

# Tropical Update:




**No immediate tropical threats to Houston over the next 7-10 days on our favored weather model guidance.**




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Today will feature a few hit and miss pockets of precip from the daybreak timeframe out through late afternoon. With that said, we continue to think there can be plenty of drier hours throughout the day and precip does not look to be widespread.
- Sustained winds continuing to come out of the S at 13-18 MPH are favored, with a few gusts to 20 MPH being possible. A few locally stronger gusts will be possible in the heaviest of downpours.
- Today continues the theme of highs at the boarding station in the upper 80s, low to mid 90s likely for our N stations.
- *No fog is favored for today.*


## Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Saturday looks to offer up another day of spotty, hit and miss pockets of precipitation around the area. There will be several hours of drier weather between any cells.
- Winds turn a touch more SSE for Saturday, coming sustained at 10-15 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH possible.
- Expecting similar temps Saturday, highs in the upper 80s to lower 90s across the area.
  - *No fog is anticipated Saturday.*


## Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Sunday looks to be the best threat over the next few days for increased precipitation chances. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will be around the area and at this distance, the middle portion of the day looks to hold the highest overall chances for precipitation.
- Sunday's winds will be a bit more out of the SE, sustained 13-18 MPH with a few gusts to 18-23 MPH.
- Sunday's highs look to be in the upper 80s to lower 90s
- *No fog is expected for Sunday.*


## Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)








## Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temperatures look to run at right about normal the next 7 days. Once we work into early next week, we are in favor of a bit more of an active pattern with increased chances compared to the hit and miss chances we've seen the past few days.
- Week 2 is anticipated turn more active in precipitation, with temps staying overall slightly below normal across the area.
- The weeks 3/4 (1<sup>st</sup> half of July essentially) period likely features more seasonable to cooler than normal temperatures, while precipitation looks to continue running above normal in this period as well.
