

Tropical Update:




No immediate tropical threats to Houston over the next 7-10 days on our favored weather model guidance.


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Looking at another day of spotty, hit and miss pockets of precipitation around the area. The best period for potentially slightly more organized activity would come in the 2 – 8 PM hours. Still favor several hours of drier time and will by no means be a washout.
- Winds turn a touch more SSE today, coming sustained at 13-18 MPH with gusts 18-23 MPH possible at the boarding station.
- Expecting similar temps to the past few days, highs in the upper 80s to lower 90s across the area.
- *No fog is anticipated through the day.*


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (8 PM CT)




High Temperatures Today




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Tomorrow looks to be the best threat that we've seen for precip over the past several days. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will be around the area and at this distance - while a few iso showers will be possible near daybreak - the middle portion of the day (11 AM – 6 PM) looks to hold the highest overall chances for precipitation. Lightning will be possible in any cell.
- Sunday's winds look to start out SSE, but then shift a bit more out of the ESE by mid-afternoon, sustained 13-18 MPH with a few gusts to 18-23 MPH. Pockets of precipitation do look to hold the ability to bring a few gusts locally higher.
- Sunday's highs look to be in the upper 80s to lower 90s
 - *No fog is expected for Sunday.*


Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)




High Temps Sunday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Isolated precipitation late Sunday night into Monday morning will be around the area in a very hit and miss nature, but the daytime hours will then increase precip chances. A few locally heavier pulses of rain cannot be ruled out.
- Early Monday morning winds look to turn back more out of the SSE at 13-18 MPH, gusts of 18-23 MPH will be possible.
- Monday we will see a bit of a relax in temps, only expecting mid 80s across the area.
 - *No fog is favored for our Monday.*


Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)





Simulated Radar Snapshot (10 AM CT)



High Temps Monday





Week 1 Forecast



Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temperatures look to run at right about normal the next 7 days. Once we work into early next week, we are in favor of a bit more of an active pattern with increased chances compared to the hit and miss chances we've seen the past few days.
- Week 2 is anticipated turn more active in precipitation, with temps staying overall slightly below normal across the area.
- The weeks $\frac{3}{4}$ (1st half of July essentially) period likely features more seasonable to cooler than normal temperatures, while precipitation looks to continue running above normal in this period as well.
