

Tropical Update:




No immediate tropical threats to Houston over the next 7-10 days on our favored weather model guidance.


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- An isolated shower / t-storm cannot be ruled out through the rest of the afternoon, but we are expecting any precip to be rather isolated with plenty of dry time. Into the evening and overnight, drier weather is anticipated.
- Winds are anticipated to be around 10 – 15 MPH sustained that will be generally coming out of the S. Keeping an eye on the 9 PM – 4 AM timeframe for the potential of slightly elevated winds at the boarding station, sustained 13-18 MPH possible. A few localized gusts to 20 MPH cannot be ruled out.
- Lows only look to fall back into the lower 80s today
 - *No fog is favored this evening.*


Sustained Winds (8 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 PM CT)




Low Temps This Evening




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Friday looks to hold a few hit and miss pockets of precip from the daybreak timeframe out through mid-PM. With that said, we continue to think there can be plenty of drier hours throughout the day.
- Sustained winds continuing to come out of the S at 10-15 MPH are favored, with a few gusts to 20 MPH being possible. A few locally stronger gusts will be possible in the heaviest of downpours.
- Friday continues the theme of highs at the boarding station in the upper 80s, low to mid 90s likely for our N stations.
 - *No fog is favored for Friday.*


Sustained Winds (8 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)




High Temps Friday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Saturday looks to offer up another day of spotty, hit and miss pockets of precipitation around the area. Once again another day where there will be several hours of drier weather embedded.
- Winds turn a touch more SSE for Saturday, coming sustained at 10-15 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH possible.
- Expecting similar temps Saturday, highs in the upper 80s to lower 90s across the area.
 - *No fog is anticipated Saturday.*


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)





High Temperatures Saturday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temperatures look to run at right about normal the next 7 days. In regards to precipitation, we favor a more active first half of the work week vs the second half...with rain looking to increase again into this coming weekend.
- Week 2 is anticipated turn more active in precipitation, with temps staying overall slightly below normal across the area.
- The weeks 3/4 (1st half of July essentially) period likely features more seasonable to cooler than normal temperatures, while precipitation looks to continue running above normal in this period as well.
