


## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- While an isolated pocket of mist will still be possible this AM, we are expecting drier weather today.
- While winds may be a bit more elevated in the AM hours, winds for much of the day are expected to be out of the NE on Thursday, sustained at 10-15 MPH, gusting at times to 15-20 MPH.
- High temperatures are expected to be in the mid 70s over our Stations.
  - *No fog expected today.*


## Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion


- Favoring a quieter day Friday
- Our winds will gradually shift from the NE to SE on the day Friday. Expecting winds to turn more Easterly around ~Noon and more Southeasterly by sundown. Much of the day will see sustained winds 8-13 MPH
- Highs will be in the mid to upper 70s for Friday


## Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (11 AM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Winds Saturday will be out of the SE, sustained 13-18 MPH with gusts 18-23 MPH possible
- Highs should top out in the upper 70s / lower 80s
  - *No fog expected Saturday*


## Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)





## Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)








### Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Precip chances will become quieter late work-week, but eyeing additional chances late weekend and into early next week. Temps look to average slightly below average for this time of year.
- Working into late-May, we are favoring normal/slightly below normal temps for this time of year and for precipitation to stay on the active side of things. Increased moisture risks likely continue across the Southern US.
- The weeks <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> (Late May-Early June) period likely features more above normal temperatures and above normal moisture, similar to our current week 2 thoughts.
