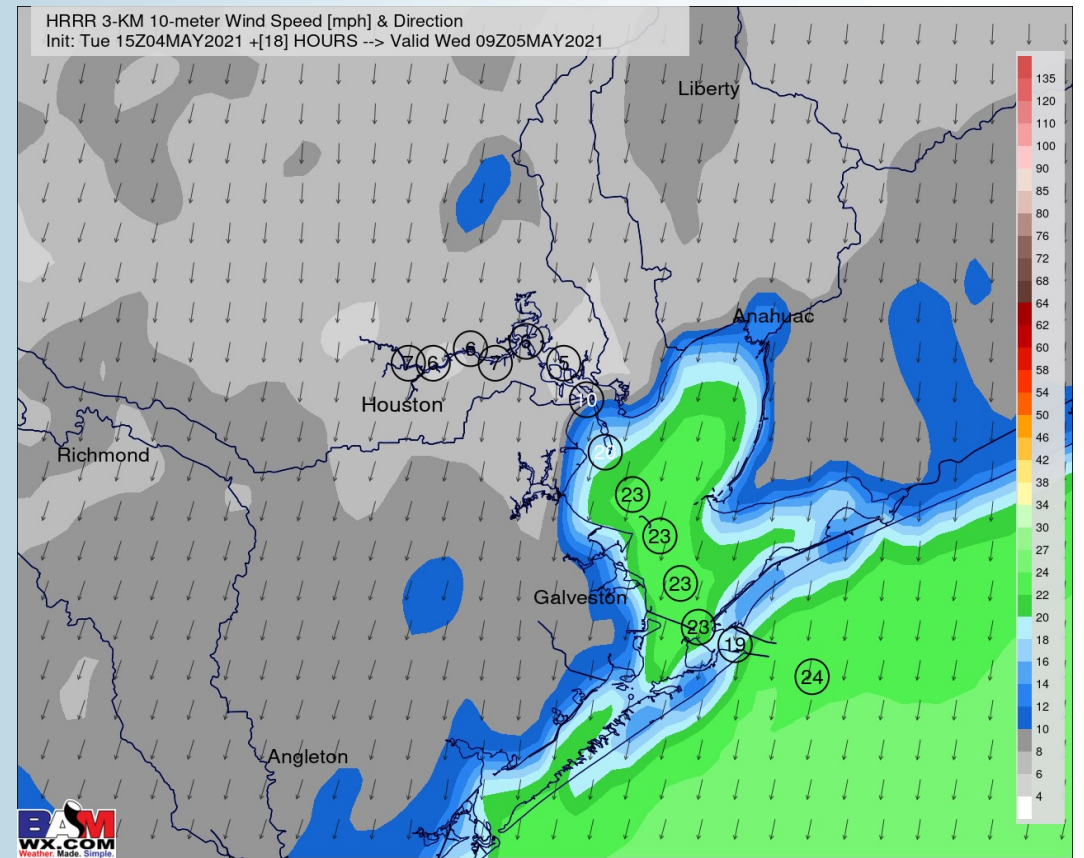

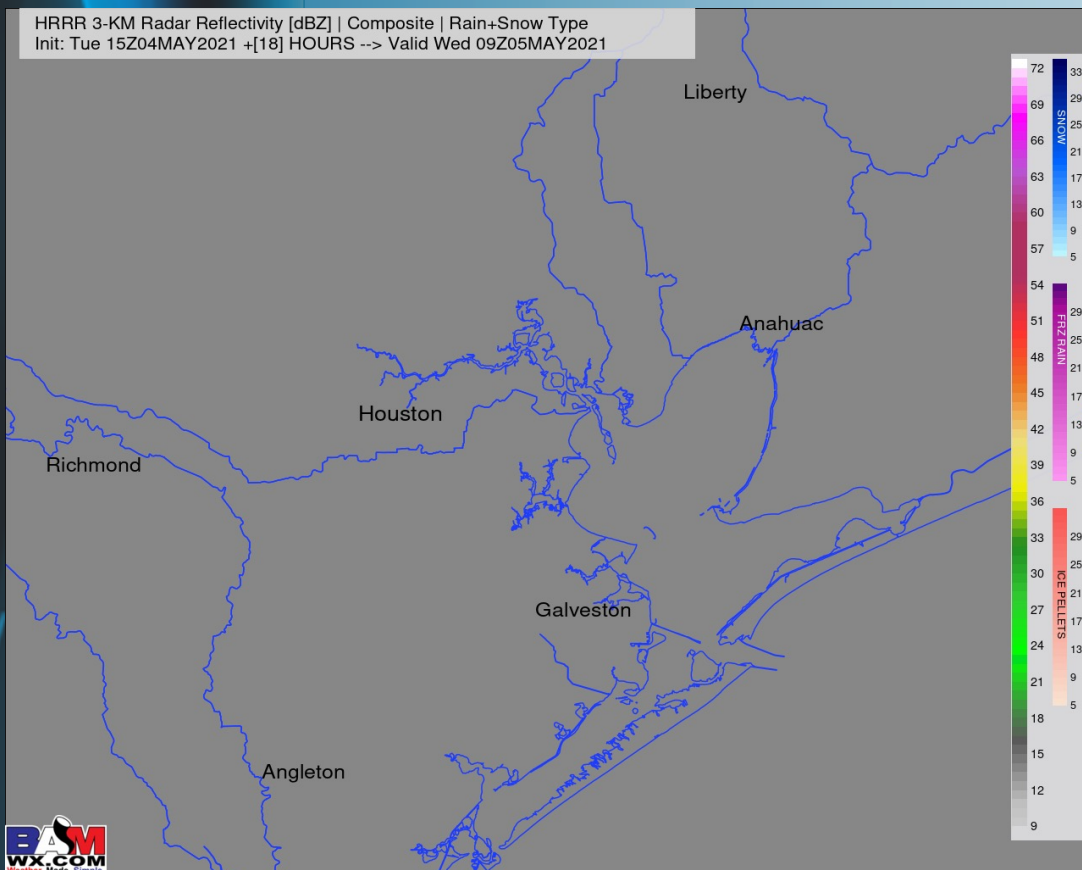
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **A few scattered t-storms will be possible along a weak cold front from the 1-7pm timeframe tonight that may briefly reduce visibility, drying out deeper into the overnight we go.**
- **Winds into the overnight increase to 15-20 MPH sustained, at times, gusting up to 23-28 MPH out of the NNE.**
- **Lows tonight drop into the upper 60s to near 70F.**
  - ***No fog expected tonight. A few periods of haze/light mist will be possible across the stations, as slide 2 shows, can't be ruled at times. Visibility is not anticipated to drop below 3miles.***

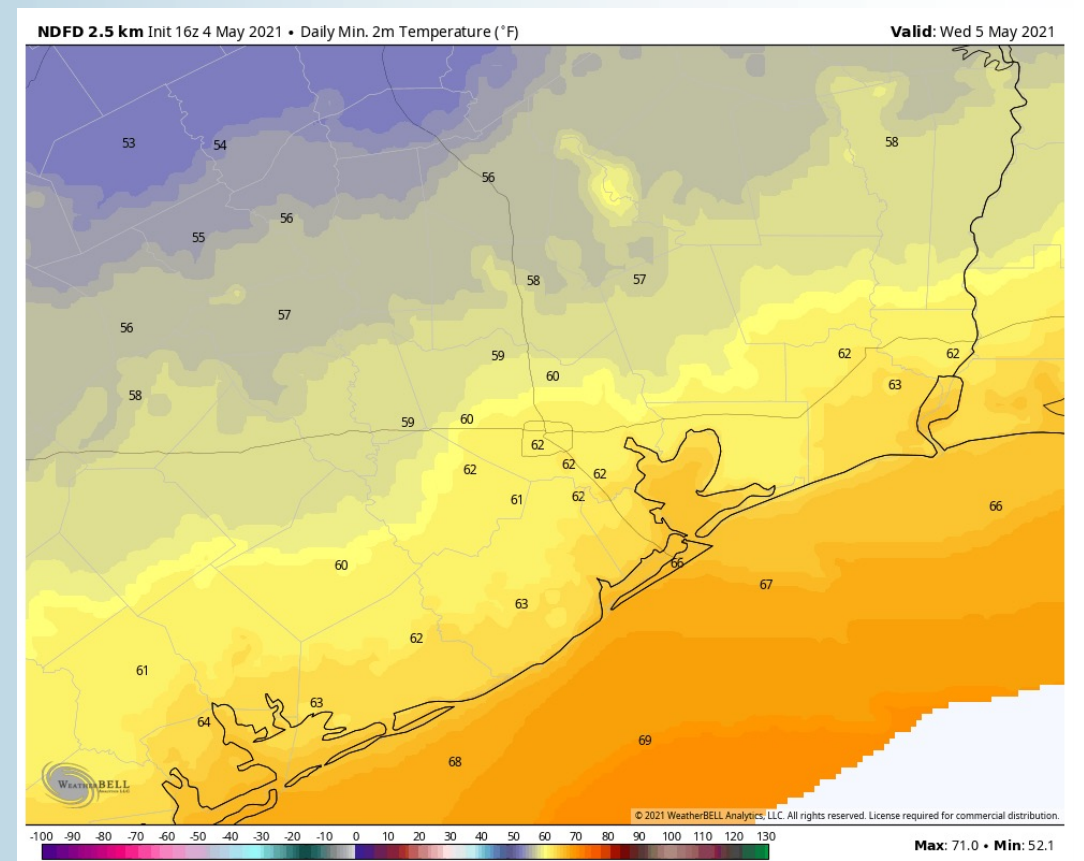
## Sustained Winds (4 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 AM CT)



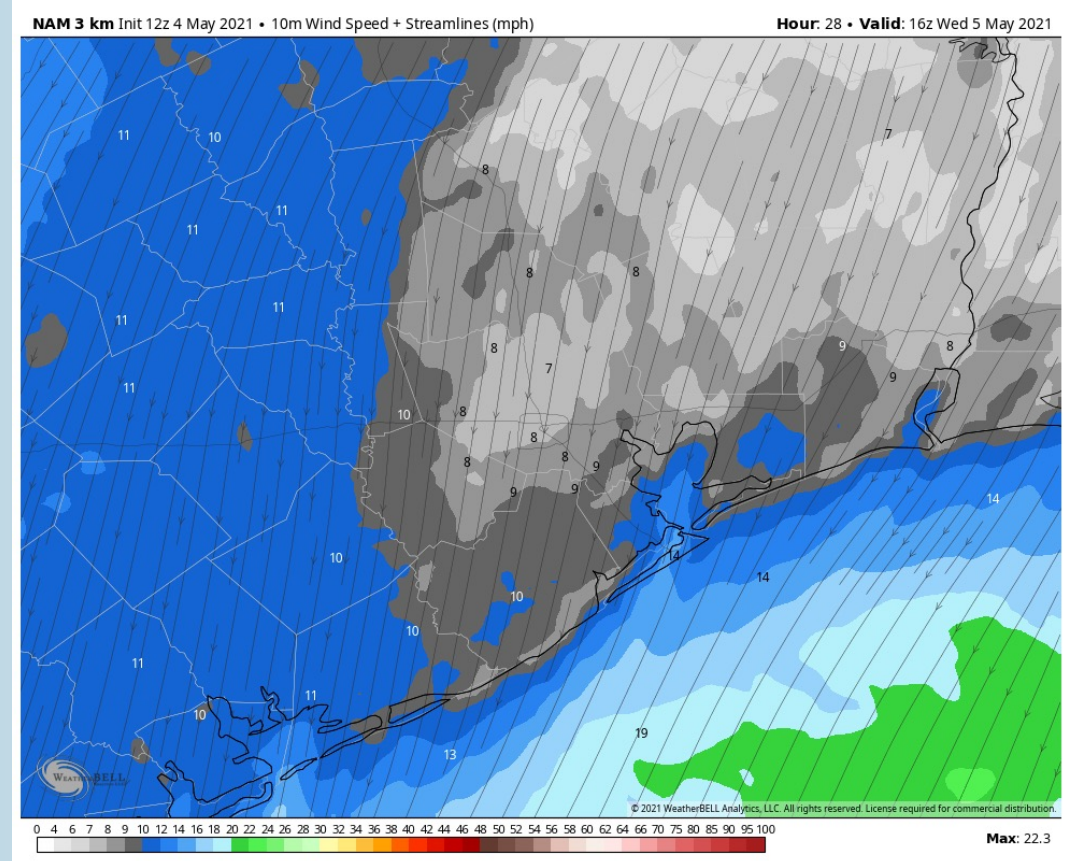
## Low Temperatures Tonight



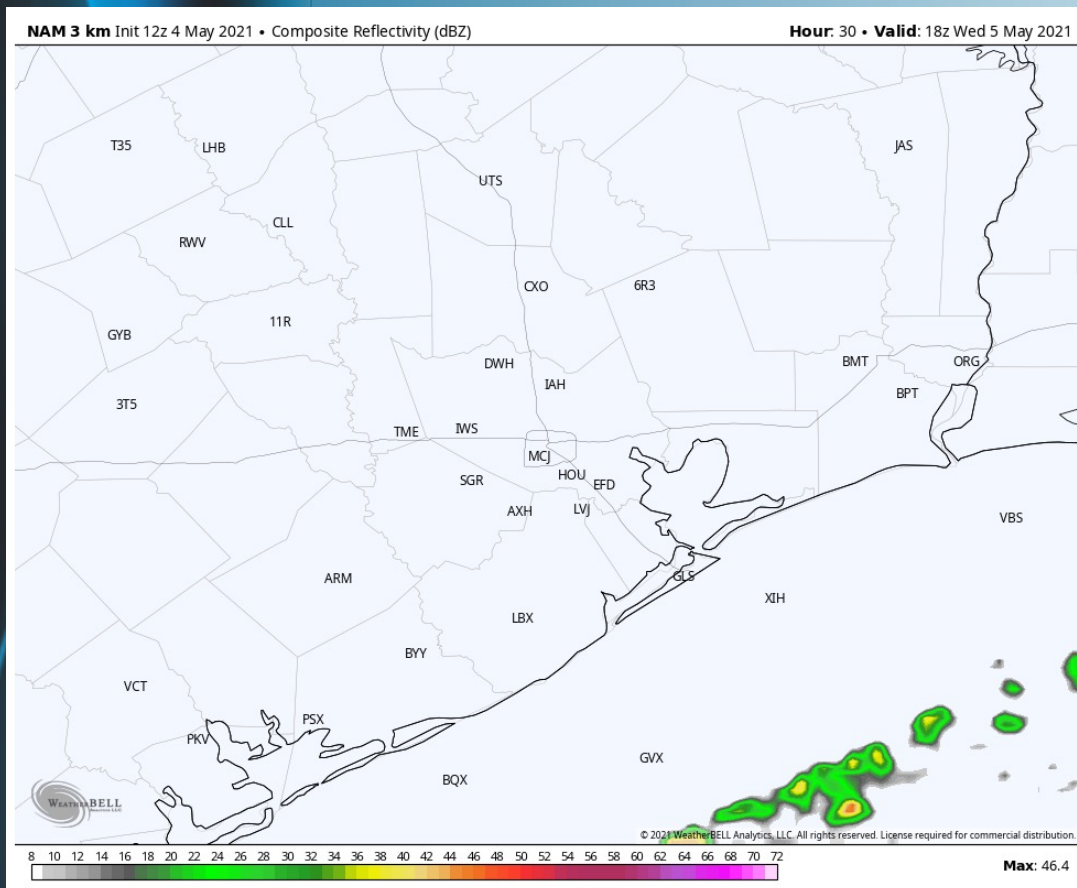
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Wednesday is expected to be a dry day across the area.
- Winds Wednesday will start out 13-18 MPH sustained out of the N / NNE in the morning, decreasing to 5-10 MPH into the PM hours.
- Highs will sit in the mid 70s over the open water, slightly warmer in-land.
- *No fog expected Wednesday night.*

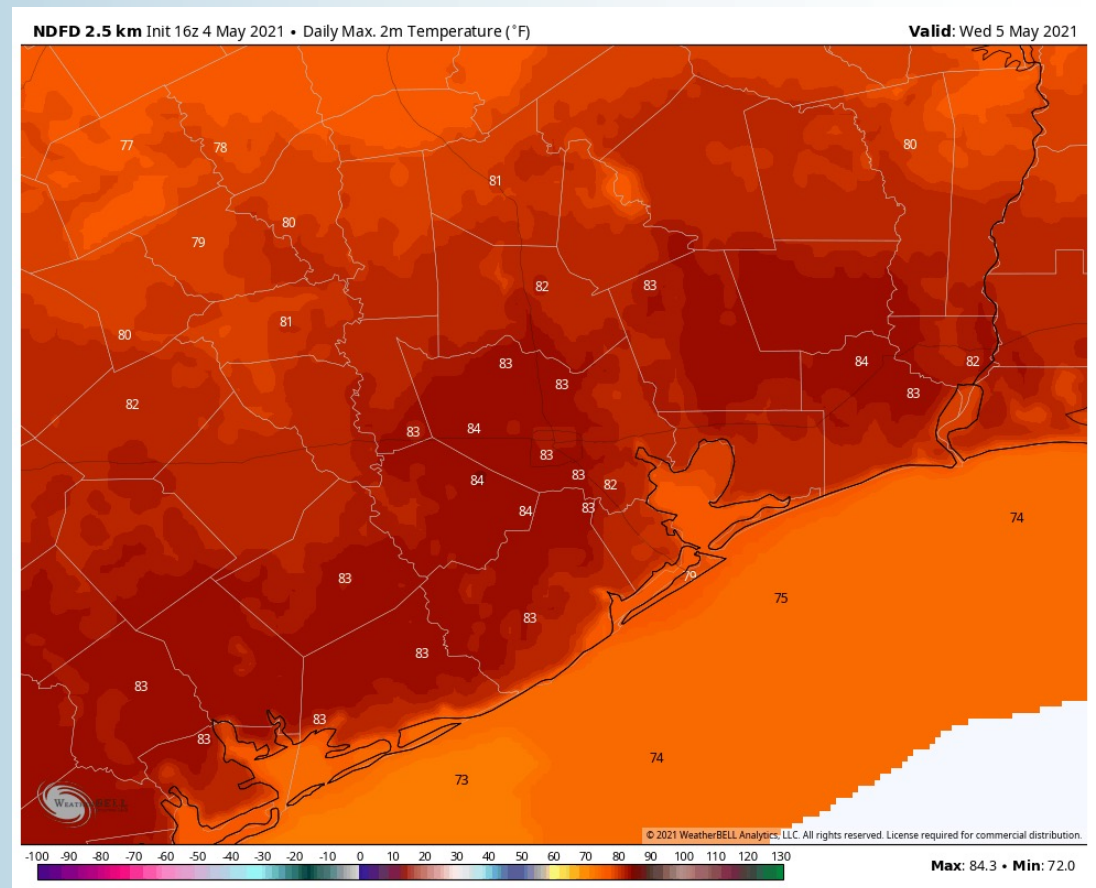
## Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)



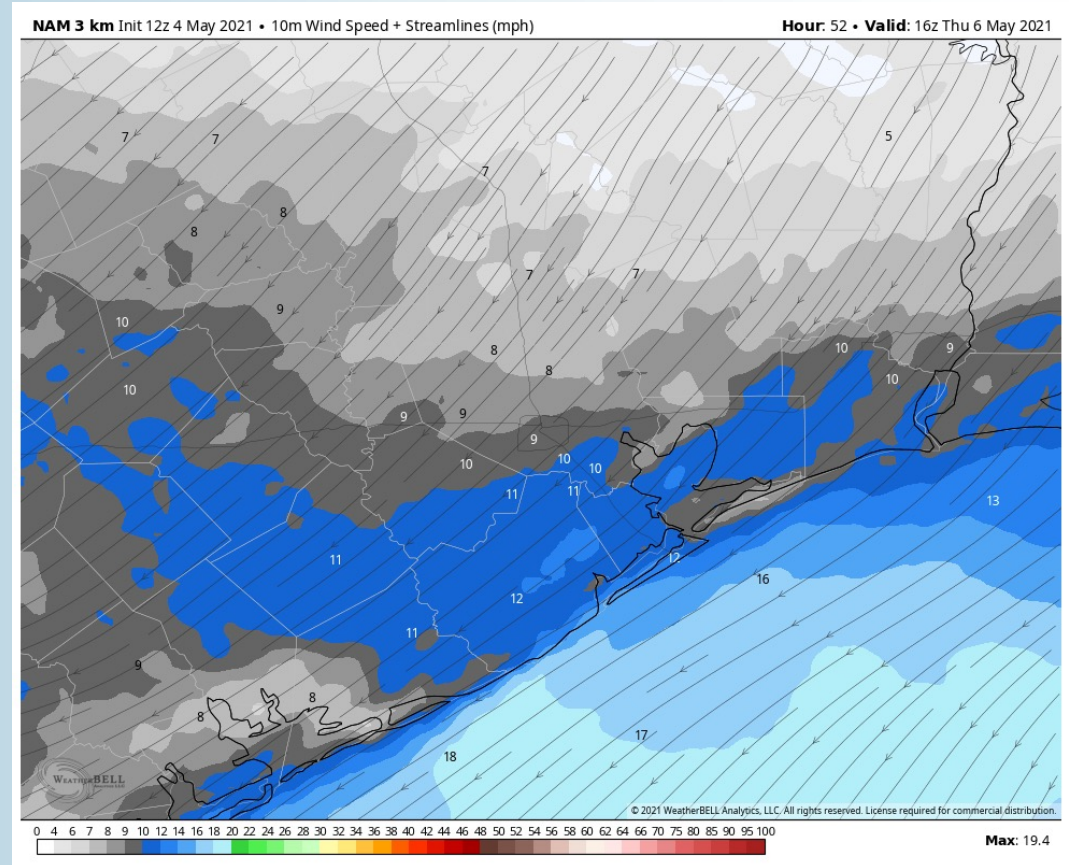
## High Temperatures Wednesday



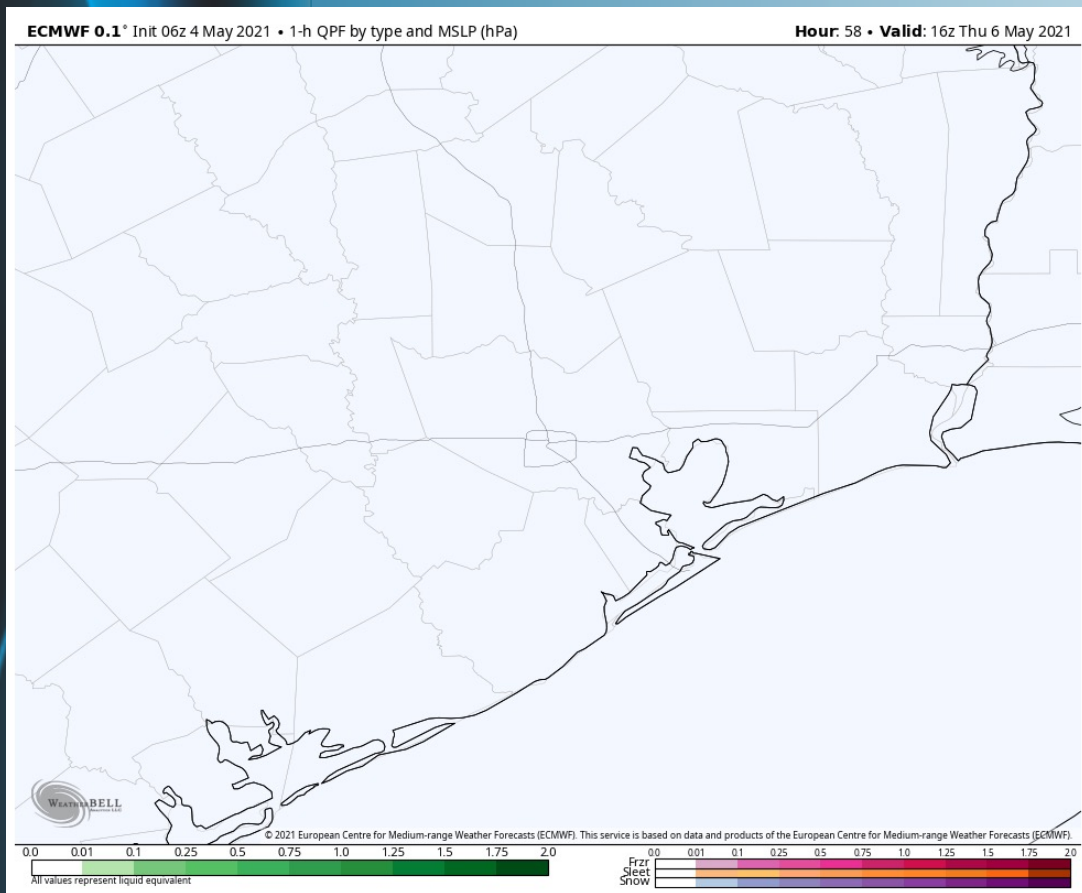
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Thursday is also expected to be a dry day across the area.
- Winds Thursday will start out 10-15 MPH sustained out of the NE in the morning, decreasing to 4-8 MPH into the PM hours.
- Highs will sit in the mid 70s over the open water, warmer in-land.
- *No fog expected Thursday night at this distance.*

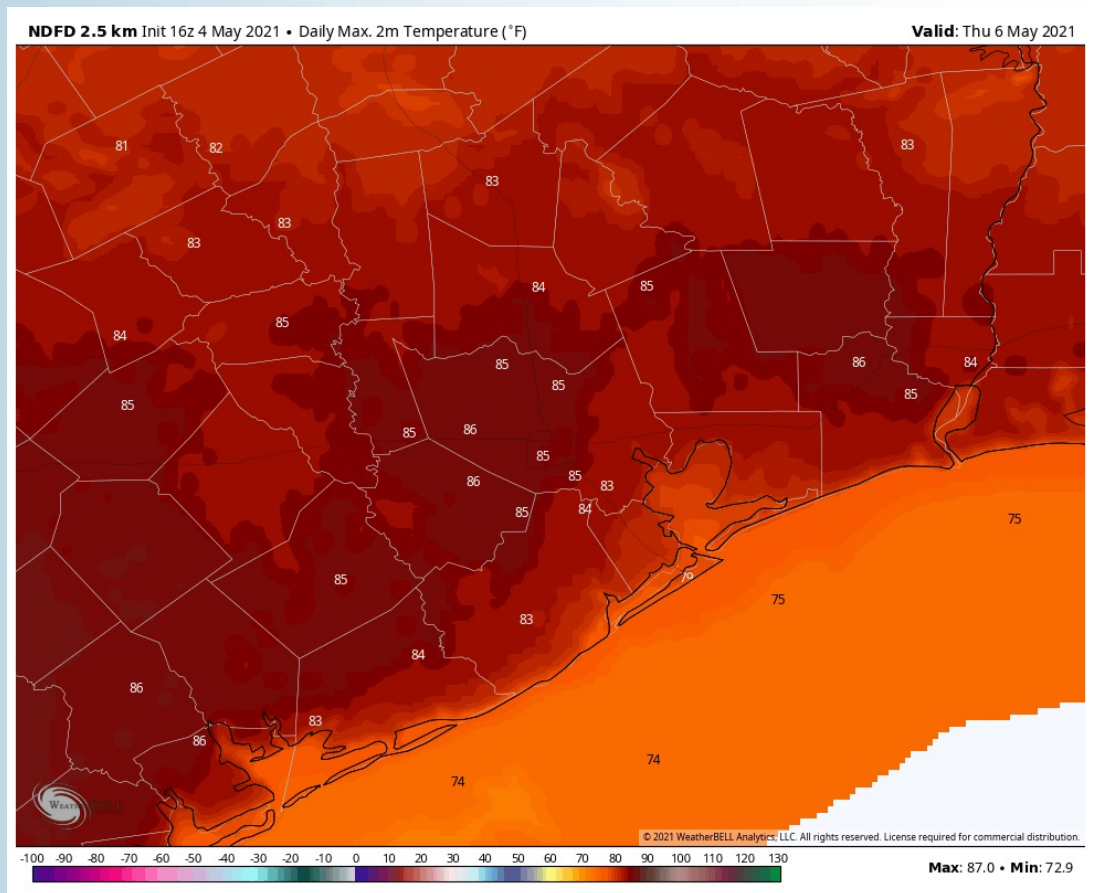
## Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)



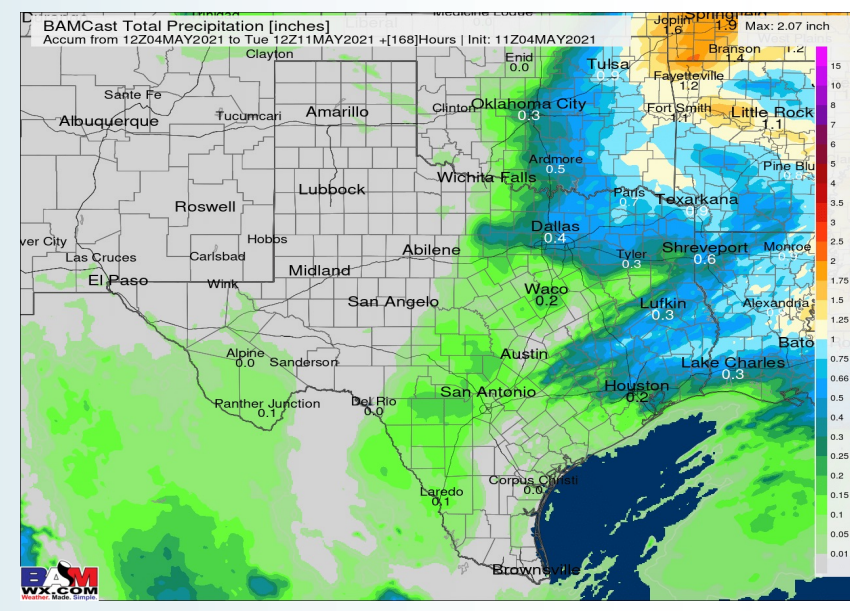
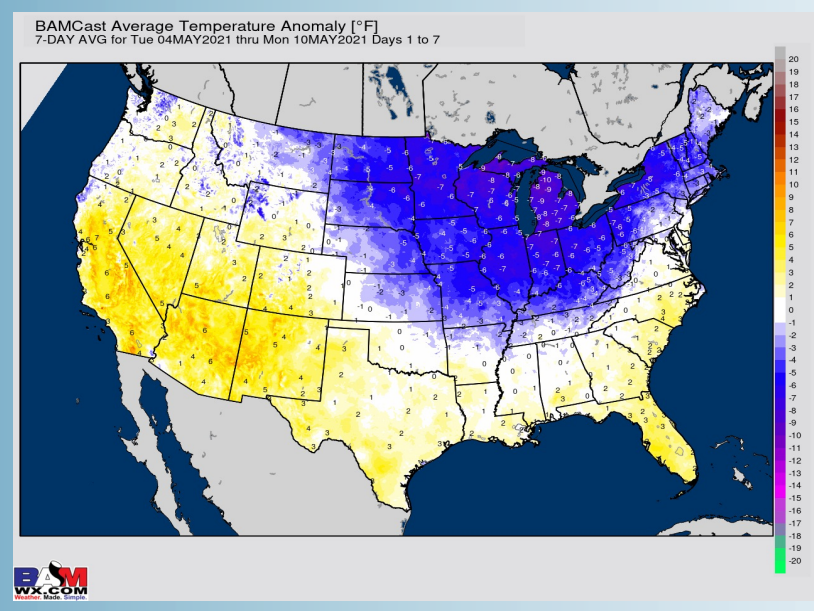

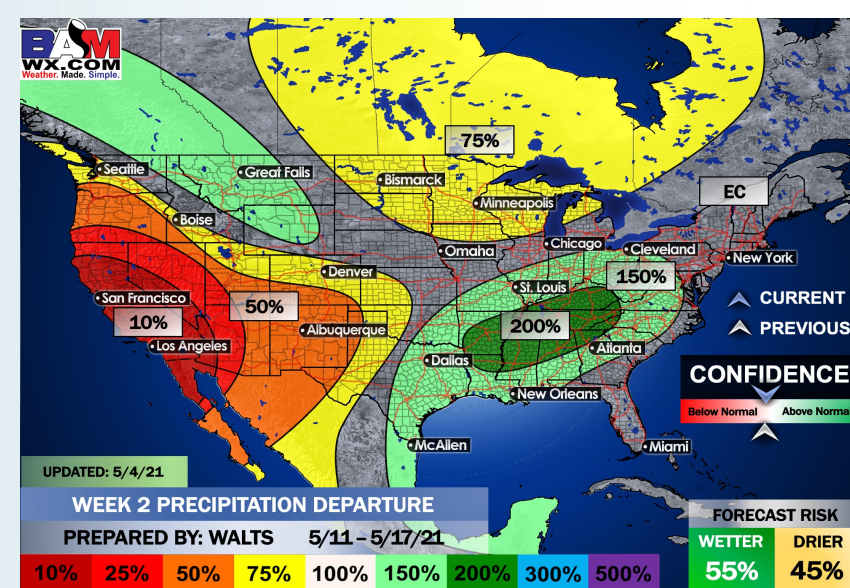
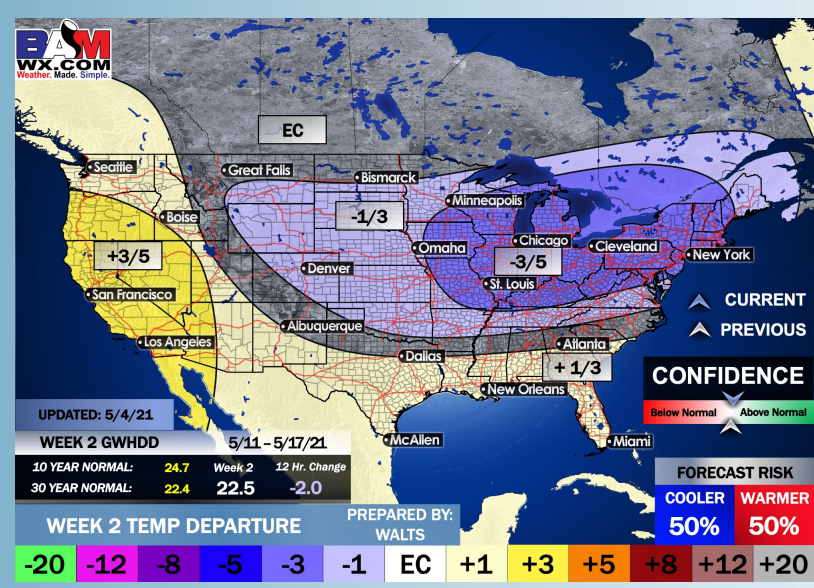
## Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Near normal temps expected over the next week, moisture risks look rather limited and further off to the northeast.
  
- Working into Mid-May, we are favoring above normal temps for this time of year and for precipitation to stay on the active side of things. Increased moisture risks likely continue across the Southern US.
  
- The weeks <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> (Mid/Late May) period likely features more above normal temperatures and above normal moisture, similar to our current week 2 thoughts.
