

Tropical Update:




Tropical activity in the Gulf of Mexico is not anticipated in the next 7-10 days.


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- We will continue to favor a ~20% chance of an isolated shower/ t-storm in the afternoon, but coverage and impacts look to be rather minimal. Any precip around the area is anticipated to fade heading toward sundown.
- After a wind shift to SE'ly in the early afternoon hours, winds at the boarding station are anticipated to stay 8-13 MPH sustained with gusts locally higher.
- Lows look to bottom out in the lower 80s for most locations this evening.
- *No fog is anticipated this evening.*


Sustained Winds (9 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 PM CT)




Low Temps This Evening




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Low end isolated shower/ t-storm chances will be possible on the day Friday, primarily coming in the afternoon hours in a very hit and miss fashion.
- Winds start out 5-10 MPH sustained from the SSE before increasing to 8-13 MPH mid-afternoon.
- Highs for Friday look to be persistent, upper 80s to lower 90s for most stations, mid 90s anticipated closer to the 610 bridge/ downtown HOU
 - *No fog is in the forecast for Friday.*


Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)




High Temps Friday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Saturday's rain chances look to be around 20-30% with a few isolated hit and miss pop ups. There will be plenty of drier hours through the day and most locations likely stay dry, but cannot call it a totally dry day at this distance.
- Winds are expected to come out of the SSW for much of the day, sustained at 8-13 MPH with gusts to 18 MPH at the boarding station
- Temps on Saturday will persist in the ~mid 90s for most locations, slightly cooler near the boarding station.
 - *No fog expected for Saturday.*


Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)

- An overall inactive stretch with a few minor chances for precipitation over the next few days. Will need to watch around next TUE for a more pronounced shot associated with a passing cold front. However, data differs on the exact timing.



Temperatures

Temperatures look to average out near normal.



- As we get more into August, the pattern look to pick up a but with better moisture flow off the Gulf of Mexico. Week 2 looks to offer up better moisture risks with below normal temperatures.

- The weeks 3/4 (mid to late August) period likely features more seasonable temperatures, while precipitation looks to run around normal to slightly above normal in this period as well. One thing to watch into mid-late August is the increased potential of tropical activity.
