

## European Ensemble Tracks




**Tropical activity in the Gulf of Mexico is not anticipated in the next 7-10 days.**




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A few isolated, hit and miss pop ups will continue to remain possible out through the day today. Into the evening and overnight hours, we'd anticipate drier conditions.
- A general southerly wind is favored at 8-13 MPH, a few gusts locally higher possible to 13-18 MPH at the boarding station primarily overnight tonight.
- Upper 70s / lower 80s will be the forecast for low temps for our stations.
  - *No fog anticipated this evening.*


## Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 PM CT)




## Low Temps This Evening




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Isolated chances will continue to be possible on Sunday in a very hit and miss nature. We continue to expect the overall best coverage to come in the PM hours, but still favor lower end chances ~20-30% for the day. Plenty of dry time will be observed.
- Sunday we will favor winds to come out of the south at 8-13 MPH with gusts to 15 MPH.
- Sunday looks to continue the theme of upper 80s/ lower 90s as highs for most.
  - *Not favoring fog for Sunday.*


## Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)




## High Temps Sunday




**Short-Term Forecast Discussion**

- Monday will be another day of hit and miss precip chances, primarily in the afternoon hours.
- Winds will continue to come out of the S/SE at 8-13 MPH across the area with a few gusts near ~18 MPH possible.
- Monday will feature temps in the upper 80s to lower 90s. “Feels-like” temperatures into the low to mid 100’s F will be possible.
- *No fog is favored on the day Monday.*


**Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)**





**Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)**



**High Temps Monday**





## Week 1 Forecast



## Long-Range Forecast Discussion



- Daily isolated-to-scattered chances will be possible over the next 7 days. However, mostly dry conditions are anticipated during this stretch. Temperatures look to run near to slightly above normal.

## Week 2 Forecast



- Temperatures will be slightly below normal during the week 2 timeframe. While there will be some shots of precipitation, the overall risk is that of drier than normal. A non-zero threat for tropical activity exists but this seems quite unlikely as it stands now.

## Weeks 3/4 Forecast



- Overall, favoring the second half of August to be on the cooler and drier side. The tropical threat later into August is still possible, however, latest research and model data is trending away from this idea. This is something we will certainly continue to keep an eye on.
