




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Continuing to eye late afternoon/ evening hours (~5 PM and beyond) for scattered showers and thunderstorms to be possible around the area in a very hit and miss nature. A few locally heavier downpours cannot be ruled out inside of the strongest cells. Lightning will be possible within any cell. Chances for precip should weaken as the sun sets.
- Winds will continue to be generally variable in direction at 5-10 MPH. We will then watch for locally stronger winds inside any showers/thunderstorms. Gusts to 20-30+ MPH will be possible in the heaviest of storms (not widespread)
 - Lows fall back into the mid 70s
 - *No fog expected, but reduced visibility will be possible within the precipitation.*


Sustained Winds (8 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (7 PM CT)




Low Temps this Evening




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A spotty shower/ mist cant be ruled out from the 4 AM – 8 AM timeframe tomorrow morning with the remainder of the day anticipated to be dry.
- Winds look to be a bit higher at the boarding station Sunday vs our Northern stations. Expecting sustained winds 13-18 MPH with gusts locally higher, winds of 8-13 MPH closer to downtown HOU. ~7-12 PM may provide a period of locally higher winds (sustained 15-20 MPH gusts 20-25 MPH) possible at the boarding station. Winds will be NE much of the day before flipping to SE near sundown
- Sunday's temps should be in the upper 70s / lower 80s around the area
 - *No fog anticipated Sunday.*


Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (5 AM CT)




High Temperatures Sunday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Drier conditions continue to be favored for Monday.**
- **Winds are expected to be coming out of the SE the majority of the day, sustained at 8-13 MPH. Gust approaching 20 MPH will be possible.**
- **High temps anticipated to be in the upper 70s to lower 80s over open waters.**
- ***No fog expected Monday.***


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)





High Temperatures Monday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temps for the next several days look to be sitting a few degrees below average, highs in the upper lower 80s and lows in the upper 70s. The active pattern continues with the highest precip totals likely coming well west of SE TX
- Working into early June, we are favoring below normal temps for this time of year and for precipitation to stay on the active side of things. Increased moisture risks likely continue across the Southern US.
- The weeks 3/4 (mid to late June) period likely features more cooler than normal temperatures and above normal moisture, similar to our current week 2 thoughts.
