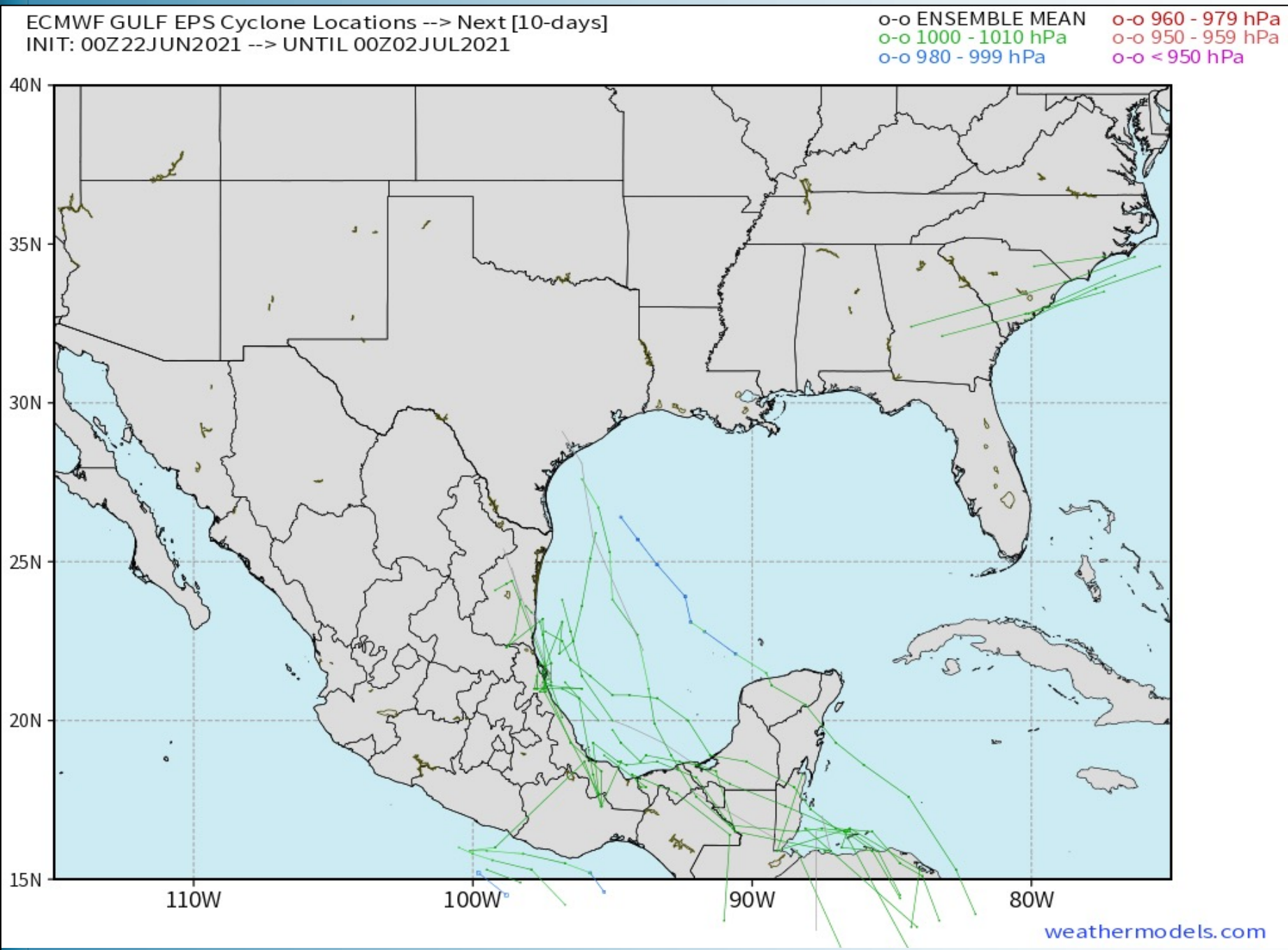

Tropical Update: *no immediate threats*

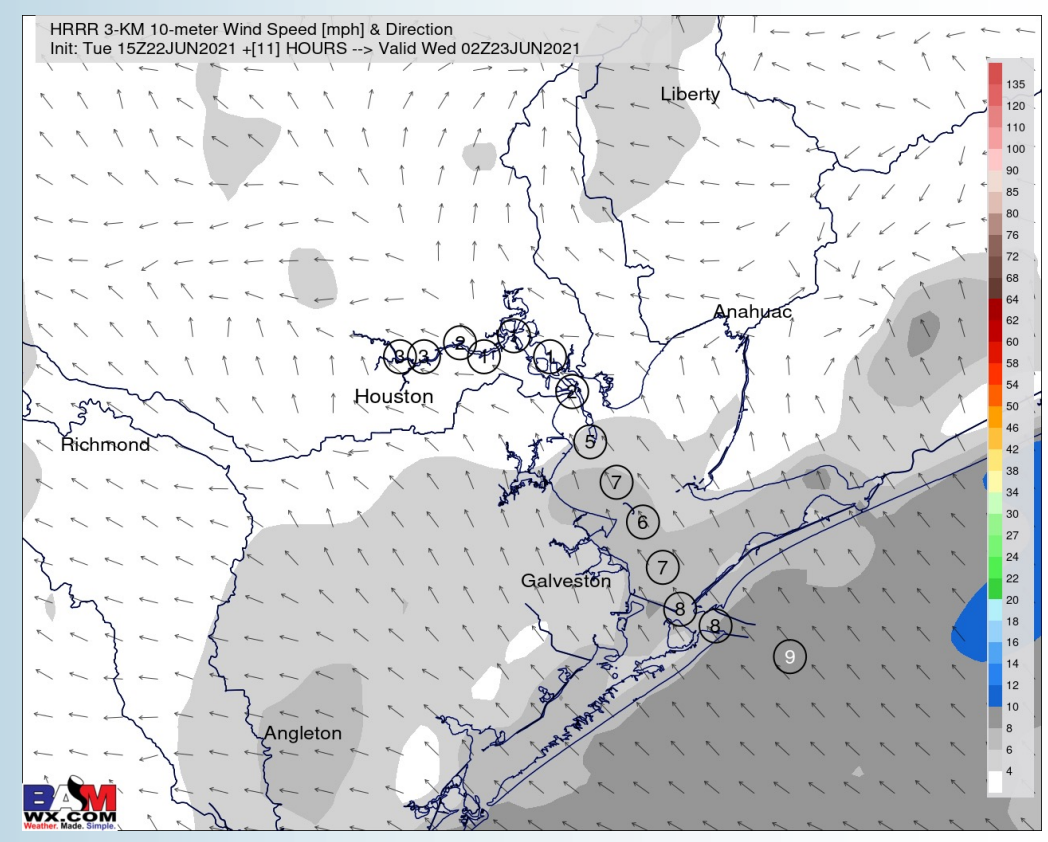


No immediate tropical threats to Houston over the next 7-10 days on our favored weather model guidance.

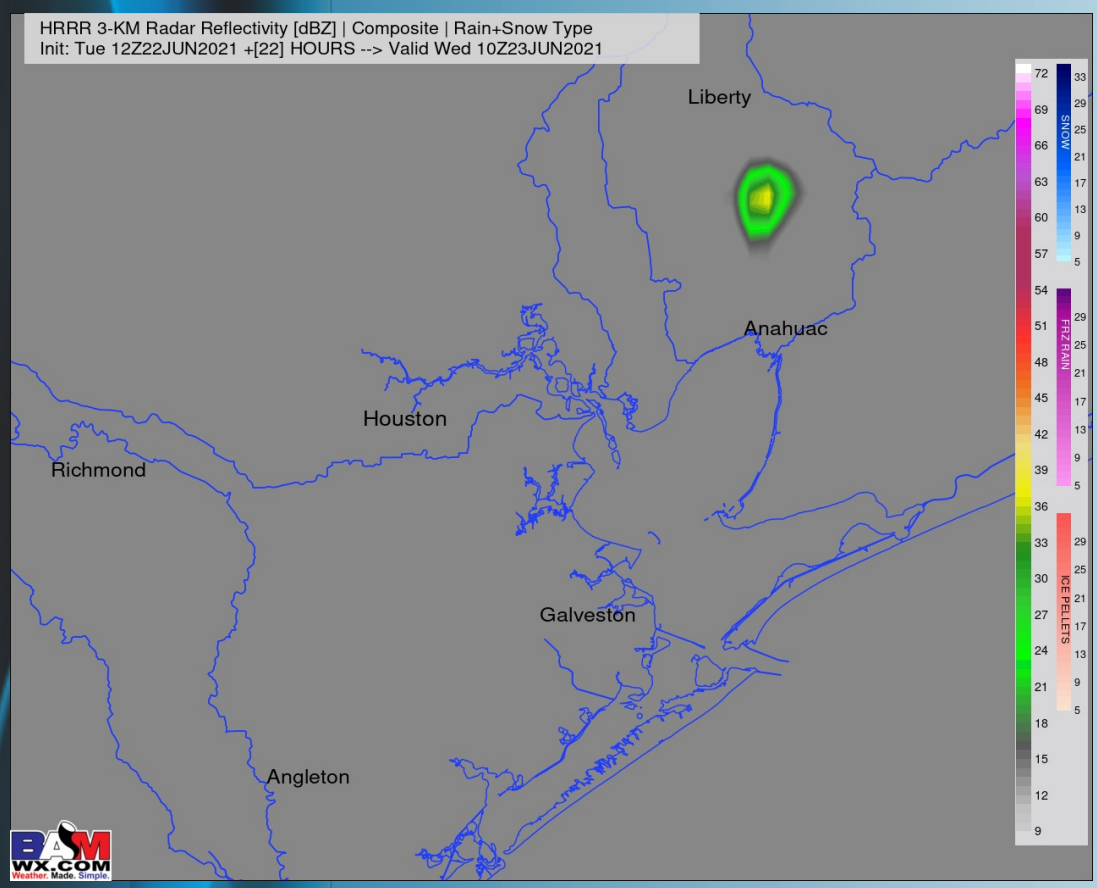
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Precipitation continues to be favored mainly along and southeast of Bravo ½ throughout the afternoon, overall diminishing all together into the evening hours. We favor a more quiet overnight period in regards to precipitation risks going forward, outside of something isolated.
- Winds are anticipated to be on the calmer side of things, with winds out of the Southeast sustained around 4 - 8 MPH generally, a few gusts up to 10 - 15 MPH can't be ruled out.
- Lows hold steady in the lower 80s F over open waters, cooler in-land.
 - *No fog is favored tonight..*

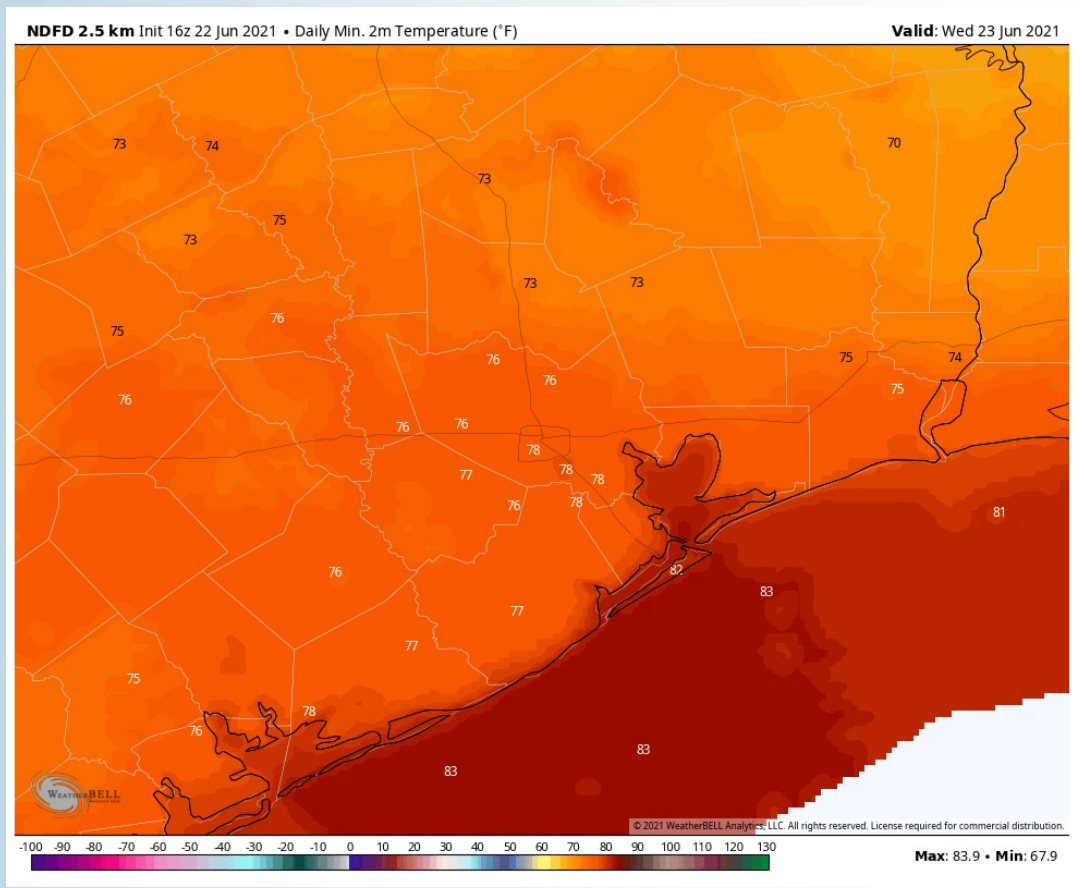
Sustained Winds (9 PM CT)

Short-Term Forecast Discussion

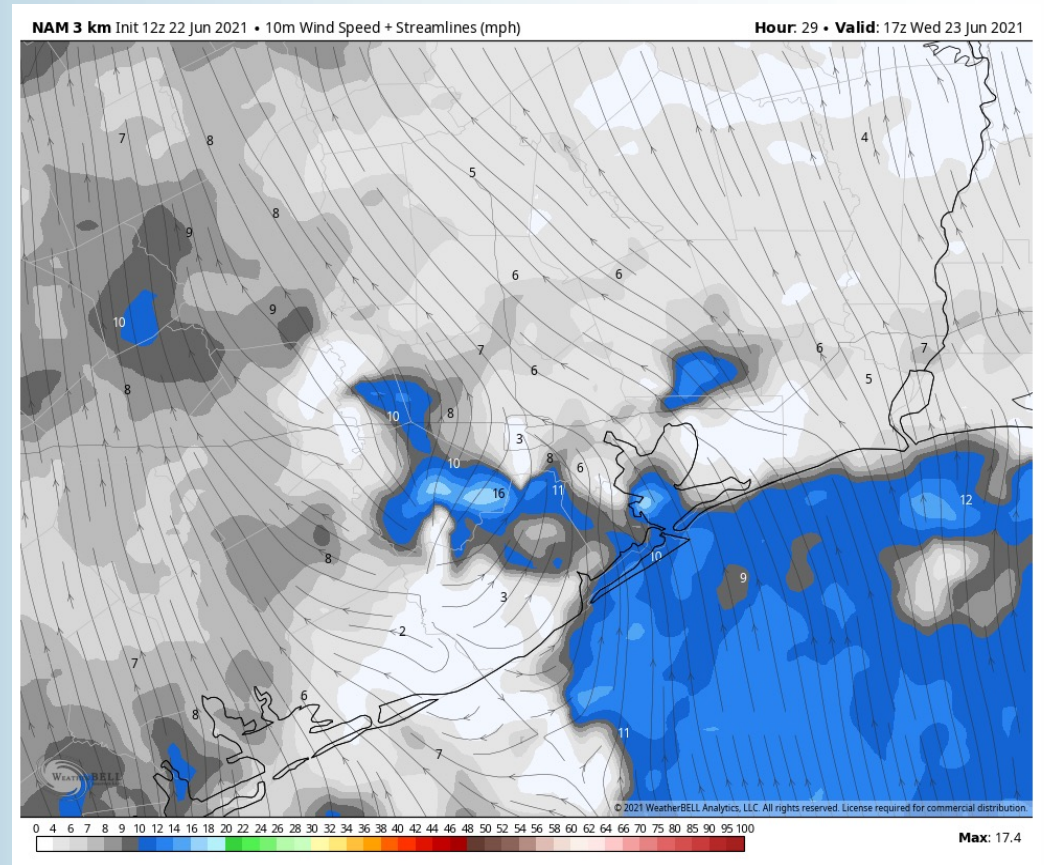
- **Precipitation chances have increased slightly for Wednesday vs the AM report. Right now we think in the window of 9am-3pm with the best chances of scattered showers and storms across our forecast area.**

- **Winds are anticipated to be on the calmer side of things on WED again, out of the S sustained around 5 – 10 MPH. A localized gust of 20-25+ MPH can't be ruled out with any storms that develop overhead.**

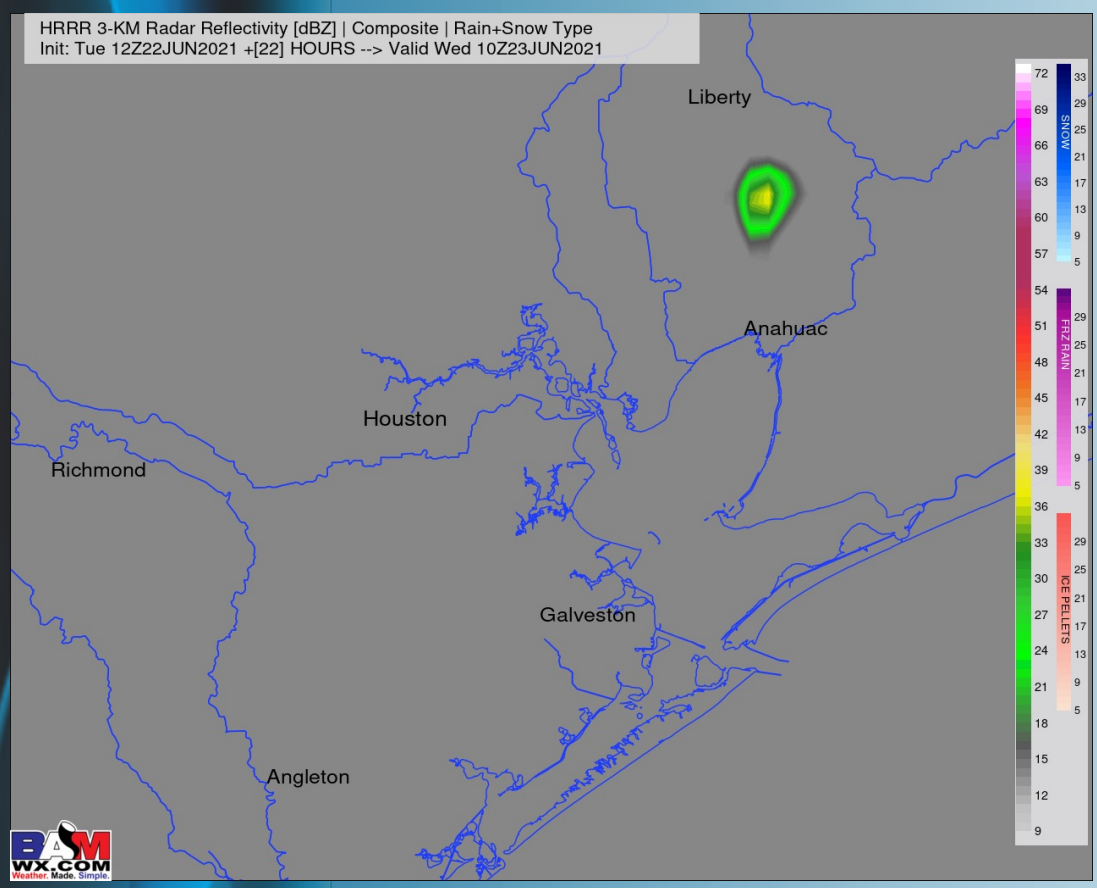
- **High temperatures once again expected to get into the mid to upper 80's F over open waters on WED, warmer in-land.**

- ***No fog is favored Wednesday.***

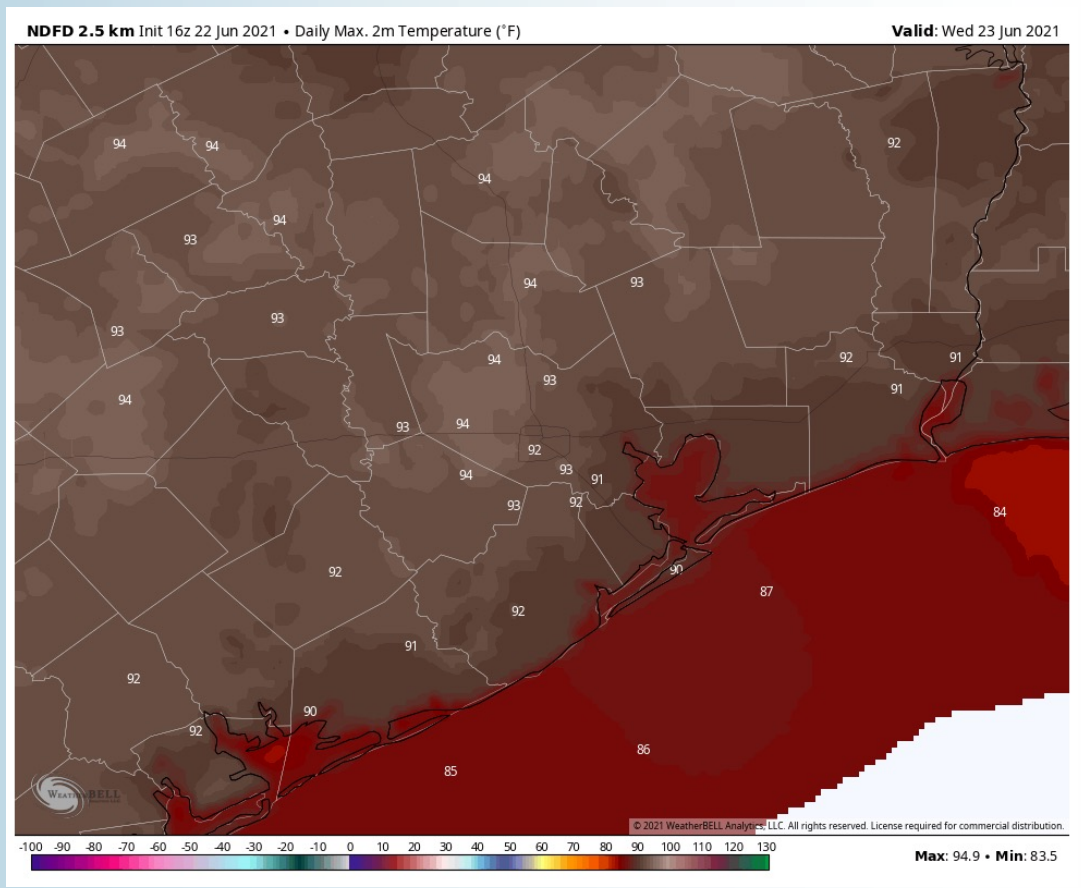
Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)



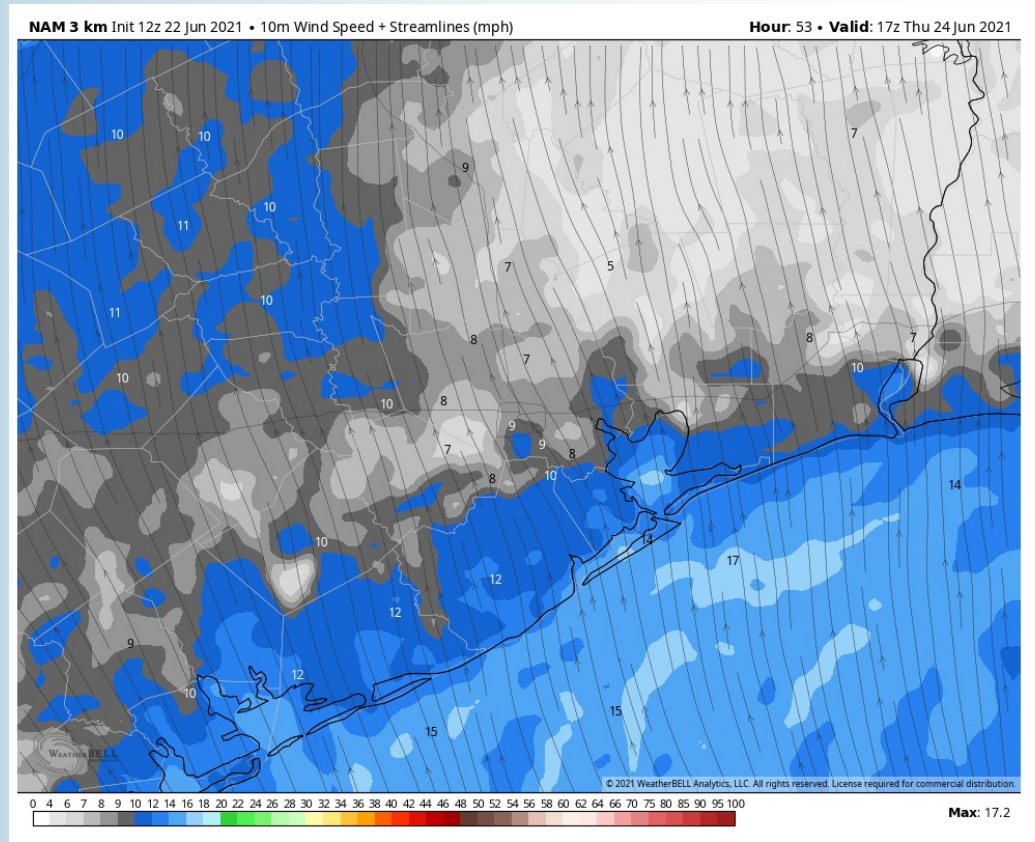
High Temperatures WED



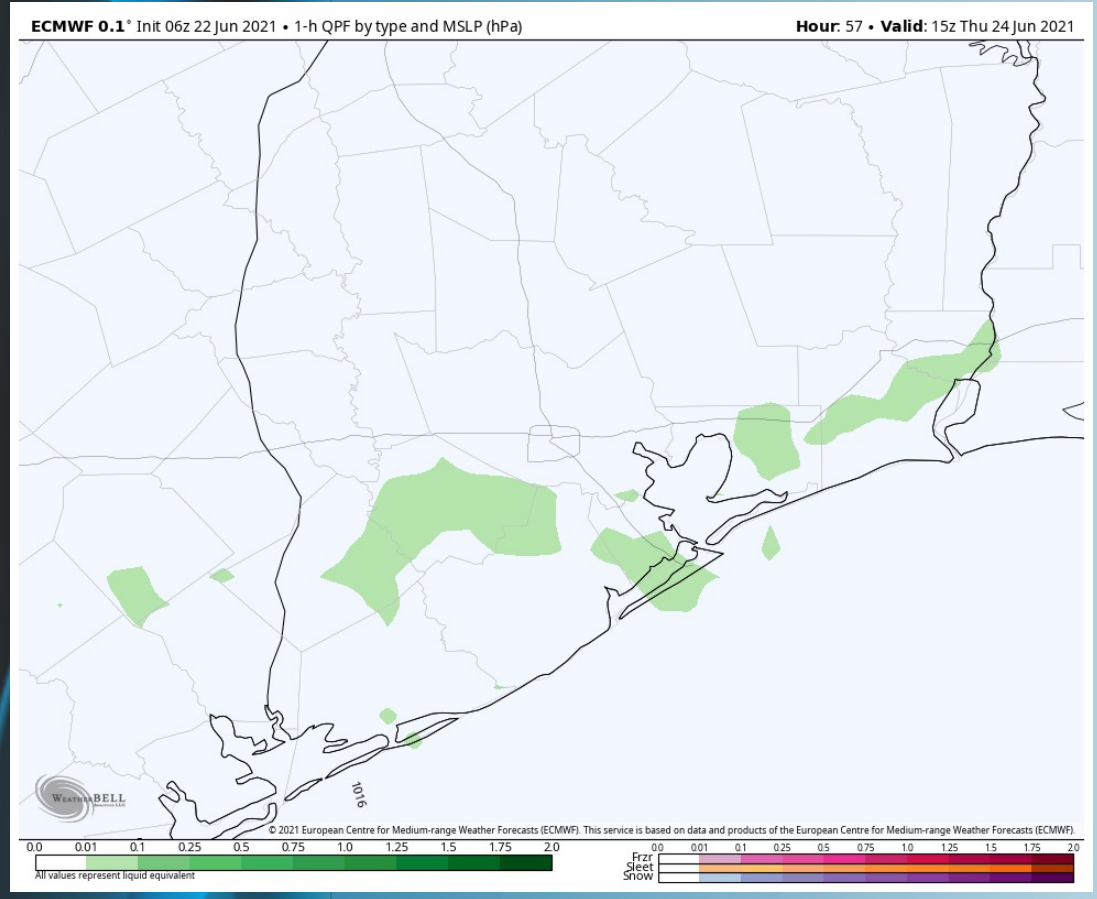
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Overall favoring mostly dry conditions on Thursday, not too different from how Wednesday is shaping up with something isolated in regards to precipitation after sunrise through early afternoon. No immediate big weather concerns here.
- Winds are anticipated to be around 6 – 12 MPH sustained on Thursday.
- High temperatures once again expected to get into the mid to upper 80's F over open waters on THU.
- *No fog is favored Thursday.*

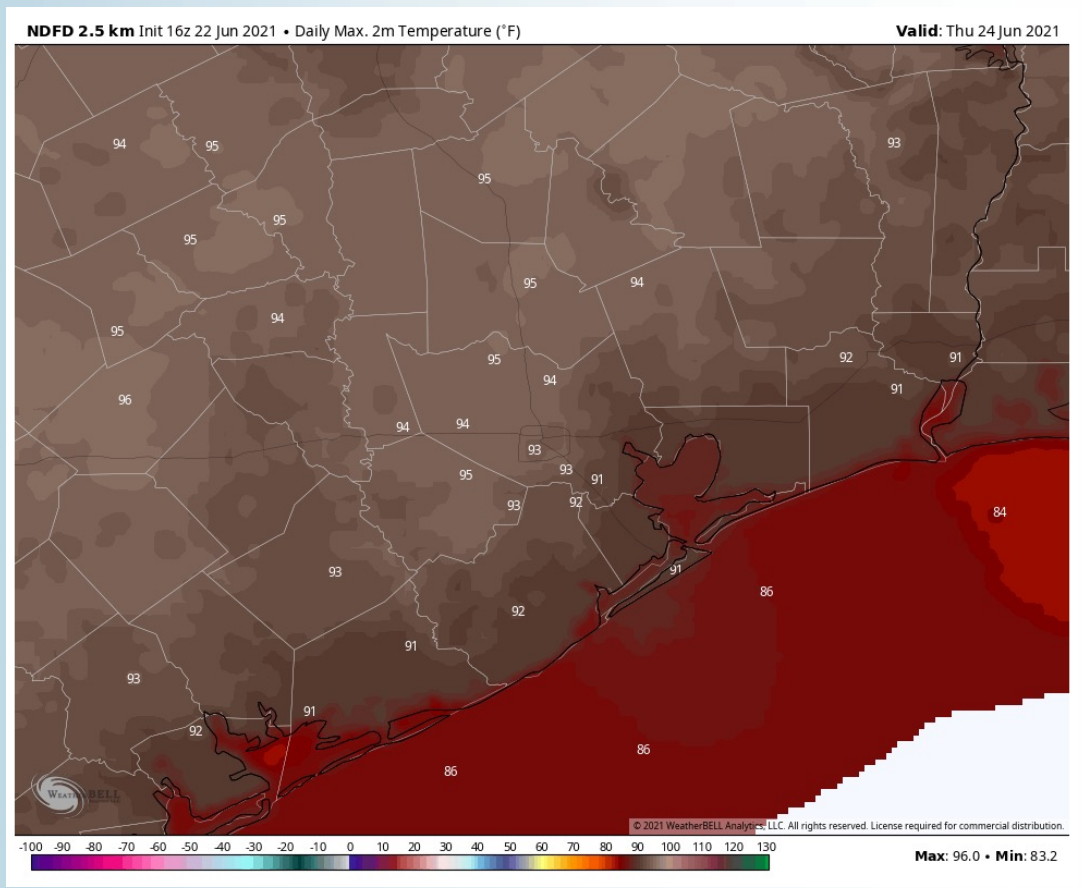
Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (11 AM CT)



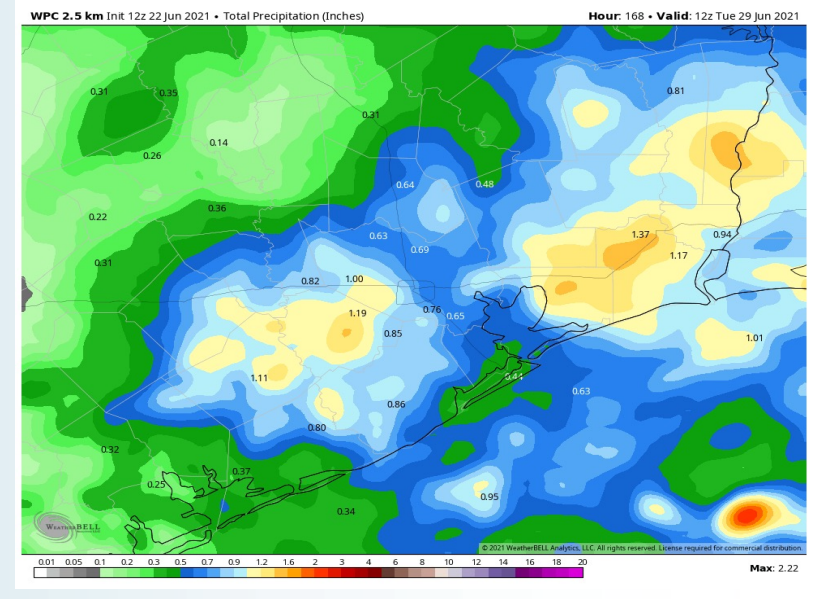
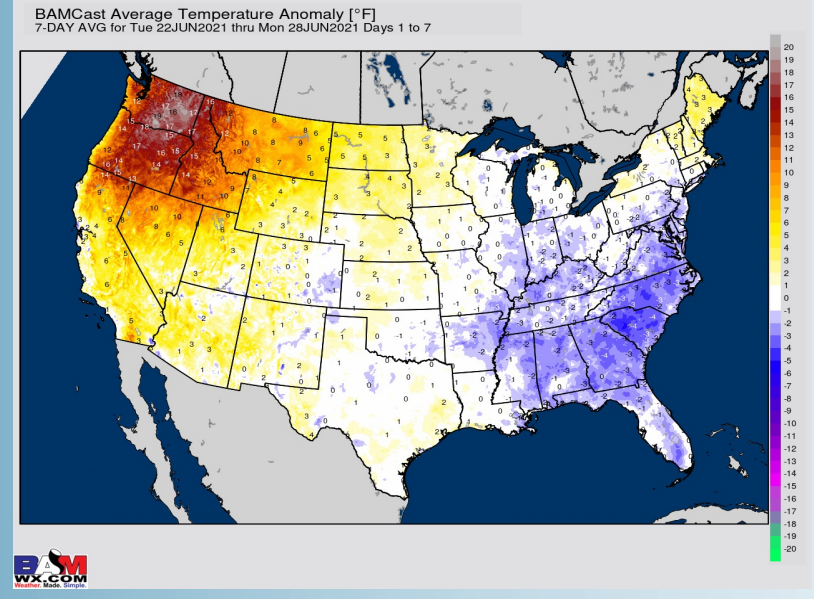
High Temperatures THU



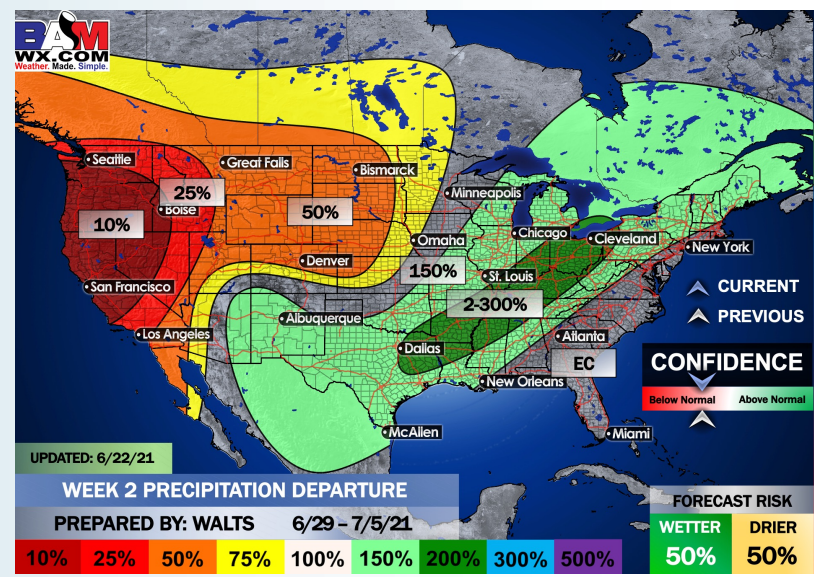
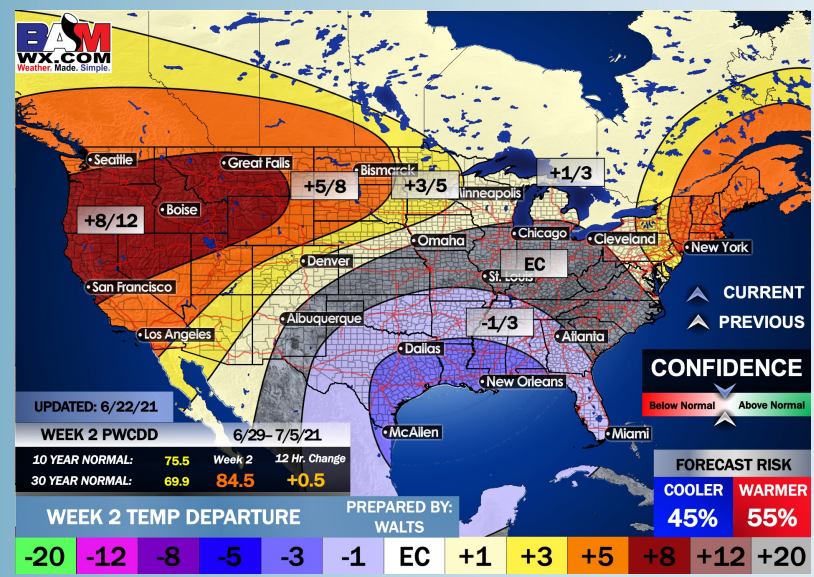
Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temperatures look to run at right about normal the next 7 days. In regards to precipitation, we favor a more active first half of the work week vs the second half...with rain looking to increase again into this coming weekend.
- Week 2 is anticipated turn more active in precipitation, with temps staying overall slightly below normal across the area.
- The weeks 3/4 (1st half of July essentially) period likely features more seasonable to cooler than normal temperatures, while precipitation looks to continue running above normal in this period as well.
