

# Tropical Update:




**Elsa will continue to not pose a threat of landfall/ impacts for the HOU area. Outside of this system, tropical activity in the next 7-10 days is not favored**




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Scattered precip will continue to be favored through the afternoon hours. Eyeing ~sundown for the best opportunity for precip to gradually wind down. Expecting generally quieter weather for the overnight hours. This afternoon, a few locally heavy downpours cannot be ruled out.
- Expecting calmer winds to continue into the evening, sustained 3-8 MPH (locally higher at the boarding station). Winds will generally be coming out of the south, but may vary in direction some due to the lighter nature. Pockets of locally stronger winds inside precip can't be ruled out.
- Lows fall back into the upper 70s / lower 80s.
  - *No fog is favored this evening.*


## Sustained Winds (9 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (8 PM CT)





## Short-Term Forecast Discussion



- Scattered showers/ storms will be possible once again on Monday as the active weather pattern continues. Rain can be heavy at times
- Winds in the morning expected to be around 4 - 8 MPH sustained out of the NE with winds into the afternoon picking up to 5 - 15 MPH sustained out of the South with gusts of 15 - 20 MPH (weaker winds towards Buffalo Bayou). Isolated stronger wind gust possible under the heaviest cells that can form
- Highs look to be in the upper 80's F on Monday.
- *No fog expected for our Monday.*

## Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Scattered showers/ storms will be possible on Tuesday with the best chances coming in the afternoon. Locally heavy downpours will be possible.
- Winds in the AM may be more out of the E before shifting more out of the South late morning/ afternoon. Winds look to be around 5 - 15 mph.
- High temps look to get into the upper 80's F over open waters.
  - *No fog is anticipated.*


## Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (5 PM CT)








## Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- A stalled out boundary near the HOU area will lead to daily precipitation chances over the next week with a more pronounced tropical airmass in place. This will also lead to temperatures remaining below normal as well.
- The overall pattern remains consistent in the week 2 period with above normal precipitation risk and below normal temperature risk.
- The weeks 3/4 (mid to late July essentially) period likely features more seasonable to cooler than normal temperatures, while precipitation looks to continue running above normal in this period as well.
