

## ECMWF EPS 10-days Tracks




- We continue to favor the Gulf to remain quiet at least for the next 7-10 days. Current tropical activity is expected to stay confined to the Atlantic.




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry conditions today.
- Winds most of Wednesday look to be out of the NNE/NE out through ~2 PM, becoming variable mid to late afternoon, and then switching to a S/SE flow beyond sundown. Sustained winds 5-10 MPH for our stations with gusts up to 15 MPH possible out through 11 AM at the boarding station.
- Highs look to be in the mid to upper 80s.
- **Fog is not expected for the day.**


## Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (11 AM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry conditions look to continue for Thursday.
- Winds Wednesday night to daybreak Thu will mainly be coming out of the S. From sunrise to ~6 PM, winds are out of the N/NE at 5-10 MPH sustained before flipping out of the SE Thu evening & remaining calmer.
- Highs once again are favored to work into the mid to upper 80s.
- *No fog favored for our stations Thursday, any patchy fog would stay away from our stations (develop further inland).*


## Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- High pressure overhead will keep winds variable in direction and light, 5-10 MPH sustained for the stations.
- Highs Friday once again sit in the mid to upper 80s.
- *Fog is not anticipated Friday.*


## Sustained Winds (10 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (10 PM CT)








## Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Rain chances look to be minimal as we have a rather inactive week ahead. Temperatures average out to slightly above normal for the week ahead.
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have slightly above average temps with slightly below normal precip risks. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance but will need to continue to monitor for potential development.
- Right now, we have risks for slightly below normal temps and normal to slightly below normal precip for the weeks 3/4 period. We will continue to monitor for tropical disturbances during this time. All it takes is for one system to produce above normal rainfall. The forecast may ultimately be “boom or bust” regarding precipitation potential.
