

European Ensemble Tracks




Tropical activity in the Gulf of Mexico is not anticipated in the next 7-10 days.


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **A boundary from the AM precipitation off the coast has crept west and allowed for some scattered showers/storms to work into the area. Working into the afternoon, as long as the boundary is present, precipitation chances cannot be taken off the table. Scattered showers/storms will be possible out through sundown when the loss of daytime heating likely weakens the precipitation chances.**
- **Storm activity has prompted a southerly wind a bit earlier than first thought. Winds are still anticipated to stay calmer, out of the South at 5-10 MPH. There may be a few periods where light winds will lead to variable direction.**
- **Lows tonight will fall back into the upper 70s/ lower 80s.**
 - ***No fog anticipated this evening.***


Sustained Winds (9 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)




Low Temps This Evening




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Thursday we would favor the bulk of the activity to be to the west of the area where the boundary will set up. A few spotty showers/storms especially in the afternoon cannot be ruled out, but the more widespread activity should stay west. Lighting as well as a briefly moderate downpour cannot be ruled out.
- Winds generally look to remain on the weaker wide sustained at 8-13 MPH out of the S/SE. There may be a period of wind gusts to 15 MPH at the boarding station in the morning.
- High temperatures will continue to hover in the upper 80s to lower 90s.
 - *Not favoring fog for Thursday.*


Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)




High Temperatures Thursday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Scattered chances look to be possible throughout the day before activity wanes into the evening as instability is lost.
- Winds will continue coming out of the S at 5-10 MPH across the area. Gust around 10 – 15 MPH will be possible.
- High temperatures look to get into the upper 80's F over open waters on Friday. Higher temperatures into the mid 90's F possible further inland towards the HOU metro area. "Feels-like" temperatures look to get near 100 F.
- *No fog is favored for Friday.*


Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)

High Temps Friday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- We continue to deal with daily chances over the next 7 days, likely in a scattered fashion. Localized heavier amounts will be possible vs the image to the right. Overall temperatures look to sit near normal over the next 7 days.



- Cooler than normal temperatures and below average precipitation risks look to be present as we head into the 2nd week of August.

- Heading later into August, we still favor overall more of a pattern suited for below average temps and above average precipitation. This is the time period where we would anticipate an increase in tropical activity across the Atlantic.
