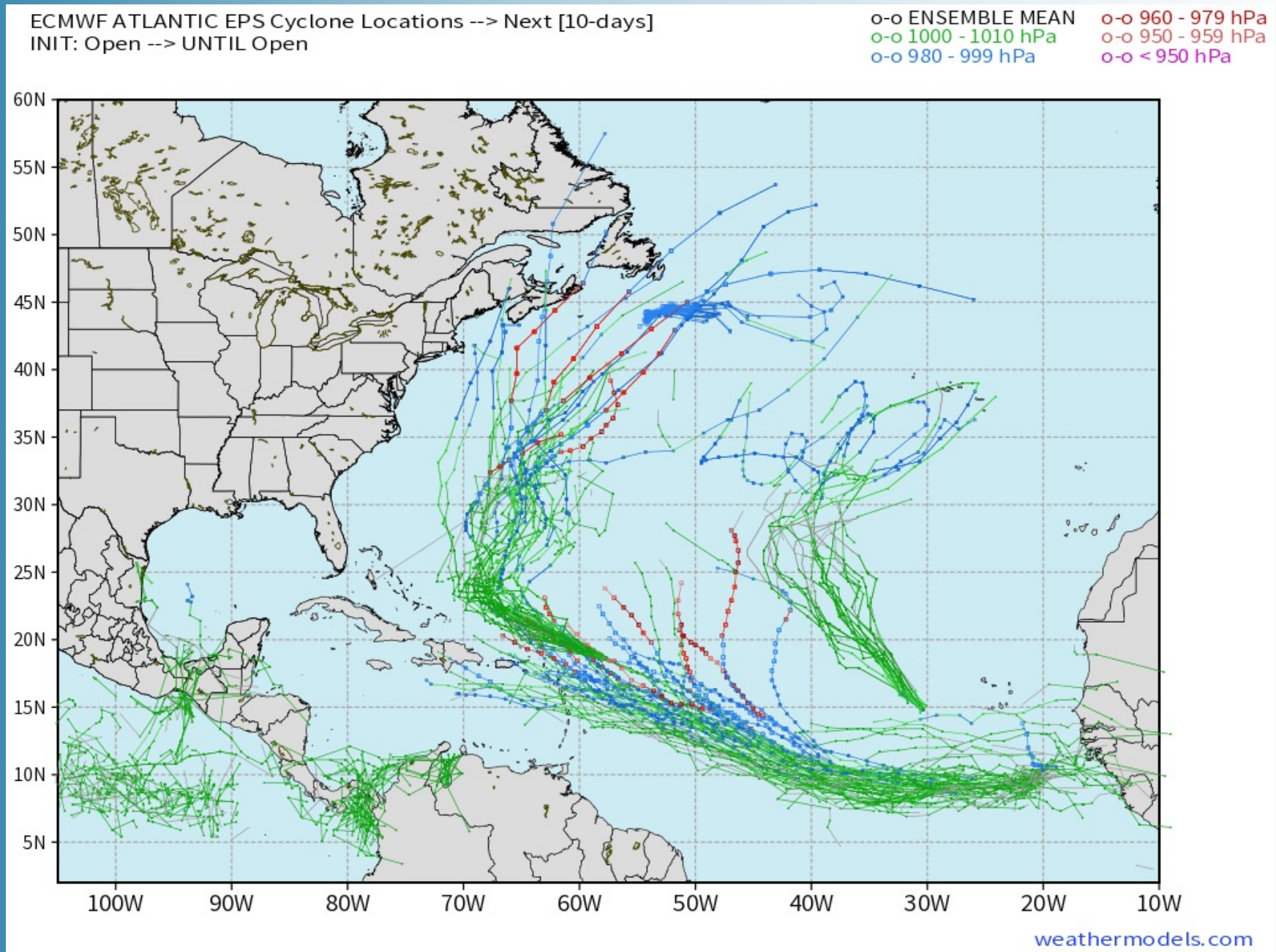

ECMWF 10-days Tracks

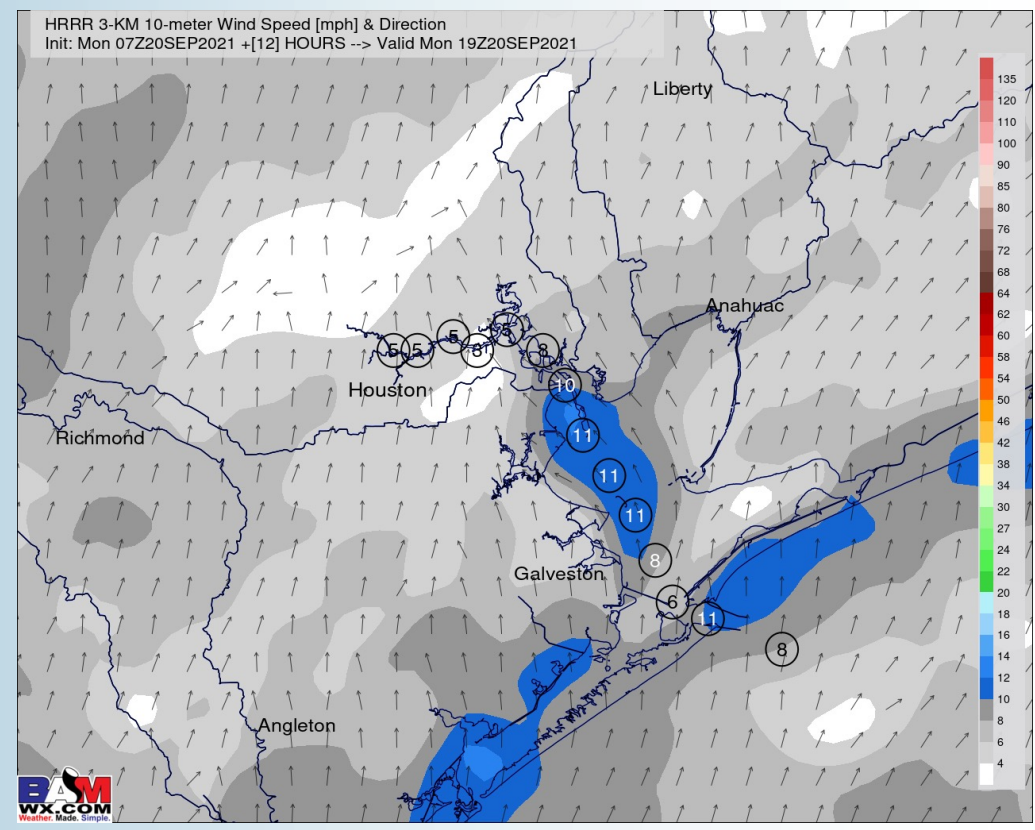


- The Gulf continues to remain quiet at least for the next 10 days. Current tropical activity is expected to stay confined to the Atlantic.

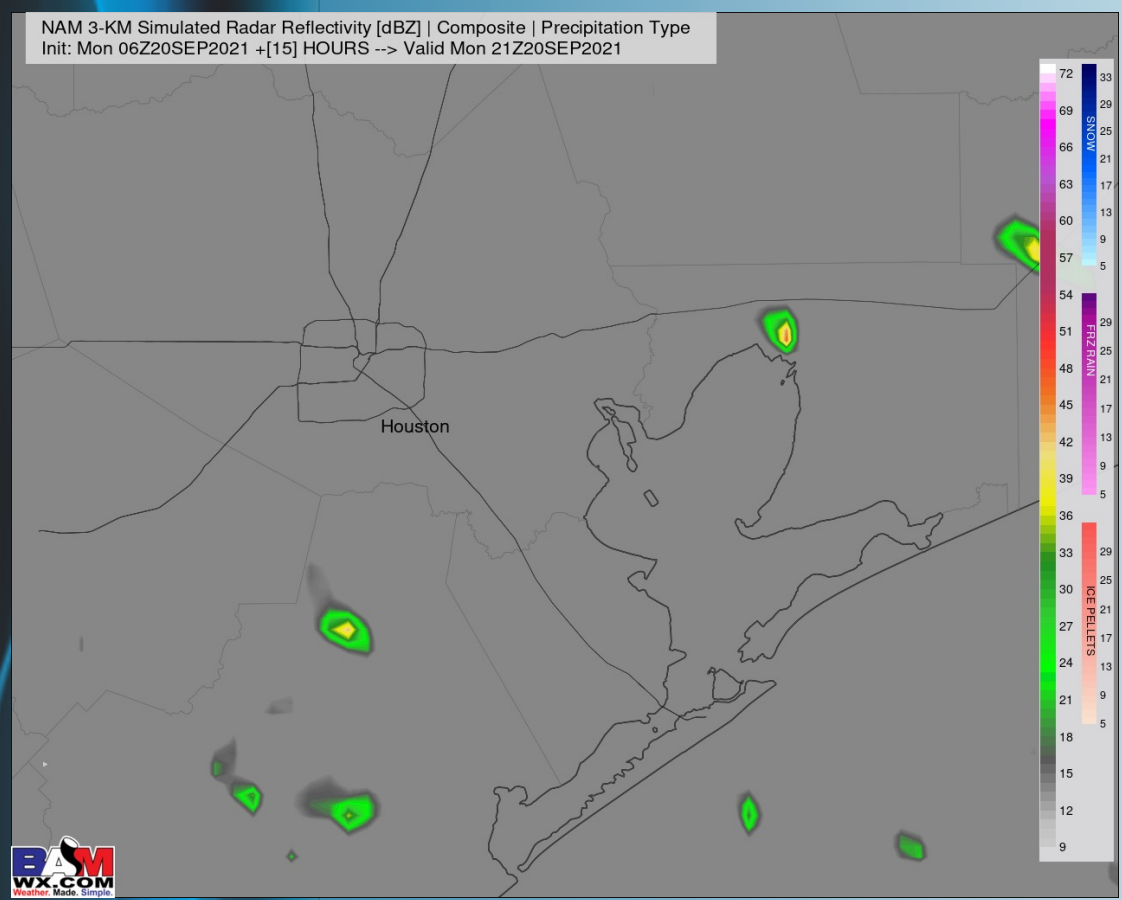
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Today looks to feature much more dry time than not. A 10-20% chance of an isolated shower/storm in the 2-7PM timeframe, but anticipating dry conditions for most of today. A locally heavier downpour will be possible if caught under an isolated stronger cell.
- Winds this AM look to be coming out of the SW at 5-10 MPH sustained before switching to a southerly flow for the second half of the day. Gusts up to 15 MPH possible going into nighttime/overnight hours.
- High temperatures today look to be in the upper 80s to low 90s.
- *No fog is anticipated for today to tonight.*

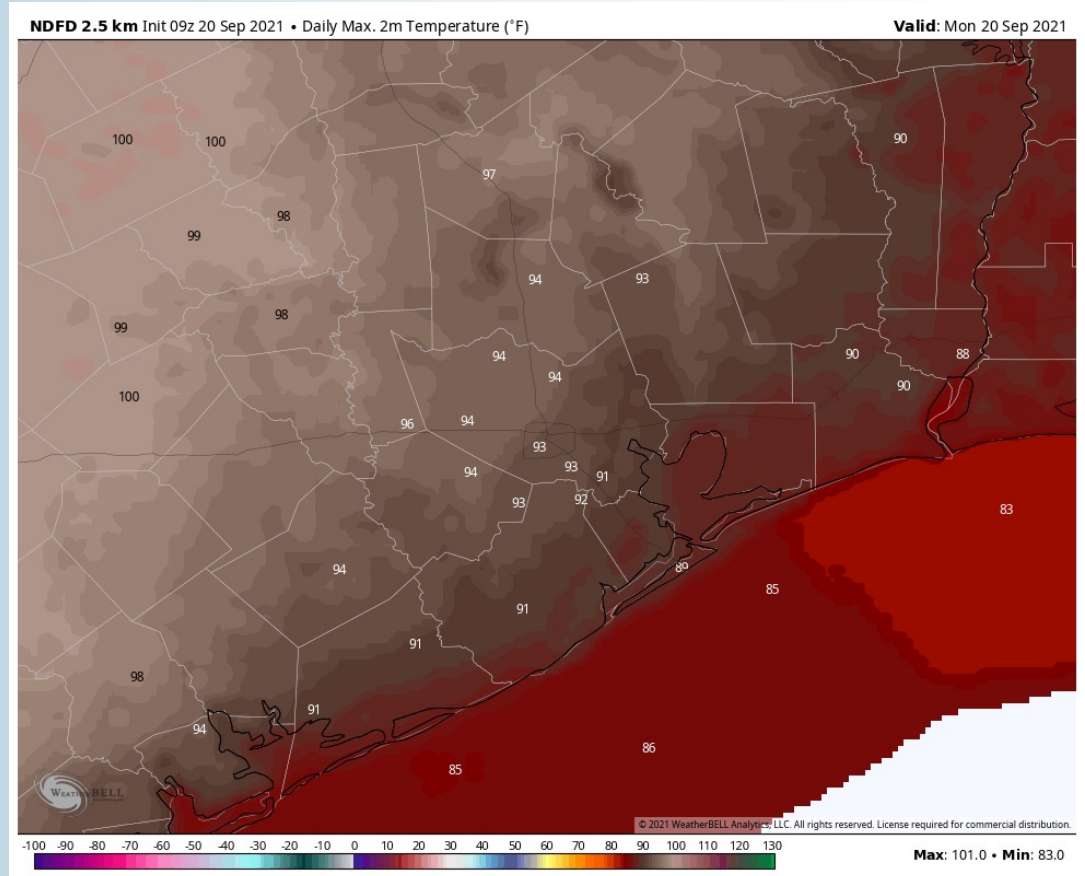
Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)



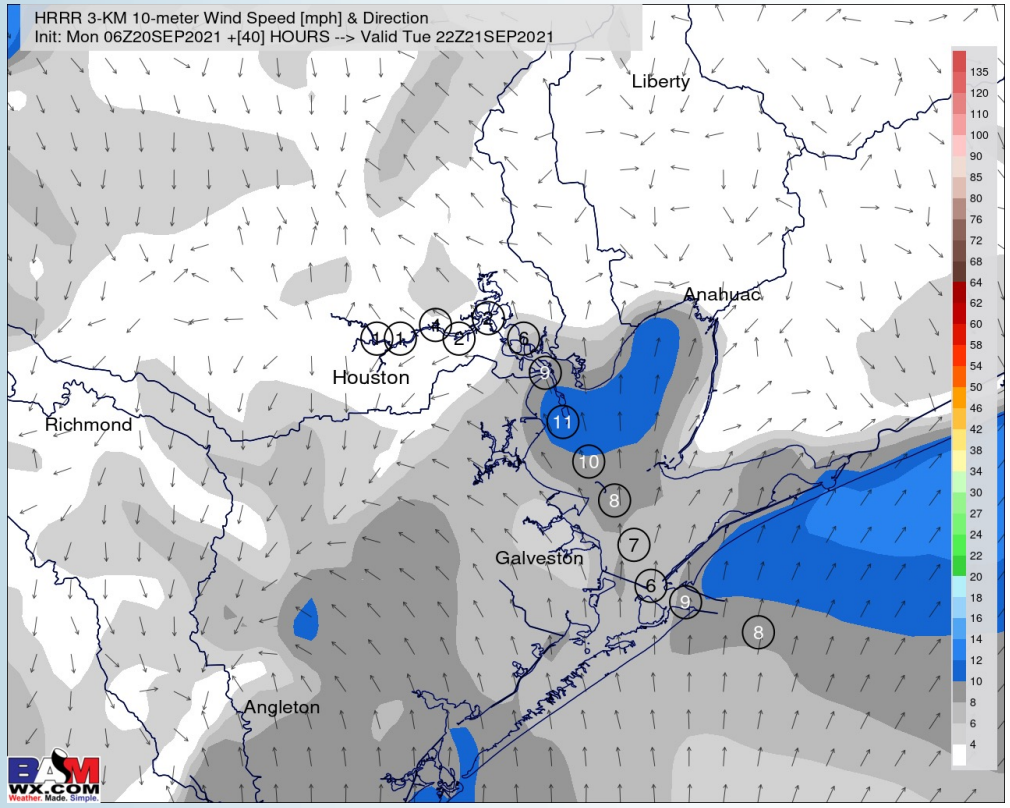
High Temperatures Today



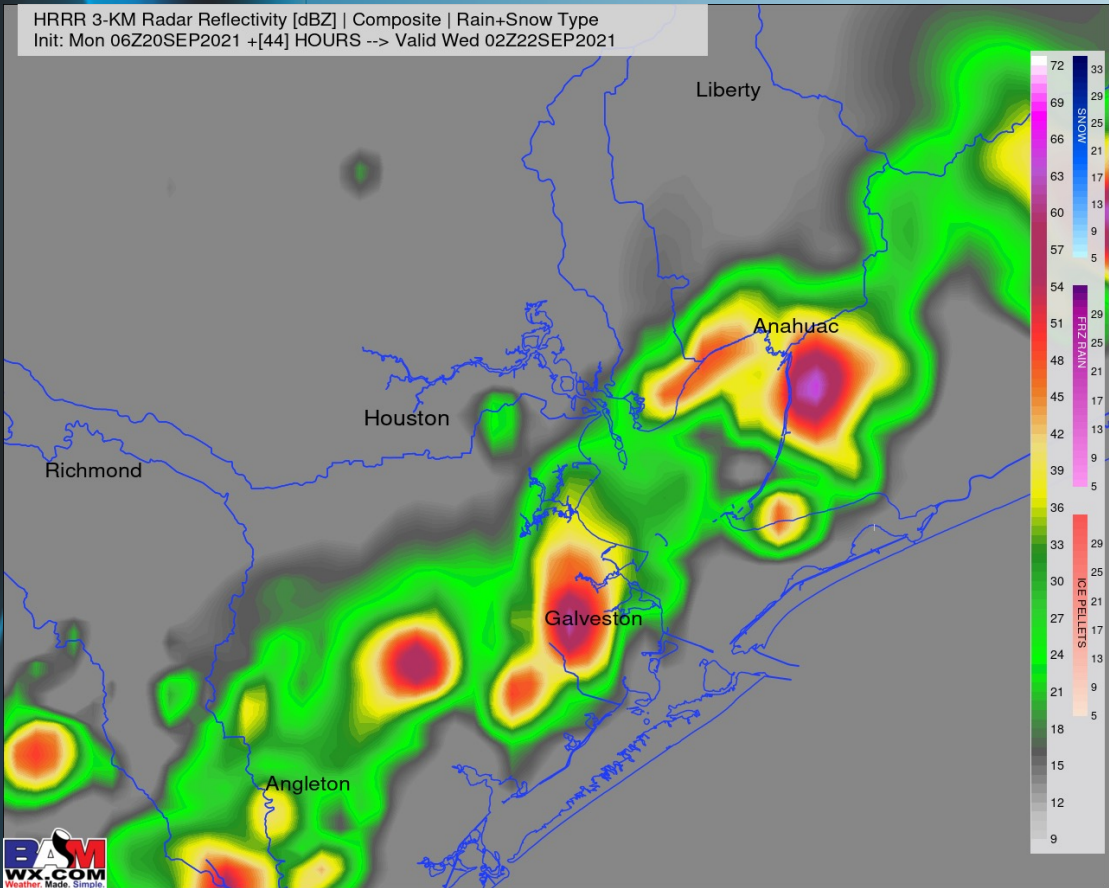
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Outside of an isolated pocket of precip TUES AM, we are expecting mostly dry weather here. The main focal point of precip will be as a frontal boundary works SE, anticipating ~7-11 PM for an uptick in storm activity. Locally heavier downpours will be possible.
- Winds Tuesday AM look to be coming out of the SW at 8-13 MPH sustained, calming a bit at 5-10 MPH sustained after midday veering to a more southerly flow. A burst of higher wind speeds / gusts will be possible as the front passes, gusting up to 20-30 MPH can't be ruled out.
- High temperatures Tuesday look to be in the low 90s.
 - *No fog is favored for Tuesday.*

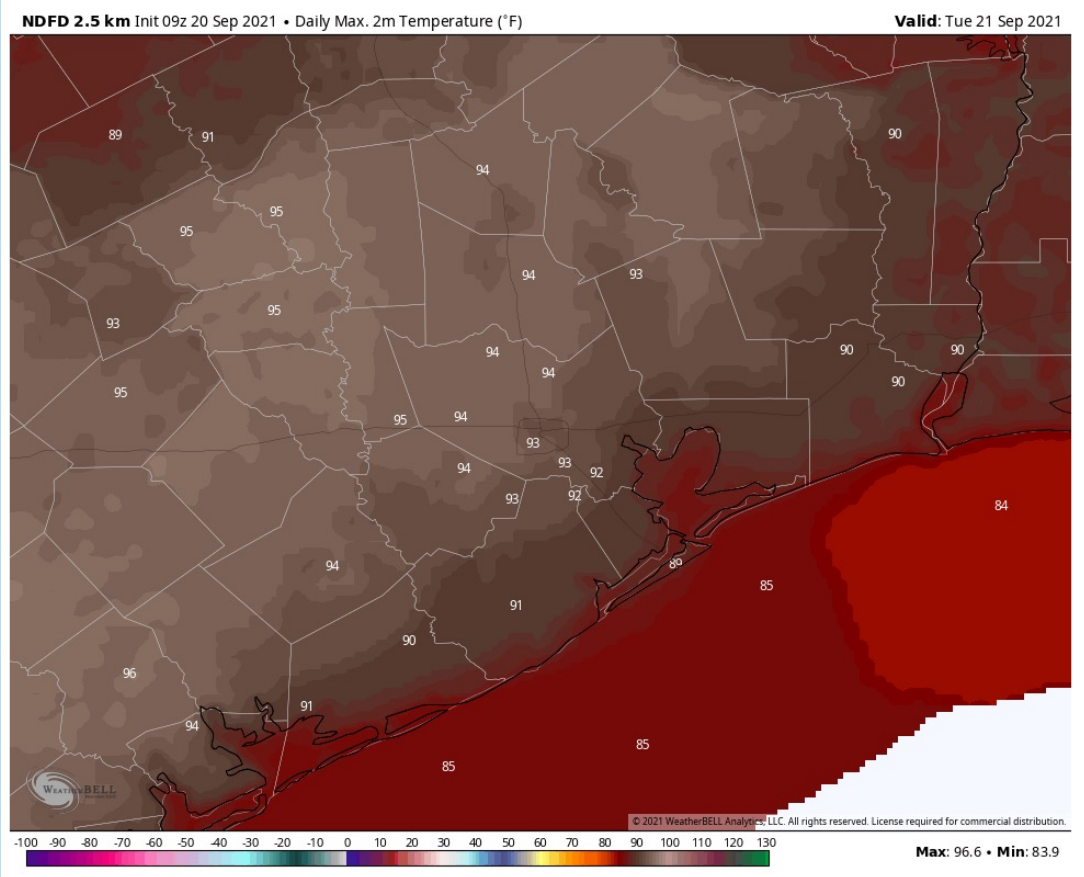
Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 PM CT)



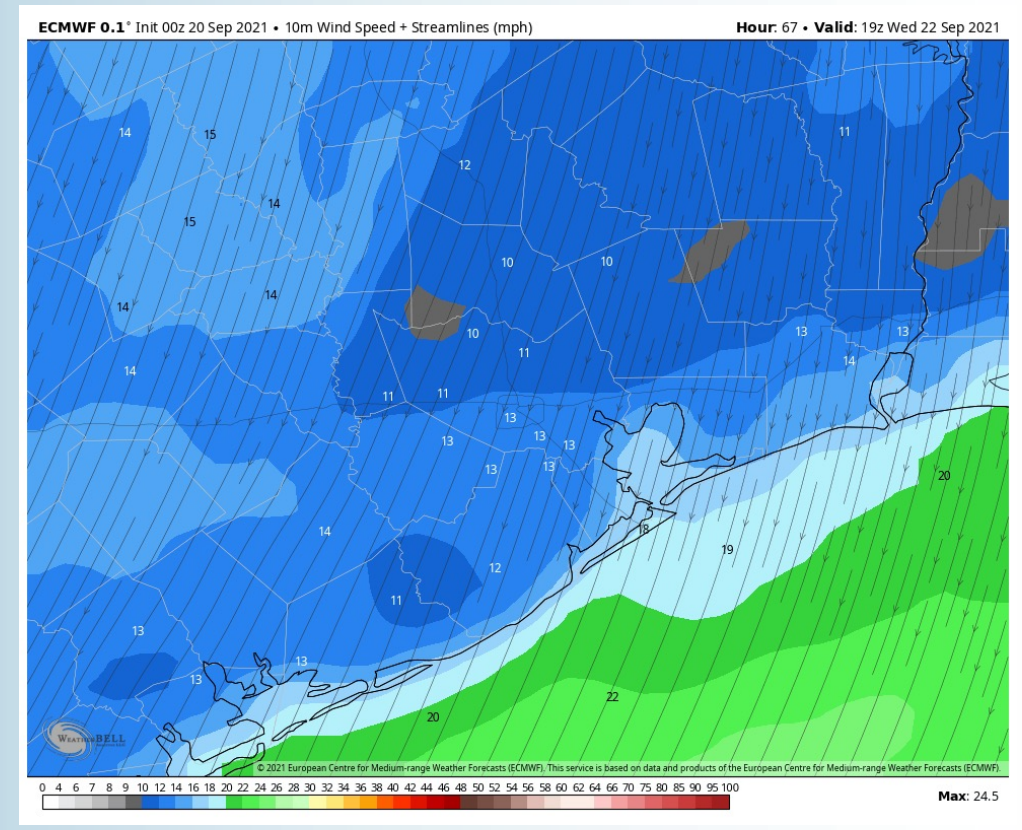
High Temperatures Tuesday



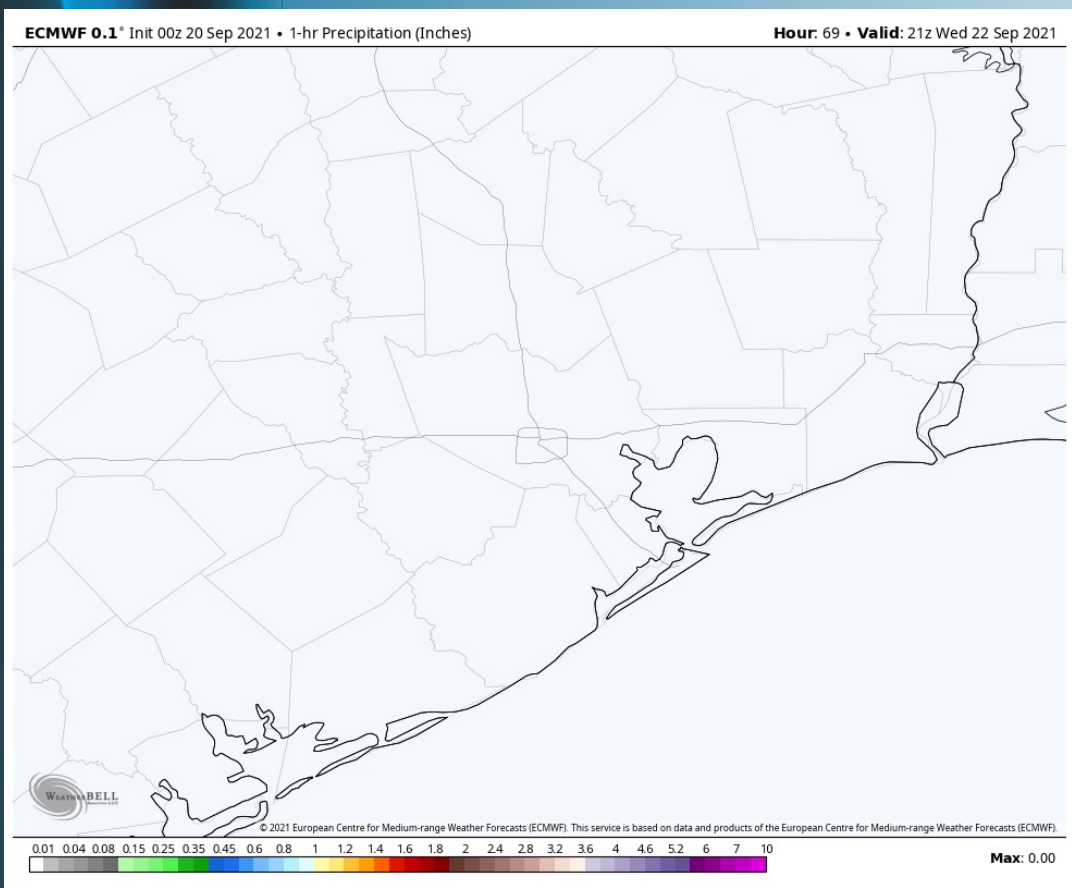
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Wednesday is expected to be a dry day.
- Winds Wednesday are expected to be quite breezy, sustained through early afternoon at 15-25 MPH out of the North, gusting at times up to 35 MPH. Late afternoon to evening winds weaken to 10-15 MPH sustained.
- High temperatures Wednesday look to dip down into the lower 80s behind the front.
 - *No fog is favored for Wednesday.*

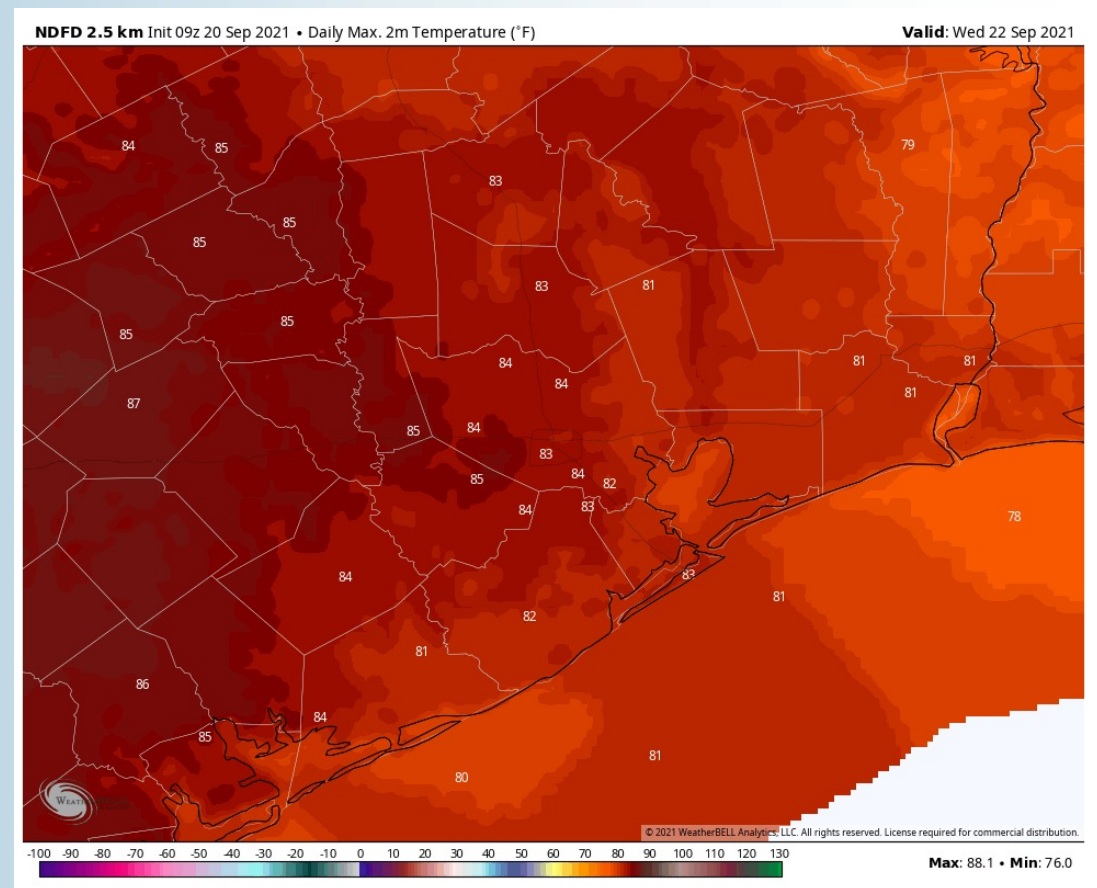
Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



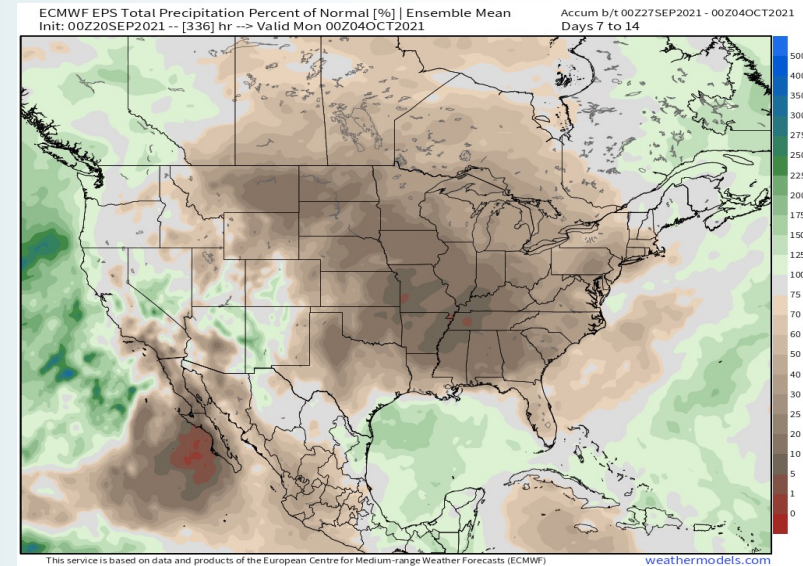
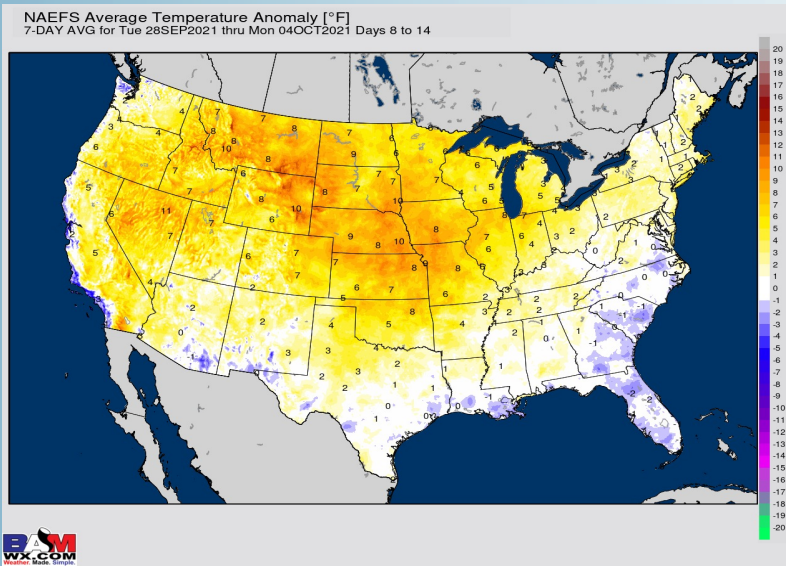
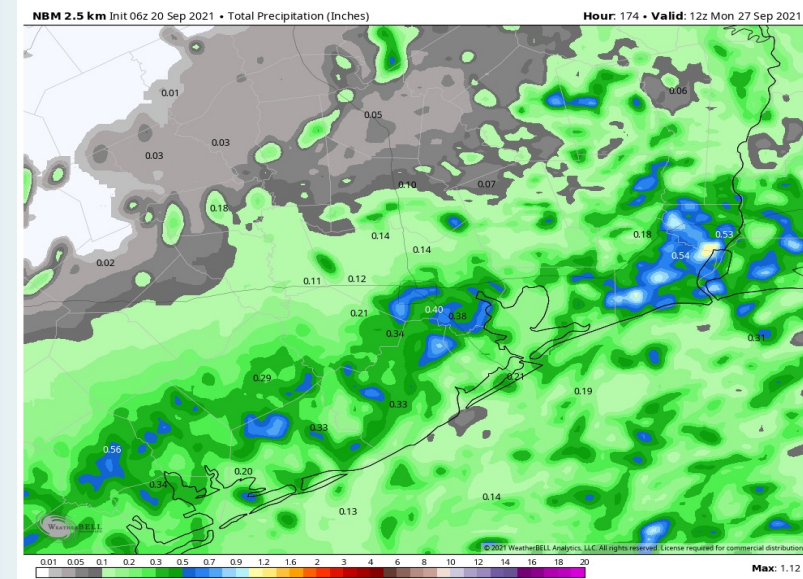
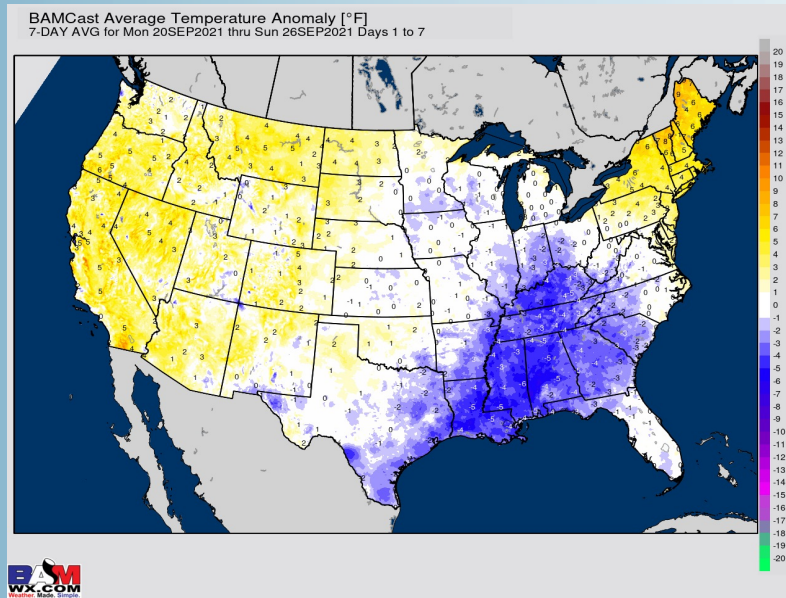
Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)



High Temperatures Wednesday

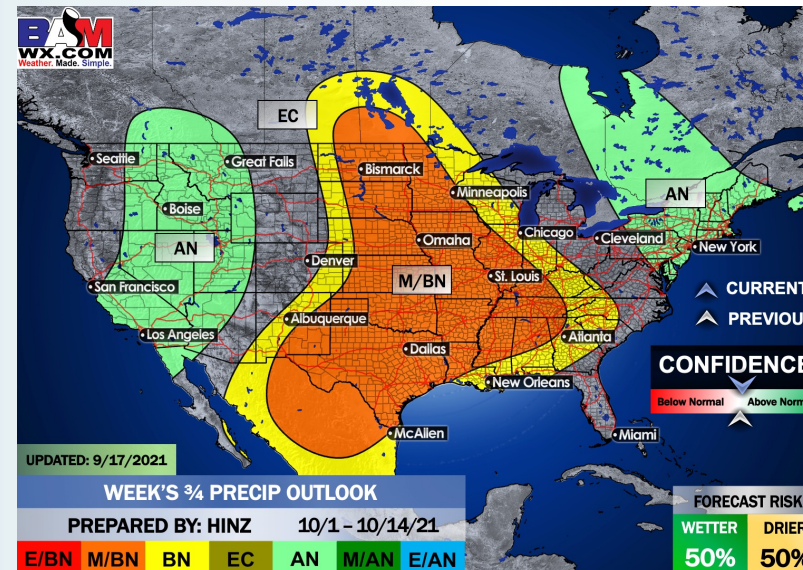
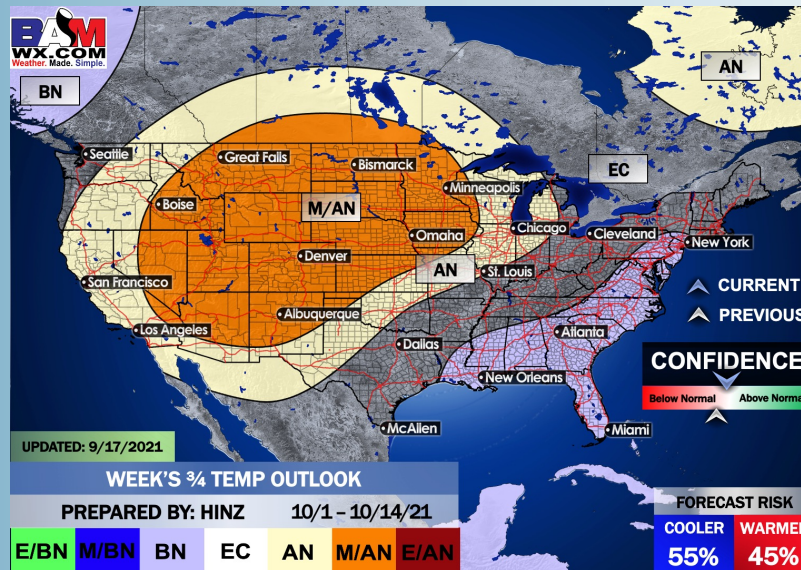


Week 1 Forecast

Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Eyeing scattered shower/storm chances on Tue/Wed, however the pattern moving forward looks to be rather dry. Temps likely sitting slightly below normal for this time of year.
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have slightly below average precipitation with near normal temperatures. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance, but will need to continue to monitor.
- Right now, we have the risk for slightly below normal temps and below normal precipitation for the weeks 3/4 period. While we are favoring a drier forecast for the upcoming weeks, we will continue to monitor for tropical disturbances during this time. All it takes is for one system for above normal rainfall. The forecast may ultimately be “boom or bust” in regards to precipitation potential.
