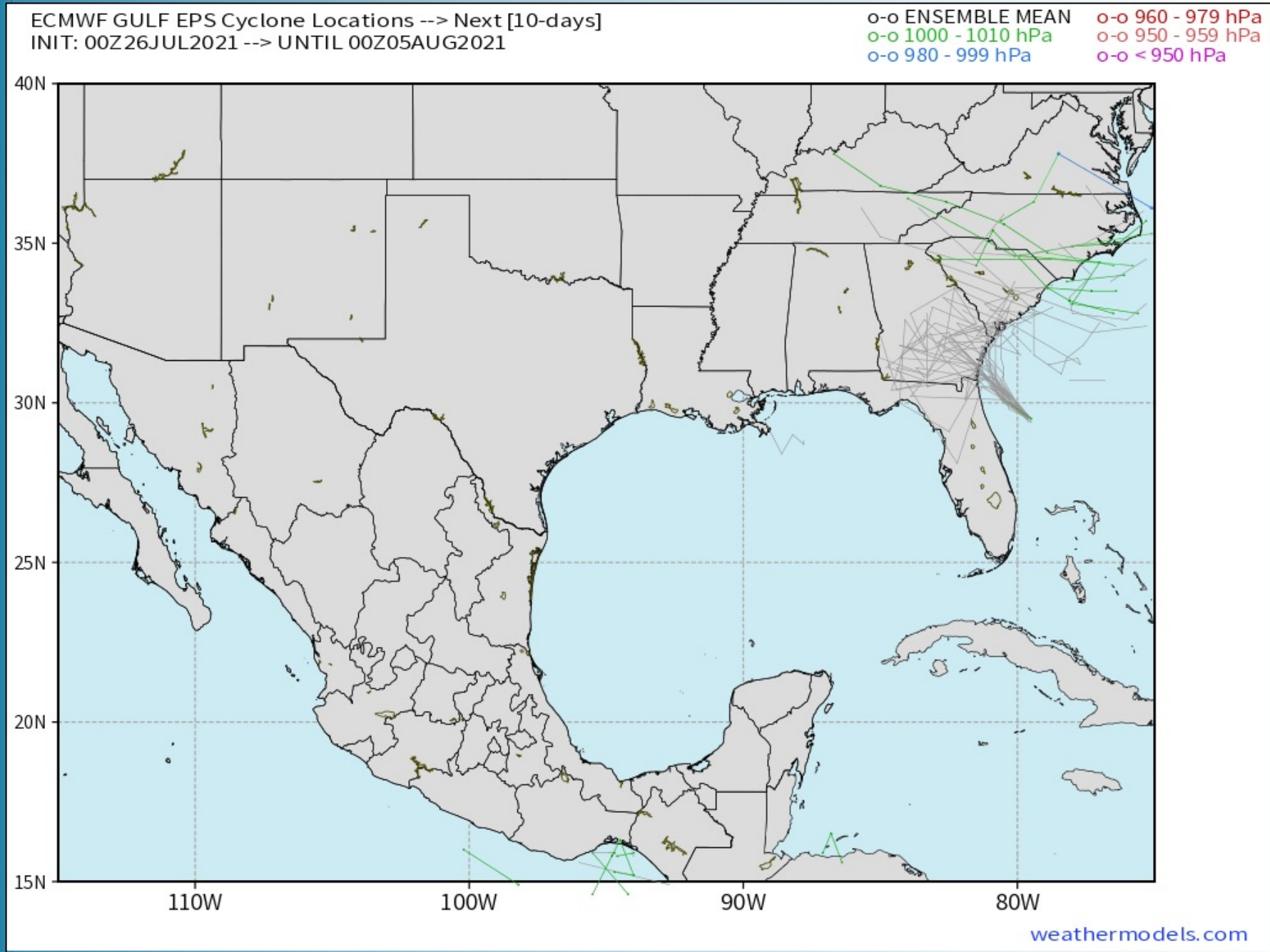

Tropical Update:

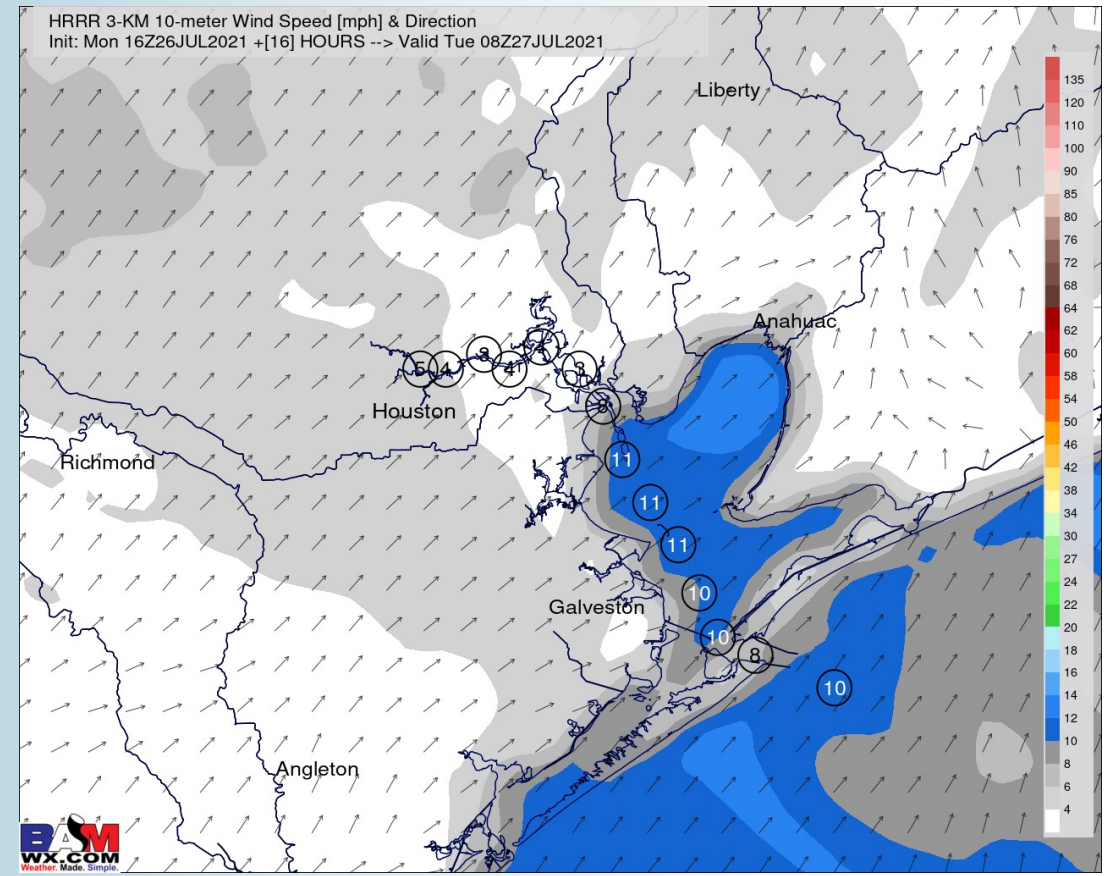


Tropical activity in the Gulf of Mexico is not anticipated in the next 7-10 days.

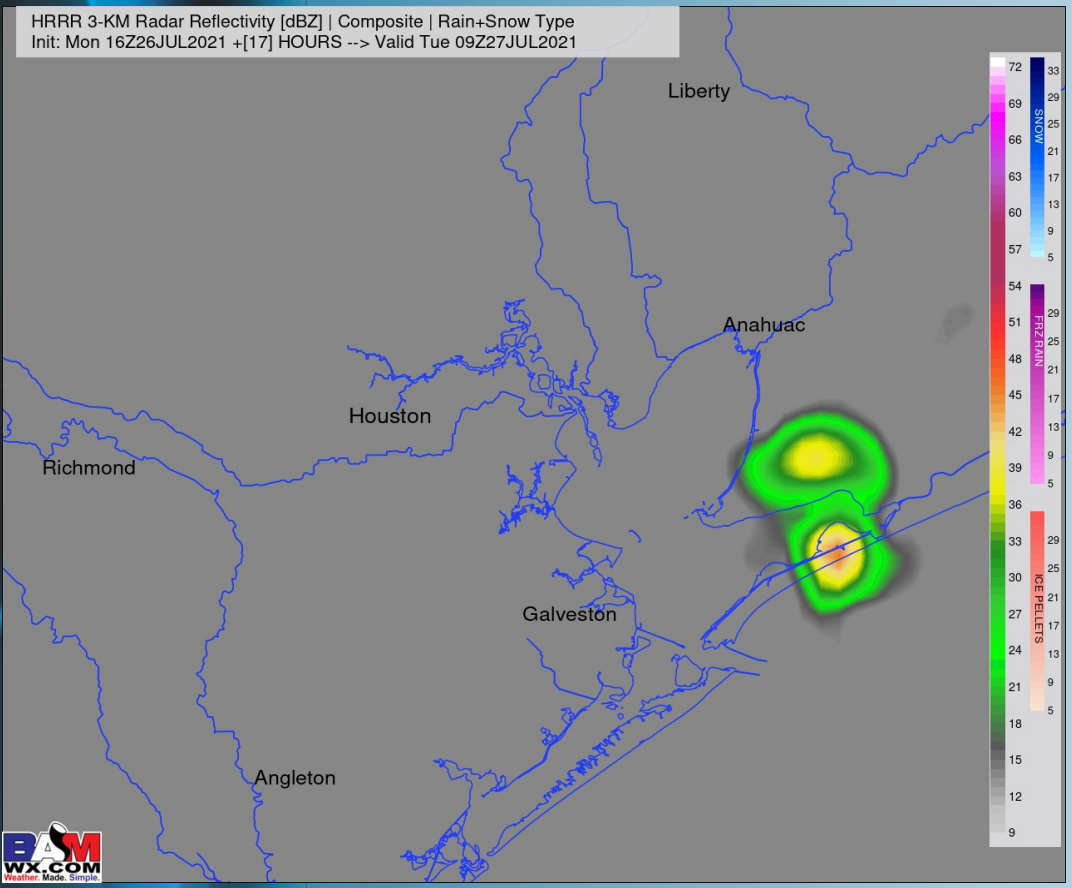
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Continuing to favor dry weather through the evening and most of the overnight across the area. We do think an isolated shower after ~4am CT through daybreak can't be ruled out.
- Winds tonight through tomorrow morning look to generally be out of the SSW at 8-13 MPH sustained.
- Temps linger in the mid 80s over open waters, cooler in-land.
- *Fog is not anticipated today into tonight. Some slightly patchy, lower visibility may be possible along and west of Galveston after 3-4am CT towards daybreak (lower confidence mention).*

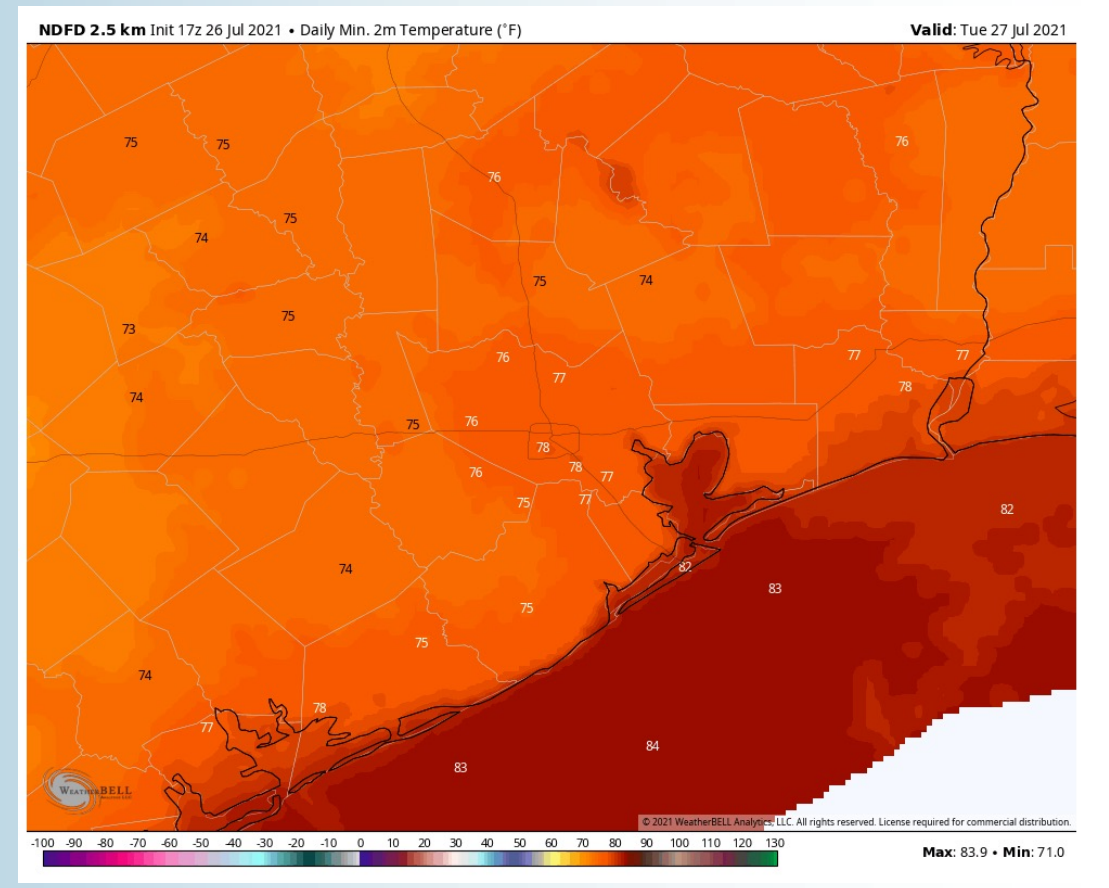
Sustained Winds (3 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 AM CT)



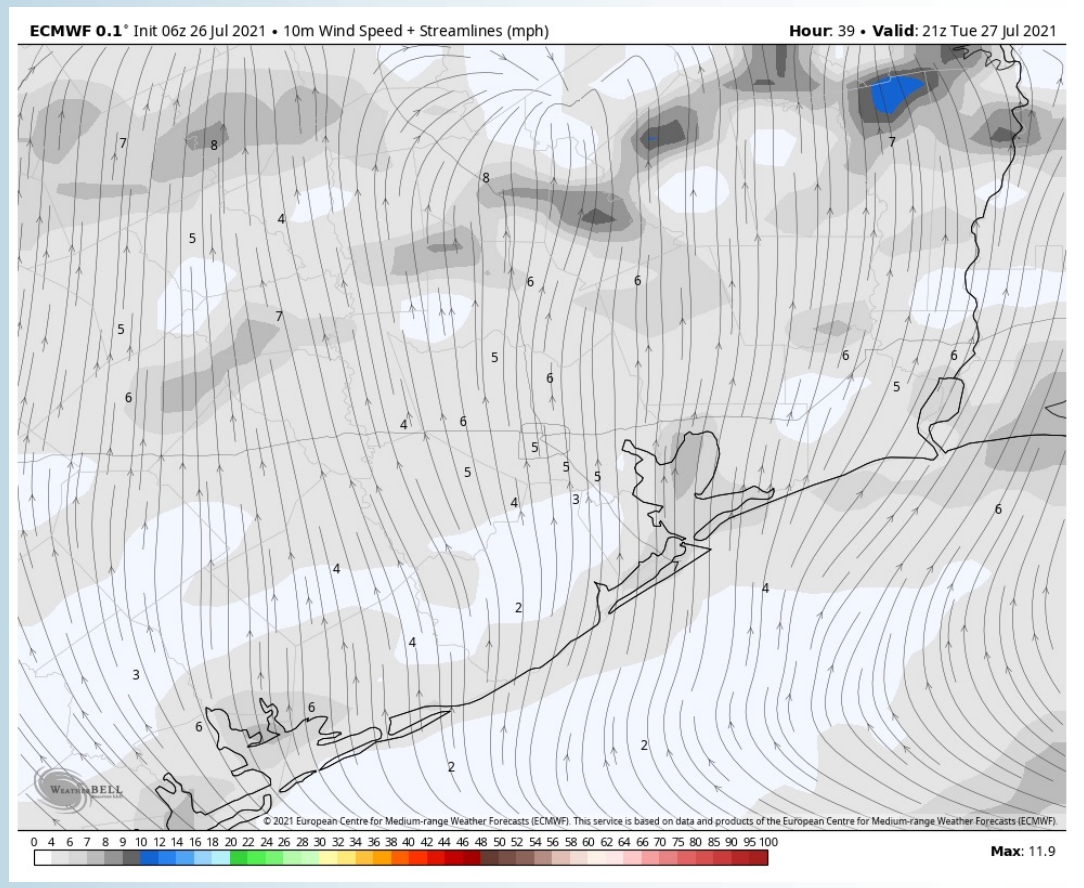
Low Temps Tonight



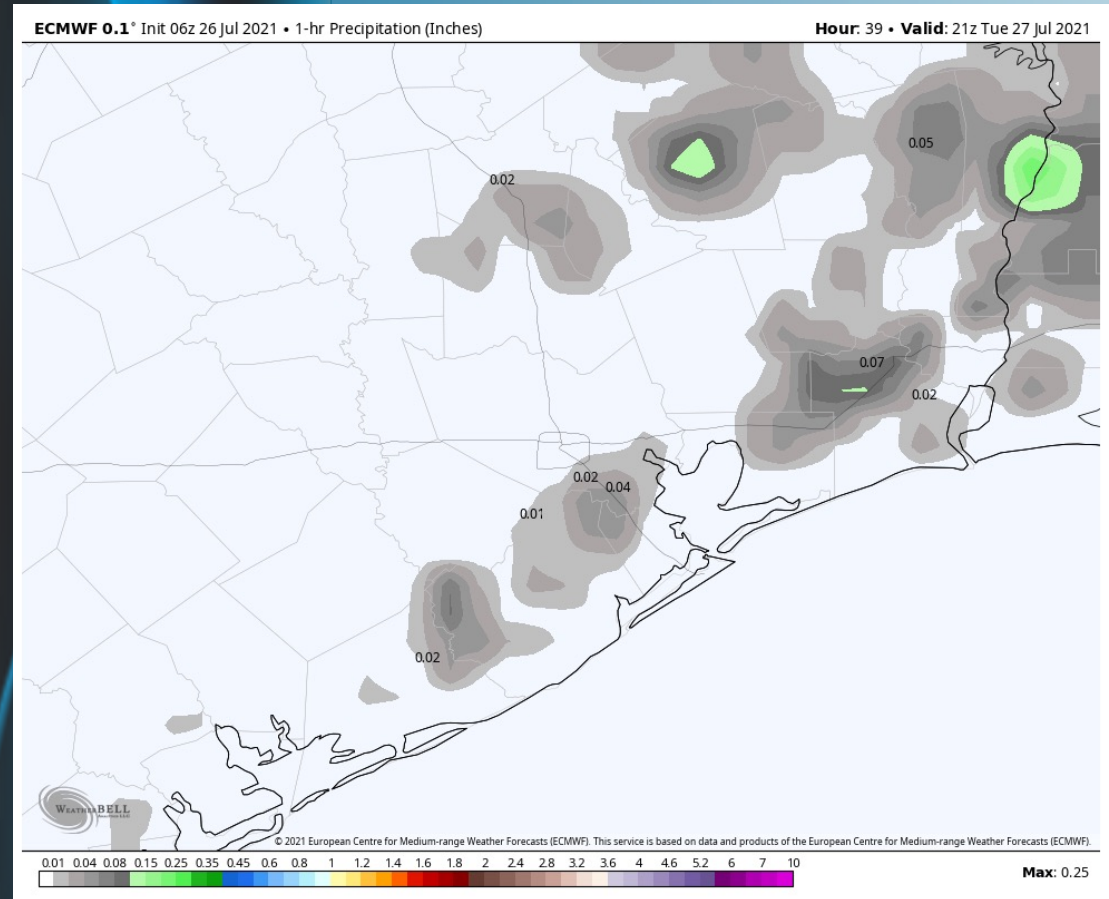
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Tuesday looks to start out dry, but a few very isolated showers will work back into the forecast into the afternoon hours. Low end chances (~20%) as coverage will likely be rather minimal.
- Winds will generally be coming out of the South at 5-10 MPH.
- Expecting a similar setup for Tuesday, highs ranging from the upper 80s near the boarding station to the mid 90s closer toward the 610 bridge.
- *No fog expected Tuesday.*

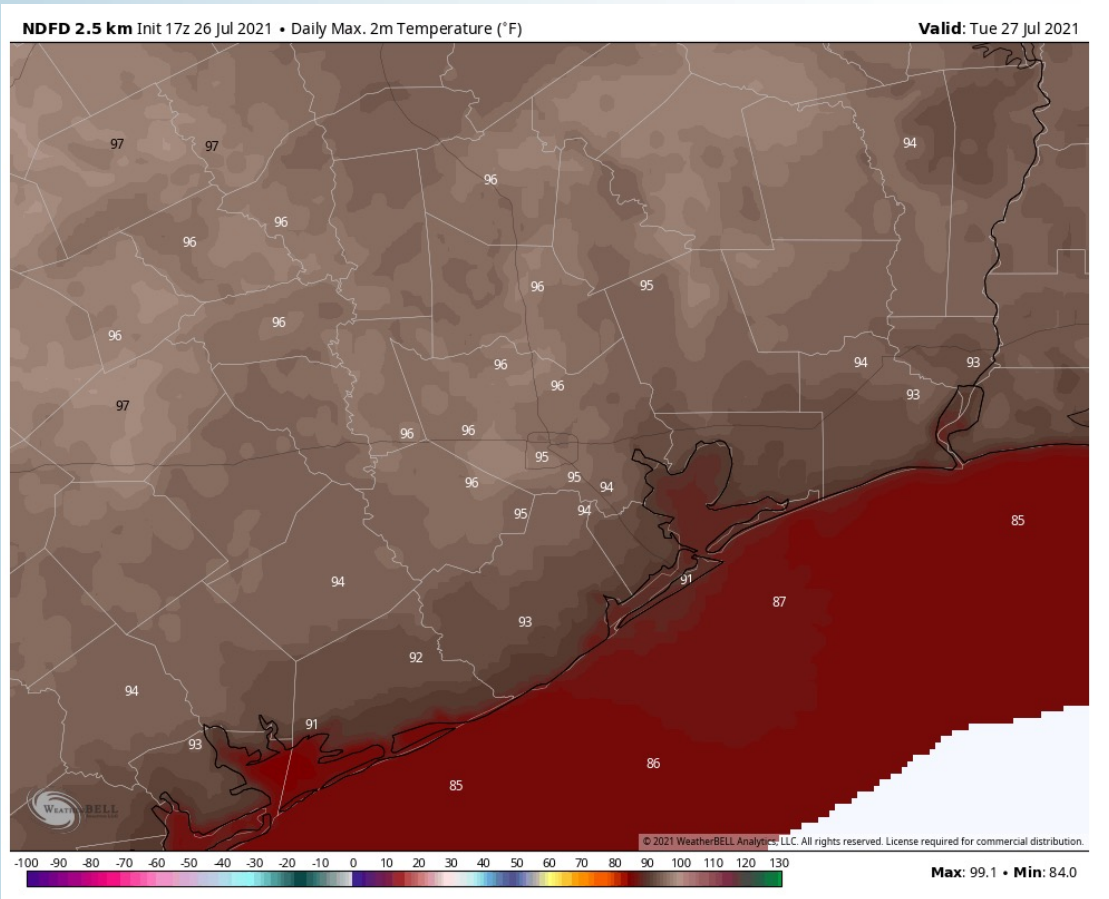
Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)



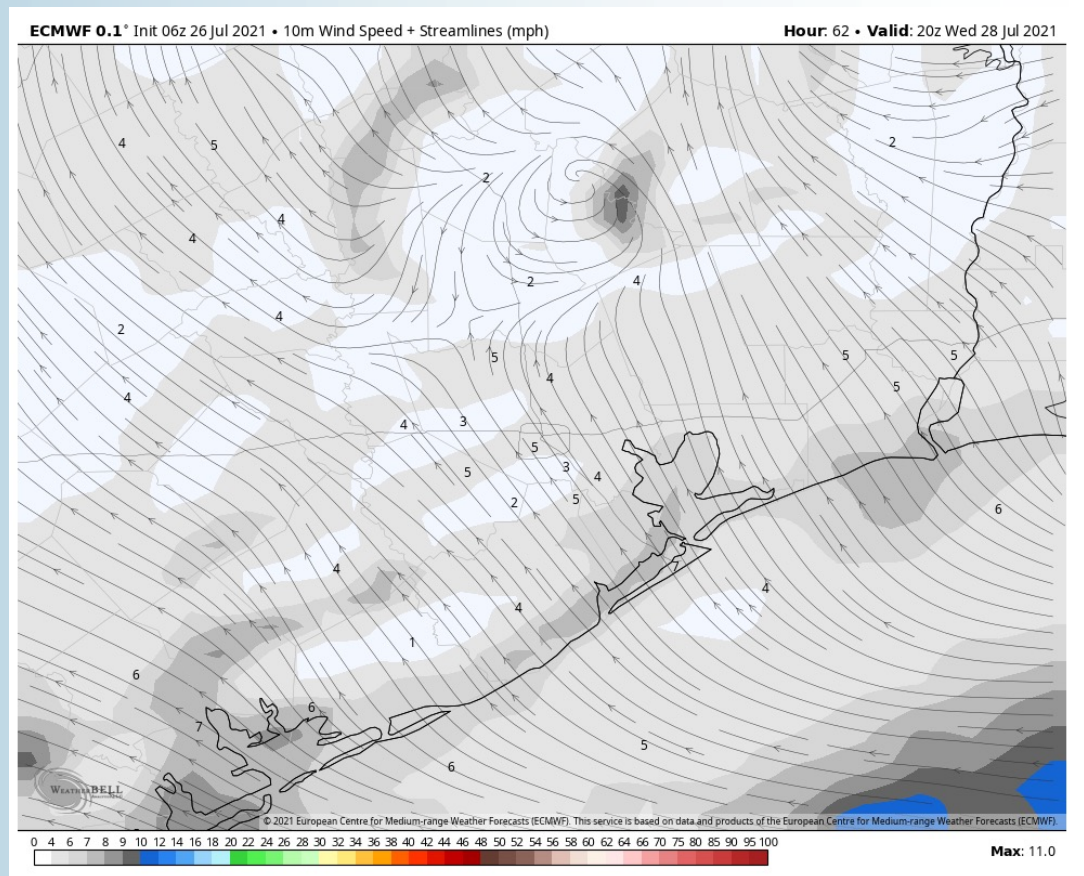
High Temps Tuesday



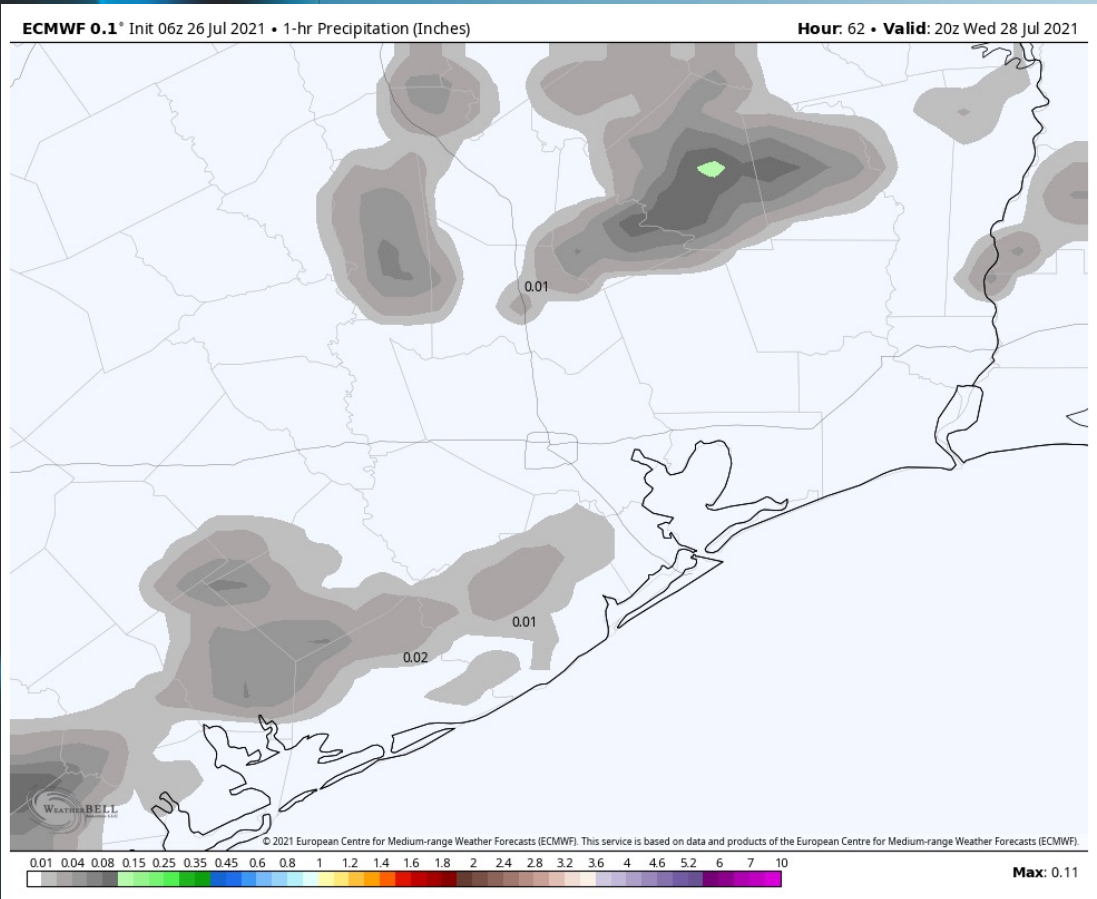
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Wednesday, at this distance looks to overall be a drier day; a 10-20% chance for an afternoon shower can't be ruled out, as well, but not seeing any big impacts right now.
- Winds will generally be coming out of the Southeast at 5-10 MPH.
- Expecting a similar setup for Wednesday, highs ranging from the upper 80s near the boarding station to the mid 90s closer toward the 610 bridge.
- *No fog expected Wednesday at this distance.*

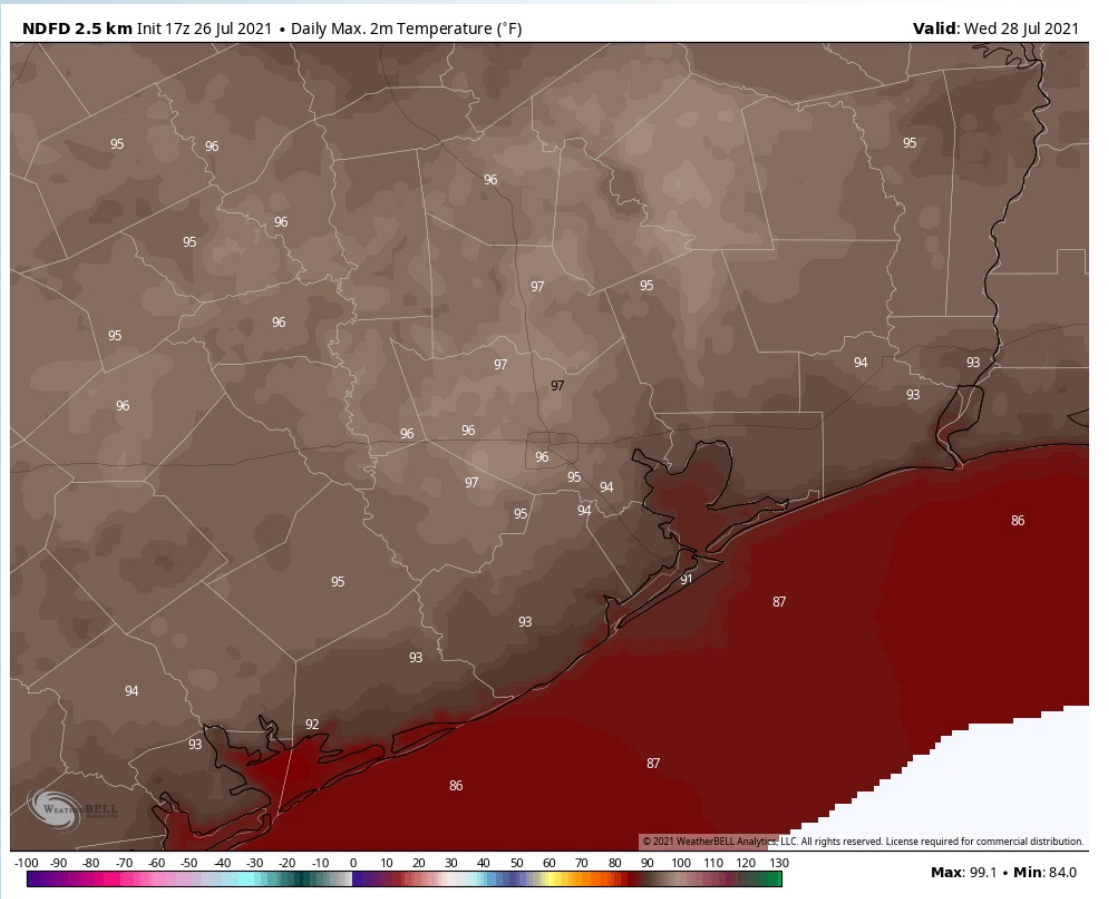
Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)

High Temps Wednesday



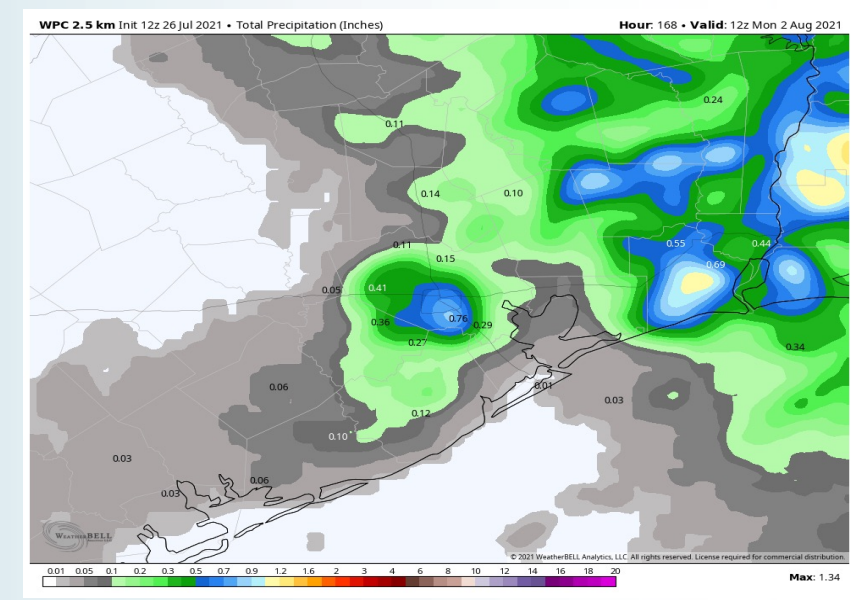
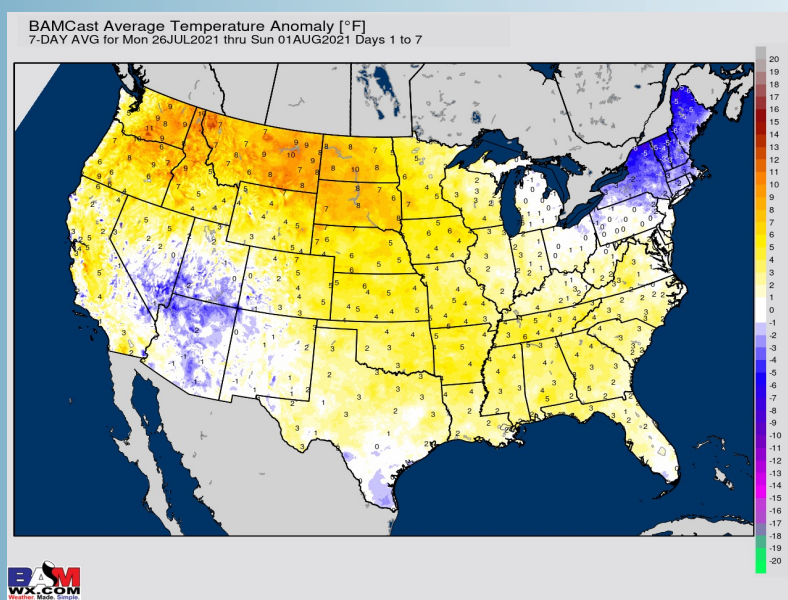
Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Continuing to favor quieter weather moving forward as we start to feel more the influence of an upper level high pressure system. Thanks to this higher pressure, temps will continue to stay slightly above average for this time of year.

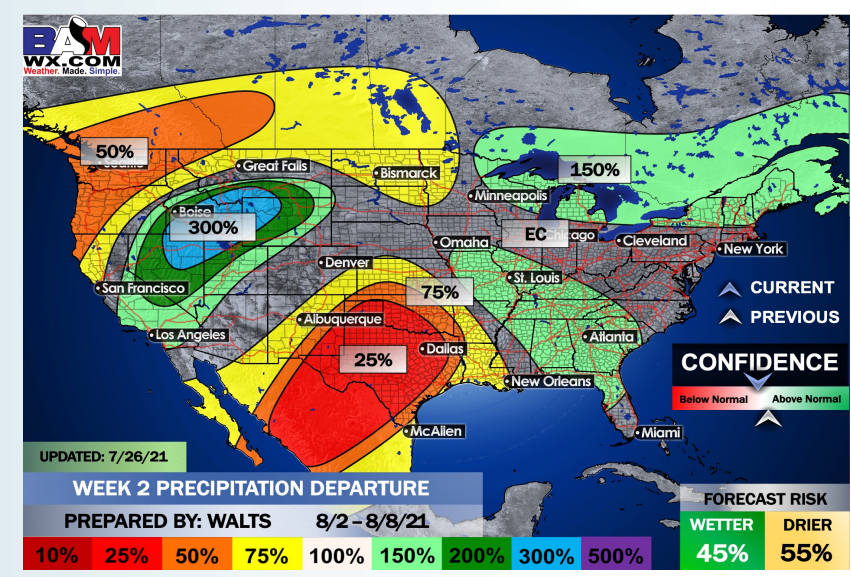
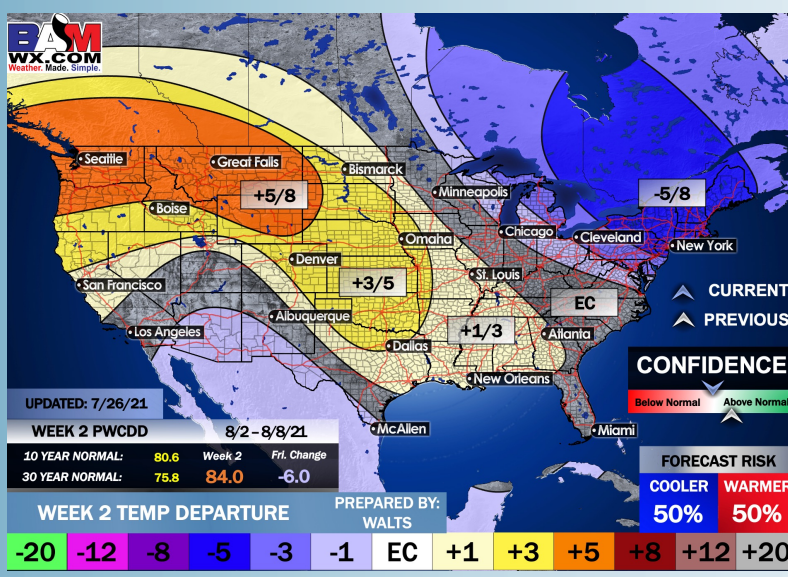
- The quiet weather from week 1 ahead looks to bleed into week 2 with below normal moisture risks expected. Temperatures are anticipated to run below normal as well.

- The weeks ¾ (first half of August) period likely features more seasonable to cooler than normal temperatures, while precipitation looks to run around normal in this period as well. One thing to watch into mid-late August is the increased potential of tropical activity.
