

Tropical Update:

ECMWF EPS 10-days Tracks




- We continue to favor the Gulf to remain quiet at least for the next 7-10 days. Current tropical activity is expected to stay confined to the Atlantic.


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Expecting coverage of precipitation to increase here as we work deeper into the morning with showers and thunderstorms. Chances really start to increase (~70%) beyond ~10 AM and continue out through about ~5 PM before precip likely becomes a bit more isolated and lighter (~40% for the evening) . In the middle part of the day, locally heavy downpours will be possible as well as lightning and temporarily reduced visibility from precip.
- Winds much of today will be coming out of the SW at 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 MPH possible at the boarding station. When the heaviest of precip works through we need to keep an eye on elevated winds. In the 11 AM – 5 PM period, sustained winds within precip of 15-20 MPH with gusts 20-30 will be possible.
 - Highs look to be in the mid to upper 80s .
 - *No fog is favored for today.*


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (11 AM CT)




High Temperatures Today




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Expecting continued precip chances into Wednesday. A touch higher confidence that the best surge of moisture would come in the ~4-9 AM window (~60-70%) with chances becoming a bit more scattered into the late AM and afternoon hours (~30-40%). A few locally heavier downpours will be possible.
- Wednesday's winds look to mainly come out of the SSE at 8-13 MPH sustained with gusts to 15 MPH possible in the afternoon. Stronger precipitation does hold the potential to bring slightly stronger winds.
- Not much change in temps, Wednesday highs are expected to sit in the mid to upper 80s.
- *No fog is anticipated for Wednesday.*


Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (8 AM CT)




High Temps Wednesday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Precip chances extend into Thursday with multiple rounds of moisture working through the area.
- Winds are expected to be coming out of the SSE at 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 MPH possible. Heavier winds will be possible in the strongest of precip.
- High Temps favored to be in the low to mid 80s.
- *Not anticipating fog for Thursday.*


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)





High Temps Thursday





Week 1 Forecast

Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Scattered precip chances will be possible almost daily out into the upcoming weekend. A few locally heavy downpours will be possible throughout the week. Temps slowly warm up as well with temperatures averaging out slightly above normal.
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have slightly below average temps with slightly above normal precipitation. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance, but will need to continue to monitor.
- Right now, we have risks for slightly above normal temps and near normal to slightly above normal precip for the weeks 3/4 period. We will continue to monitor for tropical disturbances during this time. All it takes is for one system to produce above normal rainfall. The forecast may ultimately be “boom or bust” in regards to precipitation potential.
