




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Favoring quieter weather today
- Our winds will gradually shift from the NE to SE through the day. Expecting winds to turn more Easterly around ~Noon and more Southeasterly by late evening. Much of the day will see sustained winds 10-15 MPH
- Highs will be in the mid to upper 70s, warmer inland
 - *No fog expected today*


Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 PM CT)






Short-Term Forecast Discussion

 - *No fog expected Saturday*


Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)




High Temps Saturday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Recent guidance has delayed our precip on Sunday. While a few iso showers will be possible in the AM, the better precip chances will introduce themselves later into the afternoon. Precip is favored to be overall scattered.
- Winds will continue coming out of the SE, sustained at 13-18 MPH, gusting at times to 18-23 MPH.
- Highs will continue to remain in the upper 70s / lower 80s.
- *No fog expected Sunday.*


Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 PM CT)





High Temperatures Sunday




Week 1 Forecast

Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- While temps likely end up being right around average, we are eyeing the pattern to become increasingly active over the next several days
- Working into late-May, we are favoring normal/slightly below normal temps for this time of year and for precipitation to stay on the active side of things. Increased moisture risks likely continue across the Southern US.
