




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Ongoing showers/thunderstorms are expected to work out of the area within the next few hours. Once this precipitation moves out, the rest of the AM hours will feature periods of scattered, hit and miss showers around the area. A few rumbles of thunder will be possible. While drier weather is favored into the afternoon, a few very isolated pockets of rain will be possible out through ~8 PM
 - Outside of the ongoing precipitation, winds look to come out of the NNE at 8-13 MPH with gusts locally higher. Keeping an eye on beyond sundown tonight for a localized uptick in winds where sustained 13-18 MPH will be possible
 - High temperatures are expected to be in the mid 70s over our Stations.
- *No fog expected today.*


Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)




High Temps Today




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Continuing to favor a drier day on Thursday
- While winds may be a bit more elevated in the AM hours, winds for much of the day are expected to be out of the NE on Thursday, sustained at 8-13 MPH, gusting at times to 13-18 MPH.
- High temperatures are expected to be in the mid 70s over our Stations.
 - *No fog expected Thursday.*


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (10 AM CT)




High Temps Thursday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Favoring a quieter day Friday
- Our winds will gradually shift from the NE to SE on the day Friday. Expecting winds to turn more Easterly around ~Noon and more Southeasterly by sundown. Much of the day will see sustained winds 8-13 MPH
- Highs will be in the mid-70s for Friday
 - *No fog expected*


Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)





Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)



High Temps Friday




Week 1 Forecast





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Precip chances will become quieter late work-week, but eyeing additional chances late weekend. Temps look to average slightly below normal.
- Working into late-May, we are favoring normal/slightly below normal temps for this time of year and for precipitation to stay on the active side of things. Increased moisture risks likely continue across the Southern US.
