




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- While drier hours are favored moving forward through the rest of the daytime, a few very isolated showers will be possible with the best threat for this coming for our far N stations (<20%). Into the overnight, continued dry weather is favored.
- Winds will continue out of the SE at ~10-15 MPH sustained, gusts locally higher.
- Lows tonight look to fall back into the lower to mid 70s
 - **No fog expected today.**


Sustained Winds (2 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (7 PM CT)




Low Temps this Evening




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Thursday looks like an overall drier day as well at this distance. An isolated shower / t'storm cannot be fully ruled out in the mid AM to mid-PM window, but chances continue to look quite low.
- Winds on Thursday will continue out of the SSE at ~10-15 MPH sustained. A brief period after sundown may feature locally elevated winds for a few hours before returning back to 10-15 MPH.
- Highs will once again be in the lower 80s, much warmer inland.
- *No fog expected on Thursday.*


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)




High Temperatures Thursday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Continue to favor a mostly dry day on Friday. The better precipitation chances look to be focused to the north of the Houston Area. However, an isolated shower/ thunderstorm cant be ruled, mainly in the afternoon hours.
- Winds will stay consistent into Friday, coming out of the SSE sustained at 8-13 MPH with gusts of 15 – 20 MPH possible.
- Temperatures into the mid 80's F will be possible over open waters. Temperatures approaching 90 F will be possible into the HOU metro.
- *No fog expected Friday.*


Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)

High Temperatures Friday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- For the next 5-7 days, we favor temps to be right around average for this time of year and our active precip pattern will relax some as we head deeper into this week.



- Working into early June, we are favoring below normal temps for this time of year and for precipitation to stay on the active side of things. Increased moisture risks likely continue across the Southern US.

- The weeks 3/4 (early to mid June) period likely features more cooler than normal temperatures and above normal moisture, similar to our current week 2 thoughts.
