

ECMWF EPS 10-days Tracks




- We continue to favor the Gulf to remain quiet at least for the next 7-10 days. Current tropical activity is expected to stay confined to the Atlantic.


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry conditions look to continue for today.
- Winds are out of the N/NE at 5-10 MPH sustained until ~4 PM before flipping out of the SE for the remainder of the day.
- Highs once again are favored to work into the mid to upper 80s.
 - *No fog favored for our stations today.*


Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)




High Temps Today




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Friday is expected to be a dry day.
- High pressure overhead will keep winds light at 5-10 MPH, mainly coming from the NE in the morning hours before flipping back to the SE in the afternoon hours.
- Highs Friday once again sit in the mid to upper 80s.
- *Fog is not anticipated Friday for our stations, however some patchy fog further inland cannot be ruled out in the AM hours.*


Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)




High Temps Friday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry stretch will continue through Saturday.
- Saturday's winds look to be coming out of the SE for much of the day at 8-13 MPH.
- Saturday should bring temps similar to the last few days, mid to upper 80s.
- **Fog is not expected for our day Saturday.**


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)





High Temps Saturday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Rain chances look to be minimal as we have a rather inactive week ahead. Temperatures average out to slightly above normal for the week ahead.
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have slightly above average temps with slightly below normal precip risks. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance but will need to continue to monitor for potential development.
- Right now, we have risks for slightly below normal temps and normal to slightly below normal precip for the weeks 3/4 period. We will continue to monitor for tropical disturbances during this time. All it takes is for one system to produce above normal rainfall. The forecast may ultimately be “boom or bust” regarding precipitation potential.
