




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Scattered showers and a few isolated thunderstorms will continue to remain possible out through the late afternoon hours. A boundary has stalled around the area and has lingered precipitation chances. Chances will wind down heading into the evening/overnight. An isolated pocket of drizzle cannot be eliminated into the overnight hours
- Winds look to continue coming out of the NNE at 13-18 MPH with gusts locally higher. Keeping an eye on beyond sundown tonight for a localized uptick in winds where sustained 18-23 MPH will be possible
- Lows this evening look to drop back into the middle to upper 60s
 - *No fog expected this evening.*


Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)




Low Temps this Evening




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- While an isolated sprinkle/ pocket of mist cannot be ruled out in the AM hours, we continue to favor a drier day on Thursday
- While winds may be a bit more elevated in the AM hours, winds for much of the day are expected to be out of the NE on Thursday, sustained at 8-13 MPH, gusting at times to 13-18 MPH.
- High temperatures are expected to be in the mid 70s over our Stations.
 - *No fog expected Thursday.*


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (10 AM CT)




High Temps Thursday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Favoring a quieter day Friday
- Our winds will gradually shift from the NE to SE on the day Friday. Expecting winds to turn more Easterly around ~Noon and more Southeasterly by sundown. Much of the day will see sustained winds 8-13 MPH
- Highs will be in the mid-70s for Friday
 - *No fog expected*


Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)





Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)

Week 1 Forecast





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Precip chances will become quieter late work-week, but eyeing additional chances late weekend and into early next week. Temps look to average slightly below average for this time of year.

- Working into late-May, we are favoring normal/slightly below normal temps for this time of year and for precipitation to stay on the active side of things. Increased moisture risks likely continue across the Southern US.

- The weeks ³/₄ (Late May-Early June) period likely features more above normal temperatures and above normal moisture, similar to our current week 2 thoughts.
