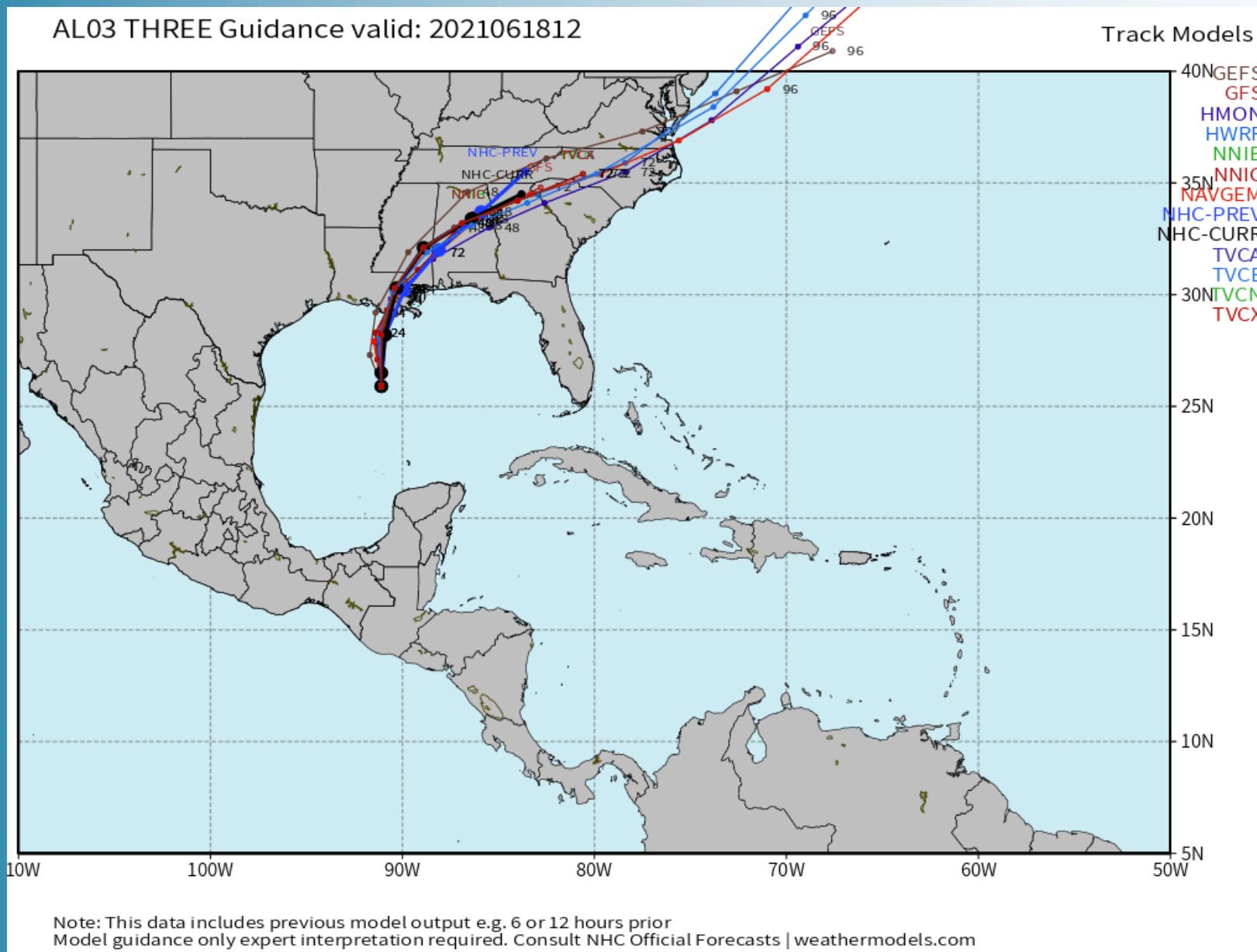

Tropical Update (*main impacts East*):

Various Models for the upcoming tropical wave (Claudette)

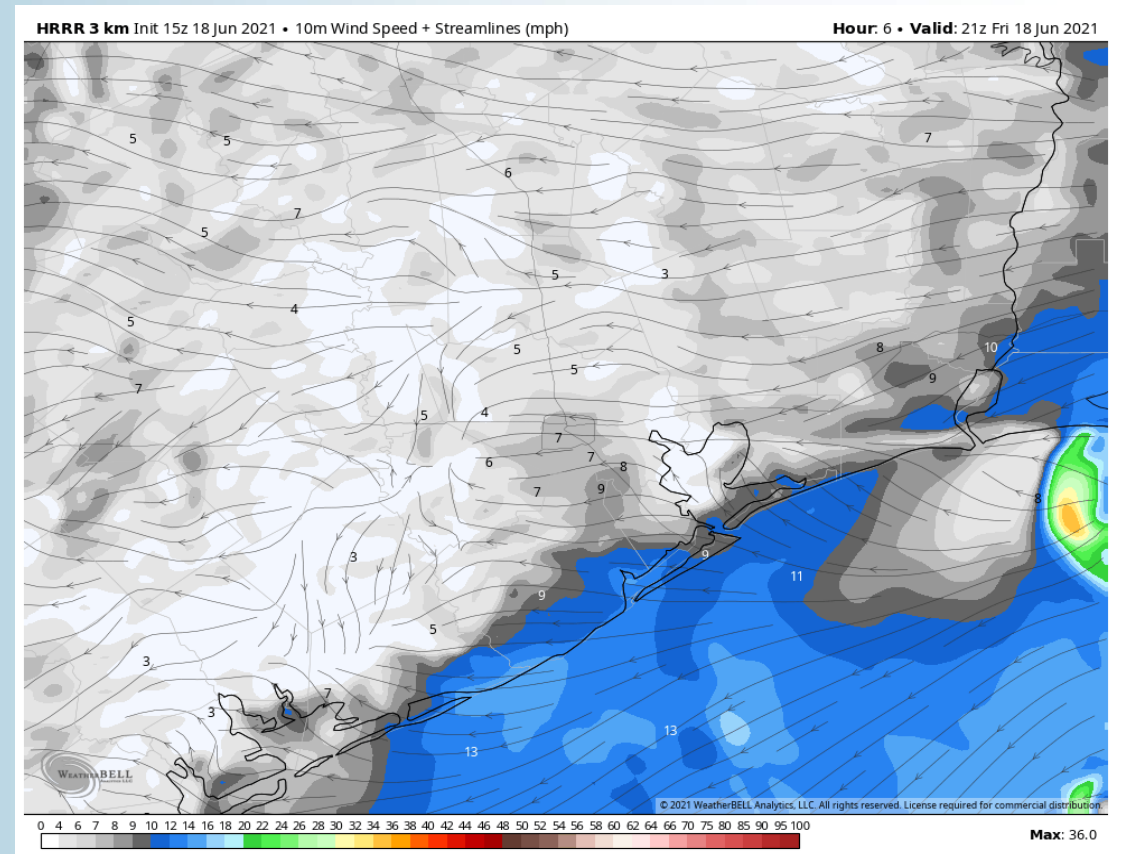


The track of the tropical disturbance, likely to become Tropical Storm Claudette, still is anticipated to be east of the Houston area. Overall, impacts continue to look quite limited, with just an uptick in precipitation chances and slightly elevated winds.

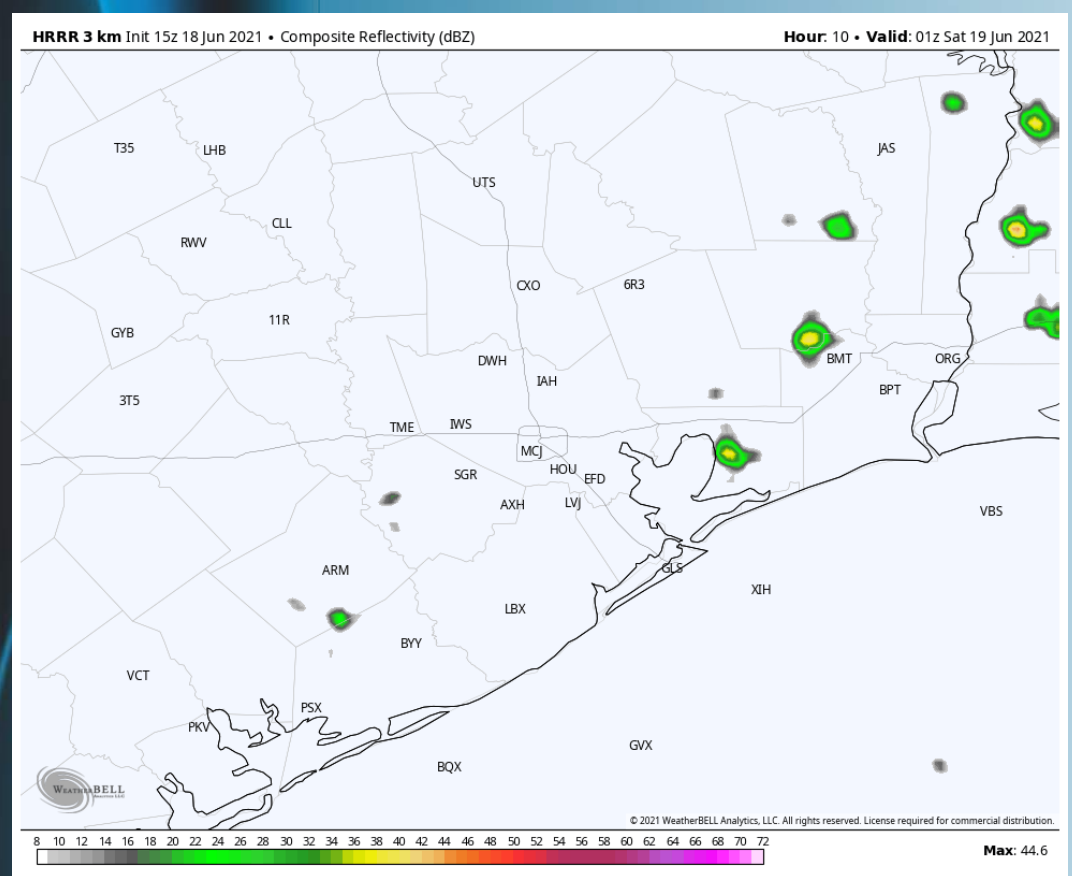
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Still favoring drier weather the rest of the day. A very isolated chance (~10% for shower/ t-storm) will be possible late into the PM hours (~8 PM – midnight).
- Winds still anticipated to shift more out of the SE by ~4-6 PM. Winds should generally be around 8 – 13 MPH sustained with approaching 20 MPH near the boarding station. Winds likely weaken towards midnight.
- Low temps tomorrow morning look to get near ~80 F over open waters.
 - **No fog anticipated this evening.**

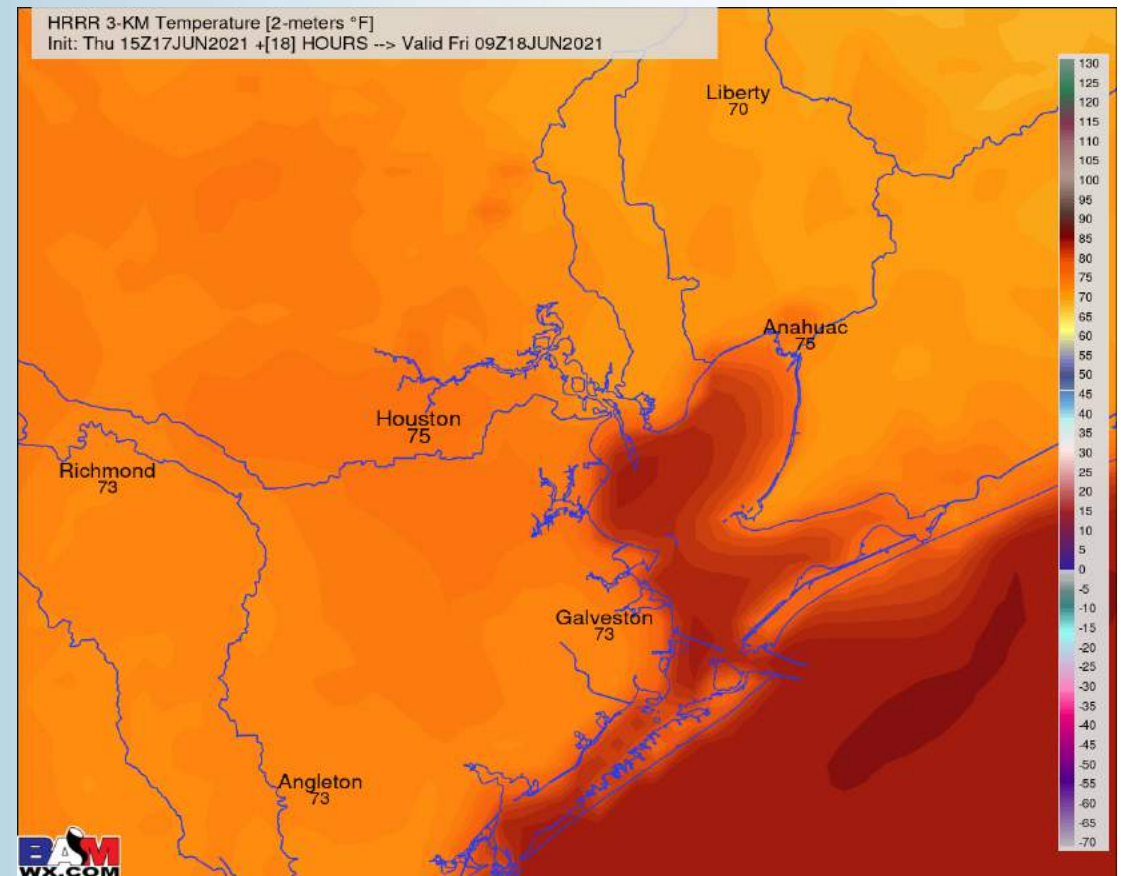
Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (8 PM CT)



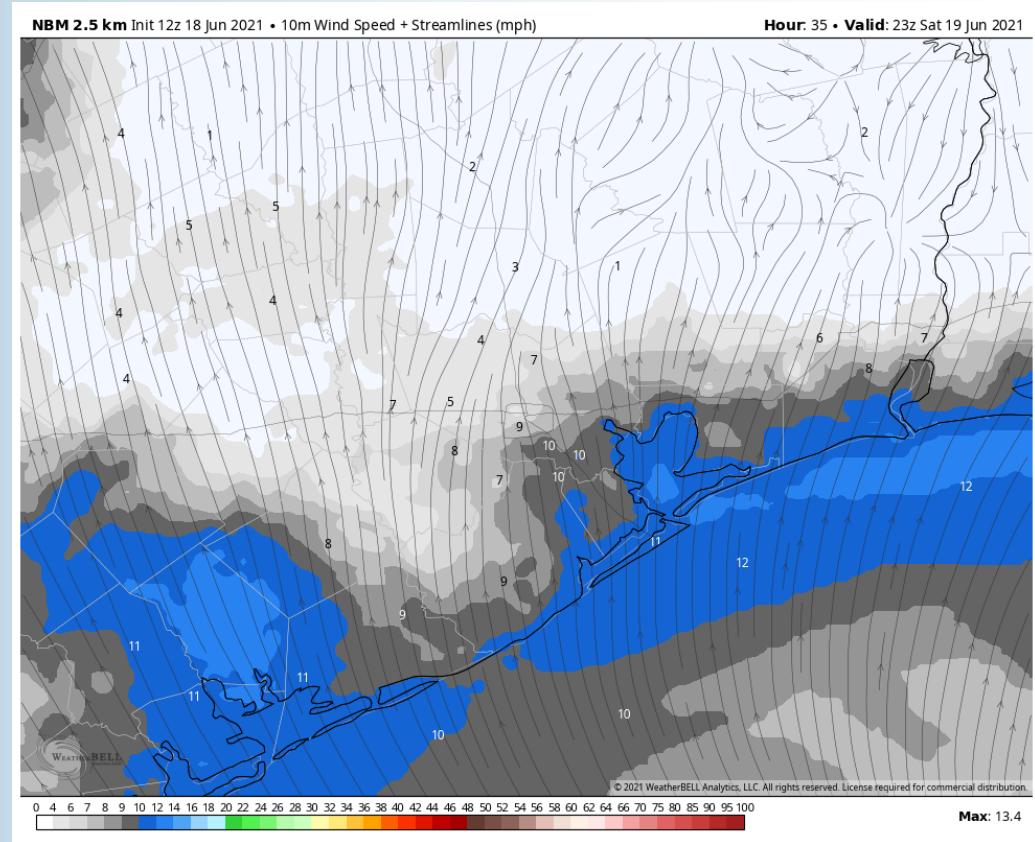
Low Temps this Evening



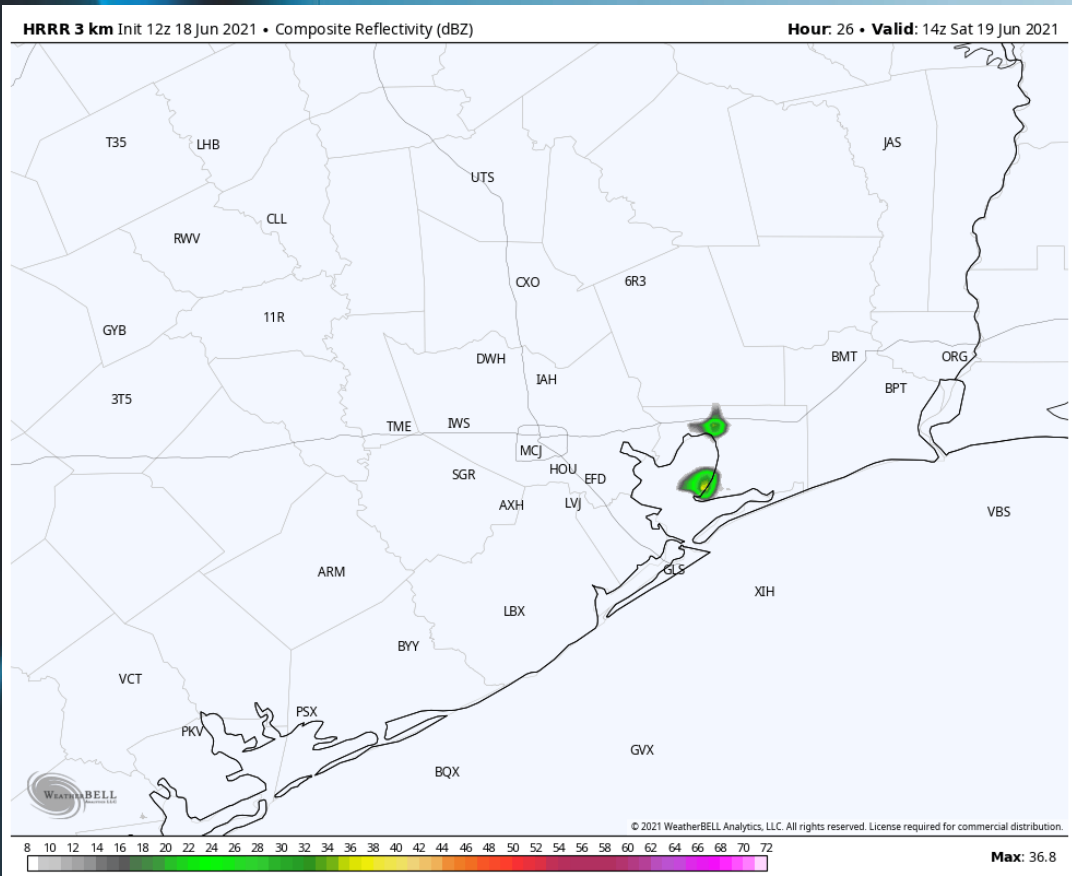
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Tomorrow still looking like a mostly dry day. Any chances would be quite minor with activity staying isolated in nature if anything can indeed form. Slightly better chances will be possible in the AM with the better chances in the PM likely staying north.
- Wind direction tomorrow morning will likely be a bit variable with the general flow out of the W/ NW sustained around 3 – 8 MPH. Around 1 – 3 PM winds shift more out of the South sustained around 10 – 15 MPH (gradually picking up into the overnight). Gust approaching 20 MPH will be possible, especially after sunset.
- Temperatures tomorrow look to get into the upper 80's F/ lower 90's F over open waters on Saturday
 - *No fog anticipated for Saturday.*

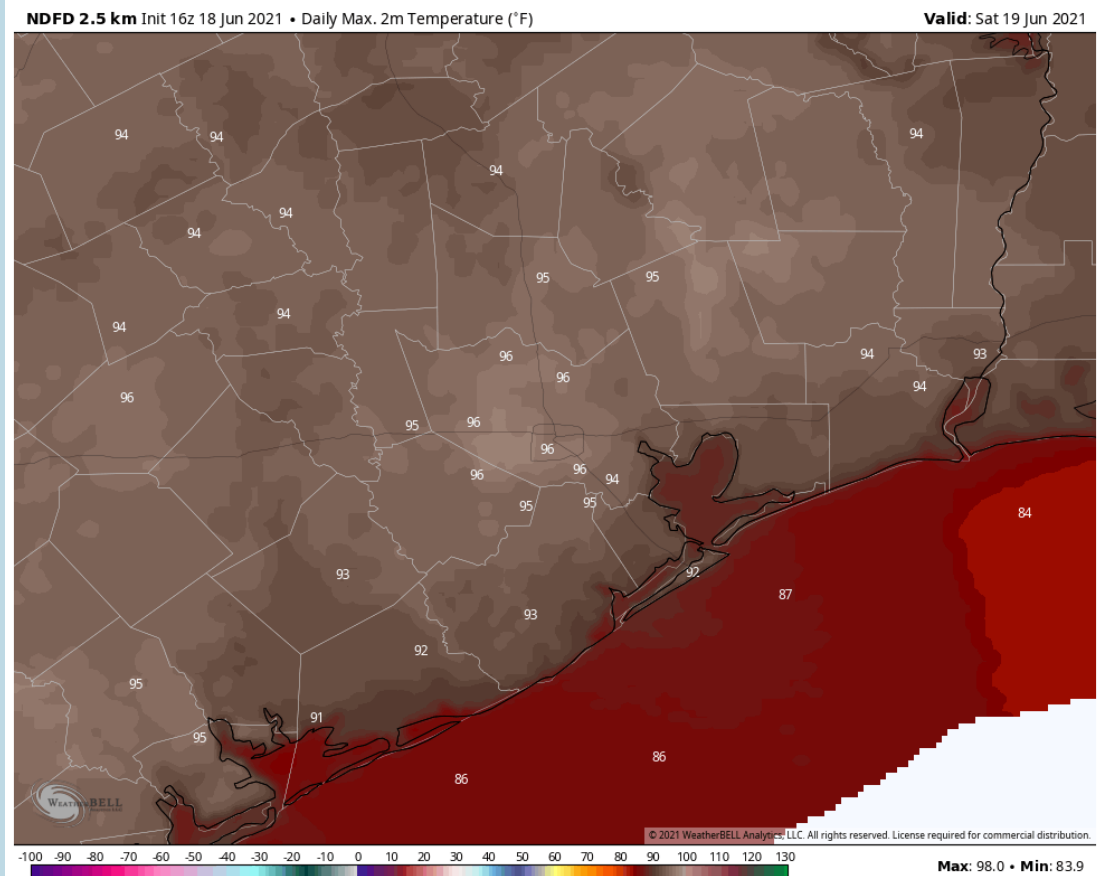
Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 AM CT)



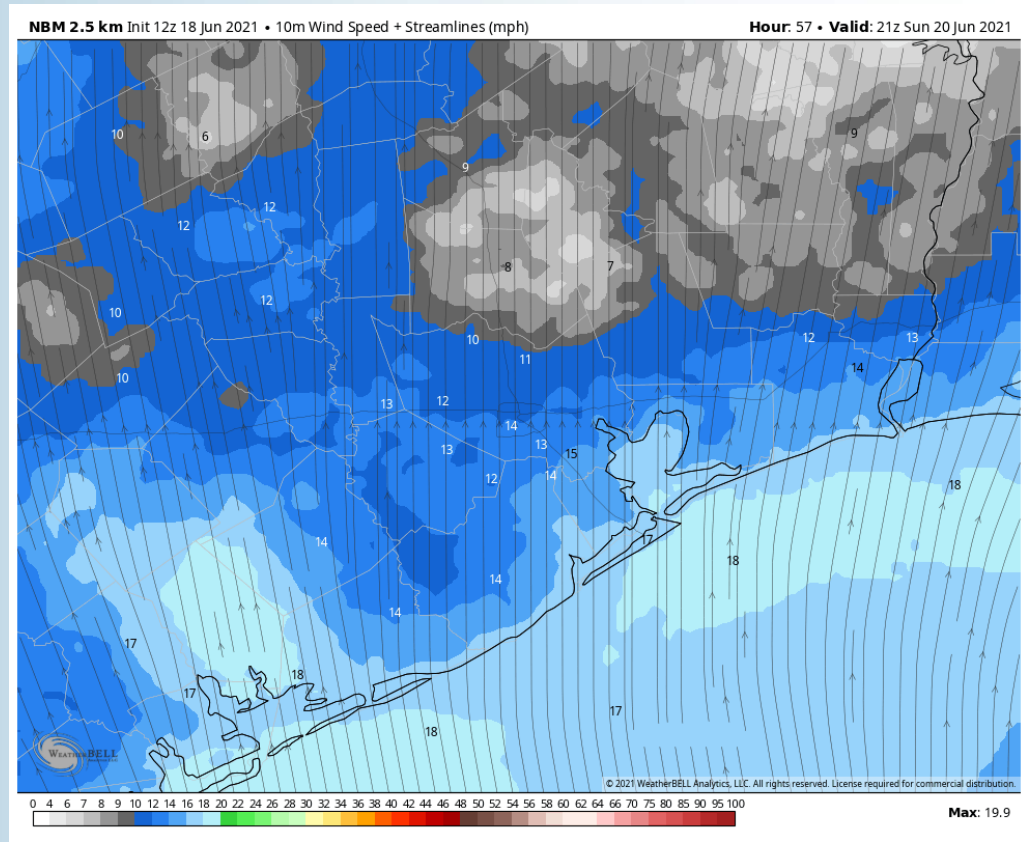
High Temperatures Friday



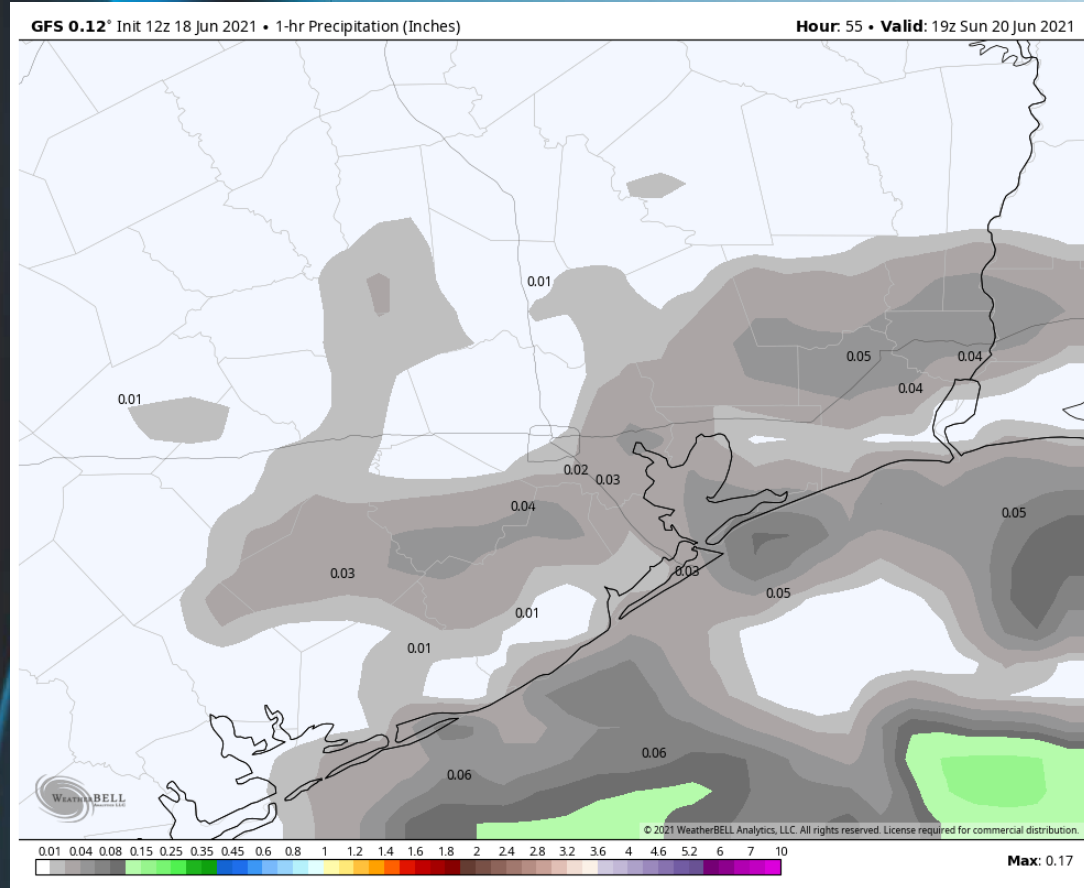
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Slightly better chances on Sunday vs that of today and Saturday. Best chances look to come in the PM hours. At this distance, not anticipating a washout with just scattered chances.
- Winds look to be coming from the south on Sunday sustained around 10 – 20 MPH (breeziest conditions near the boarding station). Locally higher gust will be possible.
- Highs Sunday look to get into the Upper 80's to lower 90's F over open waters.
- *No fog is favored Sunday.*

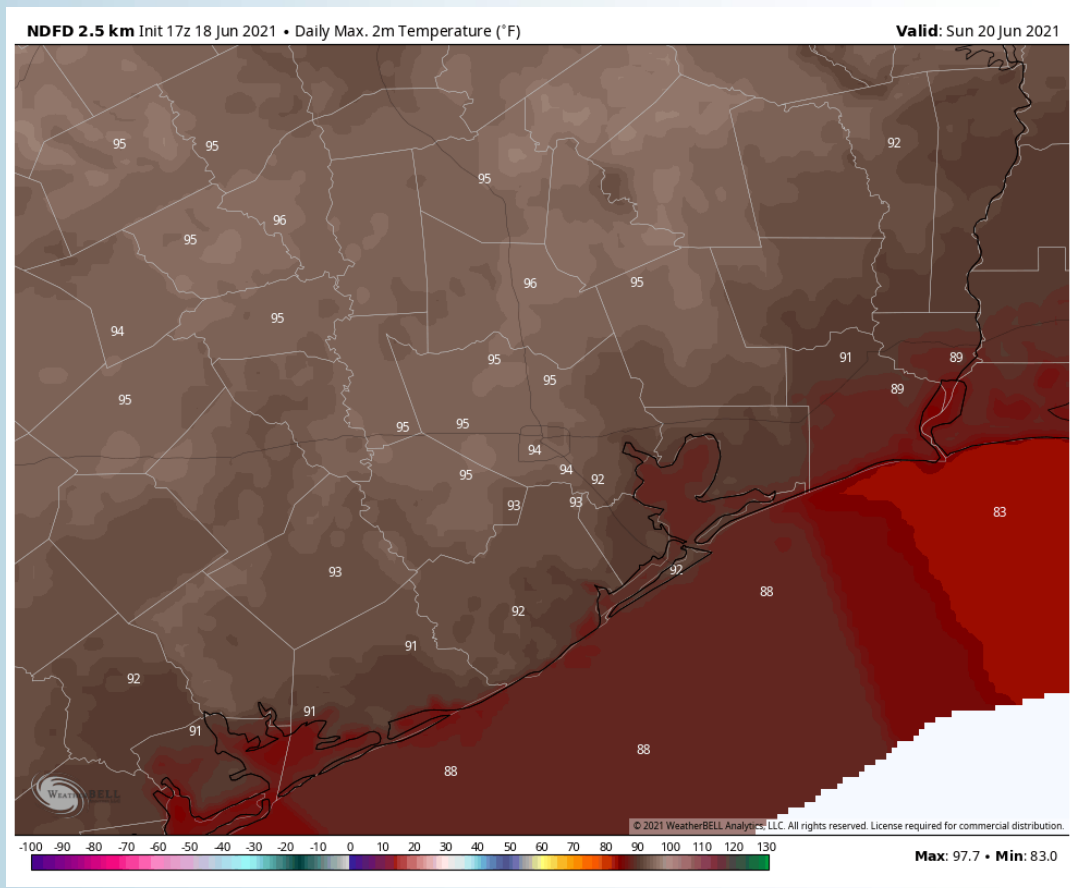
Sustained Winds (8 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)



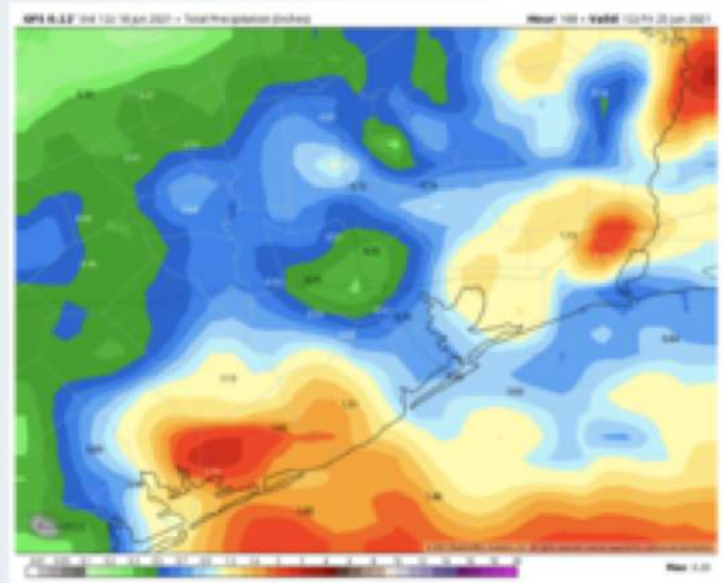
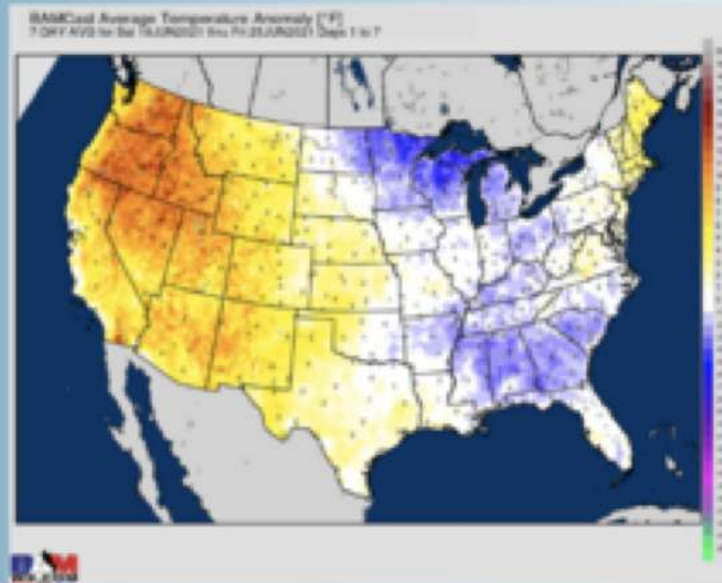
High Temps Sunday



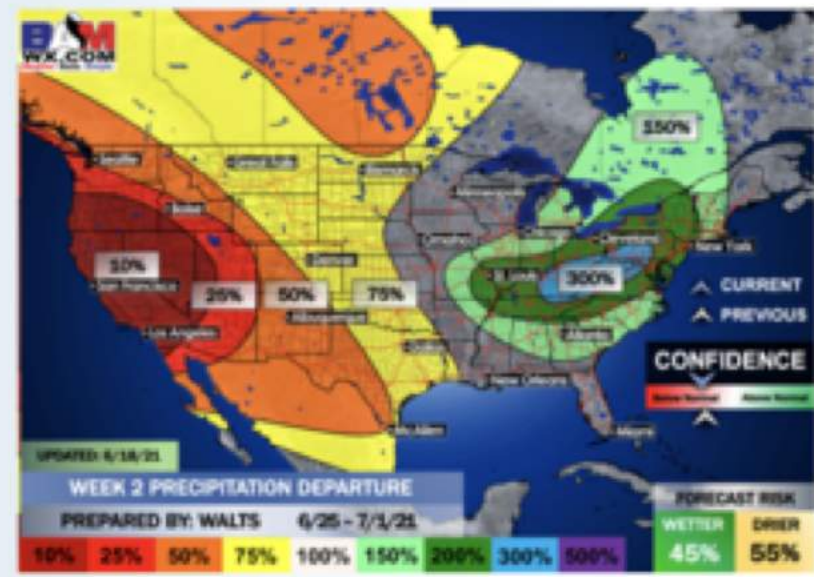
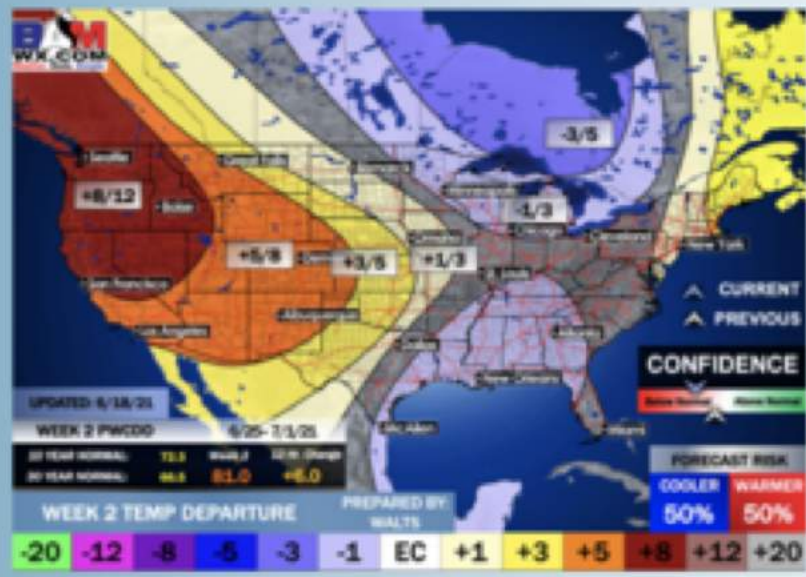
Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temperatures look to run at/ slightly above normal the next 7 days. It still looks like the heavy rains with what will be Tropical Storm Claudette should stay east of the area but rain risks will be on the uptick this weekend into early next week.
- Week 2 is anticipated to trend drier vs previous wetter weeks across the area, while temps look to stay about normal to slightly cooler here into late June.
- The weeks 3/4 (late June to early July) period likely features more seasonable to cooler than normal temperatures, while precipitation looks to return back to above normal in this period as well.
