




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Another overall quiet day is expected before an active pattern sets up into next week
- Winds Saturday will be out of the SE, sustained 13-18 MPH with gusts 18-23 MPH possible. There may be a brief period into the afternoon where sustained winds of 15-20 MPH will be possible
- Highs should top out in the upper 70s / lower 80s
 - *No fog expected today*


Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)

Short-Term Forecast Discussion


- While a few iso showers will be possible in the AM, we continue to favor the better precipitation chances to come in the 3-7 PM window and then into the evening. An isolated stronger storm cannot be ruled out, but severe weather is not expected. The most widespread precip and highest totals should come a few counties west of our area.

- Winds will continue coming out of the SE, sustained at 13-18 MPH, gusting at times to 18-23 MPH.


- Highs will continue to remain in the upper 70s / lower 80s.

- *No fog expected Sunday.*


Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)




High Temperatures Sunday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Monday will feature another round of precip most likely to arrive in the afternoon hours. The image shown is likely a bit too widespread with precip, but think it shows the chances later into the afternoon well. Moderate precip will be possible at times.
- Winds will continue coming out of the SE. Favoring sustained winds 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 MPH
- Max temps Monday likely reach the lower 80s for our stations
- *No fog expected Monday*


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)





High Temperatures Monday




Week 1 Forecast

Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temperatures overall remain rather seasonable over the next week with a few days of slightly above normal temps and a few days of slightly below normal temps. The pattern will become very active with a persistent influx of tropical moisture over the next 7 days.
- Temperatures remain closer to seasonable or slightly cooler given the active pattern in week 2. Expect continued chances of rain with above normal rainfall.
- Into the week's $\frac{3}{4}$ timeframe, we likely have another shot of cooler air followed by some moderation in week 4. Expect a continued active sub-tropical jet and above normal rainfall.
