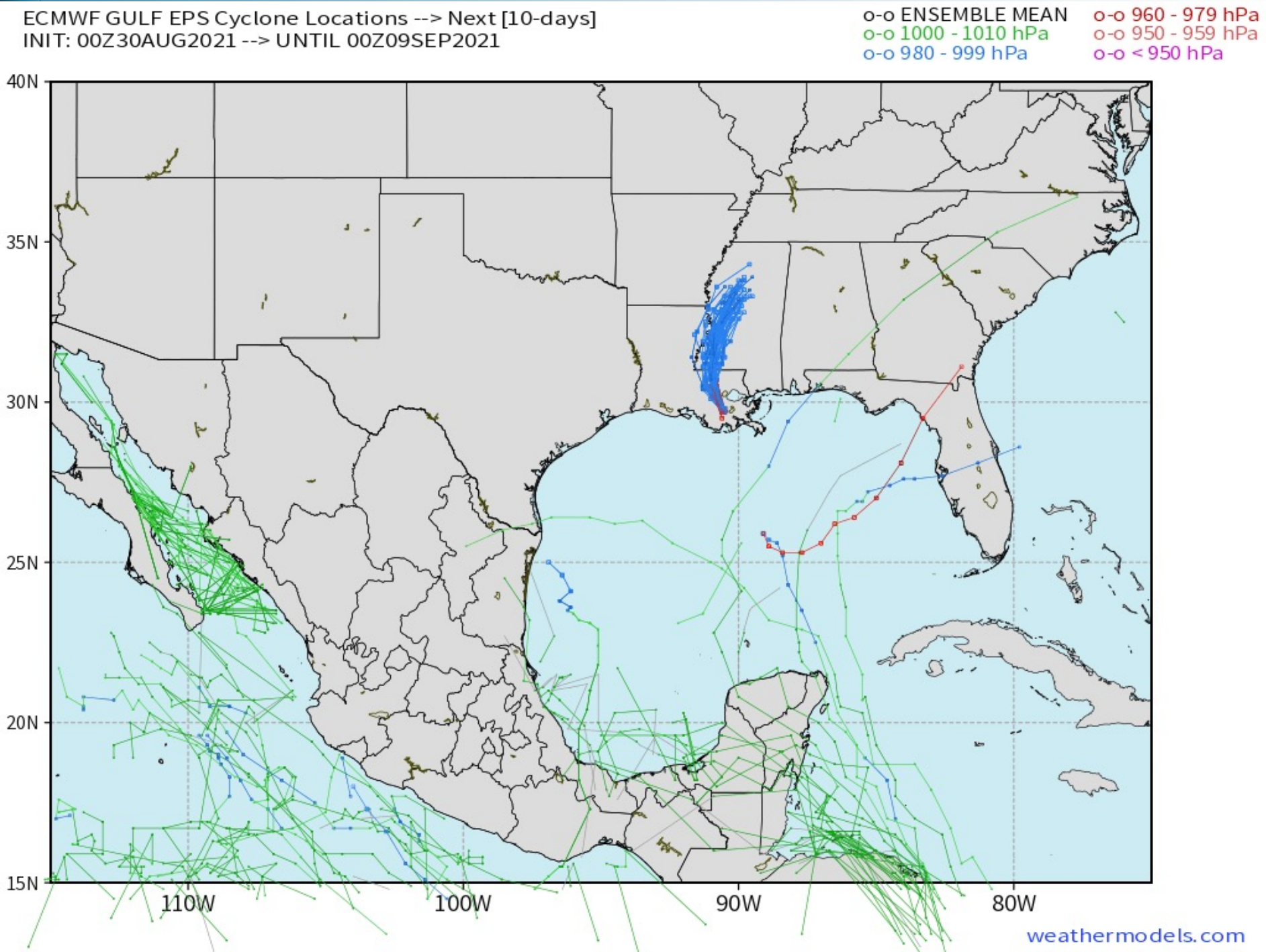

**Ida continues to slowly make its trek north further into the Deep South this morning. No impacts to Houston are expected as it does so. Additional tropical activity in the Gulf of Mexico is not anticipated in the next 7-10 days.**



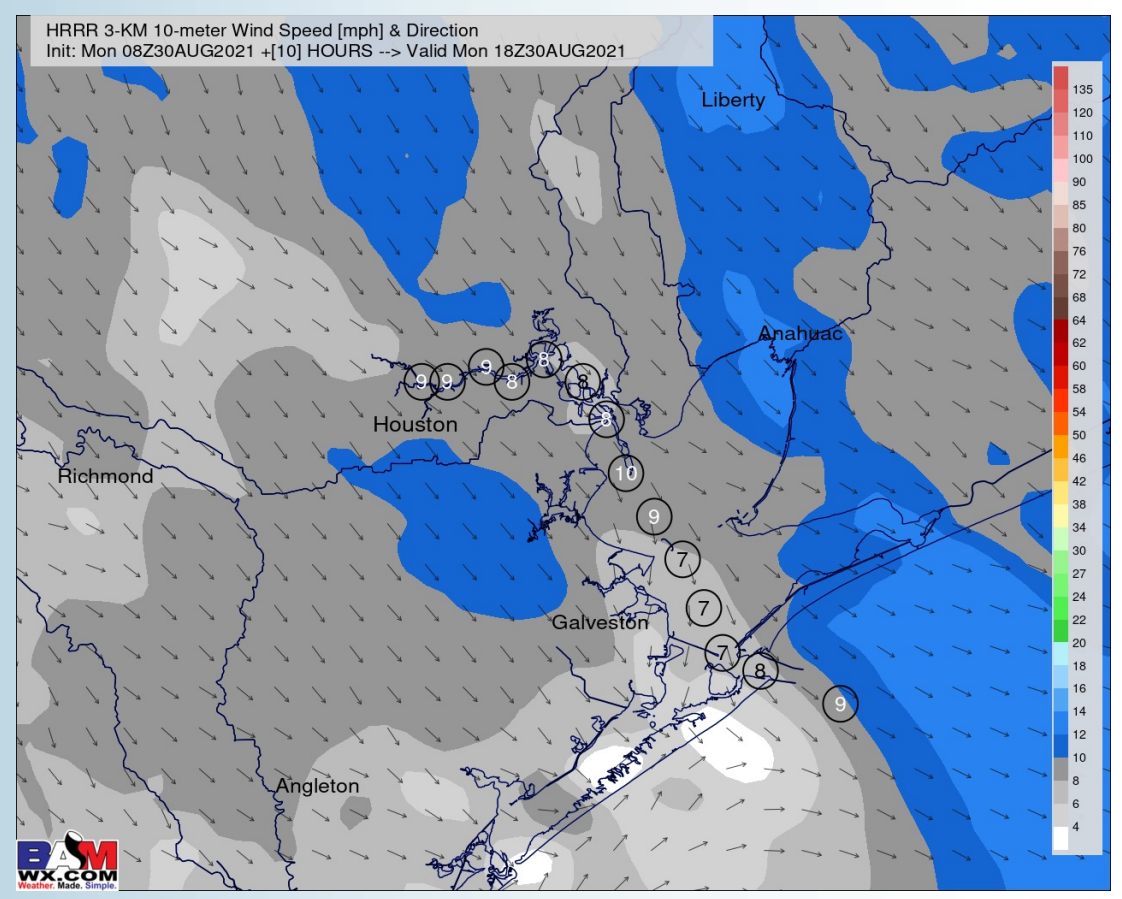




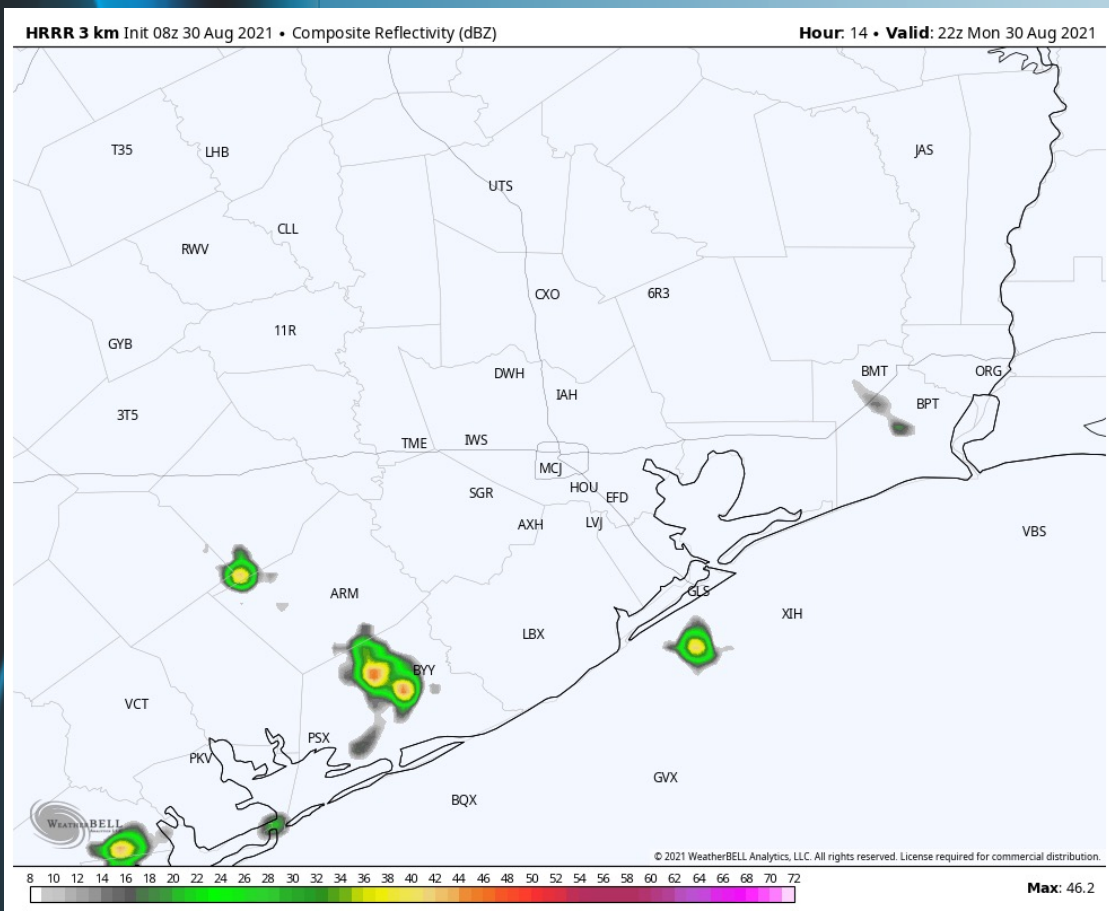
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Today looks to have some isolated chances for some rain mostly after 5PM going into midnight hours. At this distance precip pockets look to be less numerous than what we have seen in the past few days.
- Winds for much of today look to be out of the NW at 10-15 MPH sustained, shifting to a more SW flow in late evening/night hours.
- Today's highs look to sit in the mid to upper 90s especially towards HOU.
  - *No fog anticipated today to tonight.*

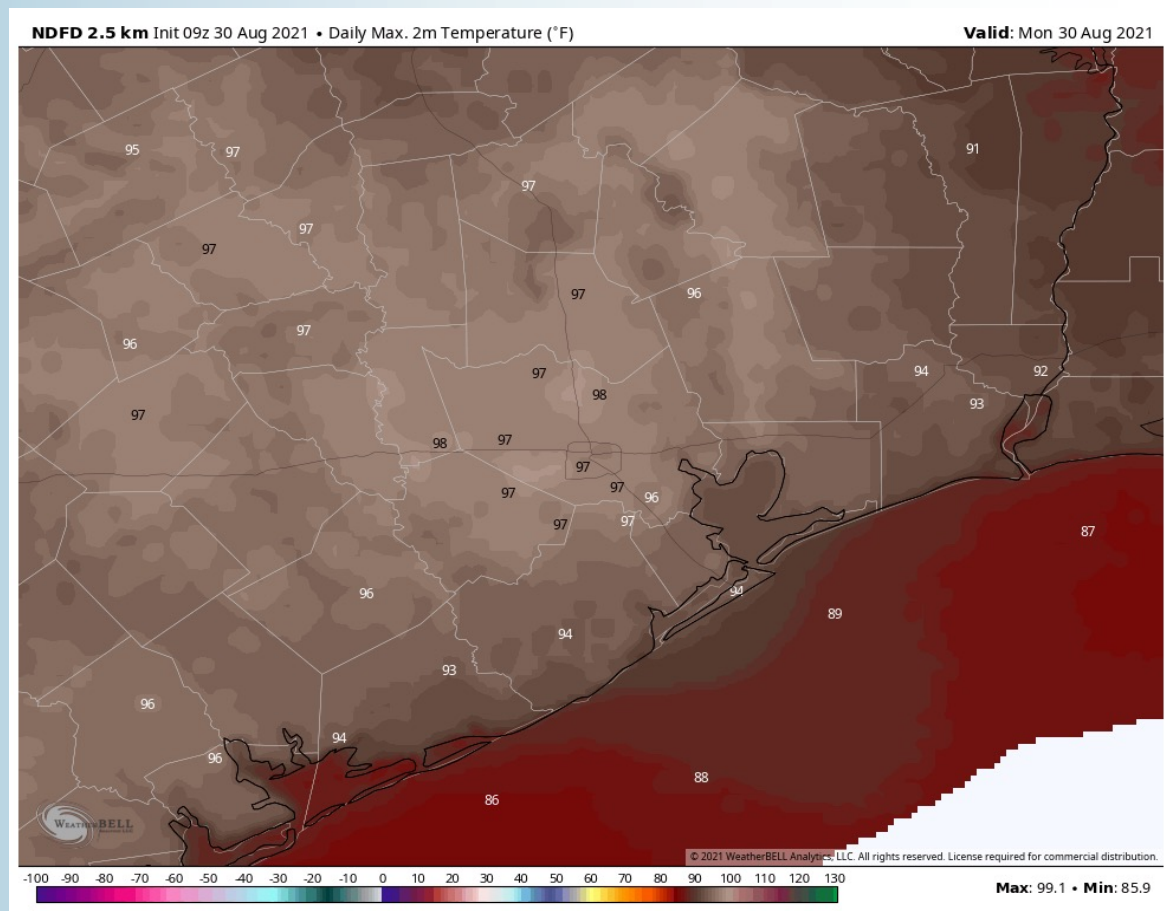
## Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)

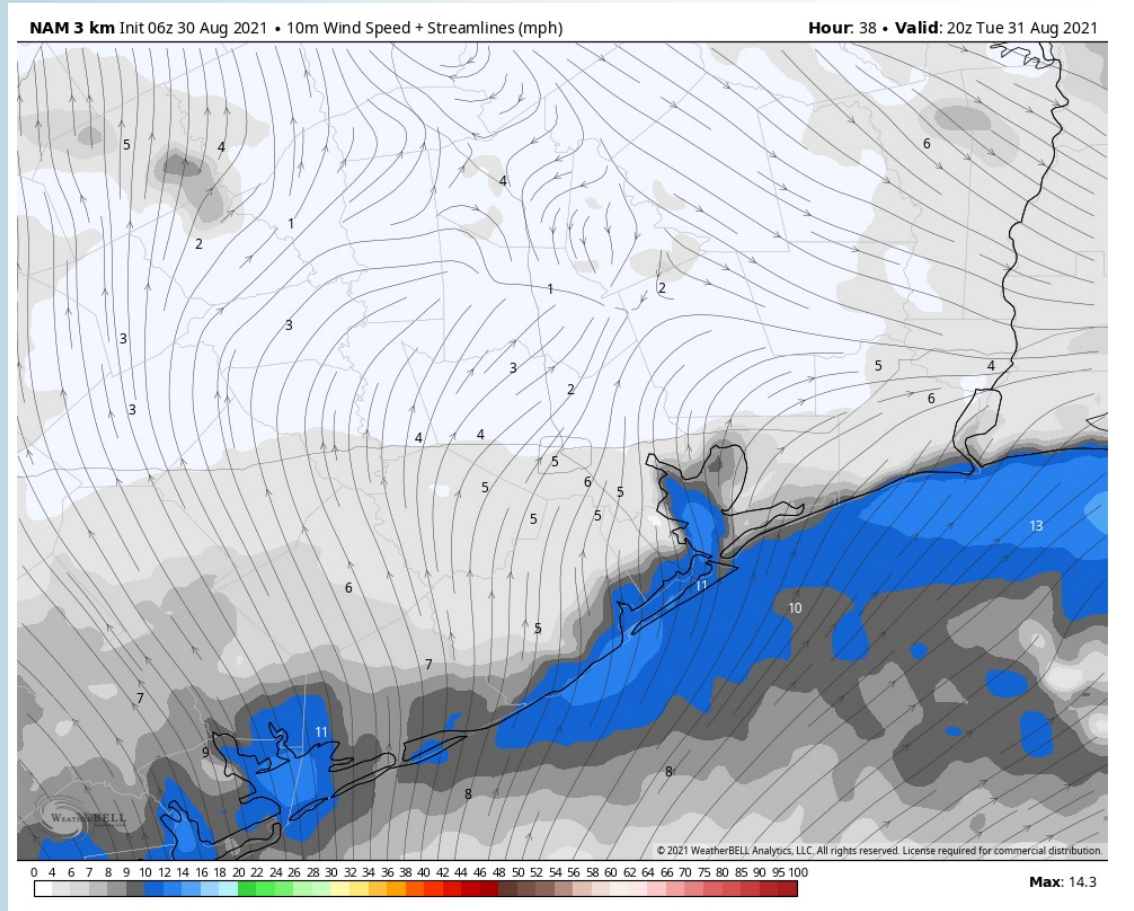




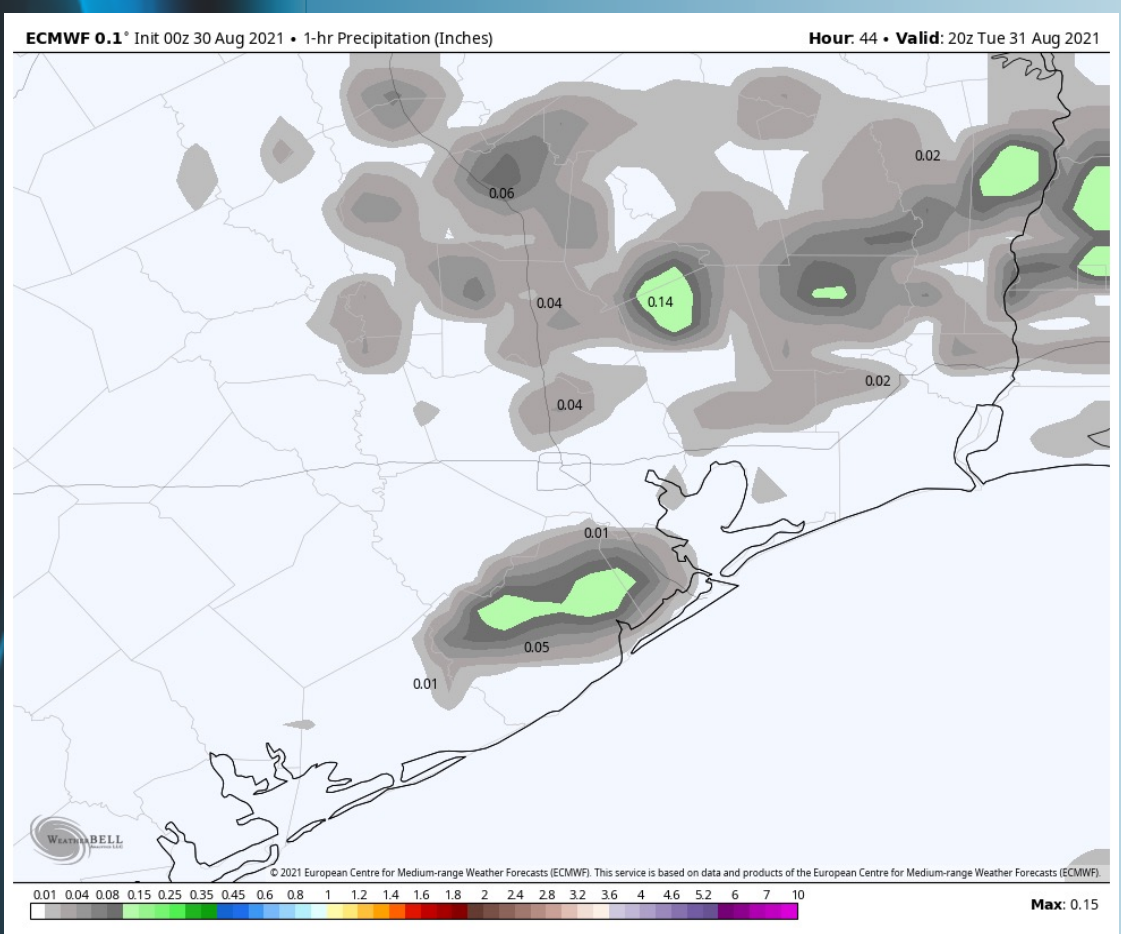
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A small chance for precip in Tuesday AM, but slightly better chances for isolated showers and a pop-up storm come in the PM as daytime heating increases.
- Winds Tuesday look to be coming out of the SW at 8-14 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH possible at the boarding station.
- Highs for Tuesday look to be in the mid-90s.
  - *Currently not favoring fog for Tuesday.*

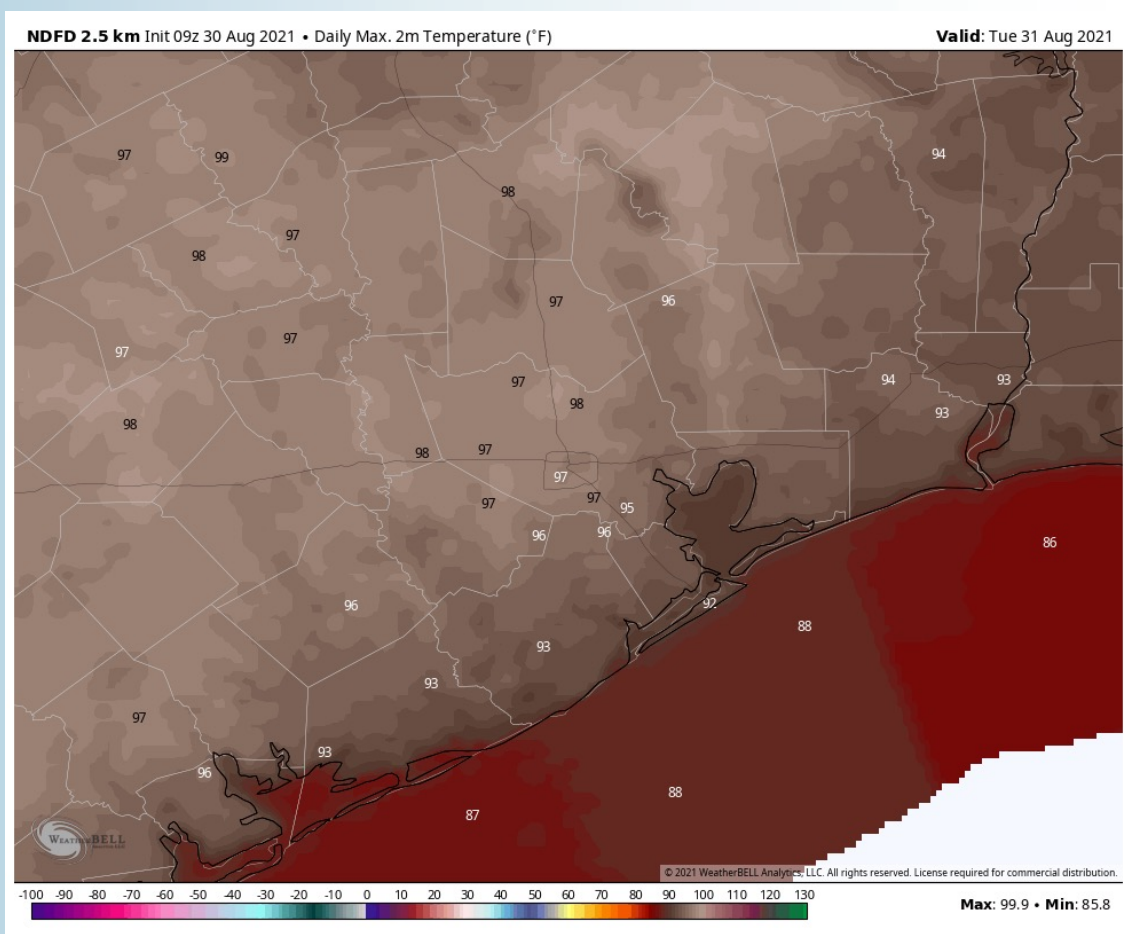
## Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)

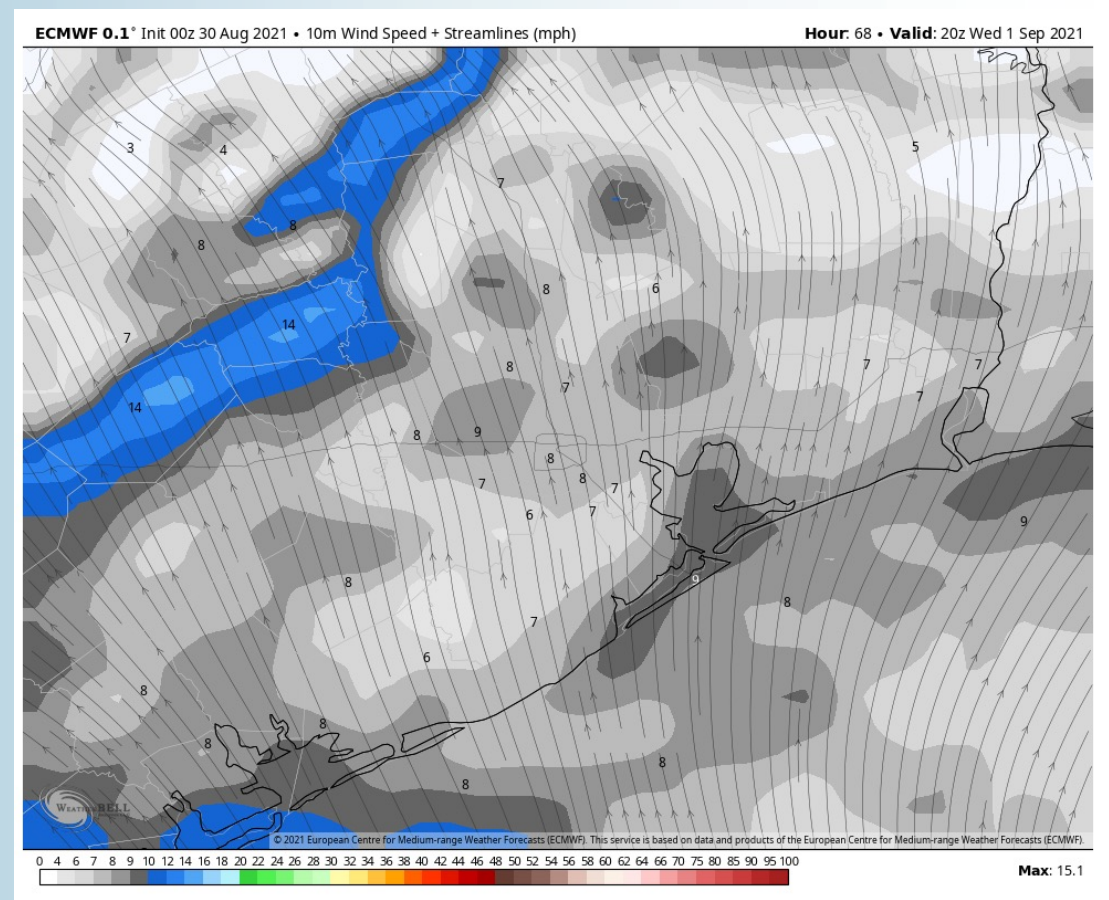




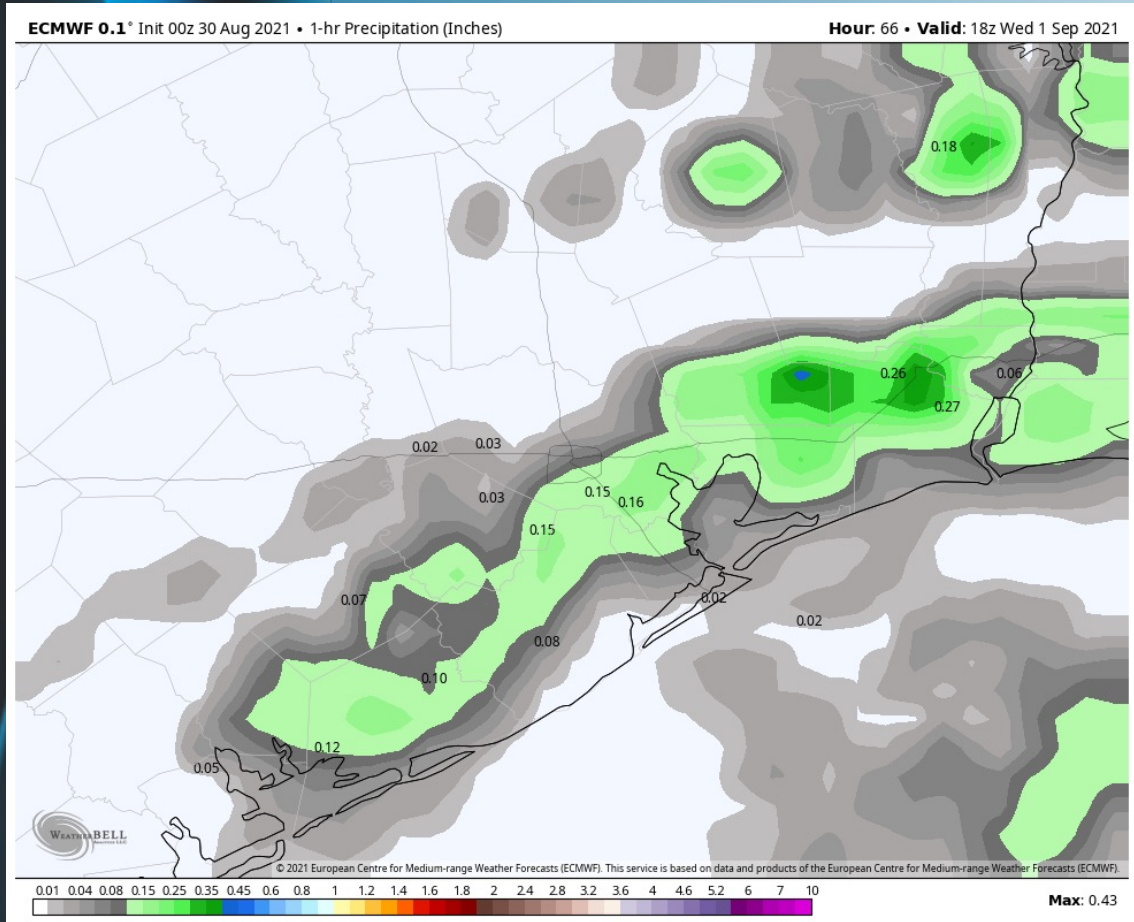
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- An isolated to scattered shot of a shower / storm can't be ruled out Wednesday morning, however, a better threat for precip coverage looks to be from the ~12 – 4 PM period at this distance...drier risks returning heading into the evening hours.
- Wind is expected to be out of the S at 5-10 MPH sustained.
- Highs are expected to be in the low to mid 90s.
  - *No fog is favored for Wednesday.*

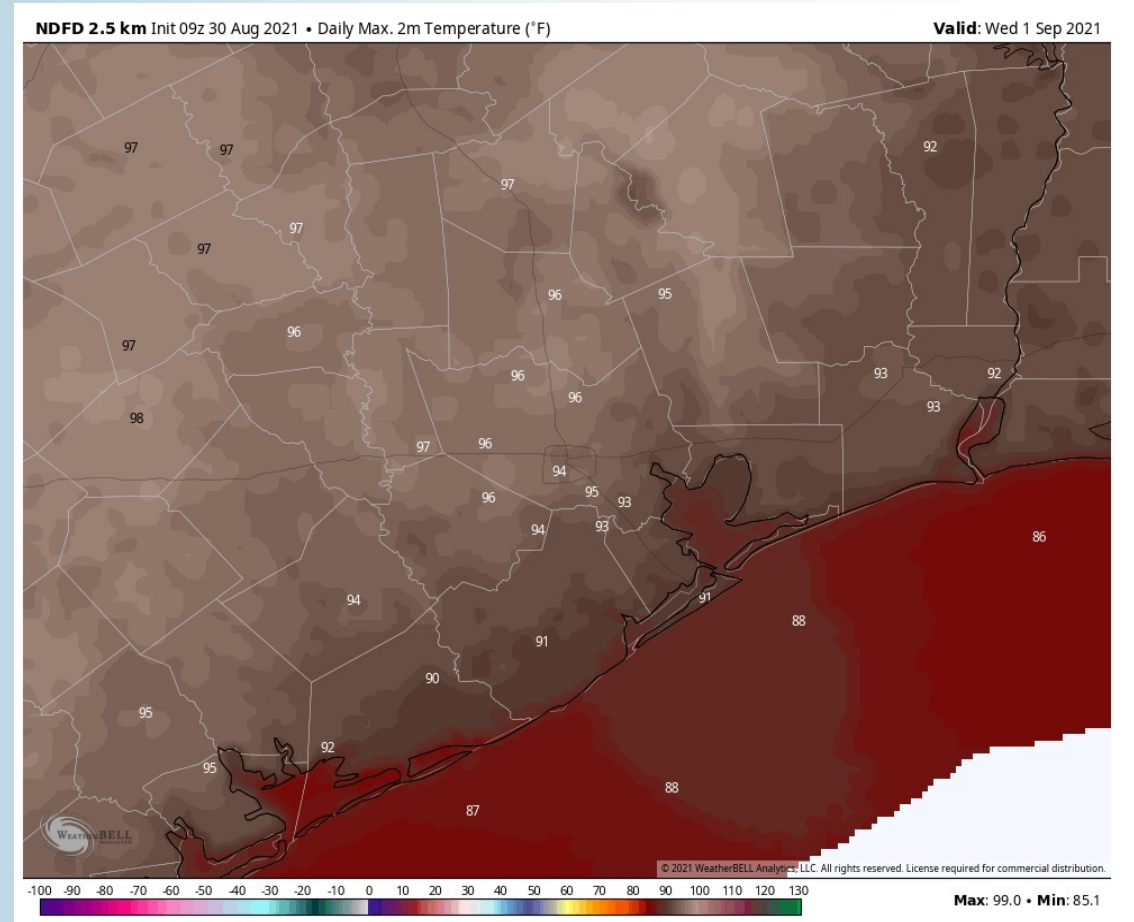
## Sustained Winds (9 AM CT)

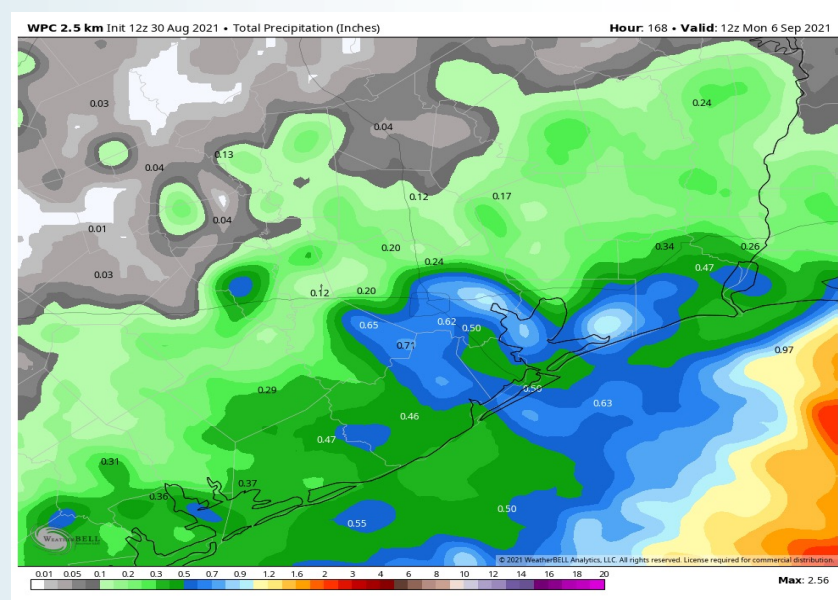
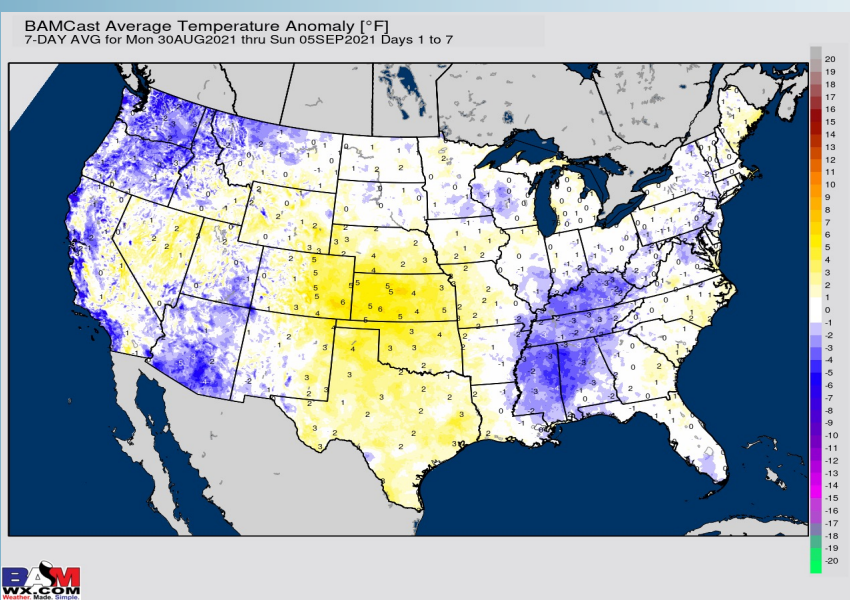




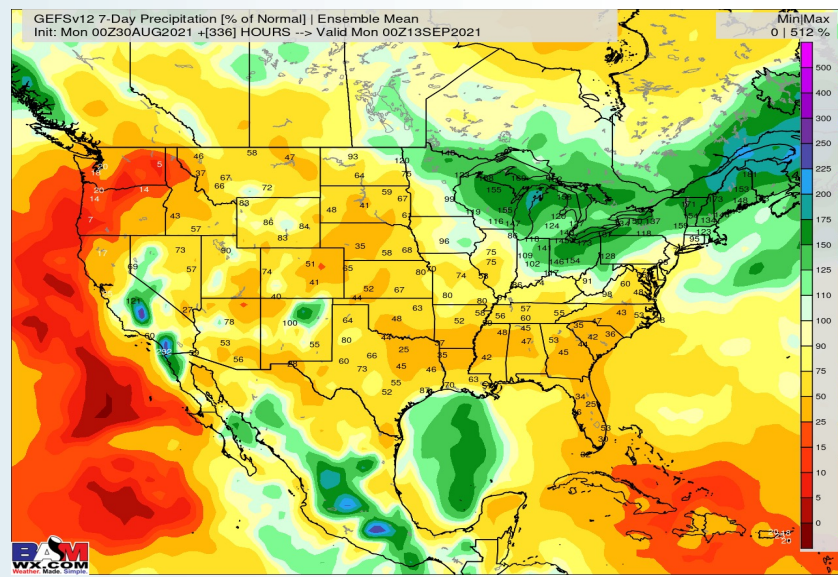
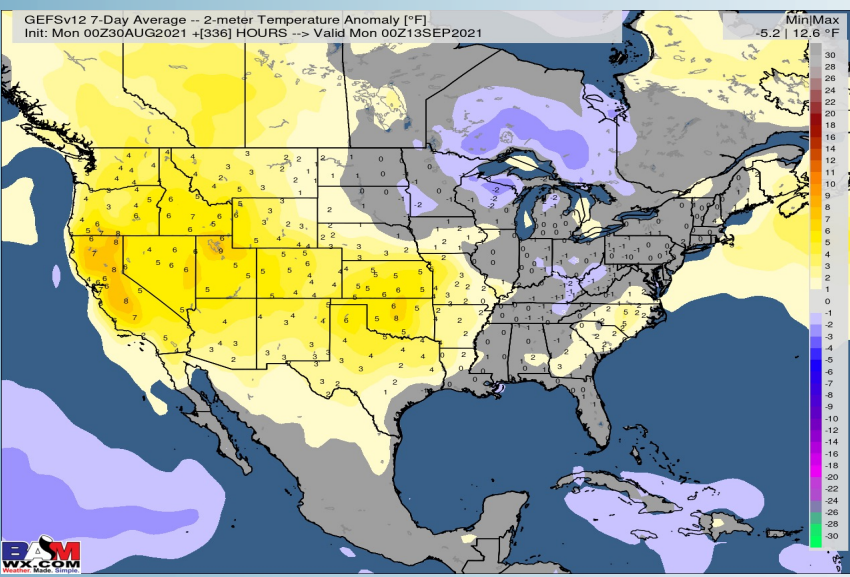
## Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- A few hit and miss storm chances the next few days as Ida drifts off to the north and east. Overall impacts will be minimal. Temps likely run slightly above normal over the next week.
  
- Temps look to average back down to normal for week 2, with precipitation also looking near-normal. We will need to watch the potential for additional tropical moisture mischief towards the end of the week 2 period.
  
- The overall pattern looks consistent into mid-to-late September. Above normal temps are expected, and additional tropical moisture mischief will be continue to need to be monitored for ahead.
