


## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Scattered showers and thunderstorms will be possible for most of the day as lingering energy with our tropical wave will provide precip opportunities at just about any point during the day. There will be a few periods of drier time, but we think it will be hard to stay 100% dry. Precip chances then looks to gradually lower in the overnight hours.
- Winds will continue to stay elevated today, continuing sustained 18-23 MPH with gusts at times to 25-30 MPH possible (iso higher at the boarding station). General direction will be coming from the ESE.
- Highs once again will be sitting in the upper 70s / lower 80s.
- *Fog is not anticipated on today.*


## Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Thanks to our tropical disturbance trending a touch stronger with organization, rain chances for Sunday PM have increased some vs previous reports. A few isolated showers will be possible out through the afternoon hours, but we favor the most organized and heaviest overall rainfall to come a few counties SW of Houston. The tropical disturbance is not expected to be of concern aside from the rain mentioned and the slightly elevated winds.
- Winds look continued to be out of the SE sustained at 10-15 MPH, gusting at times to 15-20+ MPH.
- Highs Sunday will be lower 80s around the area.
- *Outside of limited visibility possible via rain, no reduced visibility expected Sunday.*


## Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Monday's precip forecast features a touch lower confidence, but we are in favor of the majority of rainfall around SE TX staying W/ SW of our stations. A few isolated rain showers will remain possible (chances mainly in the AM hours), but think periods of drier time will be seen.
- Winds will continue coming out of the ESE at 10-15 MPH with gusts locally higher for much of the day
- Highs Monday will be right around 80F
- *No fog anticipated Monday.*


## Sustained Winds (9 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)








## Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- For the next 7 days, we favor temps to be slightly below to near average the next 7 days with continued southerly flow leading to additional rain risks.
  
- Working into late-May, we are favoring normal/slightly below normal temps for this time of year and for precipitation to stay on the active side of things. Increased moisture risks likely continue across the Southern US.
  
- The weeks <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> (first half of June) period likely features more cooler than normal temperatures and above normal moisture, similar to our current week 2 thoughts.
