

ECMWF EPS 10-days Tracks




• We continue to favor the Gulf to remain quiet at least for the next 7-10 days.


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Our front has approached the area and precip will continue to be likely out through the mid-AM hours. Any cells along this front hold the potential for briefly heavy rain, lightning, a heavier downpour, elevated winds, and briefly reduced visibility (best chances for worst conditions come in the 5-7 AM window). Lingering isolated showers will be possible behind the front through around midday. Anticipating drier conditions for the PM hours.
- Winds will slowly calm throughout the day today. Winds are likely at their peak now (5 AM) and weaken a touch as the front approaches. As the front moves through around ~7 AM, winds shift from the NW at 10-20 MPH sustained. Into the afternoon, winds continue out of the NW at 8-13 MPH sustained before weakening to 5-10 MPH near sundown.
 - High temps look to get into the mid to upper 80's F.
 - *Fog is not anticipated, but briefly reduced visibility from the line of showers/storms is certainly possible.*


Sustained Winds (7 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (8 AM CT)




High Temps Today




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Much of Tuesday is favored to stay dry, however a ~20% of a few light showers in the AM hours out through the mid afternoon hours cannot be fully ruled out given the SE flow that increases moisture flow into the area. Coverage would be quite isolated and light in intensity.
- Winds continue the SE theme on Tuesday and look to be slightly elevated, sustained at 10-15 MPH with gusts to 15-20 MPH possible throughout the day.
- Expecting another day of highs in the mid to upper 80s for our stations.
 - **Not favoring fog for Tuesday.**


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)




High Temps Tuesday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Wednesday at this distance is favored to be a dry day around the area.
- Winds continue coming out of the SE at 10-15 MPH with some gusts 15-20 MPH possible.
- Mid to high 80s are again favored for the day Wednesday.
- **Fog is not expected for Wednesday.**


Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)

High Temps Wednesday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temps will continue to remain above average for this time of year, we are watching for some rain chances to return to the forecast today and continuing into Tuesday, including a cold front Mon AM. Additional hit and miss chances will be possible into next weekend as well.



- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have slightly below normal temps with near normal to slightly above normal precip risks. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance, but will need to continue to monitor for potential development.

- Right now, we have risks for slightly below normal temps and normal to slightly below normal precip for the weeks 3/4 period. We will continue to monitor for tropical disturbances during this time. All it takes is for one system to produce above normal rainfall. The forecast may ultimately be “boom or bust” regarding precipitation potential.
