

European Ensemble Tracks




Increasing potential for a tropical cyclone in the Eastern Gulf of Mexico/East Coast in about a week. Right now model consensus is well east more towards Florida but this will be worth watching the next few days.


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Monday will be another day of hit and miss precip chances, beginning late morning into the afternoon hours. An isolated downpour early this morning can't be ruled out. Coverage along with percentages will continue to remain on the lower side ~20-30%.
- Winds will continue to come out of the SSE at 10-15 MPH across the area with a few gusts 15-20 MPH possible. Locally stronger wind gusts with a storm will be possible.
- Monday will feature temps in the upper 80s to lower 90s.
 - **No fog is favored on the day Monday.**


Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (11 AM CT)




High Temps Monday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A few isolated, hit and miss pop ups will continue to remain in the forecast throughout the day Tuesday. Into the evening and overnight hours, we'd anticipate drier conditions as daytime heating is lost to fuel pop ups.
- A general southerly wind is favored at 8-13 MPH, a few gusts locally higher possible to 13-18 MPH at the boarding station.
- Temps Tuesday will be very similar to the past several days, upper 80s over Gulf waters, mid 90s closer to downtown Houston.
 - *No fog is expected Tuesday.*


Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)




High Temps Tuesday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A weak wave may try to move through with some scattered showers or storms late morning/early afternoon Wednesday. Otherwise, an isolated pop up in the PM is possible with more dry time than wet.
- Winds will generally be sustained at 8-13 MPH with gusts to 15 MPH from the SSE.
- High temperatures once again will be in the low-mid 90s inland and upper-80s over water.
- *Not favoring fog Wednesday.*


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)





High Temps Wednesday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Daily isolated-to-scattered chances will be possible over the next 7 days with typical popups along the sea breeze as it moves inland. However, mostly dry conditions are anticipated during this stretch. Temperatures look to run near to slightly above normal.
- Temperatures will be slightly below normal during the week 2 timeframe. While there will be some shots of precipitation, the overall risk is that of drier than normal. A non-zero threat for tropical activity exists but this seems quite unlikely as it stands now.
- Overall, favoring the second half of August to be on the cooler and drier side. The tropical threat later into August is still possible, however, latest research and model data is trending away from this idea. This is something we will certainly continue to keep an eye on.
