from the SE, sustained around 10 - 15 with gusts around 15 MPH. After sunset, winds likely weaken to 8 – 13 MPH sustained.
- Temps tonight will stay elevated vs inland. Expecting temps over water to be mid 60s as lows vs upper 50s inland.
 - *No fog anticipated this evening.*


Sustained Winds (9 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (7 PM CT)




Low Temps this evening




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Similar to today, the late afternoon hours of Sunday look to hold a ~10-20% chance of a rather isolated shower. Best window for precipitation would be from 4-9 PM. Overall intensity expected to be light and any precip would likely be short lived.**
- **Generally weak winds (5-10 MPH) in the AM may be a bit out of the ESE before picking up a bit after ~10 AM and shifting more out of the SE. Winds in the PM look to be sustained around 8 – 13 MPH with gusts ~ 15 MPH possible.**
- **High temperatures look to get into the upper 60s to lower 70s F over open waters for Sunday.**
 - ***Not anticipating fog Sunday***


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)




High Temperatures Sunday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Currently favoring a dry day on Monday.
- Monday looks to continue our theme of winds coming out of the SE at 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 MPH possible.
- Highs on Monday are favored to be in the upper 60s to lower 70s across the area
- *We continue to not favor fog Monday AM, but still need to keep an eye on the pre-dawn hours of Monday for fog potential. While a SE wind + surface moisture would support fog, atmospheric profiles are not incredibly supportive. This is a risk we will fine tune in coming reports.*


Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (5 PM CT)





High Temperatures Monday




Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Precipitation chances will be little to none over the next several days across the area. Temperatures will average out close to normal as a whole over the next week as well (but increasing each day going forward), but nothing notable.
- Precipitation looks to continue to stay below normal in the week 2 timeframe, temps are still anticipated to be slightly above normal as well.
- Expectations are for a below normal pattern for precipitation risk for the Houston area for weeks 3 + 4. Temperatures are anticipated to average out to near normal for this time frame.
