




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Ongoing showers/ t-storms will continue around the area for the next several hours before coverage should gradually diminish. While chances will not be 0%, we think late AM to the mid PM hours can be a window where chances are likely the lowest throughout the day. Into the late PM thru evening hours (~4 PM and beyond), another increased round of precip will move through. Moderate to heavy rains and lightning will be the primary threats. The severe setup does look overall lower vs yesterday
- While winds may be a bit variable at times while any precip moves through, they will generally be out of the SE sustained at 13-18 MPH, gusting at times to 18-23+ MPH. Higher gusts will definitely be possible when the heaviest of precipitation works through.
 - Highs Today continue to linger in the lower 80s.
- *No fog expected today, but reduced visibility will be possible within the heaviest rainfall rates.*


Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)




High Temperatures Today




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Scattered shower and t-storm chances will be around for most of the day Thursday. With that said, we are not in favor of an all day “washout”, but think hit and miss pockets of precip will be around SE TX much of the day. A few locally heavier downpours will be possible
- Winds look continued to be out of the SE sustained at 13-18 MPH on Thursday, gusting at times to 18-23+ MPH. Higher winds will be possible when stronger bands of precipitation move through
- Highs Thursday continue to linger in the upper 70s across our Stations.
 - *No fog expected Thursday.*


Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)




High Temperatures Thursday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Precip will once again be in the cards with scattered showers and thunderstorms possible at really any point in the day Friday. Our pattern looks to stay active until later on the day Sunday into Monday.
- Favoring a similar setup with the winds, coming out of the SE at 13-18 MPH with gusts locally higher.
- High temps will be in the lower 80s for Friday.
- *No fog expected Friday.*


Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)





Simulated Radar Snapshot (10 AM CT)

Week 1 Forecast





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- While temps likely end up being right around average, we are eyeing pretty much daily rain chances across the area...tallying up to much above normal rainfall for this time of year.

- Working into late-May, we are favoring normal/slightly below normal temps for this time of year and for precipitation to stay on the active side of things. Increased moisture risks likely continue across the Southern US.

- The weeks ³/₄ (first half of June) period likely features more cooler than normal temperatures and above normal moisture, similar to our current week 2 thoughts.
