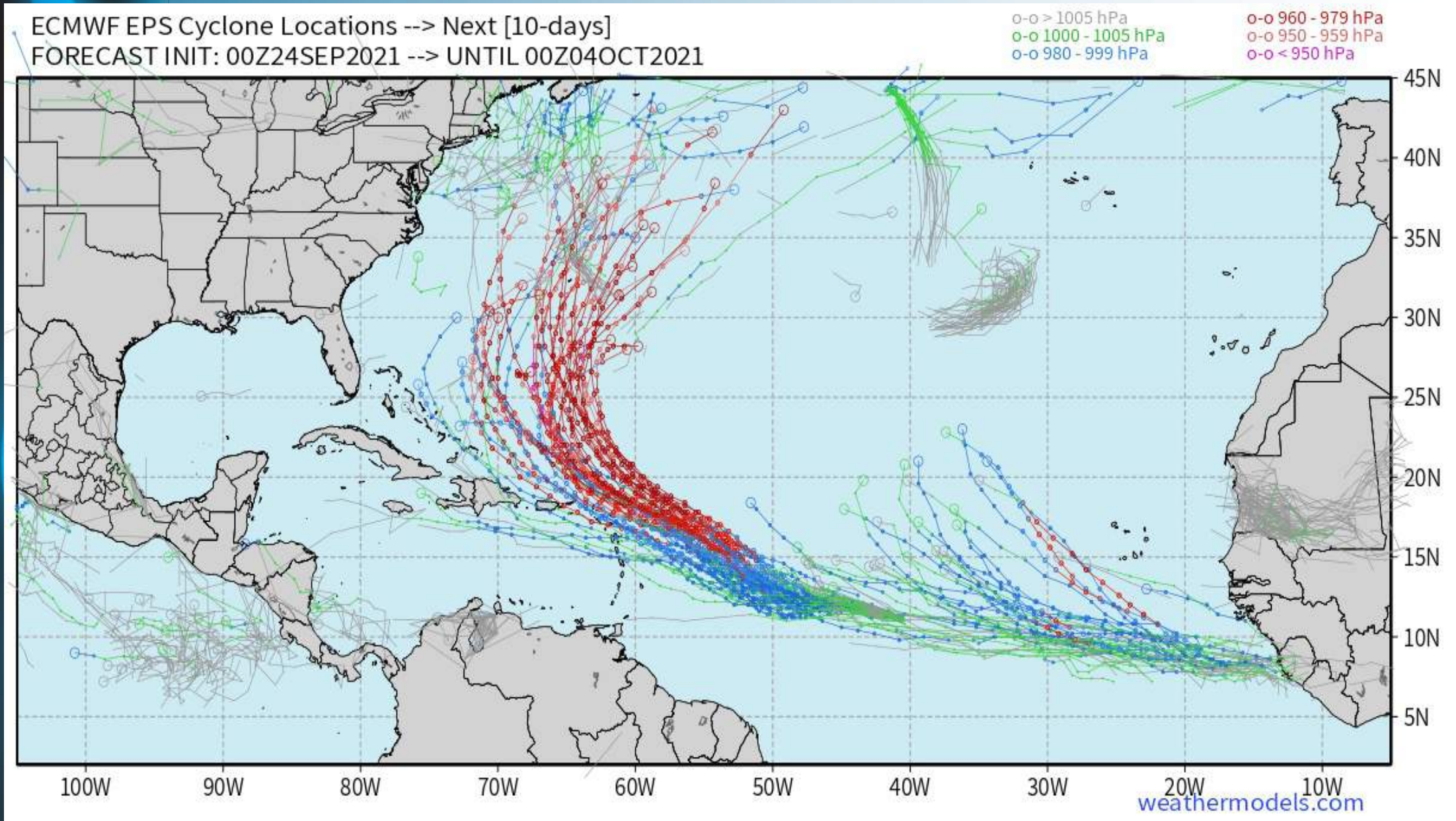

ECMWF Ensemble 10-days Tracks

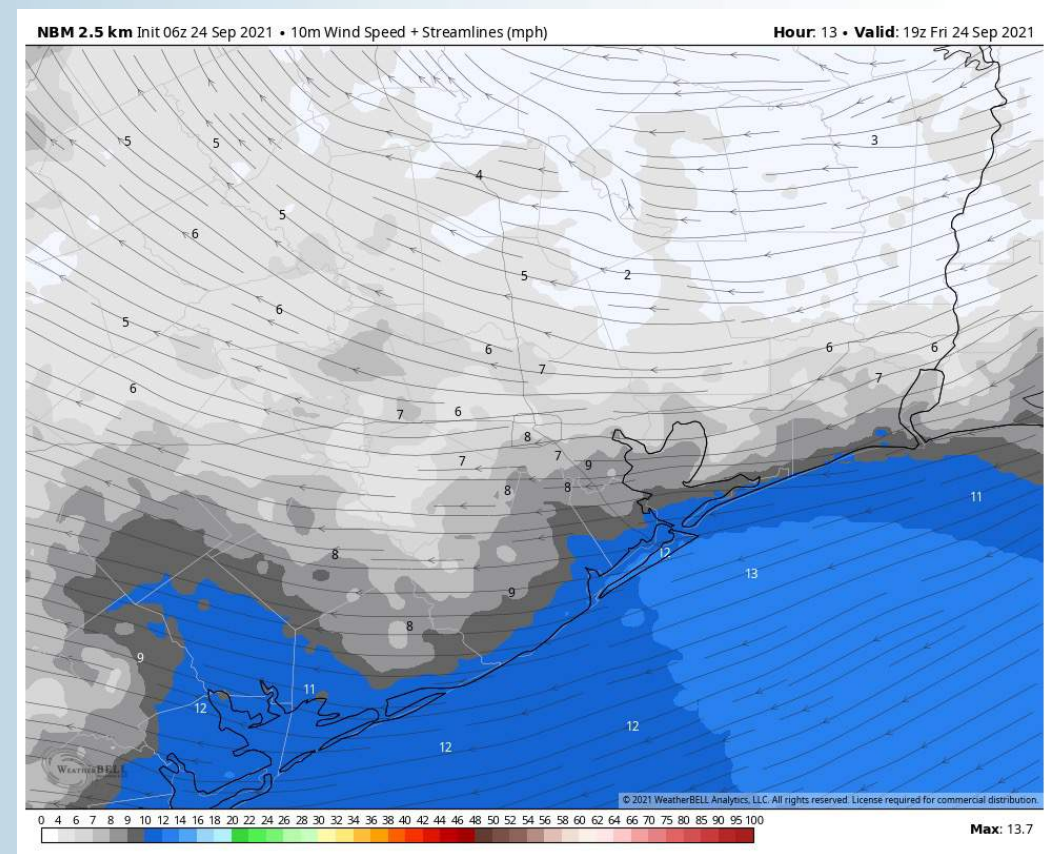


- We continue to favor the Gulf to remain quiet at least for the next 7-10 days. Current tropical activity is expected to stay confined to the Atlantic.

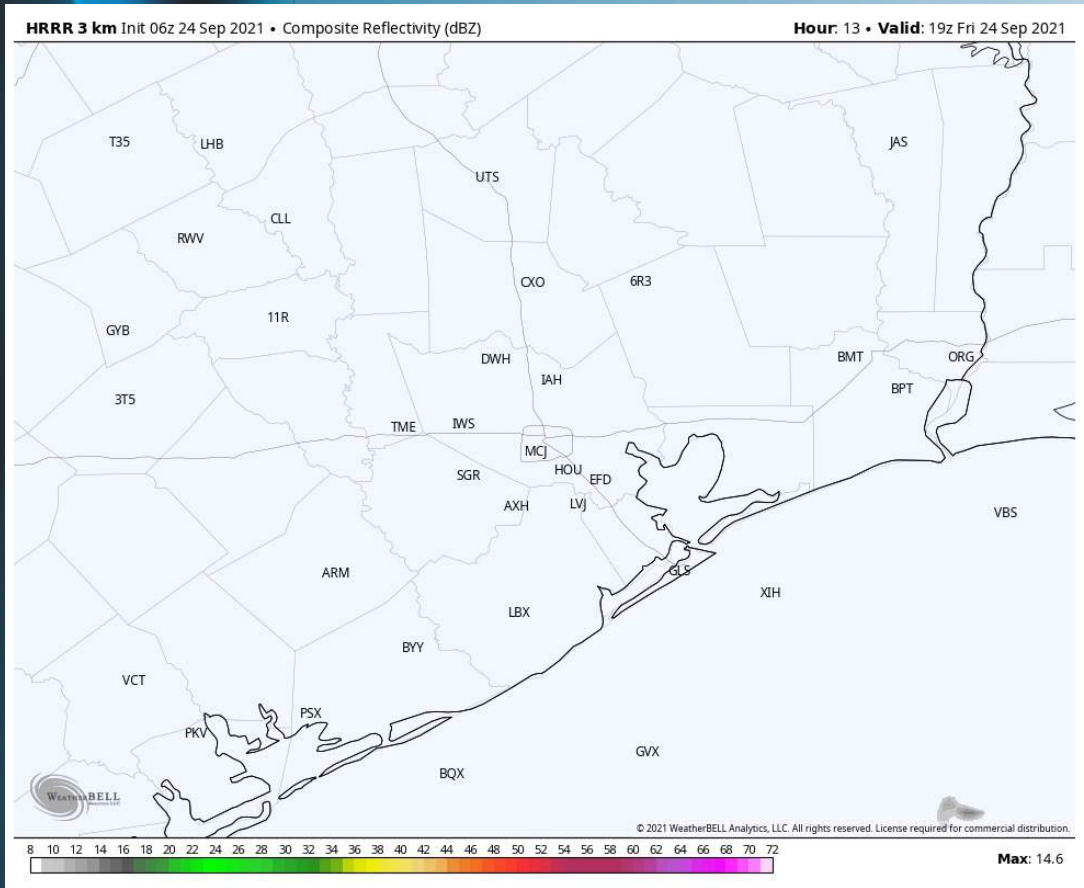
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Today looking to be a dry day.
- Continue to favor easterly winds throughout the day today. Winds pick up slightly into the morning/ early afternoon with some slight ENE/ESE variations. Winds look to be sustained around 8 – 13 MPH towards the boarding station with gust though about 20 MPH. Winds anticipated to be lighter towards Buffalo Bayou.
- Friday's highs will be sitting in the lower 80s for our stations.
- *Not anticipating fog for Friday.*

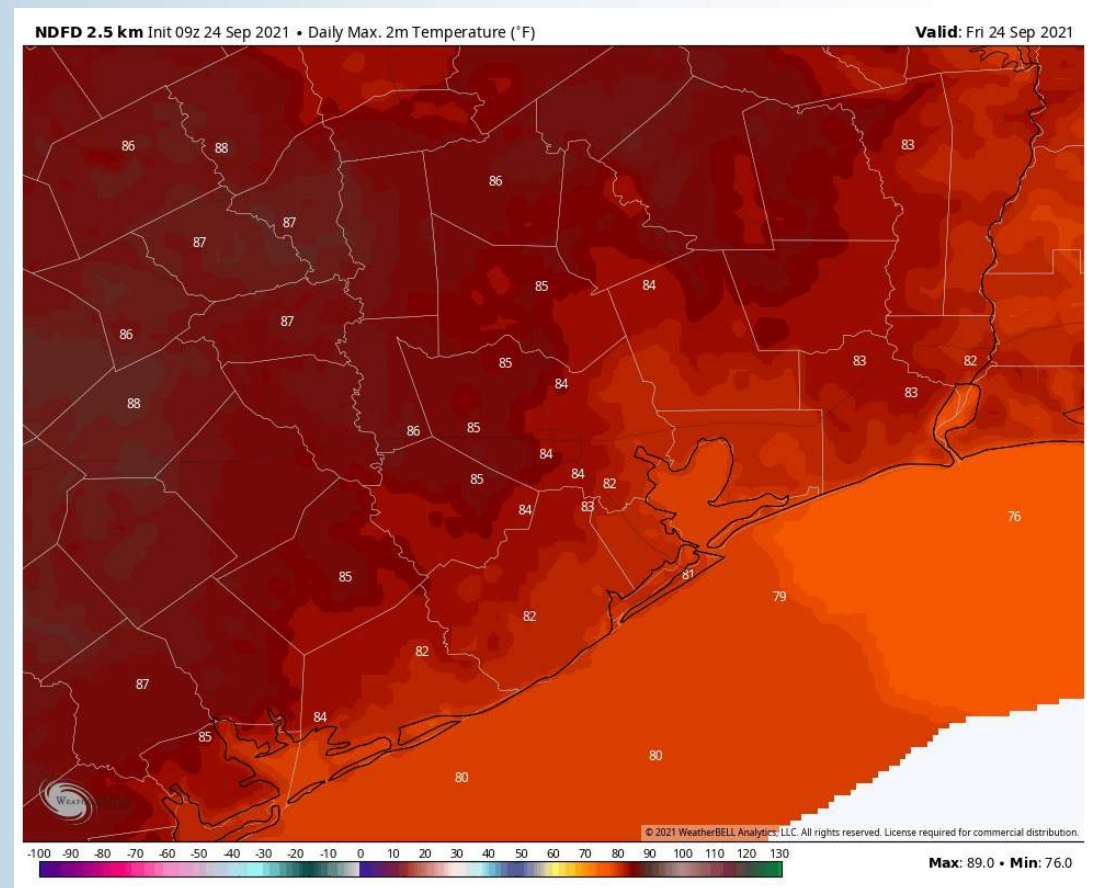
Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)



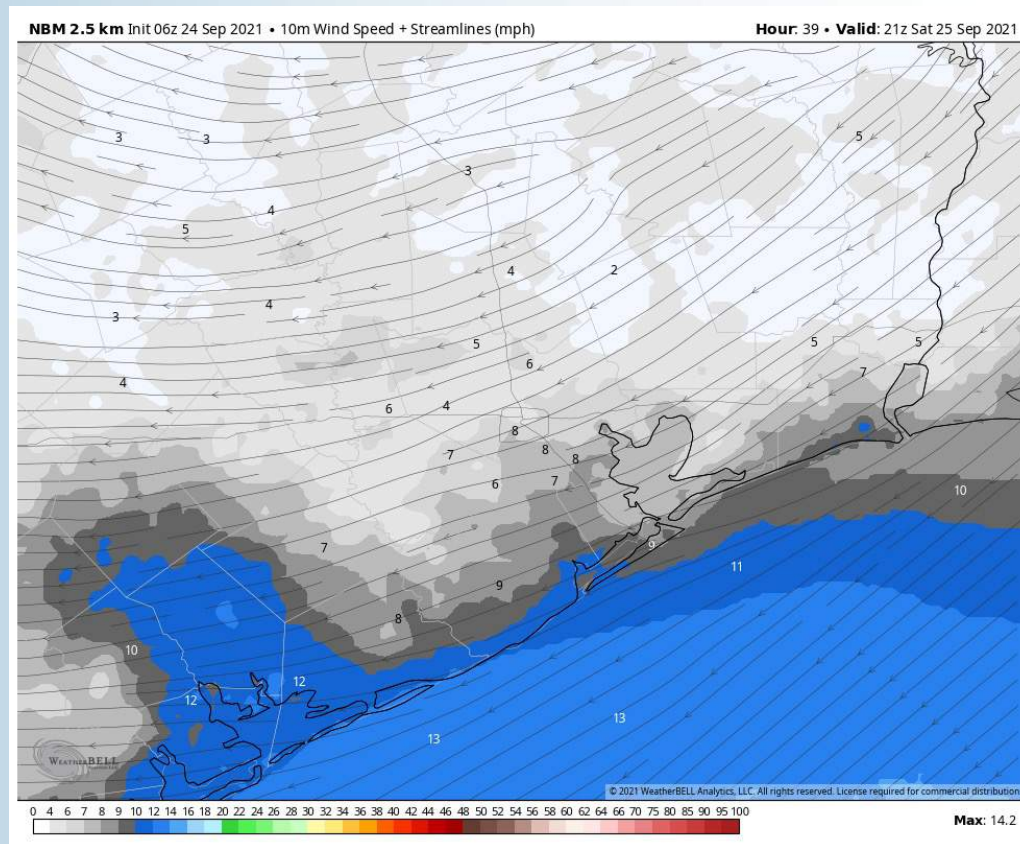
High Temperatures Friday



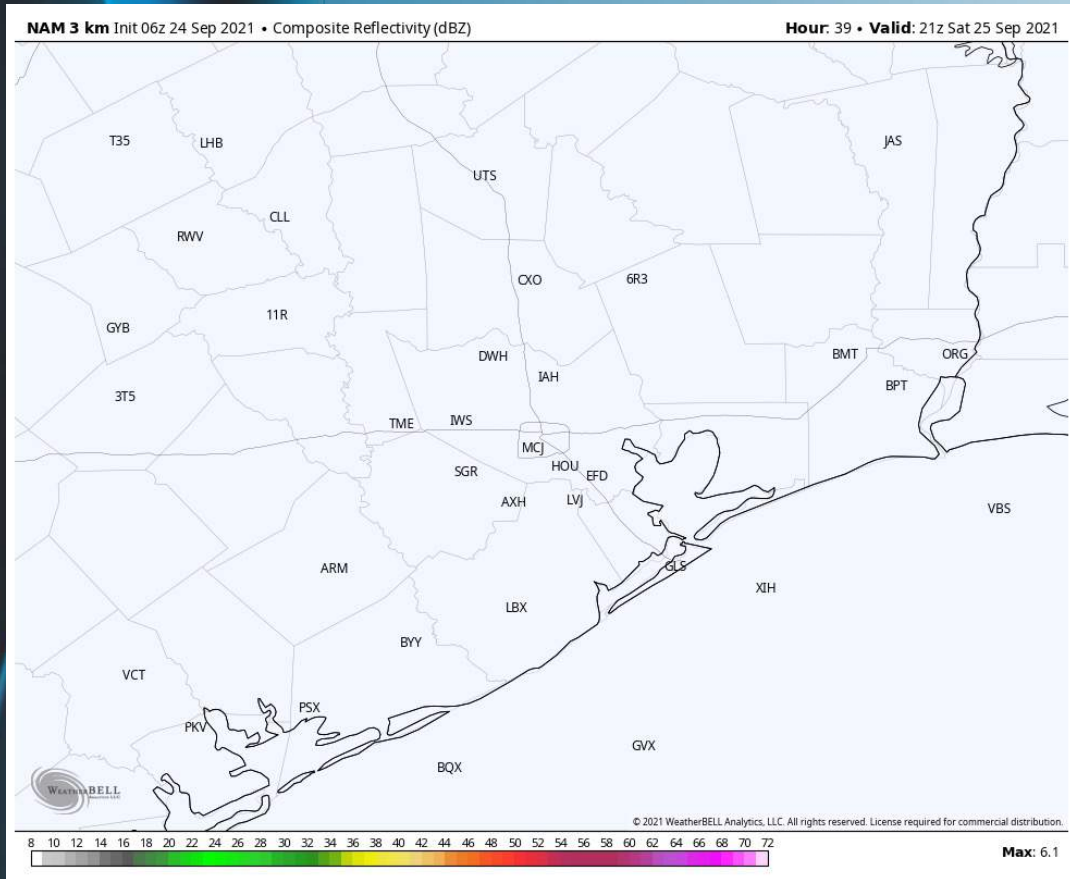
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Saturday is favored to stay dry as well.
- Winds shift more out of the NE in the very early morning hours of SAT. Winds remain out of the NE through about mid afternoon where winds start to shift more out of the SE heading into the evening. Winds are expected to generally be sustained around 5 – 10 MPH with gust up to 15 MPH possible.
- High temps for Saturday will be hovering in the low 80s.
 - *No fog is favored Saturday.*

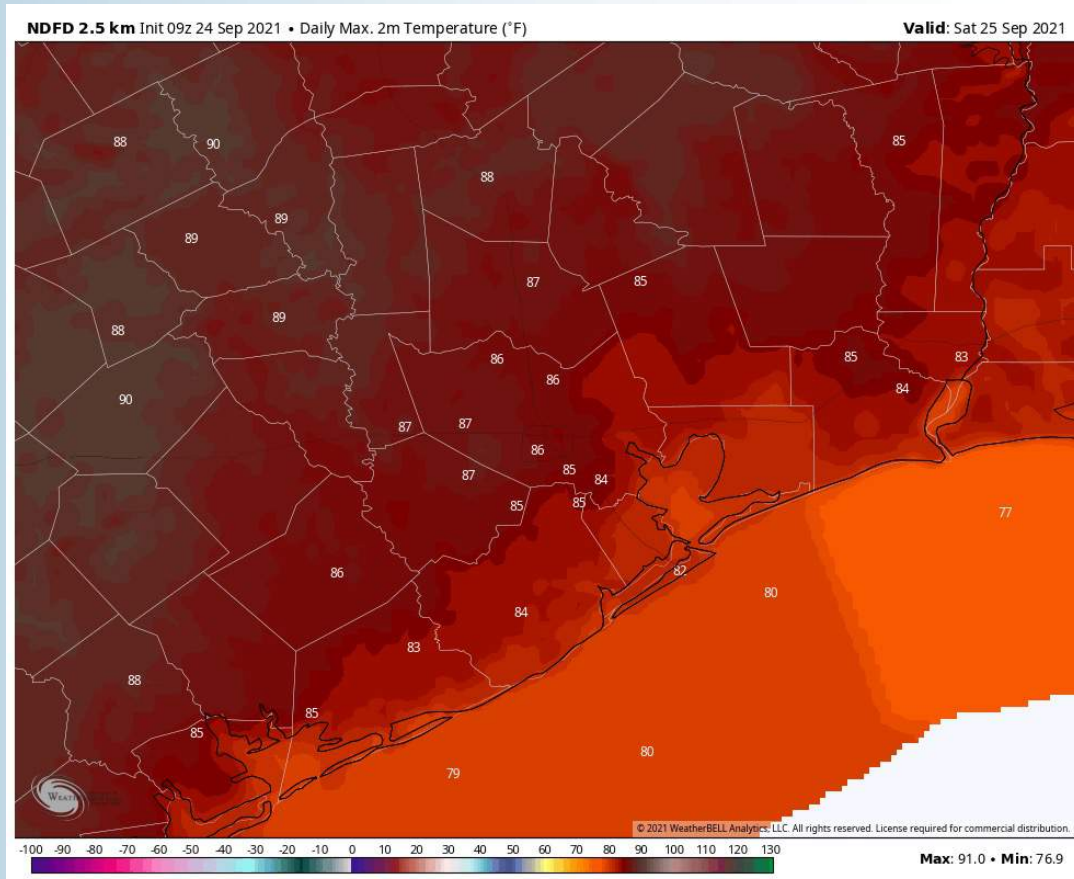
Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)



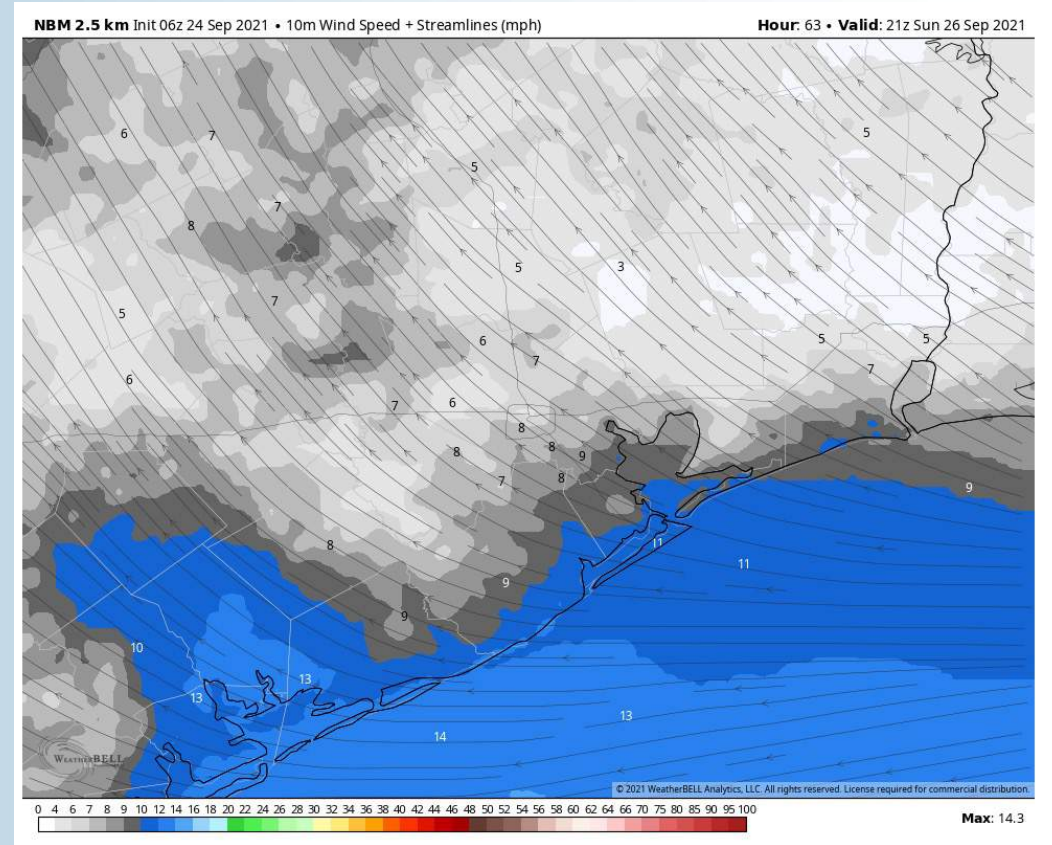
High Temps Saturday



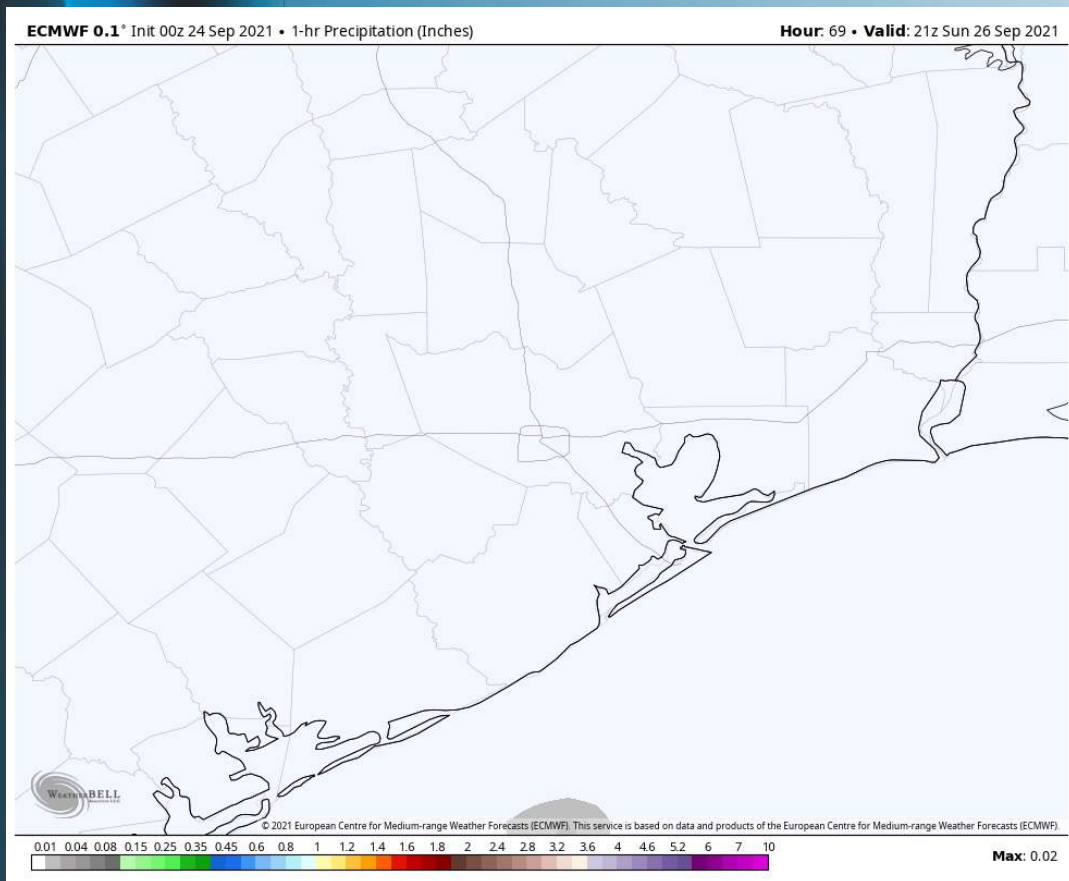
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Another dry day is on tap for the HOU area.
- Winds will generally be out of the E/ SE for most of the day, sustained around 5 – 10 MPH with gust up to 15 MPH possible.
- High Temperatures look to get into the low to mid 80's F.
 - *No fog is expected Sunday.*

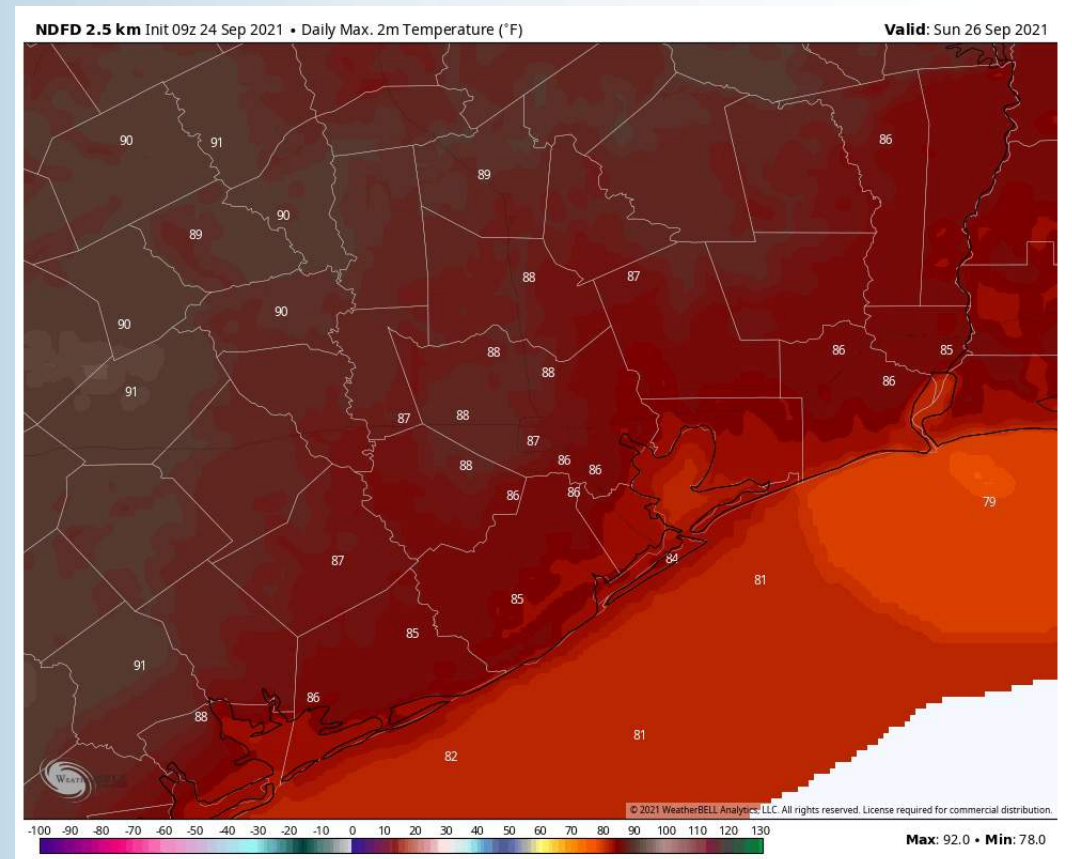
Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)

High Temps Sunday



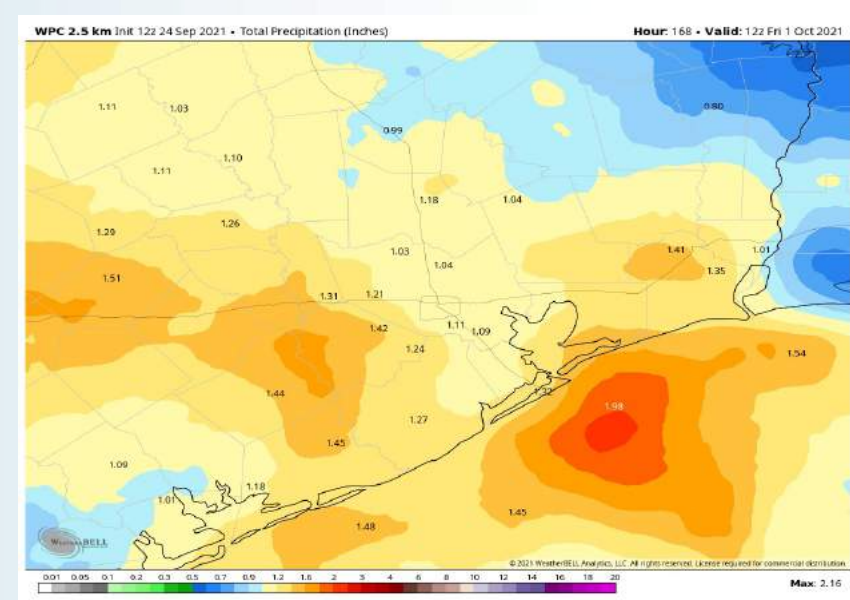
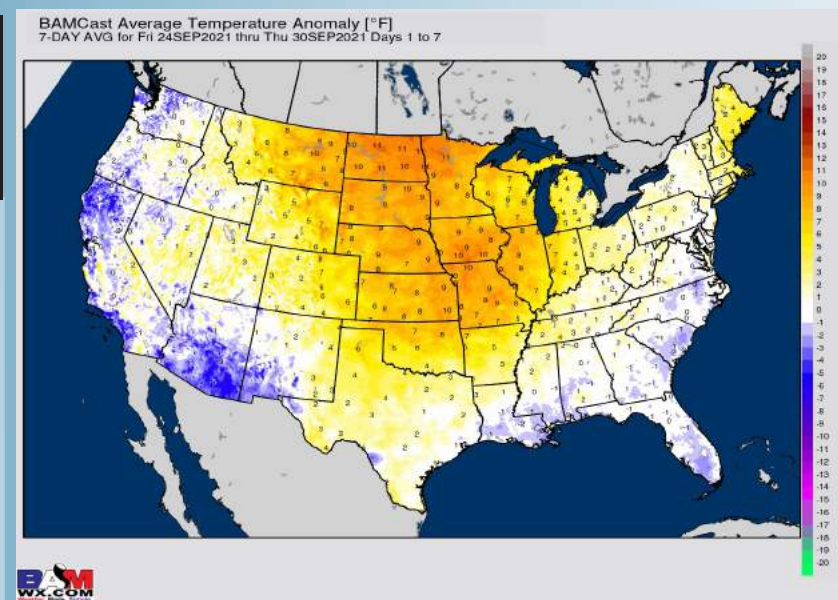
Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- A quiet weekend gives way to scattered, daily precipitation chances MON - FRI. A few locally heavy downpours will be possible throughout the week. Temps slowly warm up as well with temperature averaging out near normal.

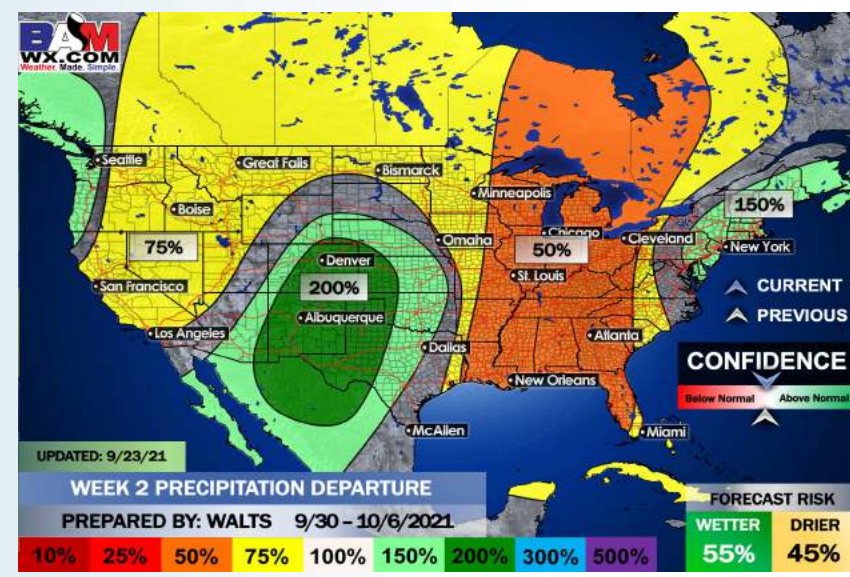
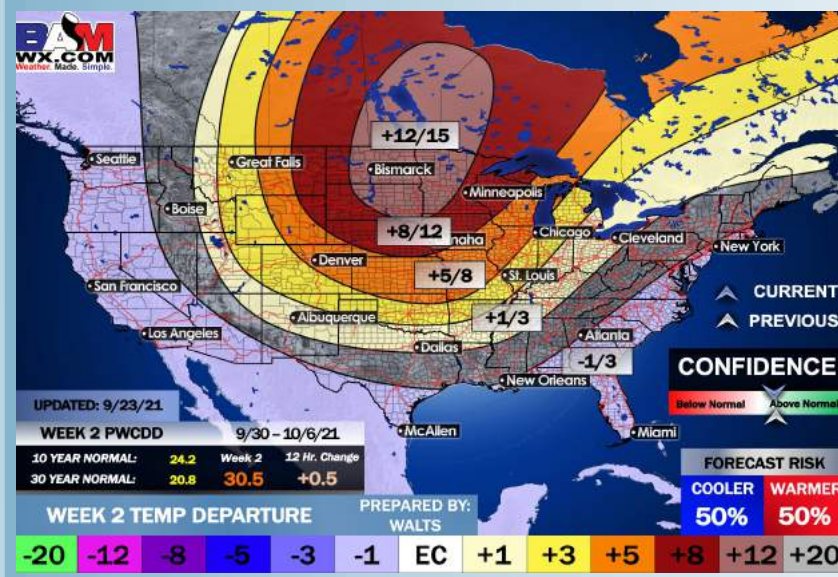
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have slightly below average precipitation with slightly below normal temperatures. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance, but will need to continue to monitor.

- Right now, we have average temps and risks for below normal precipitation for the weeks 3/4 period. While we are favoring a drier forecast for the upcoming weeks, we will continue to monitor for tropical disturbances during this time. All it takes is for one system to produce above normal rainfall. The forecast may ultimately be “boom or bust” in regards to precipitation potential.
