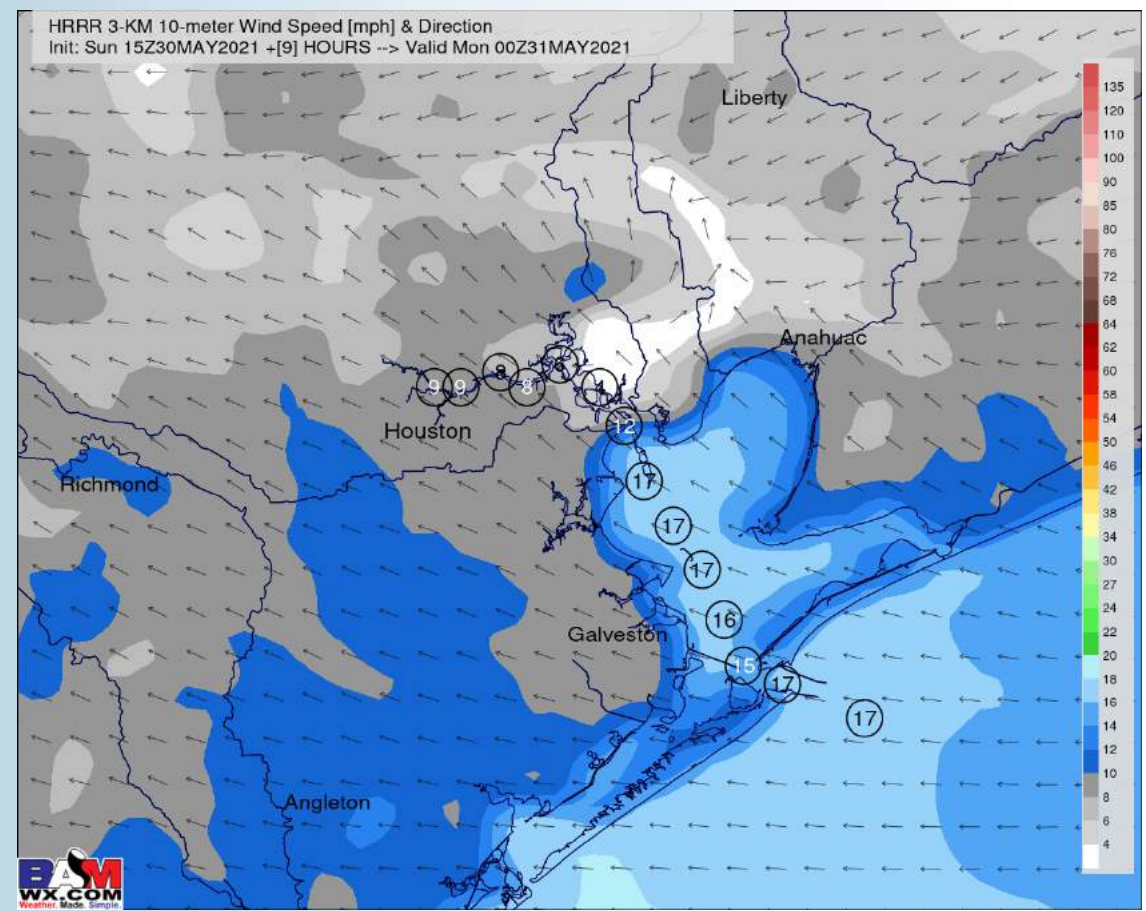




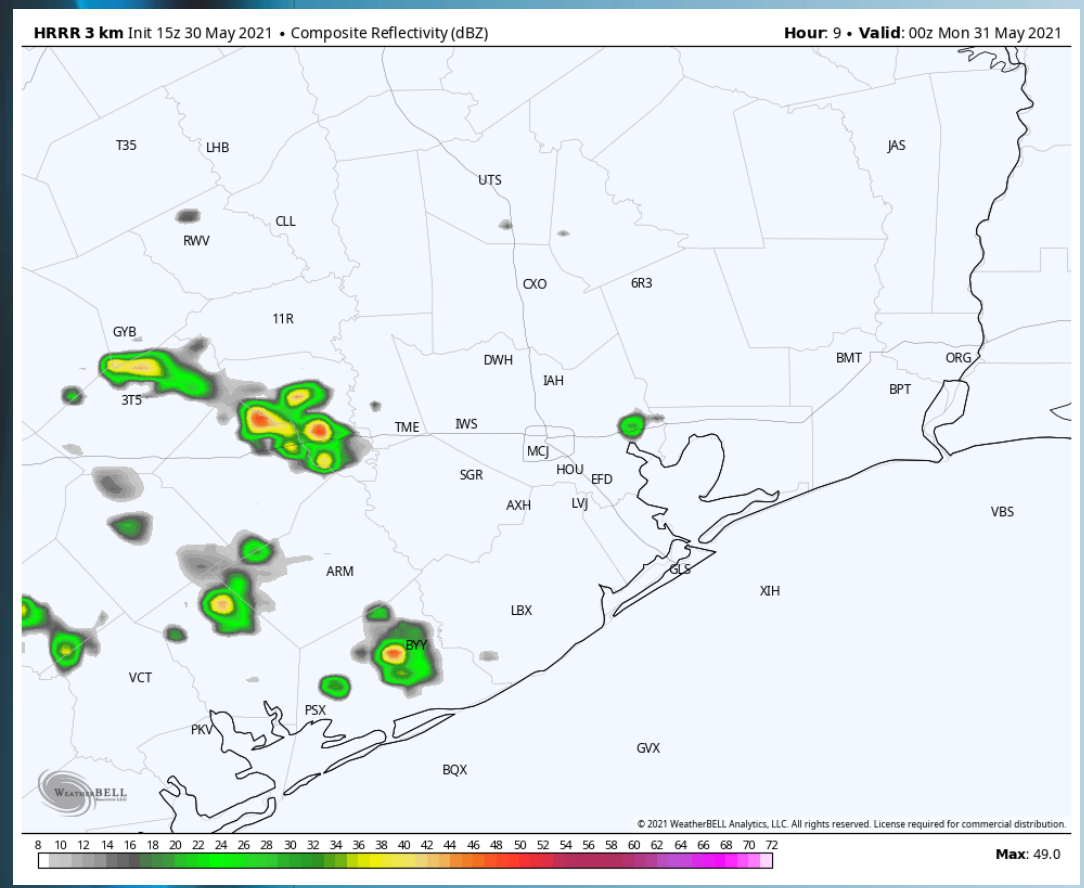
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Dry weather is anticipated for the remainder of the day.**
- **Winds continue to remain a bit elevated for the boarding station with sustained winds around 15 – 20 MPH out through ~4 PM. Winds for the remainder of the afternoon/ evening sustained around 10 – 15 MPH from the SE with gust around 20 MPH. Winds are anticipated to be weaker into the Buffalo Bayou.**
- **Temperatures stay mild into tomorrow morning with temperatures only dropping into the upper 70's over open waters.**
- ***No fog anticipated Sunday.***

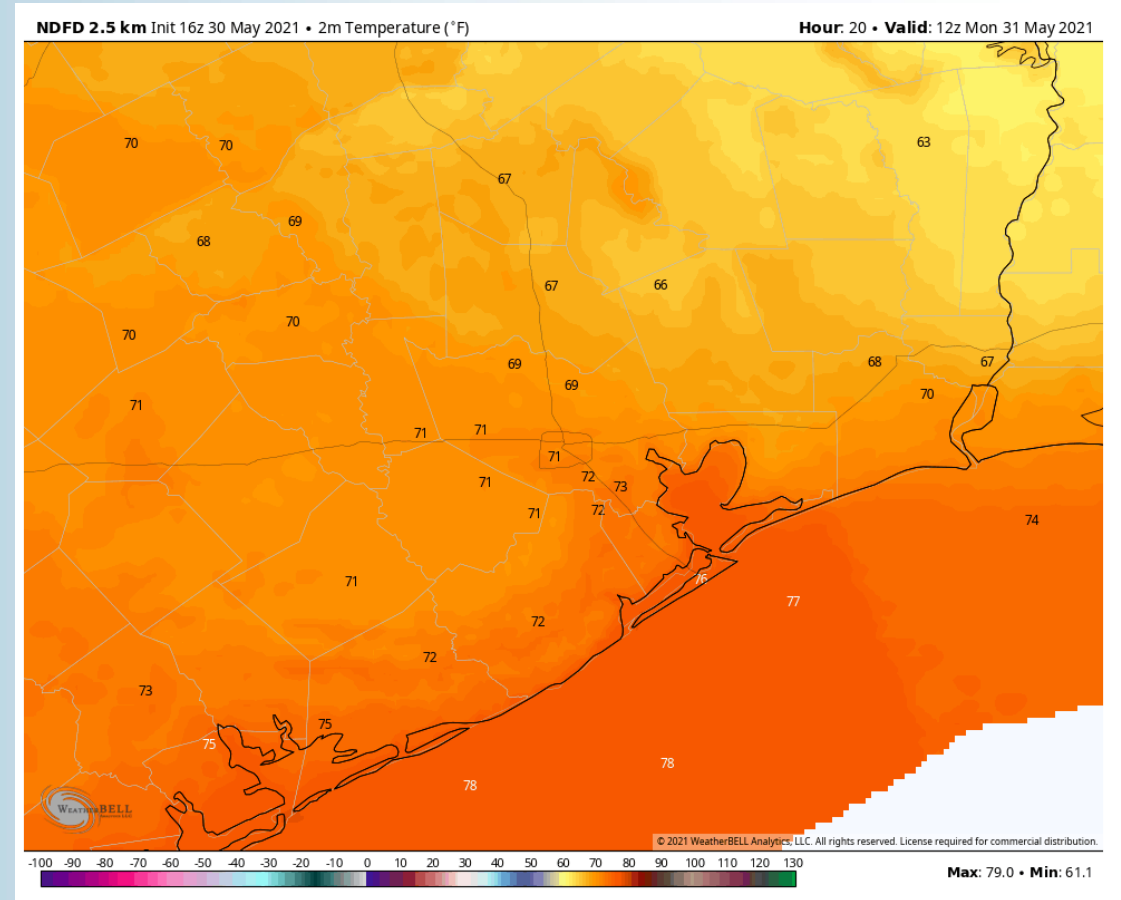
## Sustained Winds (7 PM CT)

## Low Temperature into Mon morning

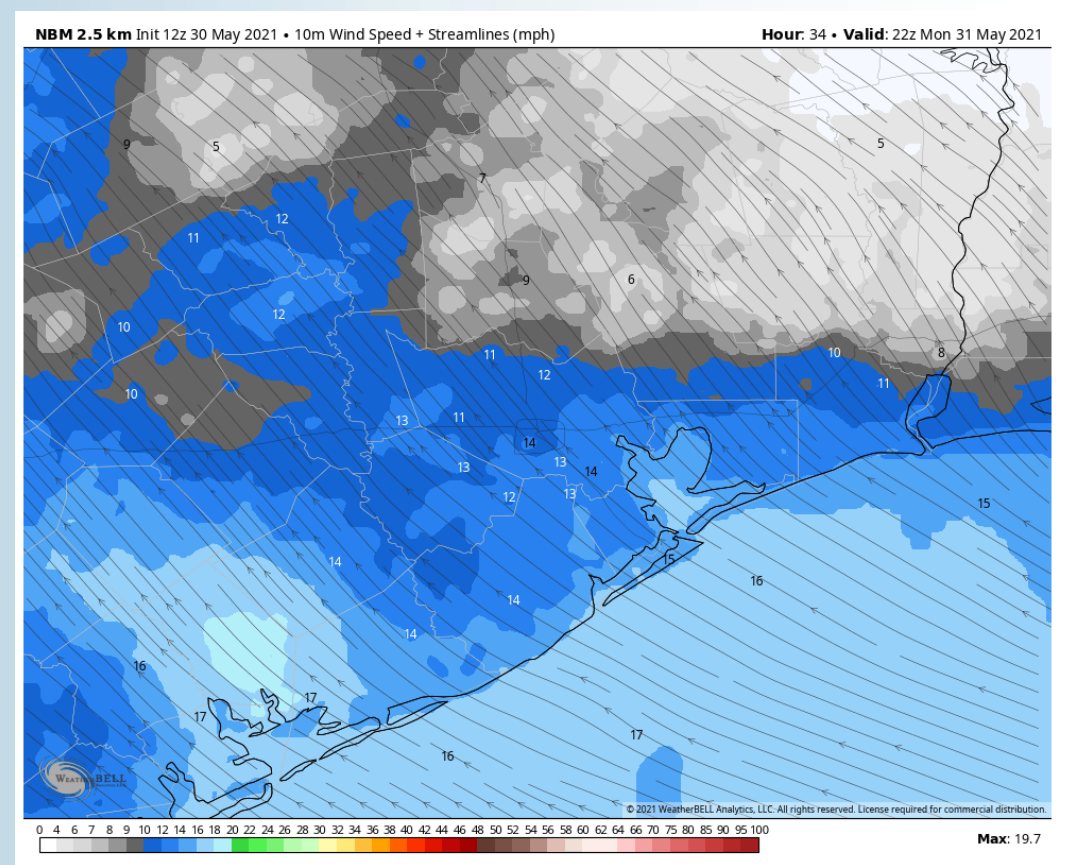




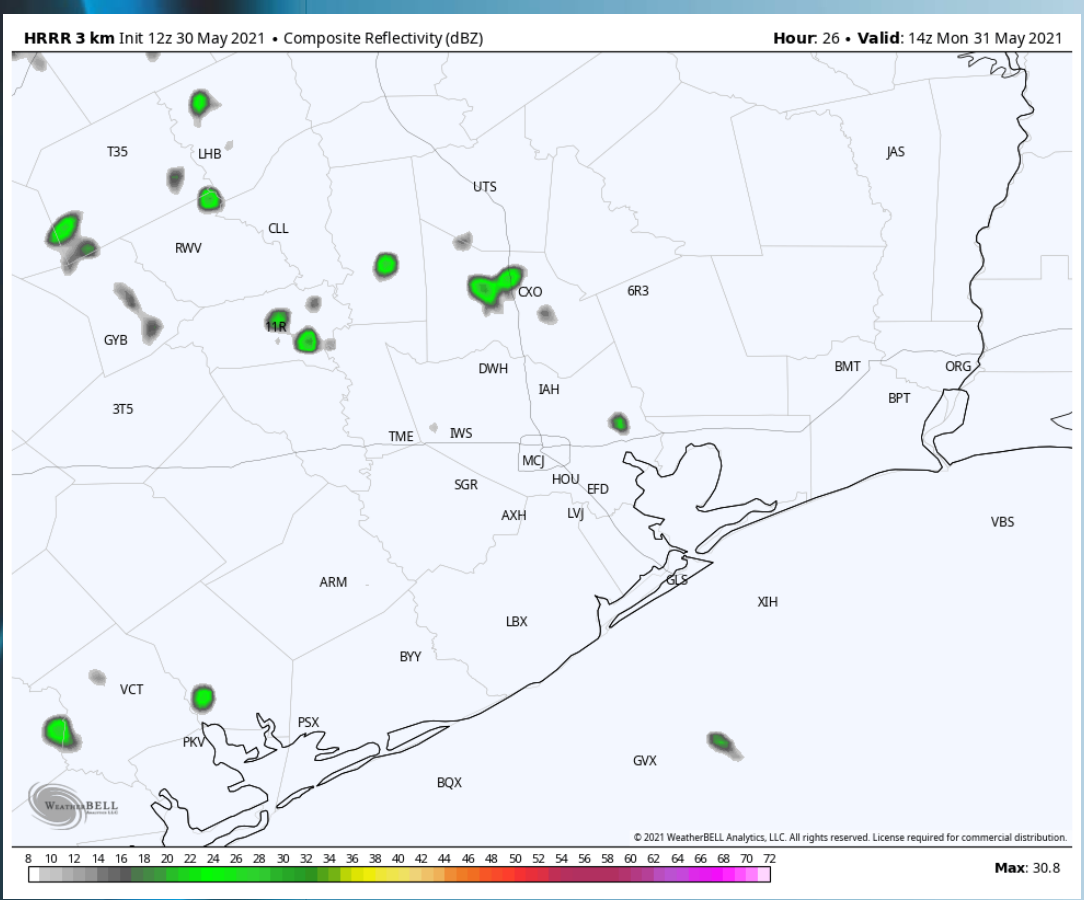
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Plenty of dry time is anticipated throughout the day tomorrow. However, isolated showers cant be ruled out from about 9 AM – 3 PM.
- Winds are expected to be coming out of the SE, sustained at 10-15 MPH with gusts approaching 20 MPH possible.
- High temps anticipated to be in the upper 70s to lower 80s
  - *No fog expected Monday.*

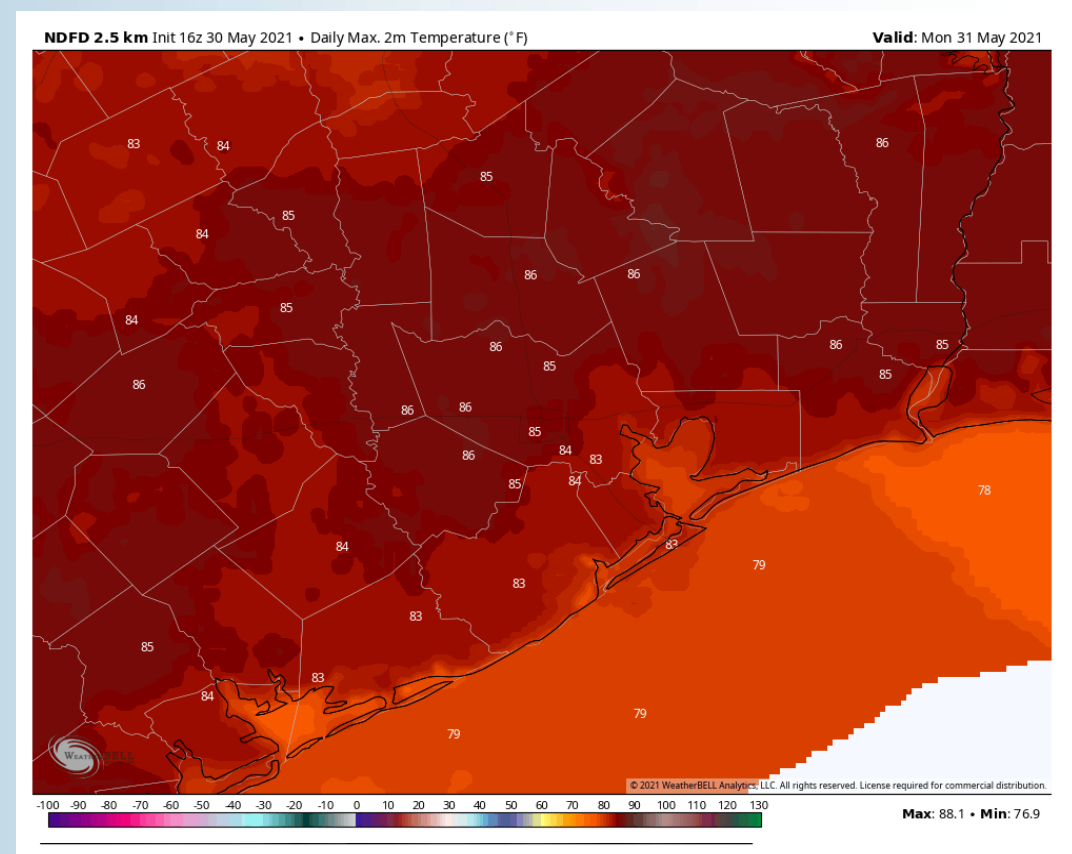
## Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)



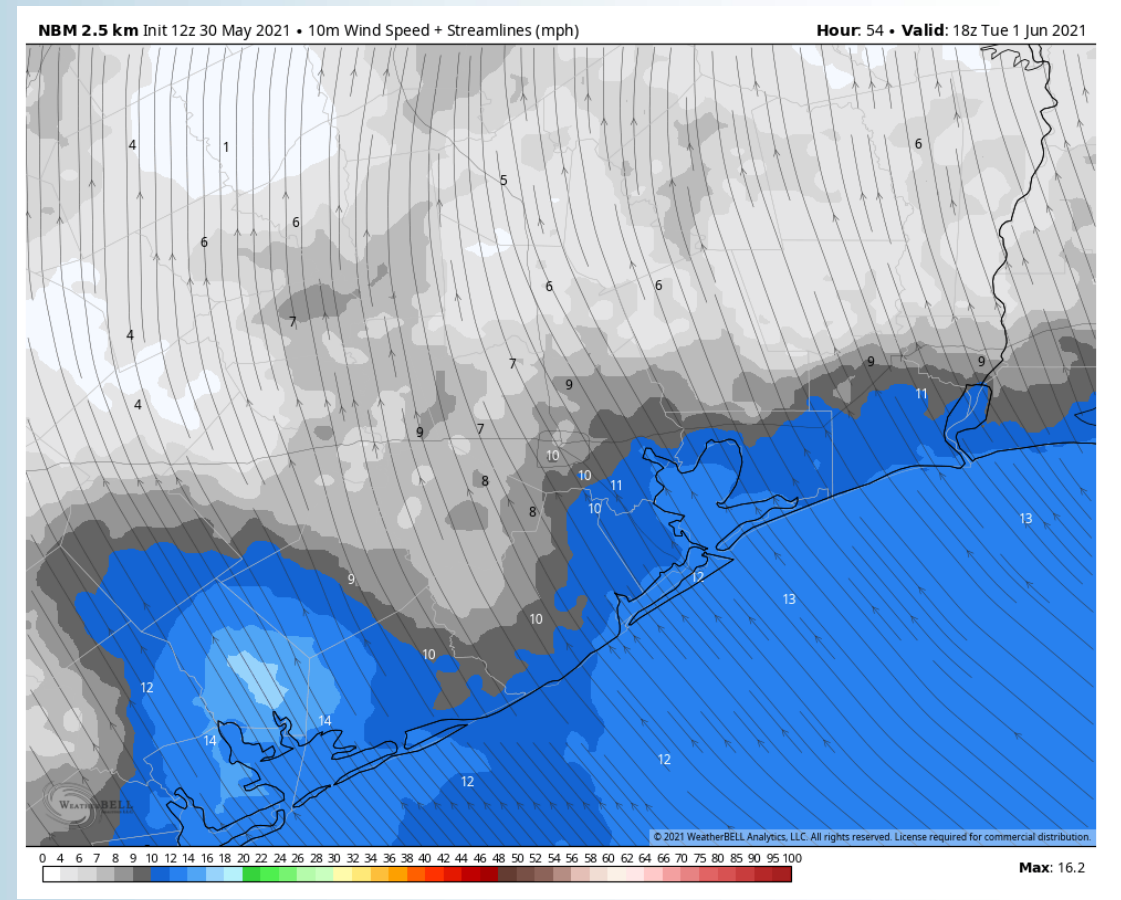

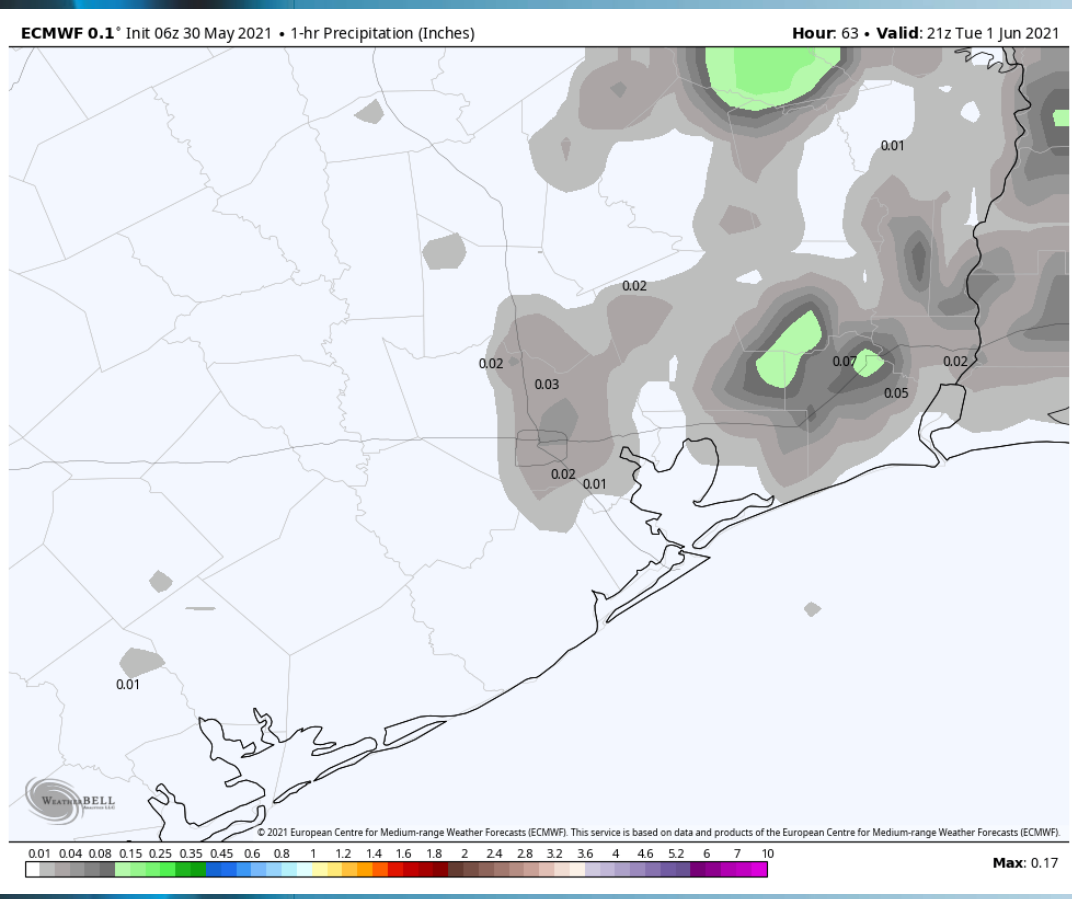
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Scattered showers/ storms will be possible in the afternoon / evening hours of Tuesday. Plenty of dry time is anticipated the first half of the day.**
- **Winds look to continue out of the SE, sustained around 8 – 13 MPH. Gust approaching 18 MPH possible**
- **High temperatures look to get around ~80 F over open waters on TUE.**
- ***No fog expected TUE.***

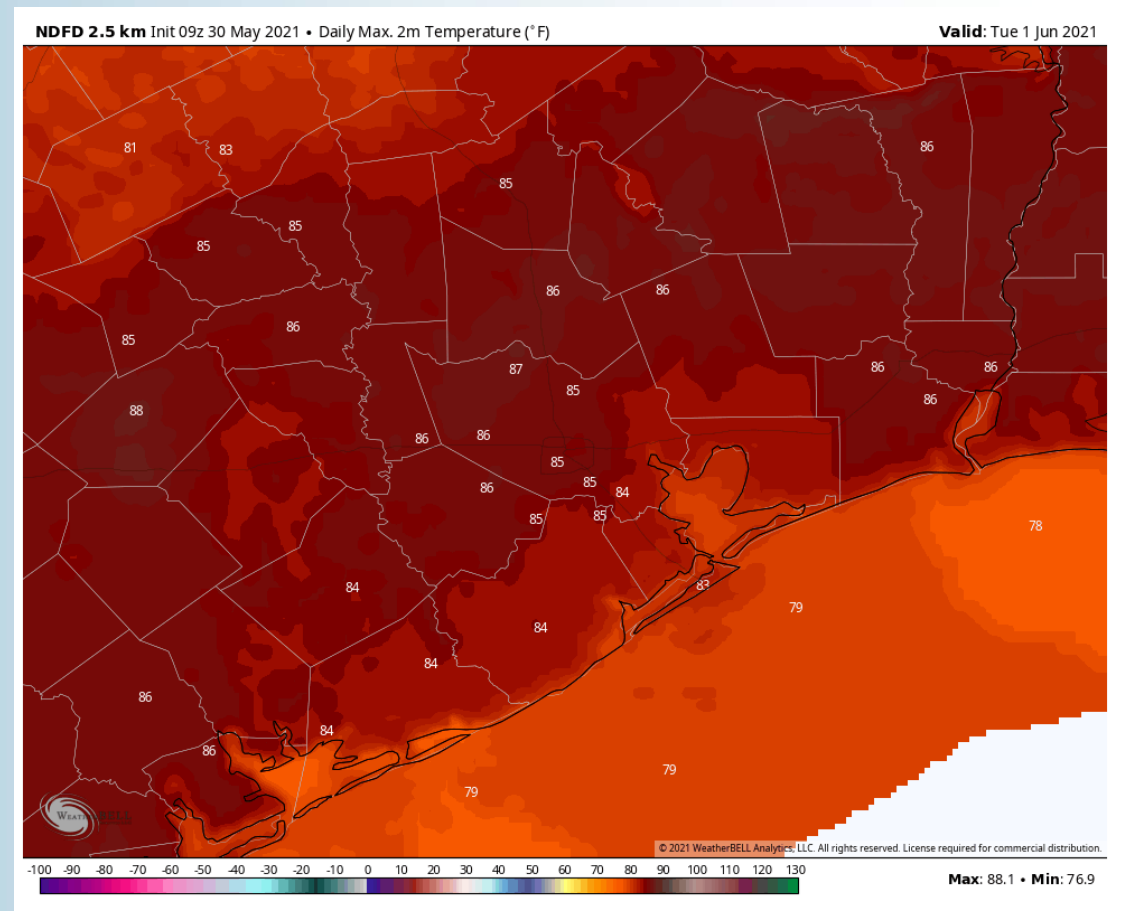
## Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)

## High Temps TUE

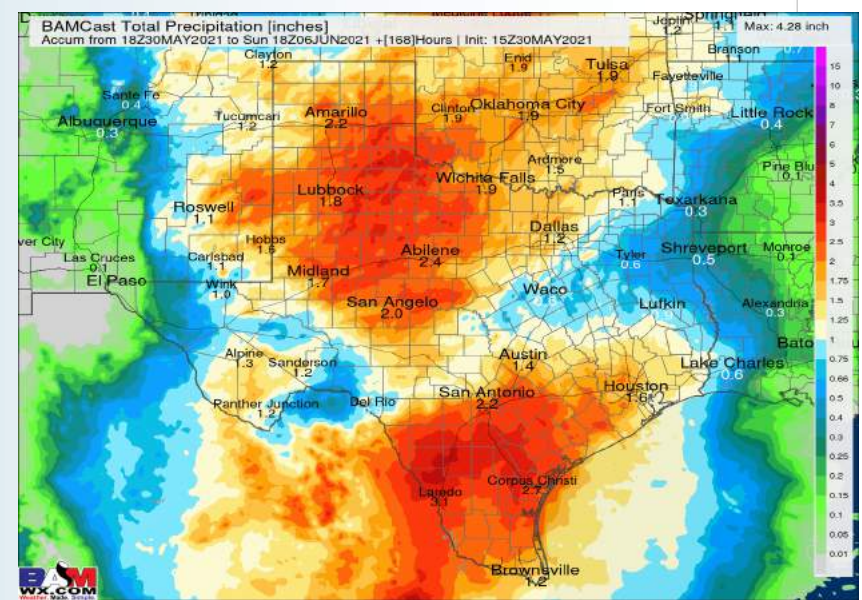
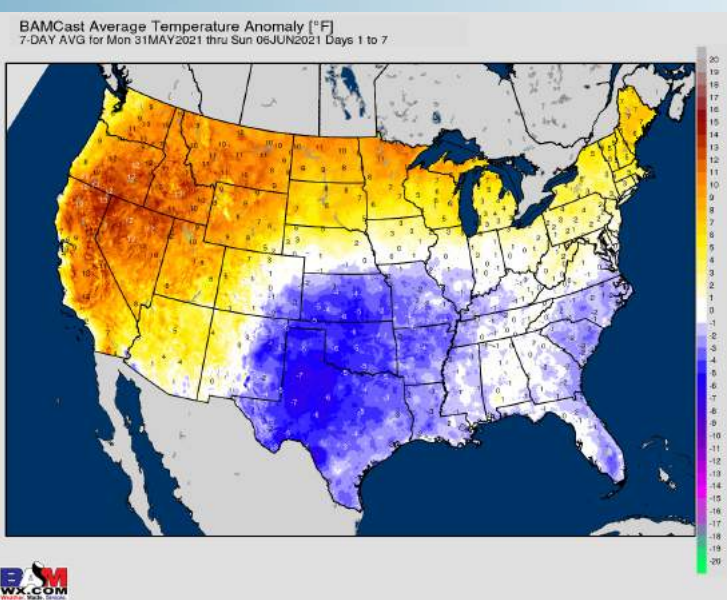




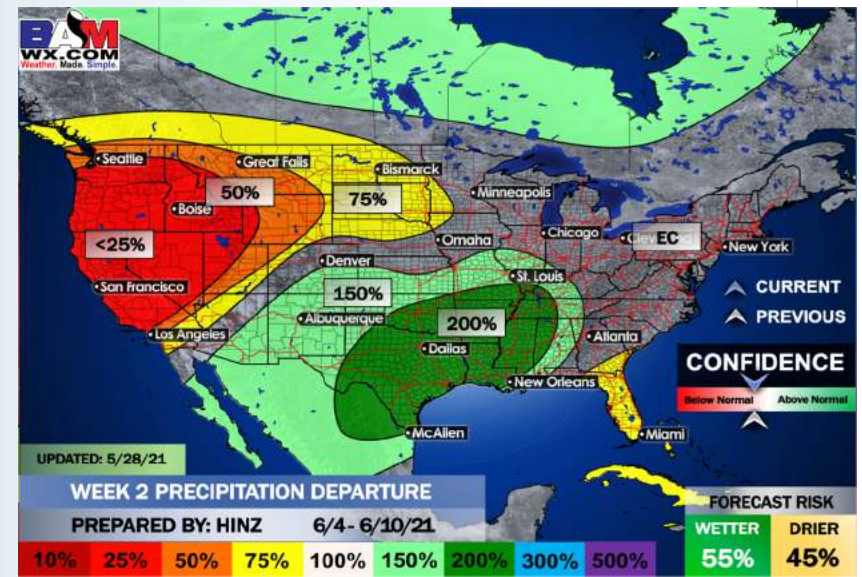
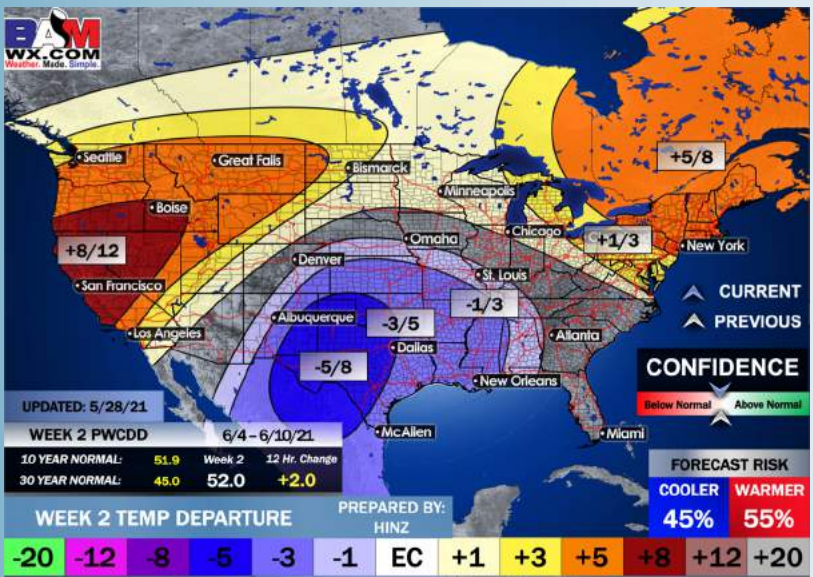
## Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- SE TX will be under the influence of the subtropical jet the next 7 days. This will lead to increased rain chances and below normal temperatures the next 7 days. Precipitation chances begin to pick back up from Wednesday into next weekend.
  
- Working into early June, we are favoring below normal temps for this time of year and for precipitation to stay on the active side of things. Increased moisture risks likely continue across the Southern US.
  
- The weeks 3/4 (mid to late June) period likely features more cooler than normal temperatures and above normal moisture, similar to our current week 2 thoughts.
