


## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Expecting the rest of today to be dry
- Expecting winds to turn more out of the SE in the next few hours and continue 8-13 MPH sustained with gusts locally higher
- Low Temps this evening look to drop back into the lower 70s, cooler inland
  - *No fog expected this evening*


## Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 PM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Saturday looks to stay precipitation free.
- Winds are looking to come from the SE and increased- sustained 18-23 MPH with gusts 23-28 MPH. A few localized gusts to 30 MPH will be possible
- Saturday will continue our theme of temps in the upper 70s/ lower 80s
  - *No fog expected Saturday.*


## Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- While most of Sunday looks to stay quieter, a few isolated showers will be possible beginning in ~mid-day. Chances of this look to be rather low ~10-20%
- Winds on our Sunday look to be coming out of the S, sustained 15-20 MPH with gusts 20-25 MPH
- Sunday's temps will be similar to the last few - sitting in the upper 70s to lower 80s
  - *No fog expected.*


## Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (8 PM CT)






## Week 1 Forecast



### Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Near normal temps expected over the next week, moisture risks look rather limited and further off to the northeast for the next few days.



## Week 2 Forecast

- Working into Mid-May, we are favoring near normal temps for this time of year and for precipitation to stay on the active side of things. Increased moisture risks likely continue across the Southern US.



## Weeks 3/4 Forecast

- The weeks 3/4 (Mid/Late May) period likely features more above normal temperatures and above normal moisture, similar to our current week 2 thoughts.
