

Tropical Update:

Multi-Model Tracks




We are confident that Tropical Depression Fred will move North into the Florida Panhandle through early next week. We now turn our attention to just West of the Lesser Antilles for a potential tropical disturbance to develop. There is a lot of uncertainty with exact track of this system as we are about 7-10 days before it even reaches the Gulf of Mexico. ***Current forecast favors the track of this system to work closer to Florida rather than the Western Gulf, but this is at least something to keep an eye on.***


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Showers and storms have lined up along the coast and will slowly move inland throughout the rest of the afternoon. Showers and storms will continue in an isolated fashion throughout the evening hours.**
- **Winds will remain from the SSE at about 5-10mph. Gusts up to 20 mph can't be ruled out with any pop-up shower or storm.**
- **Low temperatures tonight will drop into the mid 70s inland and upper 70s towards the coastline.**
- ***No fog is expected Tonight.***


Wind Speeds (9 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 PM CT)




Tonight's Low Temps




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A few isolated showers and storms are possible during the late afternoon hours, especially inland. Greatest chance looks to be late Saturday heading into the overnight hours.
- Winds will be light from the NE at 0-5 MPH during the morning and early afternoon hours. Winds will shift during the afternoon to the SSE at 8-13 MPH with gusts up to 20 MPH with any thunderstorms that do develop
- High temperatures will be in the mid 90s inland and mid to upper 80s closer to the coastline
 - *Not favoring fog on Saturday.*


Wind Speeds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)




High Temps Saturday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A few showers and storms are possible once again on Sunday as a stronger wave of energy moves into the area. Heavy downpours could lead to reduced visibility.
- Winds will continue to come out of the SSE at 0-5 MPH across the area with a few gusts 20 MPH possible with any thunderstorm.
- High temps will be in the mid 90s inland and upper 80s towards the coastline.
 - *No fog is favored on Sunday.*


Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)





High Temps Sunday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Isolated showers and storms will continue to pop-up through much of this weekend and into next week. Some storms may bring heavy rainfall and gusty winds. Best chance for precipitation comes during the afternoon hours when the most energy/instability is present.
- Cooler than normal temperatures and normal chances to see average precipitation risks look to be present as we head into the 3rd week of August.
- Heading later into August, we still favor overall more of a pattern suited for below average temps, but with the best tropical activity right now looking more centered at the East Coast, we may verify a bit drier. This is the time period where we would anticipate an increase in tropical activity across the Atlantic.
