

ECMWF Ensemble 10-days Tracks




- We continue to favor the Gulf to remain quiet at least for the next 7-10 days. Current tropical activity is expected to stay confined to the Atlantic.


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Today is expected to be a dry day.
- Winds out through about ~9 AM will be 10-15 MPH sustained out of the NE, but the rest of the day winds will be out of the ENE, sustained 8-13 MPH with some gusts 13-18 MPH possible (mainly out through noon). Winds closer to sundown will start to weaken at 5-10 MPH sustained coming out of the ESE for the overnight.
- High temperatures look to stay near 80.
 - *No fog is expected today.*


Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)




High Temperatures Today




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Friday currently looks to be another dry day.
- Expecting winds on Friday will mainly be out of the east (some variations to ESE or ENE will be possible). Winds for much of the day will be 8-13 MPH with gusts up to 15 MPH for the boarding station, weaker for stations closer to downtown HOU.
- Friday's highs will be sitting in the lower 80s for our stations.
 - *Not anticipating fog for Friday.*


Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)




High Temperatures Friday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Saturday is favored to stay dry as well.
- Anticipating winds to be coming out of the NE for much of Saturday sustained at 5-10 MPH.
- High temps for Saturday will be hovering in the low to mid 80s.
- ***No fog is favored Saturday.***


Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)





Simulated Radar Snapshot (11 AM CT)



High Temps Saturday





Week 1 Forecast



Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- We likely stay dry out through at least Monday AM. Temps likely sitting slightly below normal for this time of year. Mon – Wed of the upcoming week will feature rain chances. Temps look to stay below average
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have slightly below average precipitation with near normal temperatures. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance, but will need to continue to monitor.
- Right now, we have average temps and risks for below normal precipitation for the weeks 3/4 period. While we are favoring a drier forecast for the upcoming weeks, we will continue to monitor for tropical disturbances during this time. All it takes is for one system for above normal rainfall. The forecast may ultimately be “boom or bust” in regards to precipitation potential.
