

## European Ensemble Tracks




**Tropical activity in the Gulf of Mexico is not anticipated in the next 7-10 days.**




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Scattered pockets of hit and miss precipitation will continue to be possible out through the sundown hours before chances gradually fade into the evening/overnight. A few locally heavier downpours cannot be ruled out.
- Winds will continue coming out of the S/SE at 8-13 MPH across the area.
- Upper 70s / lower 80s anticipated for most locations for evening lows.
  - *No fog is favored this evening.*


## Sustained Winds (10 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 PM CT)




## Low Temps This Evening




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- While a few isolated showers cannot be ruled out on Saturday, several drier hours look possible. The better opportunities for lower end chances (20-30%) likely comes into the afternoon hours.
- A general southerly wind is favored at 5-10 MPH, a few gusts locally higher possible. There does look to be a period from daybreak through mid morning where a SW wind will be possible.
- Saturday will continue temps in the upper 80s / lower 90s for our stations.
  - *No fog anticipated for Saturday.*


## Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A mostly dry day is currently anticipated on Sunday. However, isolated chances cant be ruled out mainly in the afternoon.
- Sunday we will favor winds to come out of the south at 8-13 MPH wit gusts to 15-20 MPH.
- Sunday looks to continue the theme of upper 80s/ lower 90s as highs for most. “Feels-like” temperatures into the lower-to-mid 100’s F look likely.
- ***Not favoring fog for Sunday.***


## Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (5 PM CT)








## Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Daily isolated-to-scattered chances will be possible over the next 7 days. However, mostly dry conditions are anticipated during this stretch. Temperatures look to run near normal.
  
- Temperatures will be slightly below normal during the week 2 timeframe. While there will be some shots of precipitation, the overall risk is that of drier. A non-zero threat for tropical activity exists but this seems quite unlikely as it stands now.
  
- Overall, favoring the second half of August to be on the cooler and drier side. The tropical threat later into August is still possible, however, latest research and model data is trending away from this idea. This is something we will certainly continue to keep an eye on.
