

## ECMWF EPS 10-days Tracks




• We continue to favor the Gulf to remain quiet at least for the next 7-10 days.




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry conditions look to continue for today.
- Winds are out of the N/NE at 5-10 MPH sustained until ~6 PM before flipping out of the SE for the remainder of today/evening.
- Lows dip into the mid 60s inland, closer to the mid 70s for most of our stations.
- *No fog favored for our stations this evening.*


## Sustained Winds (10 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (11 PM CT)




## Low Temps This Evening




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Friday is expected to be a dry day.
- High pressure overhead will keep winds light at 5-10 MPH, mainly coming from the NE in the morning hours before flipping back to the SE in the afternoon hours.
- Highs Friday once again sit in the mid to upper 80s.
  - ***\*\*Fog is not anticipated Friday for our stations, however some patchy fog a little further inland cannot be ruled out in the AM hours. Best threat for this comes in the 5-9 AM hours of Fri\*\****


## Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry stretch will continue through Saturday.
- Saturday's winds look to be coming out of the SE for much of the day at 8-13 MPH.
- Saturday should bring temps similar to the last few days, mid to upper 80s.
- **Fog is not expected for our day Saturday.**


## Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)








## Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temps will continue to remain above average for this time of year for most of the US, however we are watching for some light rain chances to return to the forecast Sun and continuing into Tuesday.
  
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have slightly above average temps with slightly above normal precip risks. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance but will need to continue to monitor for potential development.
  
- Right now, we have risks for slightly below normal temps and normal to slightly below normal precip for the weeks 3/4 period. We will continue to monitor for tropical disturbances during this time. All it takes is for one system to produce above normal rainfall. The forecast may ultimately be “boom or bust” regarding precipitation potential.
