

Tropical Update:




Tropical activity in the Gulf of Mexico is not anticipated in the next 7-10 days.


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- We are still favoring today to be a drier day. A very isolated shower or two will be possible from ~11 AM to ~5 PM, but there should be plenty of dry time today. Better chance to see something iso pop up near our Northerly stations vs. the boarding station.
- Friday will feature winds coming out of the SW at 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 MPH possible at the boarding station. Winds look to be slightly weaker at our Northerly stations.
- Low to mid 90s will be possible across the area today.
- *Fog is not anticipated for our stations today.*


Sustained Winds (8 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)




High Temps Today




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Saturday is anticipated to be a drier day across the area.
- Winds will overall be pretty light around the area and coming out of the Southwest, 5-10 MPH with a few gusts locally higher at the boarding station.
- High temps for Saturday expected to reach into the upper 80s to lower 90s for our Southerly stations, mid to upper 90s for our Northerly stations.
- *No fog is in the forecast for Saturday.*


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)




High Temps Saturday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Anticipating Sunday to be a dry day as well.
- Winds expected to be 5-10 MPH with gusts locally higher at the boarding station. Winds likely start out the day coming from the WNW before shifting more SW into the afternoon hours.
- Temps look to be similar to Saturday, highs in the upper 80s / lower 90s for Southerly stations, mid 90s for Northerly stations.
- *While fog is not favored for Sunday, going to keep a close eye on Sunday AM for the stations near the 610 bridge for *patchy* fog. Widespread issues are not anticipated, but this threat will be fine tuned in the coming reports.*


Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)





Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)





High Temps Sunday





Week 1 Forecast

Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- A quiet week is in store today with just a few isolated chances for precipitation. Temps will continue to sit near average to slightly above.
- The quiet weather from week 1 ahead looks to bleed into week 2 with below normal moisture risks expected. Temperatures are anticipated to run at to below normal in the week 2 timeframe.
- The weeks 3/4 (first half of August essentially) period likely features more seasonable to cooler than normal temperatures, while precipitation looks to run around normal in this period as well. One thing we will need to keep an eye on will be increasing potential for tropical disturbances heading into the middle part of August (see slide after the intro slide for more details.)
