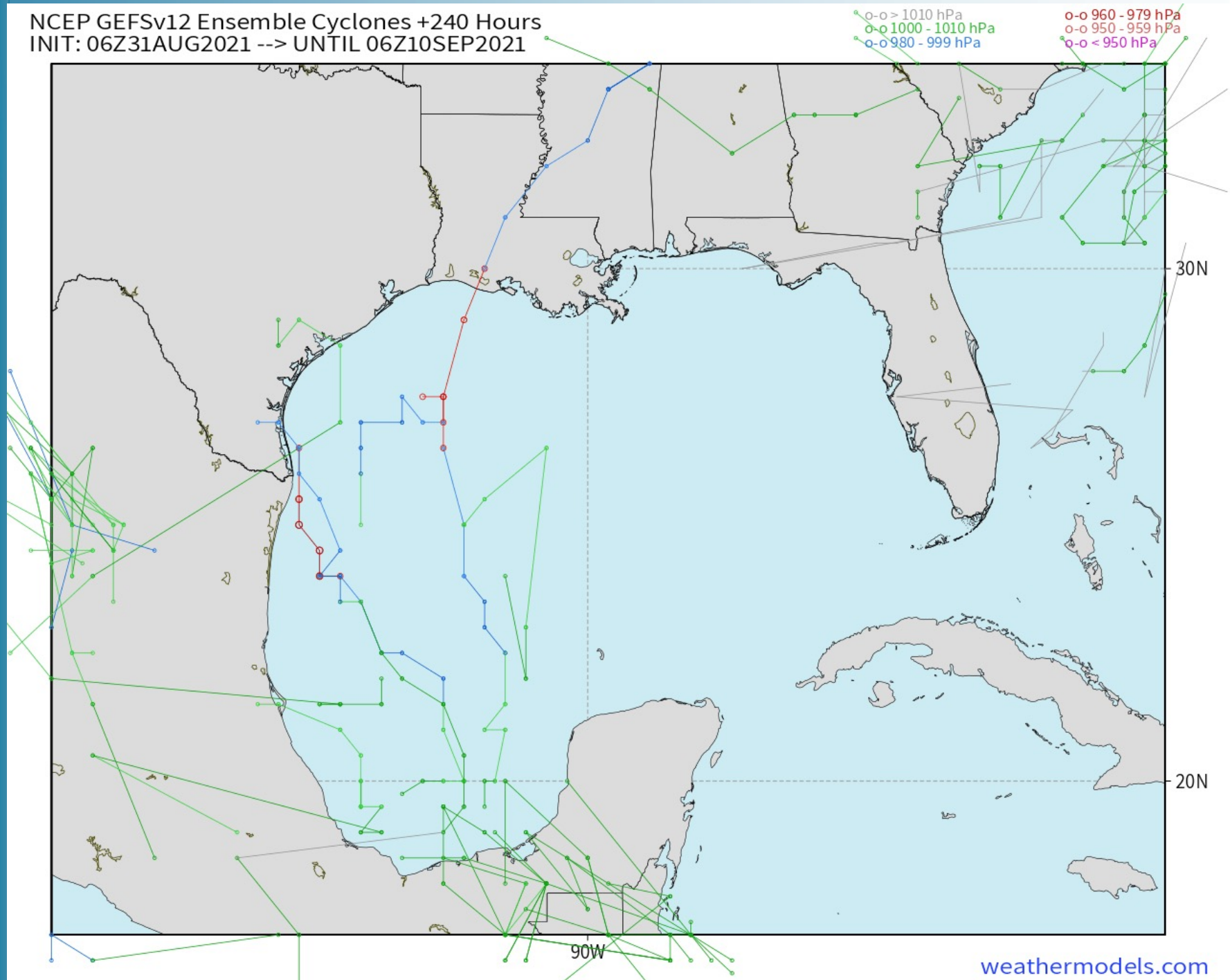

American Ensemble Tracks

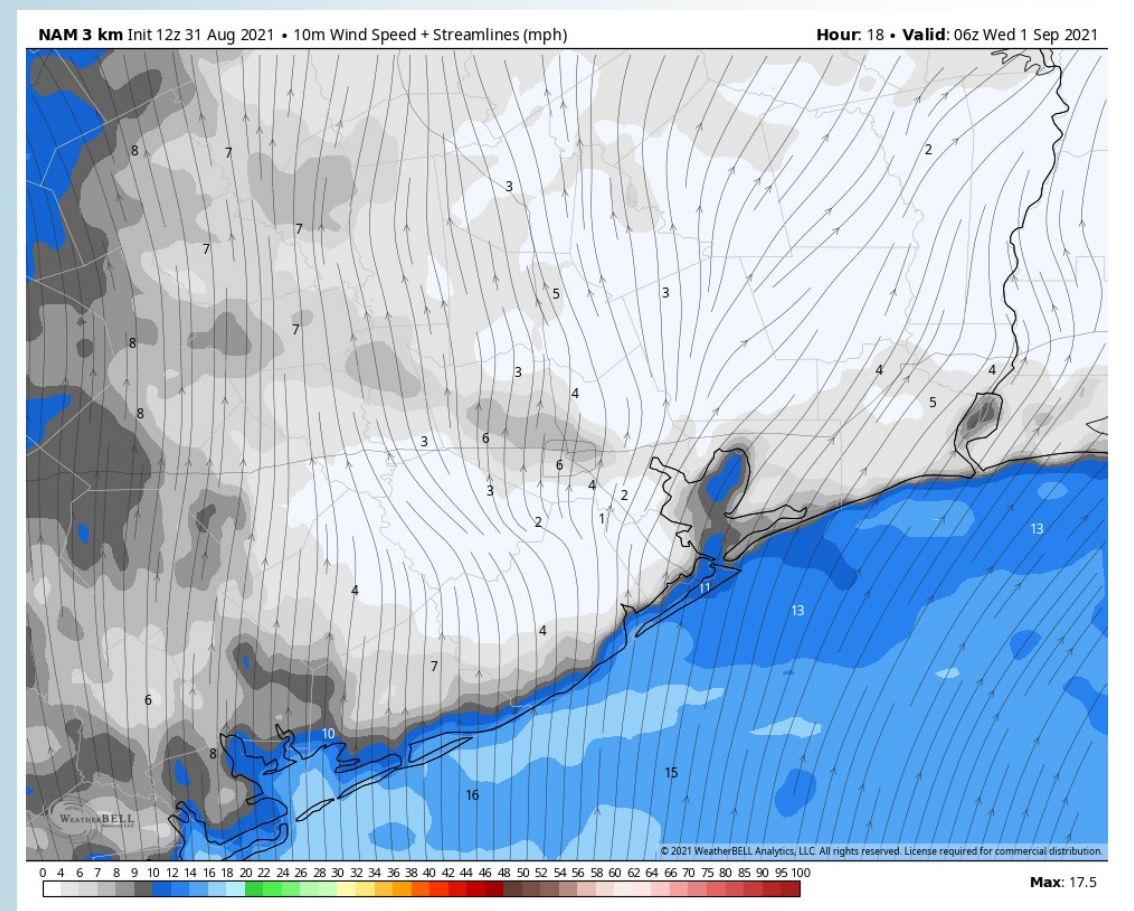


Additional tropical activity is not anticipated over the next week, a few ensemble members (especially from the American data vs European data) suggest some kind of disturbance mid to late next week developing in the southwestern Gulf that we are watching closely. Details will need to be ironed out later this week as we get closer.

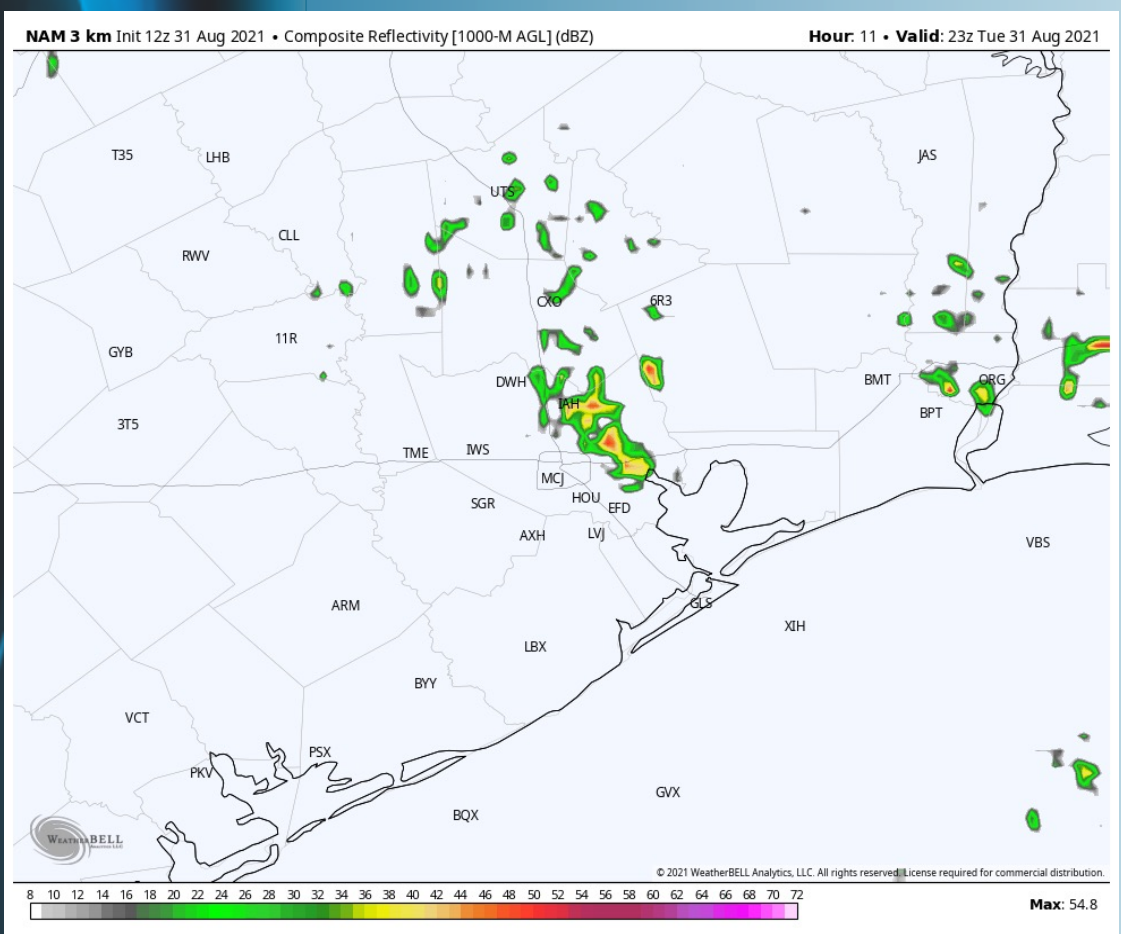
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Best threat for a scattered shower or thunderstorm looks to come between 4-9pm tonight (better chances closer to the HOU metro vs boarding station). If caught under a cell some locally heavy rain, briefly reduced visibility, lightning and a gust of 20-30 MPH can't be ruled out.**
- **Winds pick back up late afternoon to evening more out of the South / Southwest, ramping back up to 10-15 MPH sustained...gusting at times up to 20 MPH.**
- **Lows tonight will be in the low to mid 80s across open water, upper 70s more in-land.**
- ***Currently not favoring fog for today to tonight.***

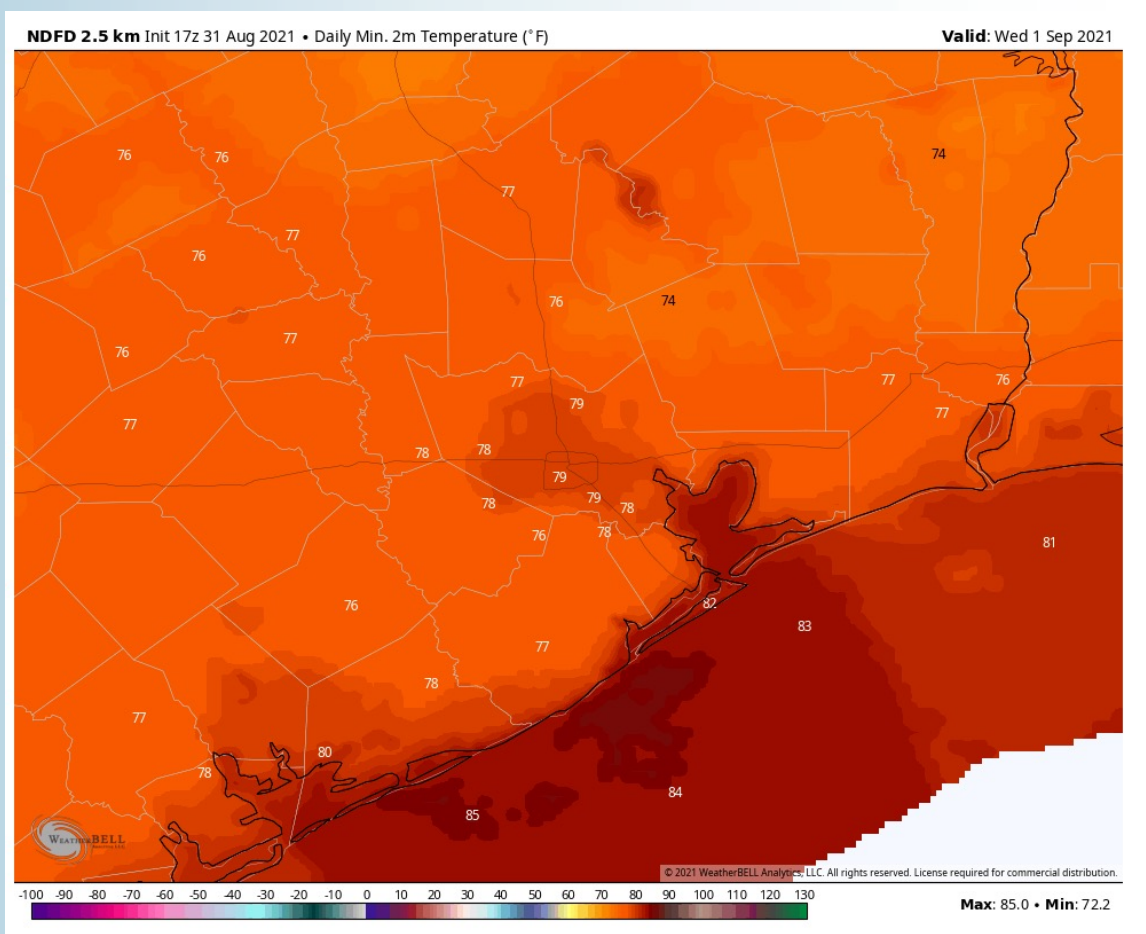
Sustained Winds (1 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 PM CT)



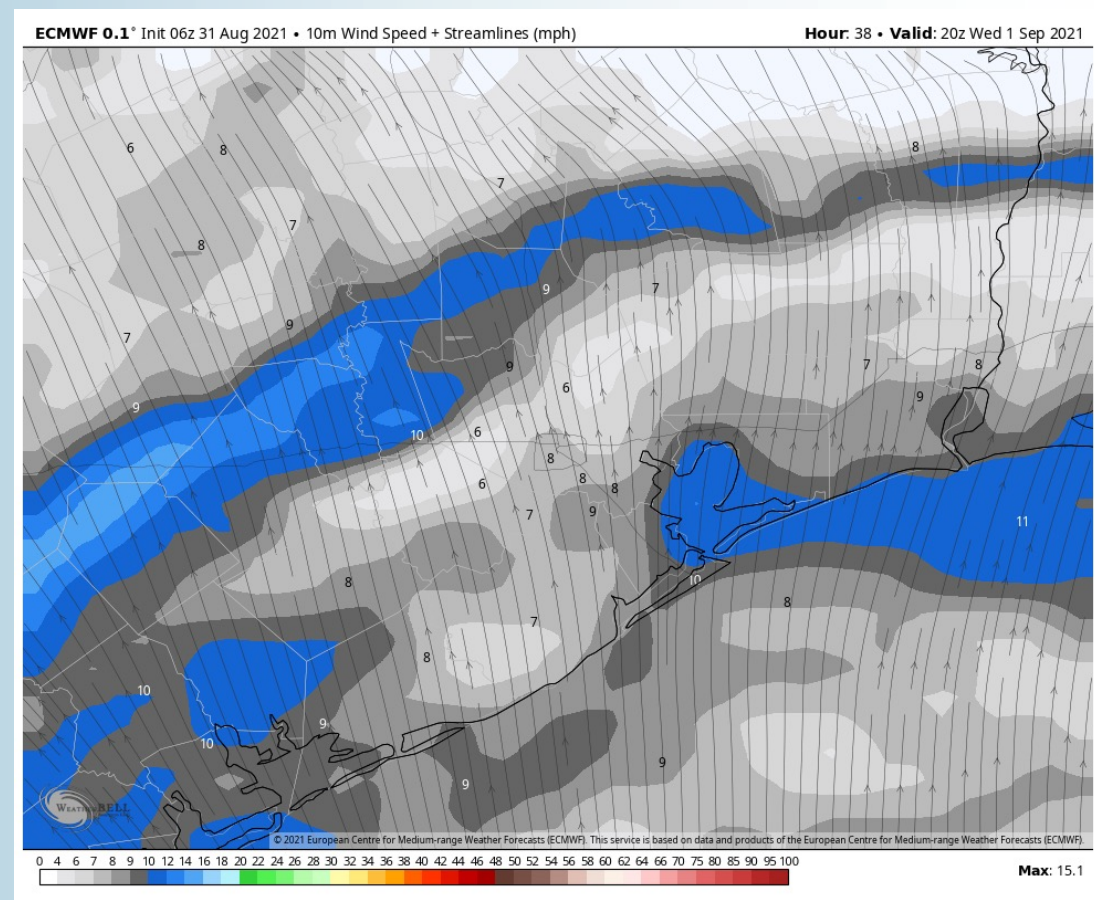
Low Temperatures Tonight



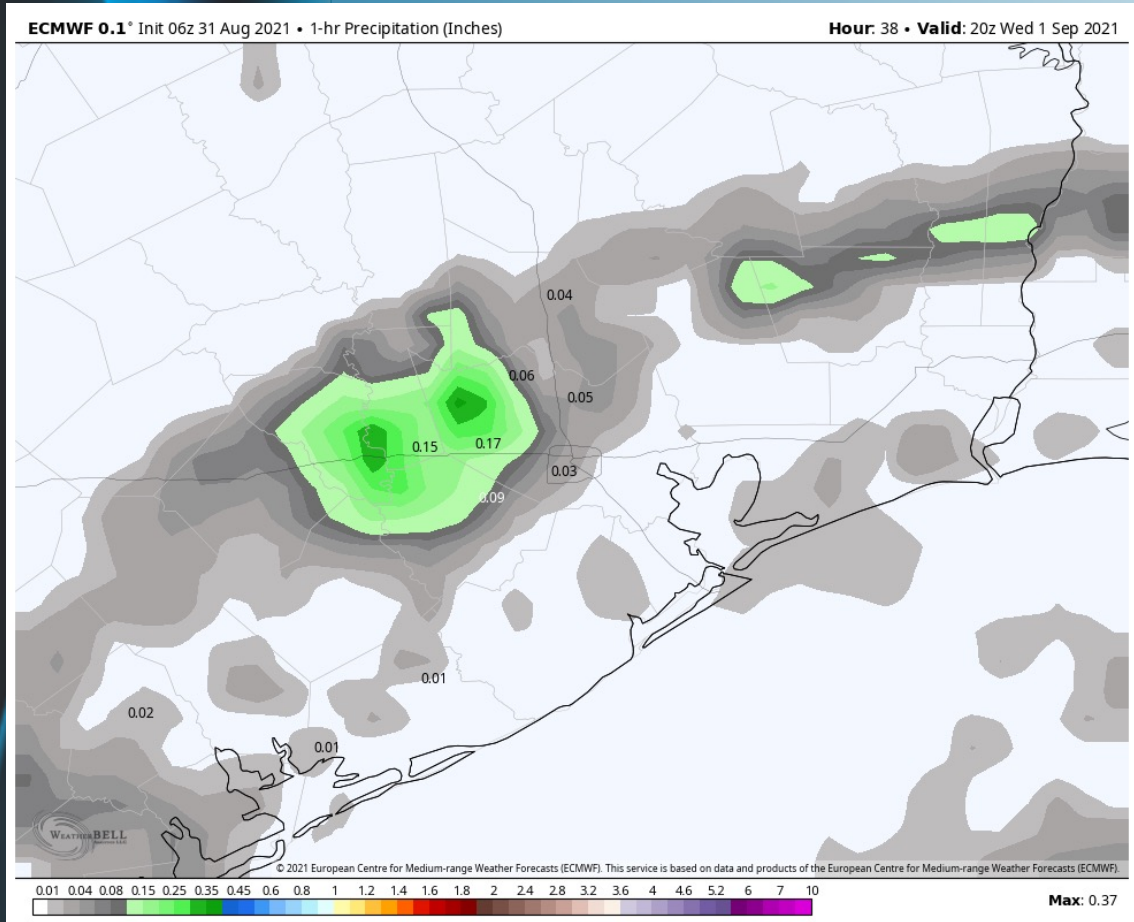
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- An isolated to scattered shower / storm can't be ruled out early Wednesday morning, however, a better threat for precip coverage looks to be from the ~2-6PM period at this distance...drier risks returning heading into the late evening hours.
- Wind is expected to be out of the S at 5-10 MPH sustained.
- Highs are expected to be in the mid-90s especially in-land.
- *No fog is favored for Wednesday.*

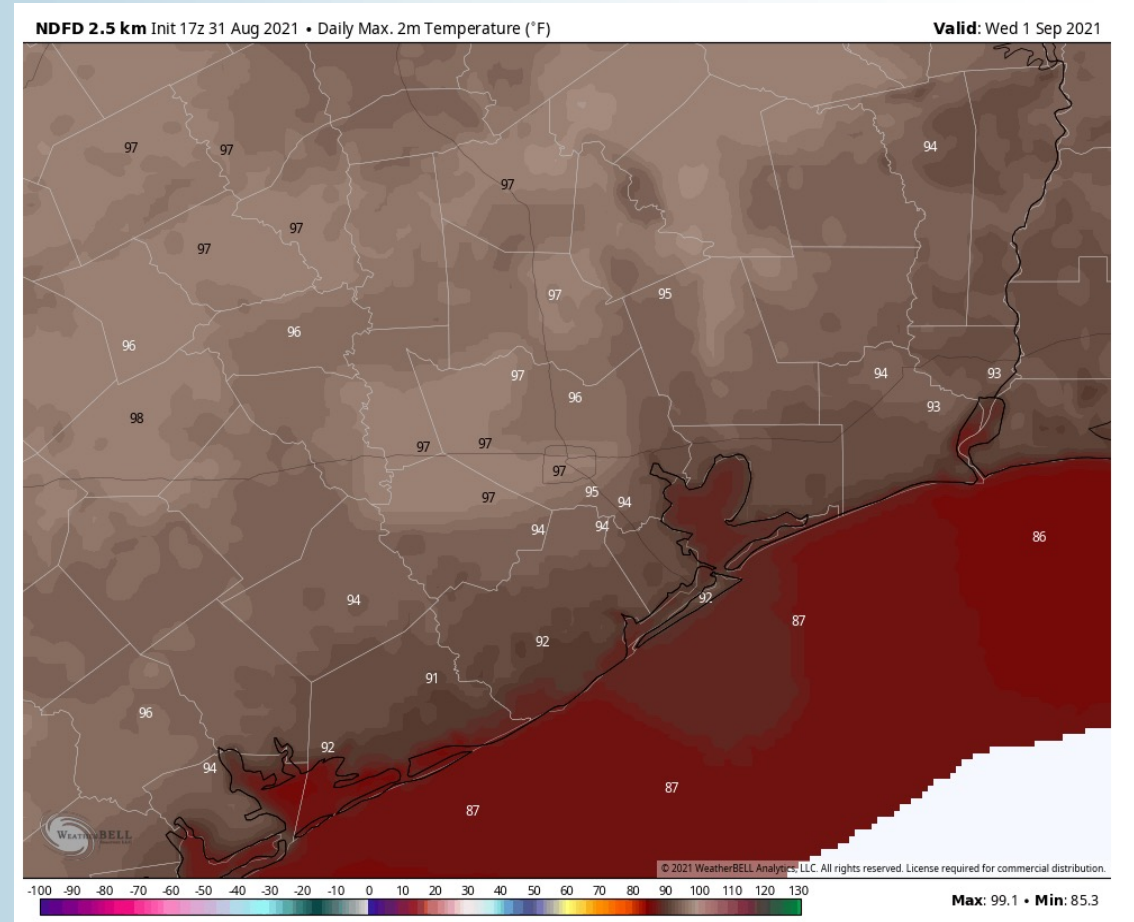
Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)



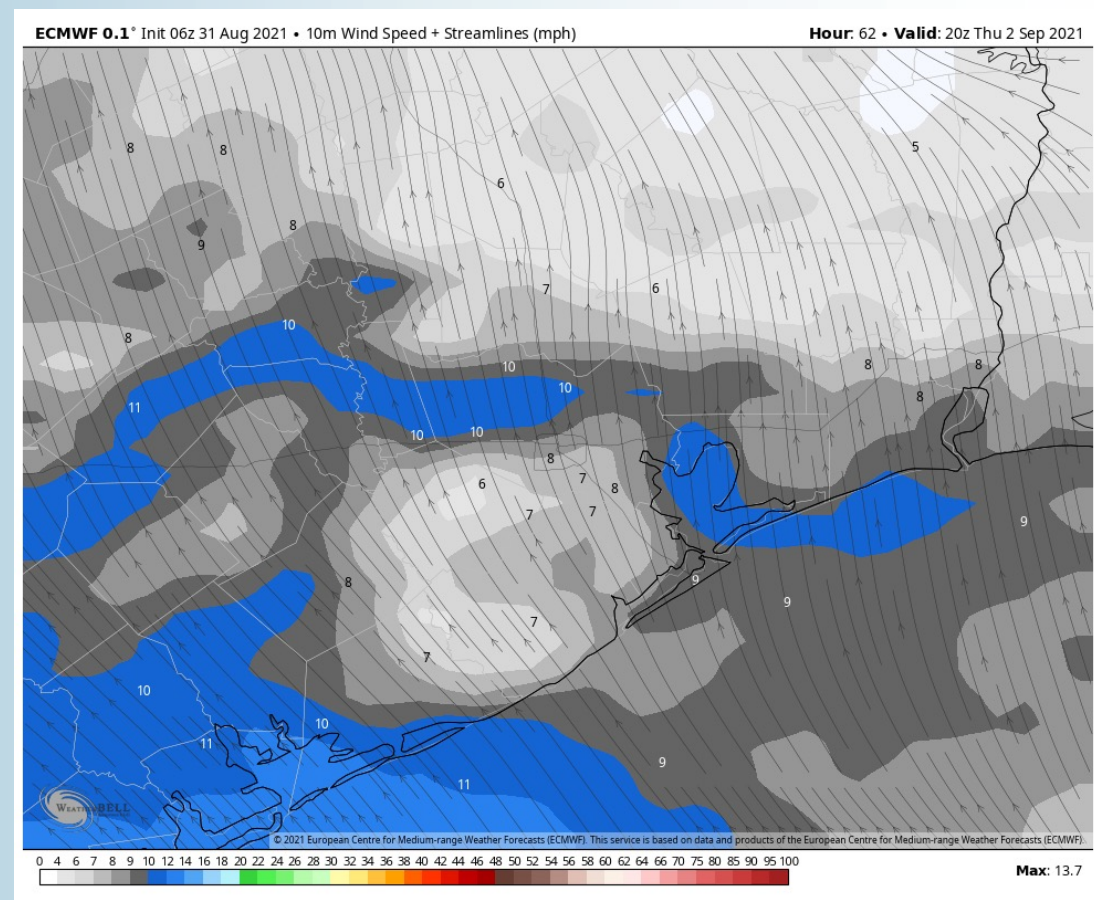
High Temps Wednesday



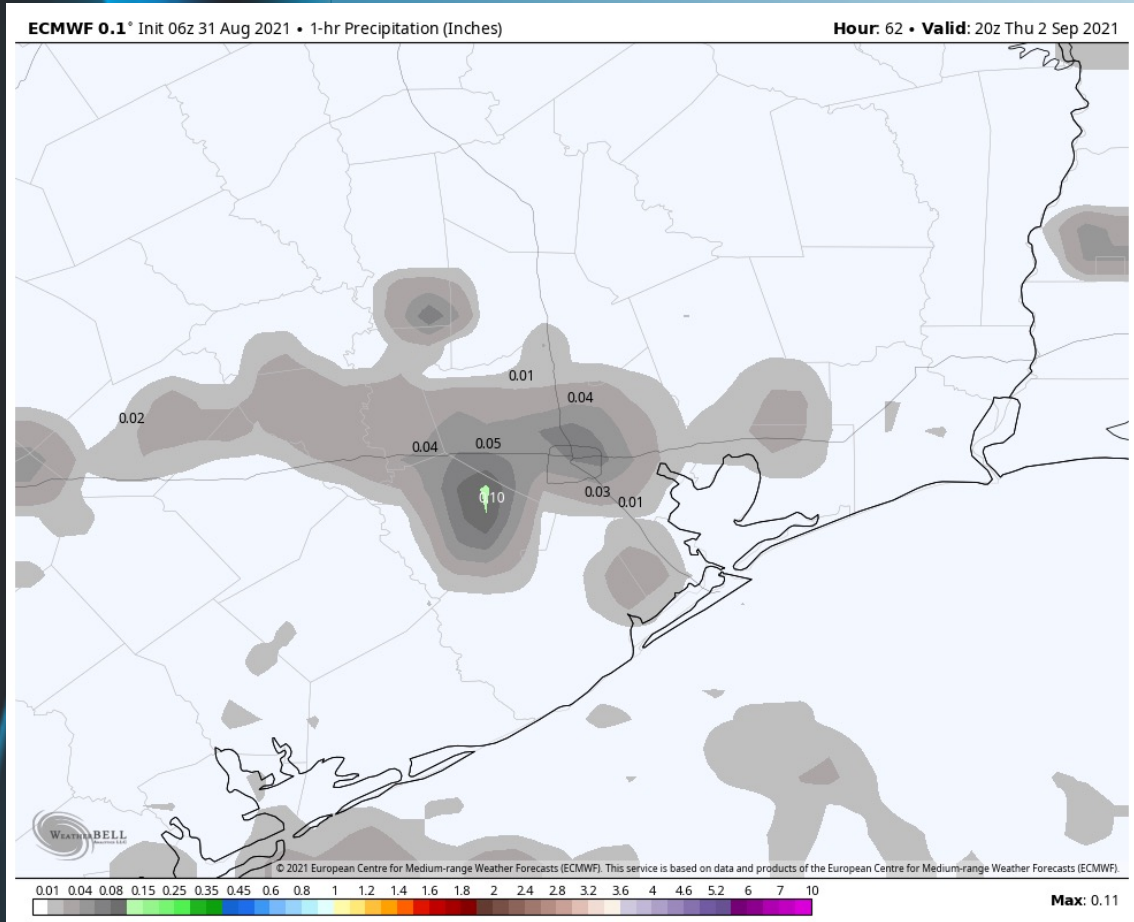
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- An isolated to scattered shower / storm can't be ruled out Thursday morning (mainly off-shore), however, a better threat for precip coverage looks to be from the ~2-6PM period at this distance...drier risks returning heading into the later evening hours.
- Wind is expected to be out of the SSE at 5-10 MPH sustained.
- Highs are expected to be in the low to mid-90s especially in-land.
- *No fog is favored for Thursday.*

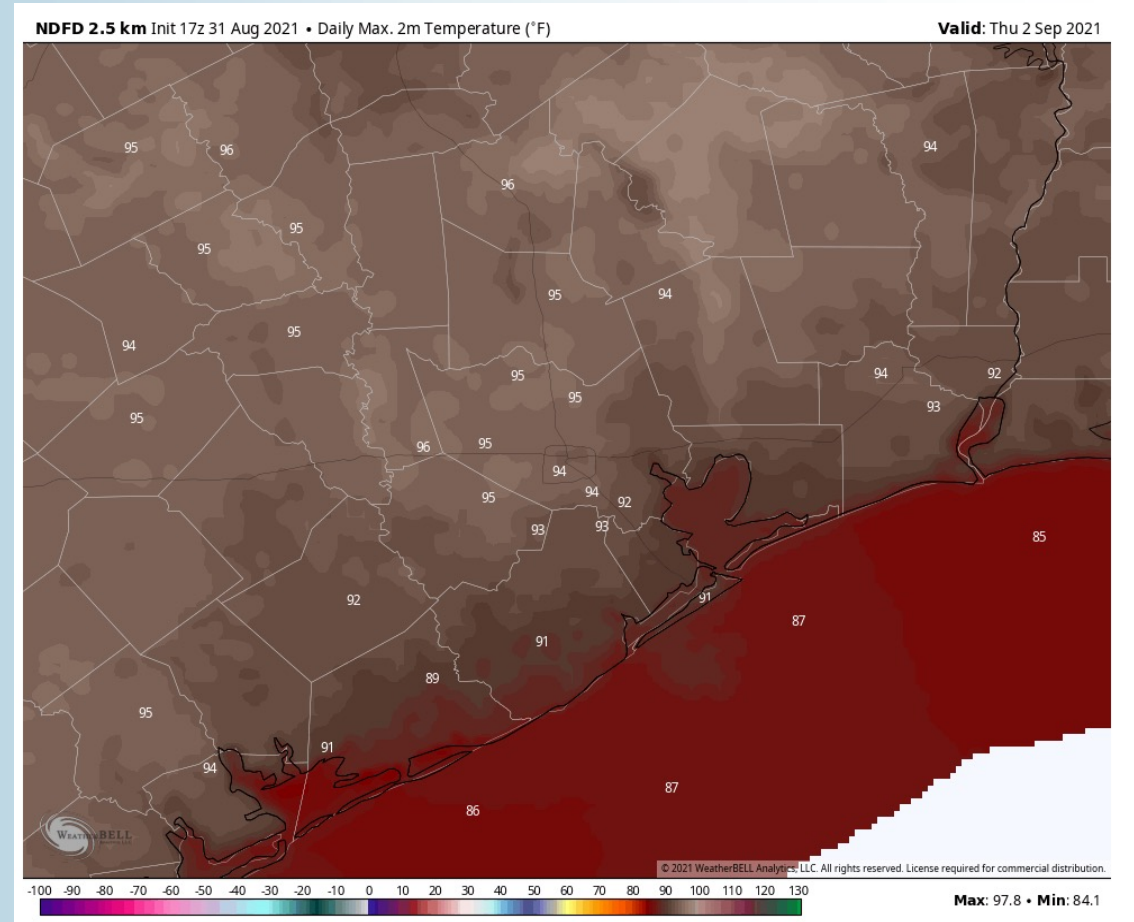
Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)

High Temps Thursday



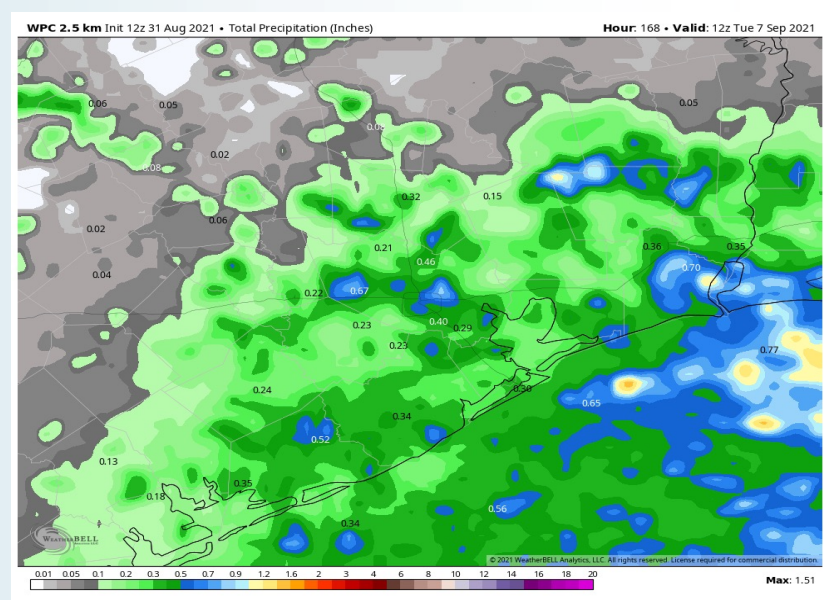
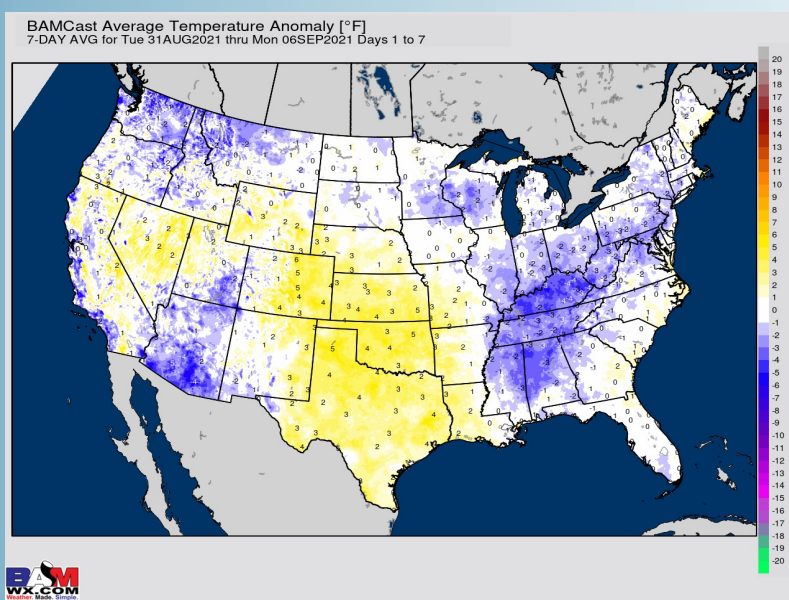
Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- A few hit and miss storm chances the next few days, precip becomes less of a concern late week to weekend. Overall impacts will be minimal. Temps likely run slightly above normal over the next week.

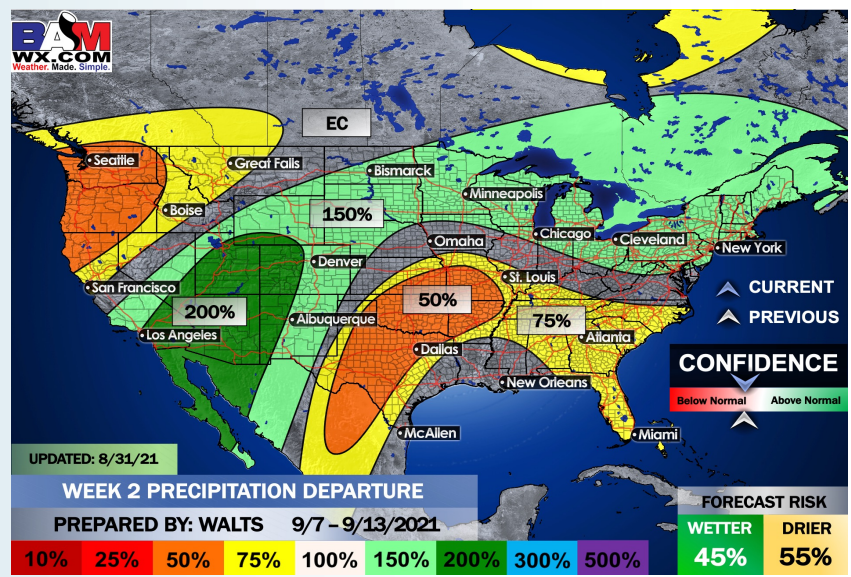
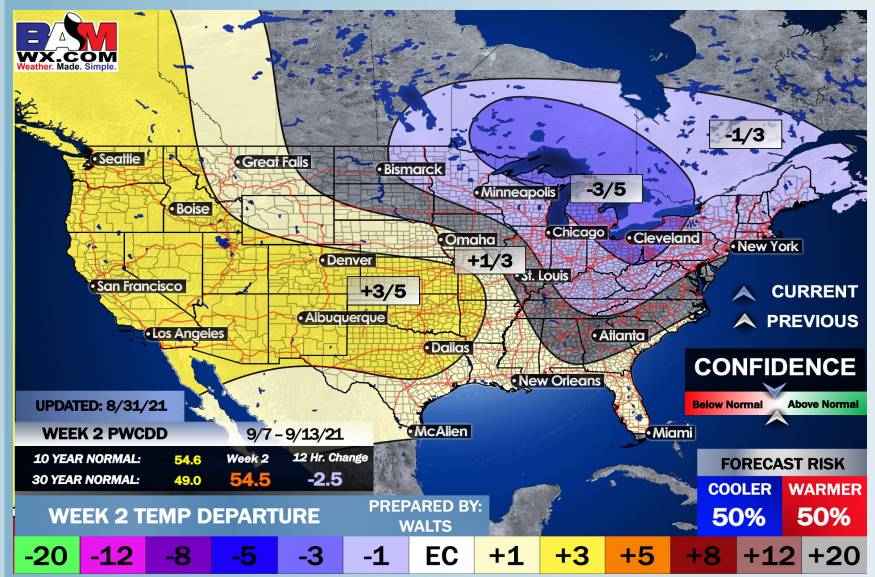
- We are favoring slightly warmer than normal temperatures for week 2. We added near normal rainfall as we will need to watch the potential for additional tropical moisture mischief towards the middle of the week 2 period, if this stays away, the risk is drier.

- The overall pattern looks consistent into mid-to-late September. Above normal temps are expected, and additional tropical moisture mischief will be continue to need to be monitored for ahead.
