


## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Shower and thunderstorm chances will continue for much of the rest of the day around the area. The best chances will come this afternoon before precip becomes more scattered beyond ~sundown. The overall best probabilities for precip will come closer stations near the 610 bridge and lower near the boarding station. While a few isolated stronger storms will be possible all the way into the overnight hours, the better severe weather setup looks to be much further inland. Precip does hold the ability to reduce visibility for a time.
- Winds will continue coming out of the SE, sustained at 15-20 MPH, gusting at times to 20-25 MPH. Locally stronger winds will be possible in the heaviest of precipitation.
- Lows will not fall much tonight, favoring the mid 70s across the area
- *No fog expected this evening*


## Sustained Winds (8 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 PM CT)




## Low Temps this Evening




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Precipitation chances will be present for much of the day on Monday. While we do not think rain will be nonstop for the entire day, the overall best opportunities look to set up into the afternoon hours where locally heavier rains will be possible at times. Monday PM does hold the threat for a few strong to severe thunderstorms. The strongest of precipitation does hold the potential to reduce visibility.**
- **Winds will continue coming out of the SE. Favoring sustained winds 13-18 MPH with gusts 18-23 MPH**
- **Max temps Monday likely reach the lower 80s for our stations**
  - *No fog expected Monday*


## Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)




## High Temperatures Monday




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Tuesday feature storm chances once again as the active weather pattern continues. As of now, would favor the PM hours for the development of storms. Will need to watch after the 5 PM timeframe for more widespread chances. Some of the storms on TUE could be stronger in nature given the amount of instability present.
- Winds look rather breezy on Tuesday, coming from the SE and sustained 18-23 MPH with gusts 25-30+ MPH looking possible
- Tuesday's temps likely push into the lower 80s
  - *No fog expected Tuesday*


## Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 PM CT)





## High Temperatures Tuesday




## Week 1 Forecast

### Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temperatures overall remain rather seasonable over the next week with a few days of slightly above normal temps and a few days of slightly below normal temps. The pattern will become very active with a persistent influx of tropical moisture over the next 7 days.
- Temperatures remain closer to seasonable or slightly cooler given the active pattern in week 2. Expect continued chances of rain with above normal rainfall.
- Into the week's 3/4 timeframe, we likely have another shot of cooler air followed by some moderation in week 4. Expect a continued active sub-tropical jet and above normal rainfall.
