

Tropical Update:




Tropical activity in the Gulf of Mexico is not anticipated in the next 7-10 days.


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- An isolated shower or two (~20%) will continue to be possible in the afternoon hours before a quieter evening and overnight is anticipated. Any precipitation is still continued to be very iso and most locations are favored stay dry.
- Continue to expect winds coming out of the SW at 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 MPH possible at the boarding station. Winds look to be slightly weaker at our Northerly stations.
- Lows likely drop back into the upper 70s to lower 80s.
- *Fog is not anticipated for our stations this evening.*


Sustained Winds (10 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 PM CT)




Low Temps This Evening




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Saturday is anticipated to be a drier day across the area.
- Winds will overall be pretty light around the area and coming out of the Southwest, 5-10 MPH with a few gusts locally higher at the boarding station.
- High temps for Saturday expected to reach into the upper 80s to lower 90s for our Southerly stations, mid to upper 90s for our Northerly stations.
- *No fog is in the forecast for Saturday.*


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)




High Temps Saturday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Anticipating Sunday to be a dry day as well.
- Winds expected to be 5-10 MPH with gusts locally higher at the boarding station. Winds likely start out the day coming from the WNW before shifting more SW into the afternoon hours.
- Temps look to be similar to Saturday, highs in the upper 80s / lower 90s for Southerly stations, mid 90s for Northerly stations.
- *Latest guidance has reduced the threat of very patchy fog for Sunday morning for our far N stations. We will continue to watch this threat, but we continue to favor no fog.*


Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)

High Temps Sunday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Continuing to favor quieter weather moving forward as we start to feel more the influence of an upper level high pressure system. Thanks to this higher pressure, temps will continue to stay slightly above average for this time of year.



- The quiet weather from week 1 ahead looks to bleed into week 2 with below normal moisture risks expected. Temperatures are anticipated to run below normal as well.

- The weeks $\frac{3}{4}$ (first half of August) period likely features more seasonable to cooler than normal temperatures, while precipitation looks to run around normal in this period as well. One thing to watch into mid-late August is the increased potential of tropical activity.
