


## Short-Term Forecast Discussion


- The afternoon hours hold a ~10-20% chance of a rather isolated shower. Best window for any precipitation would be from 3-9 PM. Overall intensity expected to be light and any precip would likely be short lived.
- Generally weak winds (5-10 MPH) this AM look to be out of the E before picking up a bit after ~10 AM and shifting more out of the SE / ESE. Winds beyond ~6 PM look to be sustained around 8 – 13 MPH with gusts ~ 15 MPH possible.
- High temperatures look to get into the upper 60s to lower 70s F over open waters.


## Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (8 PM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- While we continue to favor a mainly dry day Monday, the 5-9 AM window holds the potential of a ~10% chance isolated shower. With our SE wind, any energy passing overhead will allow for small precip chances. Any precip is favored to be rather isolated and short lived.
- Monday looks to continue our theme of winds coming out of the SE at 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 MPH possible. Watching beyond ~4 PM for sustained winds to increase to 10-15 MPH for the rest of the day, gusts 15-20 MPH possible
- Highs on Monday are favored to be in the upper 60s to lower 70s across the area, warmer inland
  - *Fog is not favored for Monday*


## Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (7 AM CT)




## High Temperatures Monday




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- At this distance Tuesday is expected to be dry
- Winds likely start at 10-15 MPH sustained but will slowly increase throughout the day. By sundown, sustained winds of 15-20 MPH and gusts of 20-25 MPH will be possible. Winds will continue coming out of the SE.
- High temps for our Tuesday will reach the lower to mid 70s for our stations, lower 80s inland.
- *No fog anticipated for Tuesday.*


## Sustained Winds (11 PM CT)





## Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)



## High Temperatures Tuesday




## Week 1 Forecast
