




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Precip chances continue today given our onshore flow and waves of upper level energy moving overhead. We continue to expect rounds of rain showers to work through the area in a very scattered / hit and miss nature. While a few rumbles of thunder look possible, severe weather is not expected. Rain will generally stay on the light side with a few pockets of at times moderate rainfall possible. Precip the next few days will be coming SE to NW.
- Winds look continued to be out of the ESE sustained at 13 - 18 MPH, gusting at times to 18-23 MPH (locally higher gusts at the boarding station).
- Highs will be in the lower 80s around the area.
- *Outside of limited visibility possible via rain, no reduced visibility expected today.*


Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)




High Temperatures Today




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Isolated to scattered precipitation chances continue for the day Monday. Once again this looks to be a day where there will definitely be breaks in the precip, but chances will be around at really any point. Expecting overall intensity to stay on the lighter side with the core of moisture sitting 1-2 counties W of us.
- Winds will continue coming out of the ESE at 13-18 MPH with gusts locally higher (18-23 MPH) for much of the day.
- Highs Monday will be right around 80F.
 - *No fog anticipated Monday.*


Sustained Winds (9 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)




High Temps Monday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A few isolated showers / t-storms will continue to be possible once again for our day Tuesday. Of the next few days, Tuesday's chances currently look to be the lowest. Coverage does not look to be impressive and think the best coverage will remain SW of the area.
- Winds on Tuesday will keep coming out of the ESE, but look to be a touch weaker – sustained 10-15 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH possible.
- Highs will once again be in the upper 70s / low 80s
 - *No fog expected on Tuesday.*


Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)

High Temperatures Tuesday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- For the next 7 days, we favor temps to be slightly below to near average the next 7 days with continued southerly flow leading to additional rain risks.



- Working into late-May, we are favoring normal/slightly below normal temps for this time of year and for precipitation to stay on the active side of things. Increased moisture risks likely continue across the Southern US.

- The weeks ³/₄ (first half of June) period likely features more cooler than normal temperatures and above normal moisture, similar to our current week 2 thoughts.
