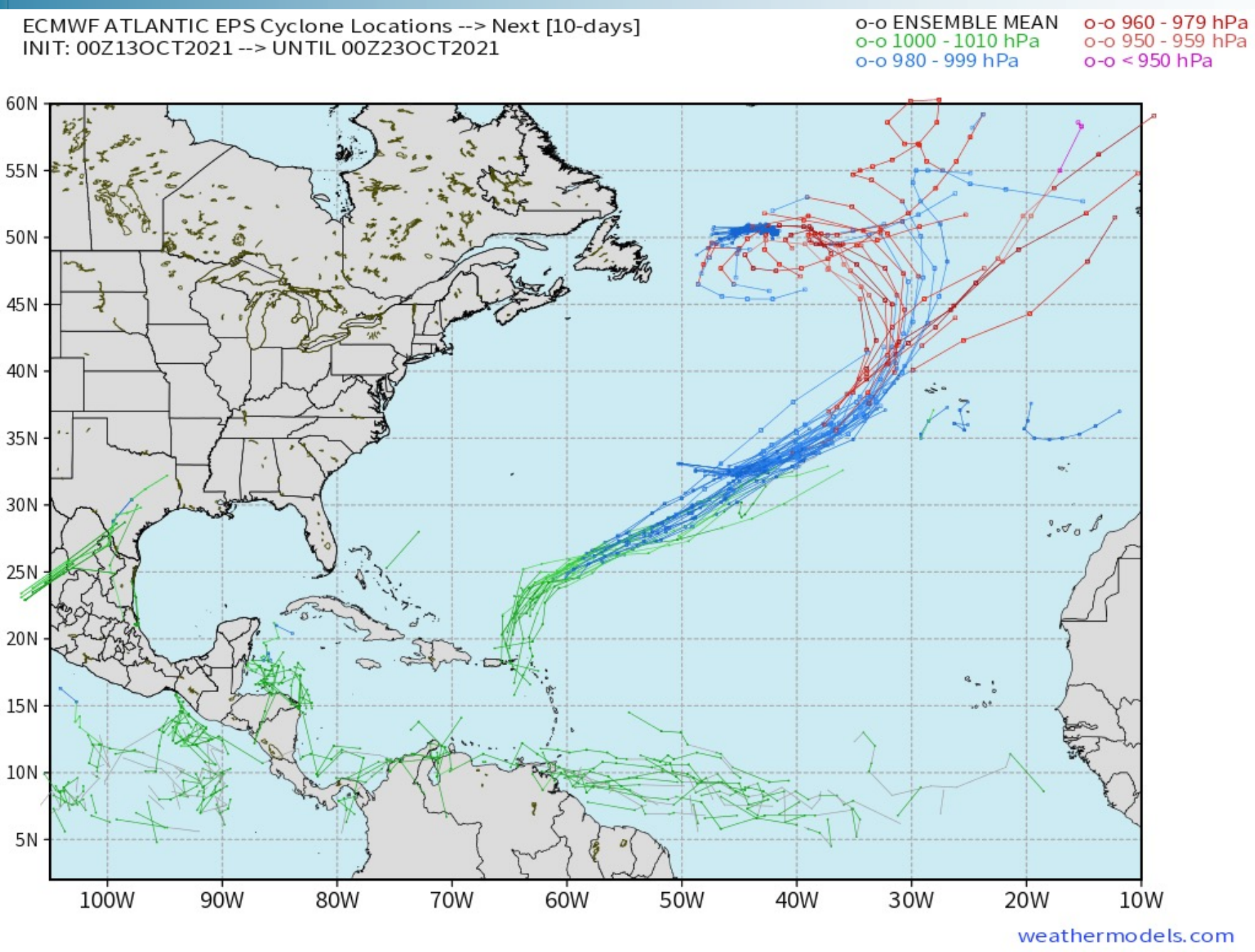

ECMWF EPS 10-days Tracks

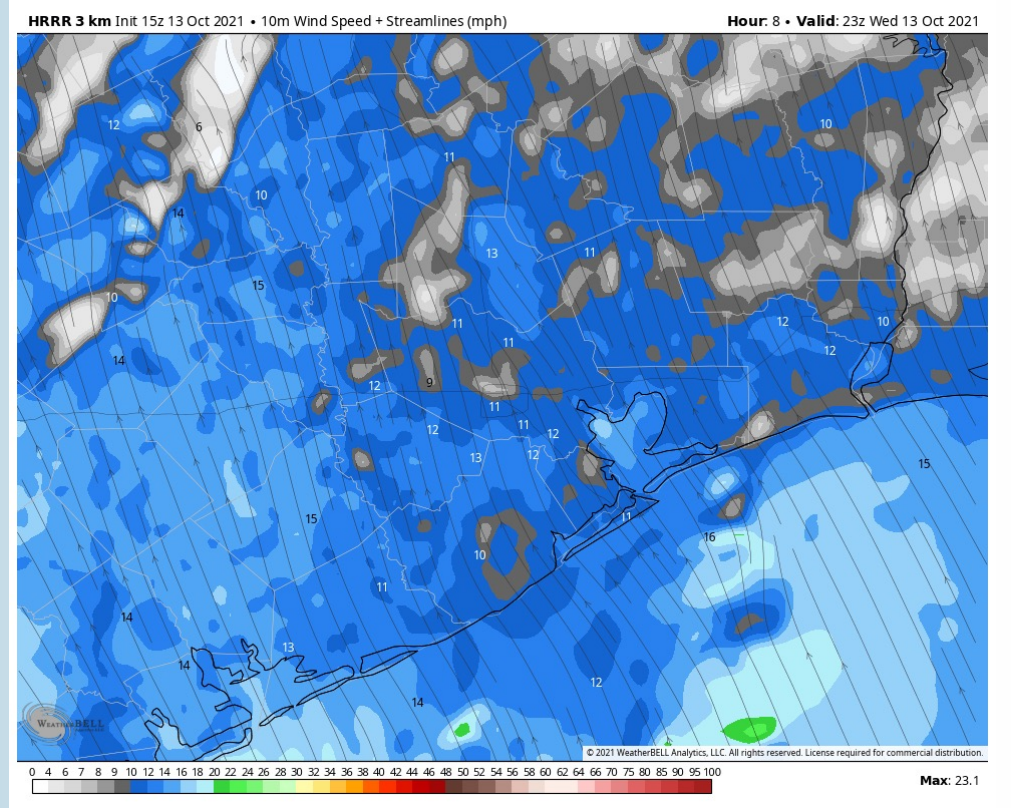


• We continue to favor the Gulf to remain quiet at least for the next 7-10 days.

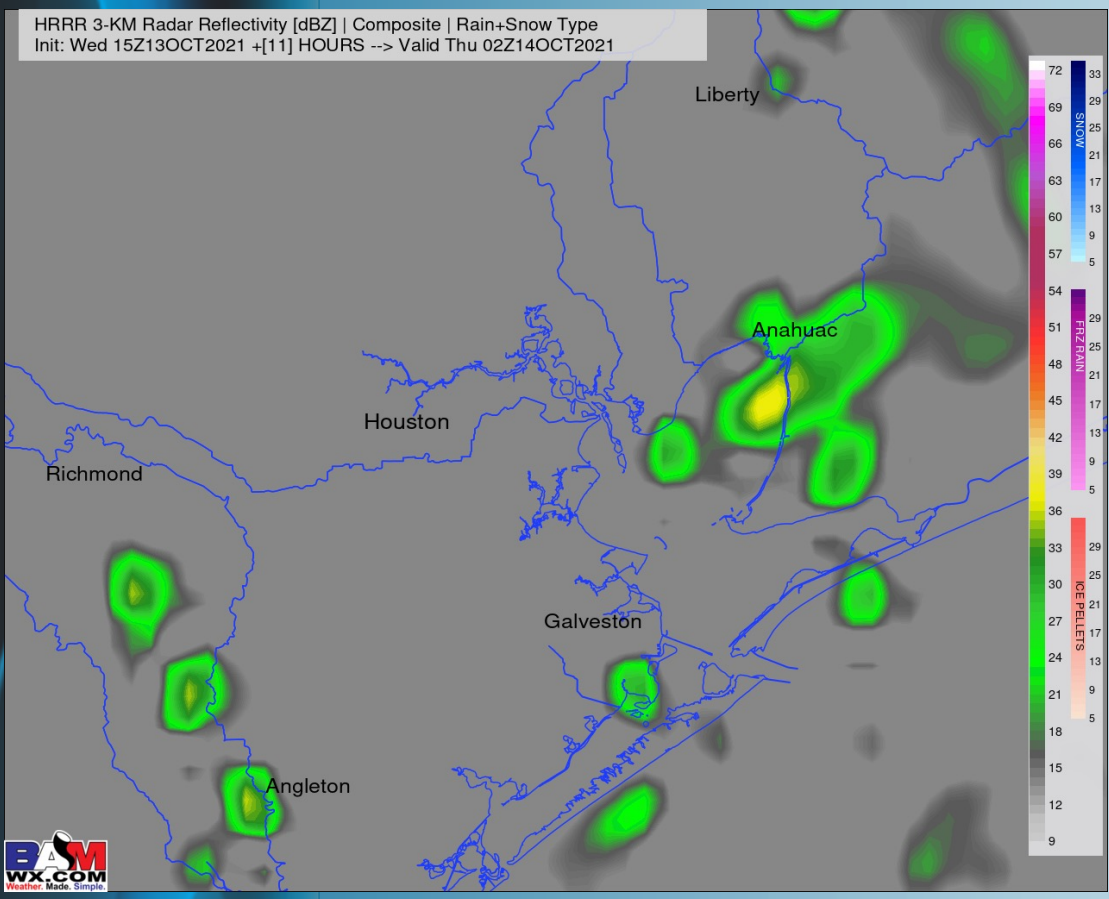
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Continue to favor mostly dry conditions with only very isolated chances the remainder of the afternoon. Chances start to pick up slightly around 7 – 8 PM this evening through the overnight. Overall, moisture is anticipated to be on the lighter side.
- Winds look to continue to remain a bit elevated today sustained out of the SSE. Winds this afternoon are generally expected to be in the 10 – 15 MPH range with gust near 20 MPH at times. After sundown, winds may pick up a little, closer to 12- 18 MPH sustained with gust near 25 MPH.
- Low temperatures look to get into the lower 80's F tonight. Slightly cooler temperatures expected towards the HOU metro area.
- **Fog is not expected for today to tonight.**

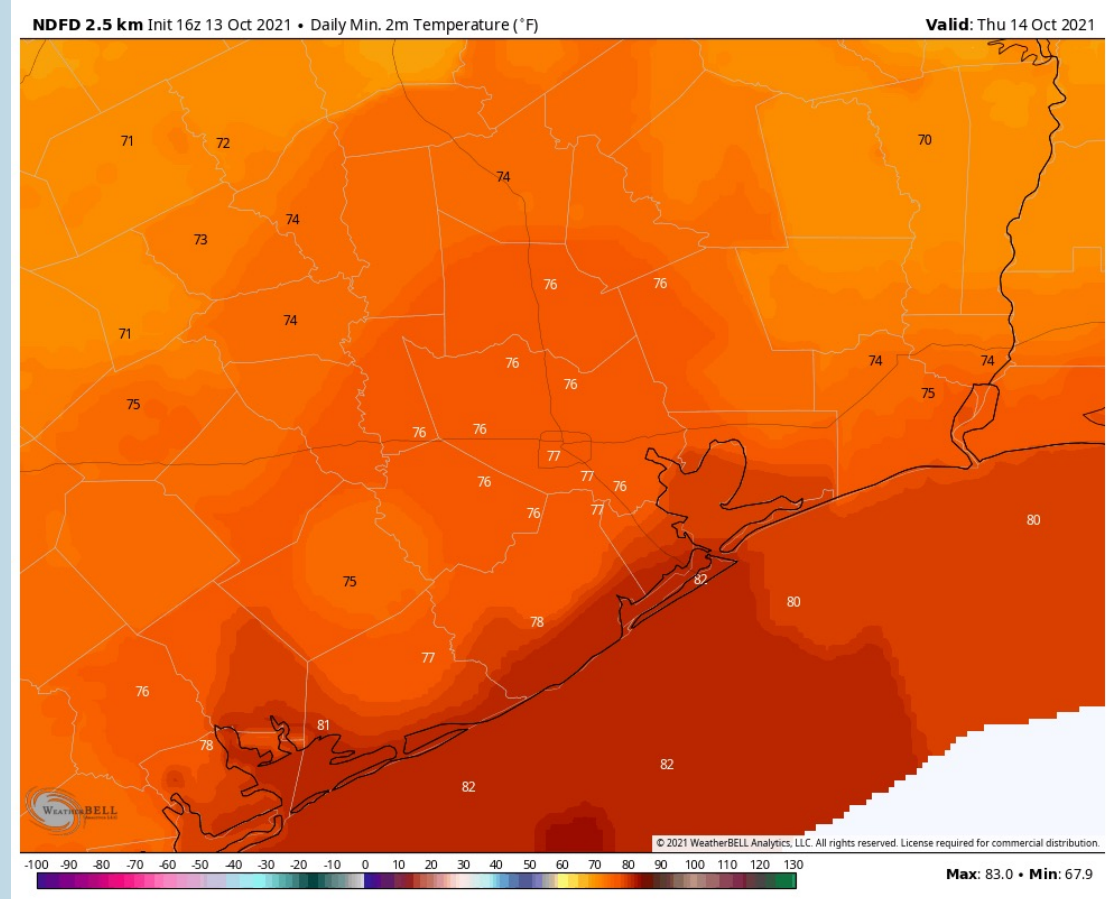
Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 PM CT)



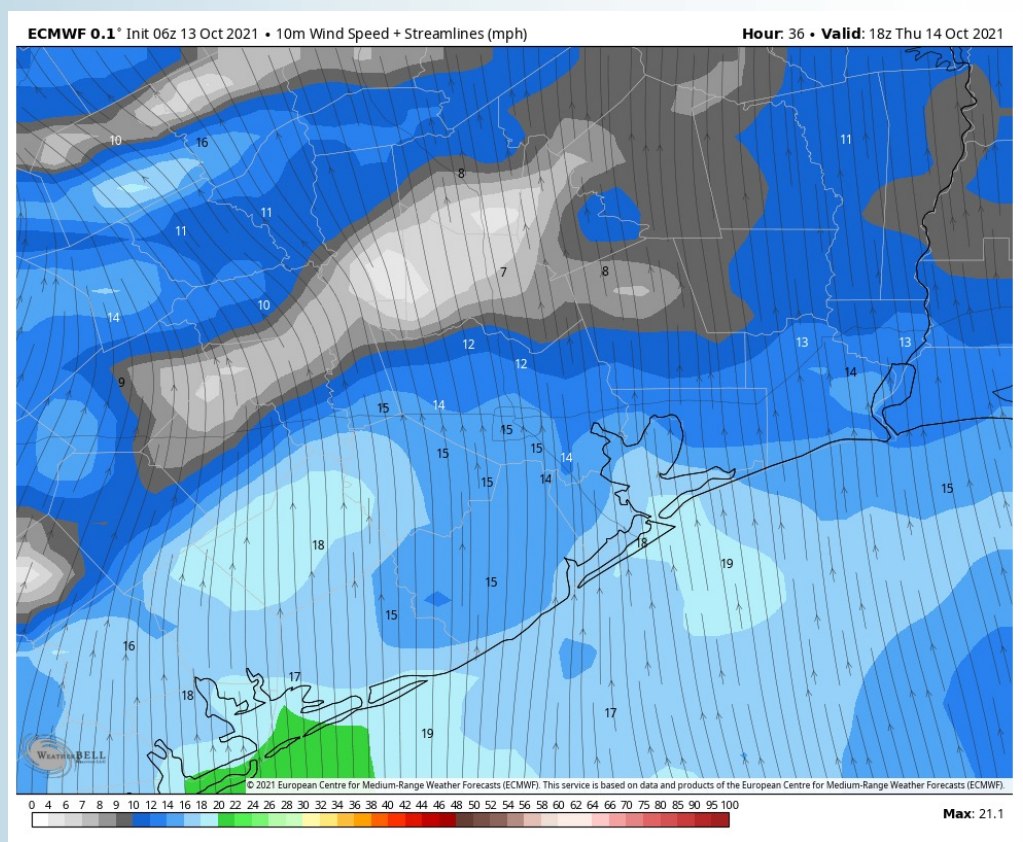
Low Temps THU morning



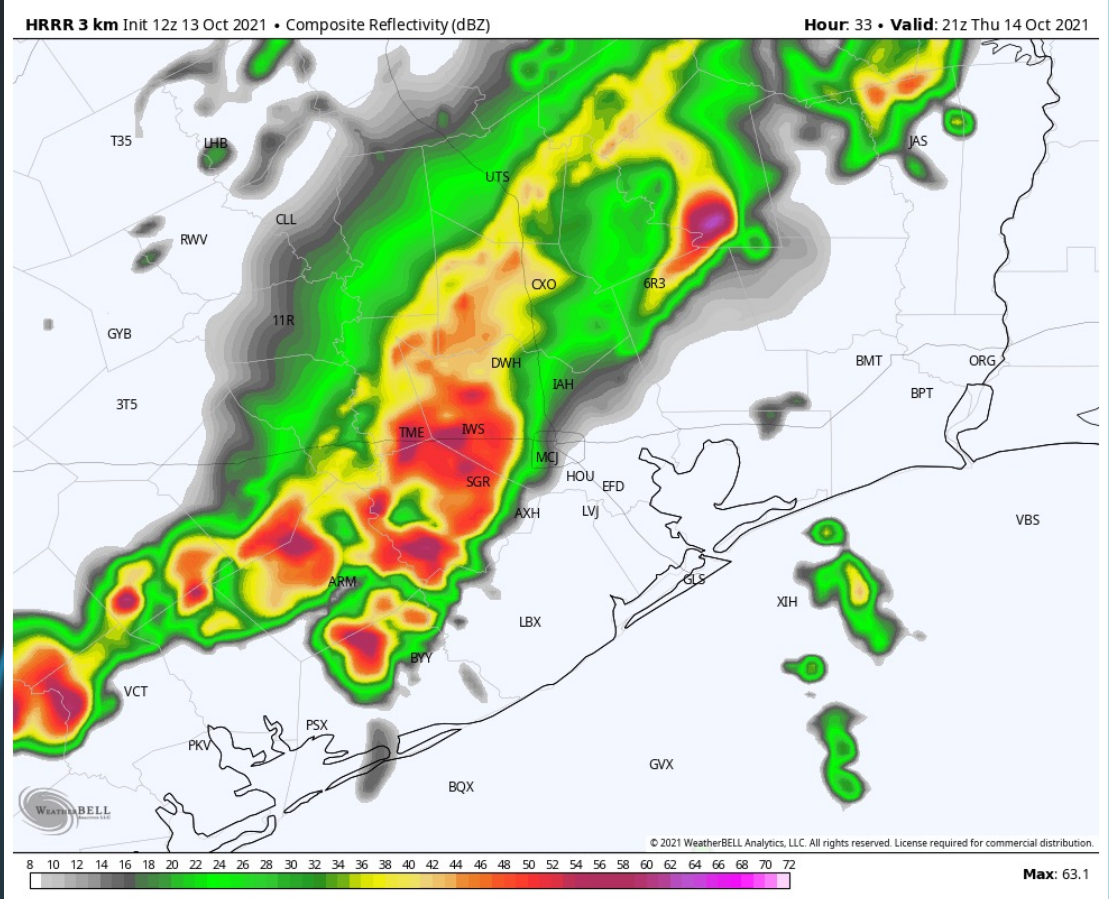
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Right now, Thursday AM looks to have isolated showers across the stations, but nothing widespread or impactful. A break in precip is expected later in the morning to mid-afternoon...however, we are watching closely for a potential cluster of storms along and west of the the HOU metro area after 4-6 PM through sunset that will need monitored for in future updates (right now continue to expect most impacts west of the boarding station). As it stands now, 6 PM – 8 PM looks to best the best timeframe to see some moisture associated with this.
- Winds continue out of the SSE for THU. Sustained winds will still be closer to that 13-18 MPH range, occasionally gusting up to 25 MPH across the boarding station.
 - Mid 80s are again favored for the day Thursday.
 - **Fog is not expected for Thursday.**

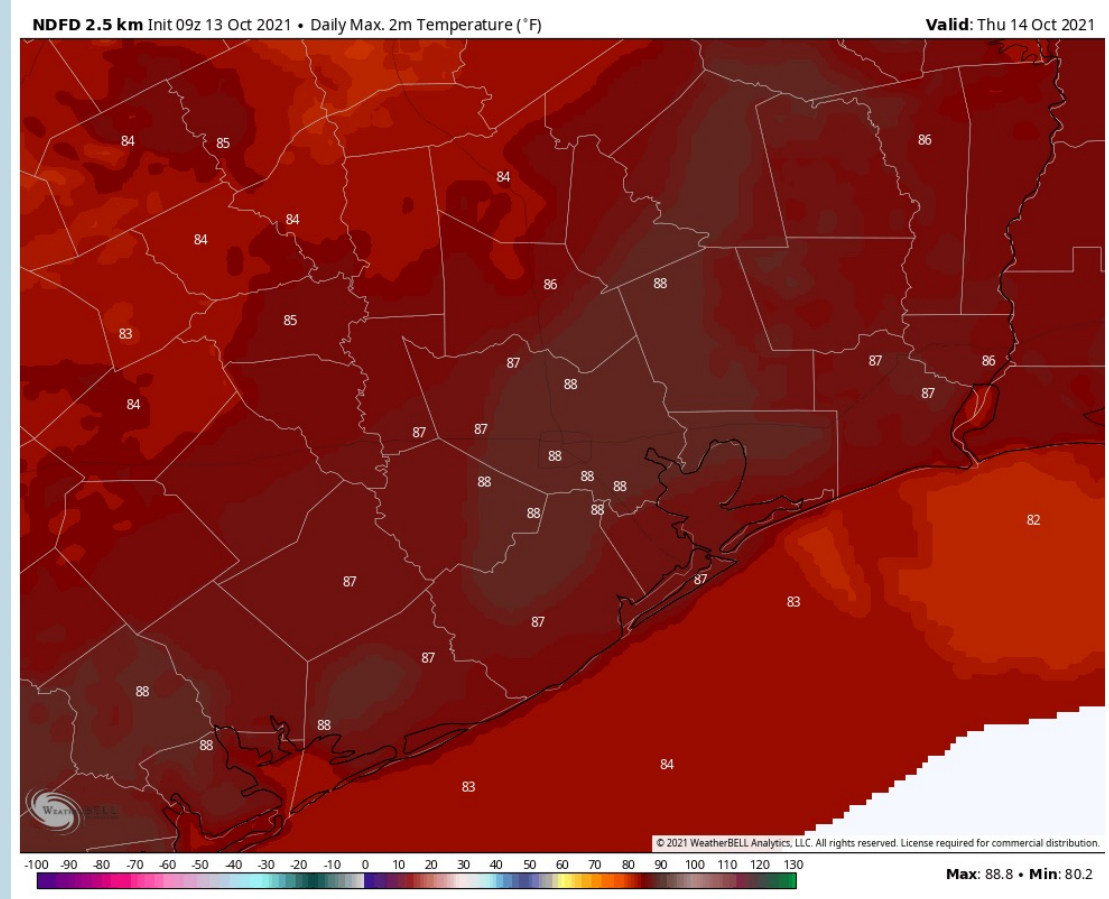
Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)



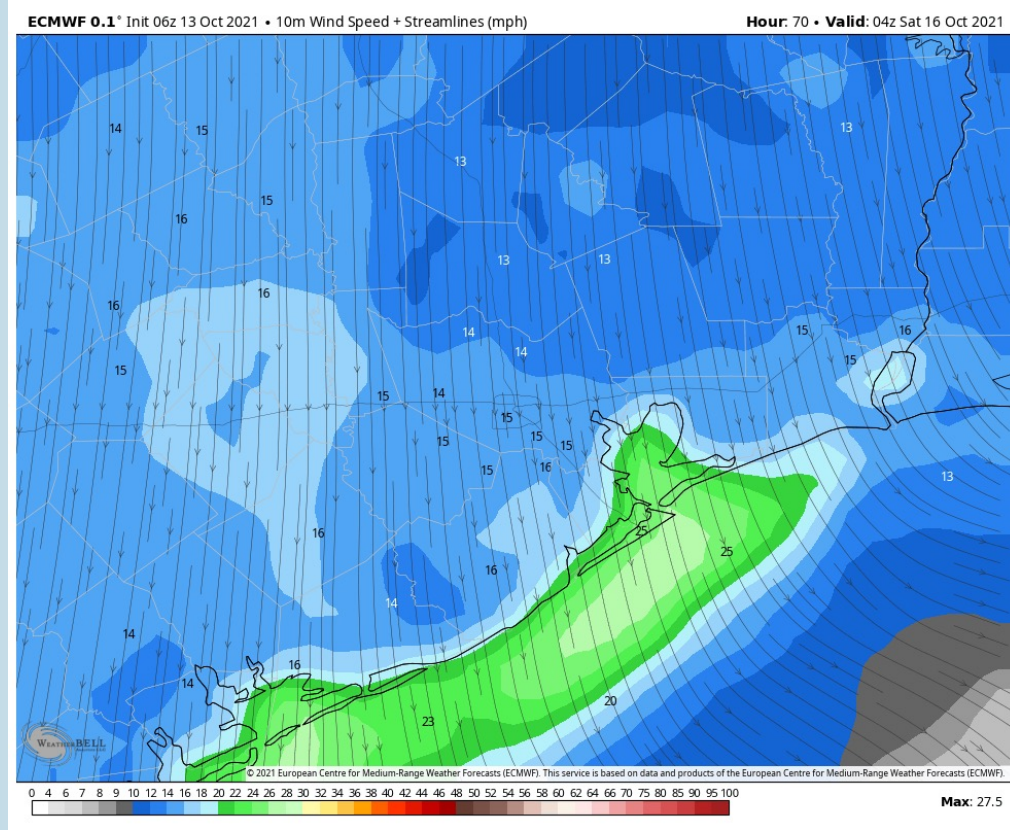
High Temps Thursday



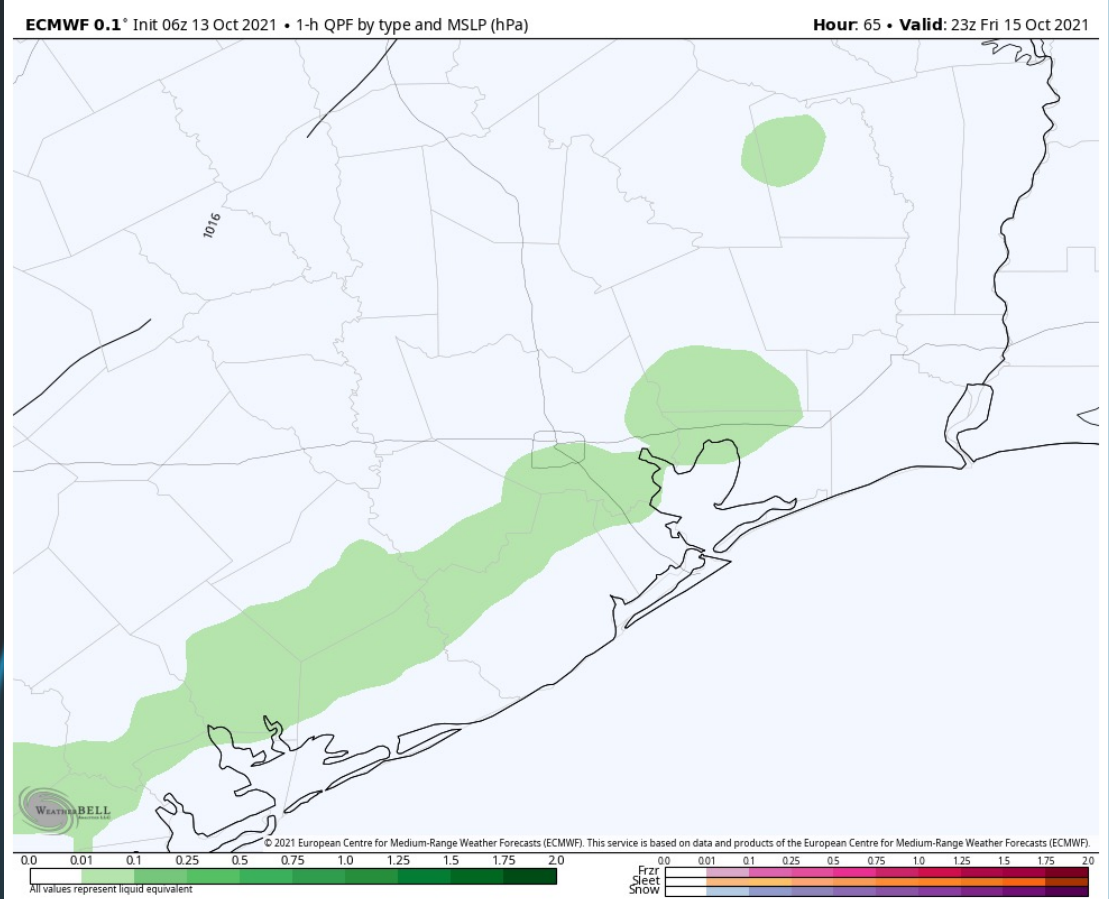
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Right now, Friday is expected to be a mostly dry day. An isolated shower may be possible later afternoon to the evening along a weak cold front, but impacts will be quite minimal.
- Winds will slowly be calming throughout the morning into the afternoon sustained from the SSW around 8 – 13 MPH. A cold front is anticipated to swing through around 10 PM – midnight. After this front passes winds will pick up sustained closer to 15 – 25 MPH. Gust from 30 – 40 MPH will be possible late Friday into Saturday morning.
- Mid 80s are again favored for the day Friday.
- **Fog is not expected for Friday.**

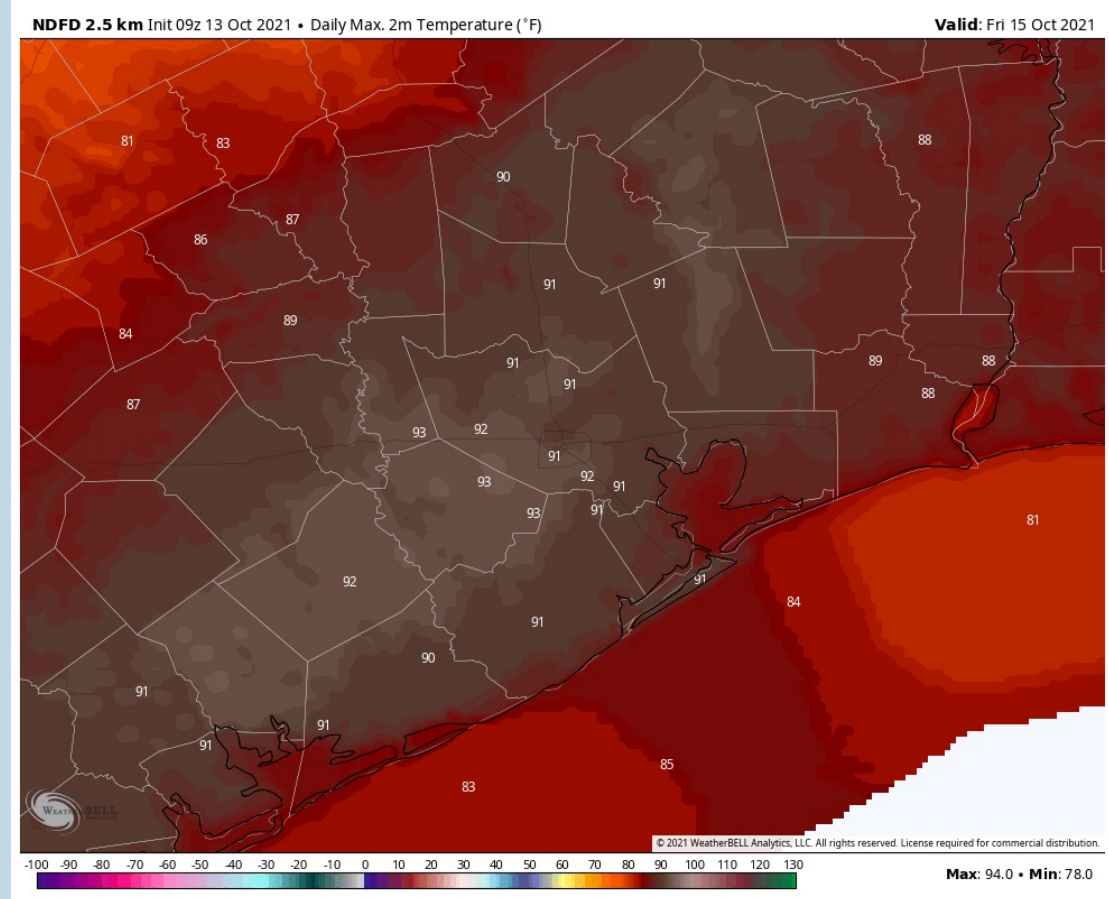
Sustained Winds (11 PM CT)

High Temps Friday



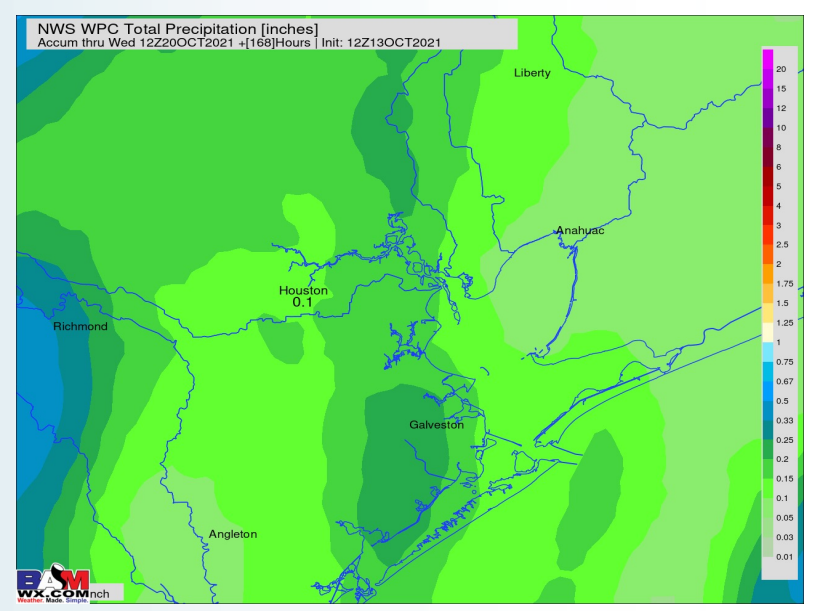
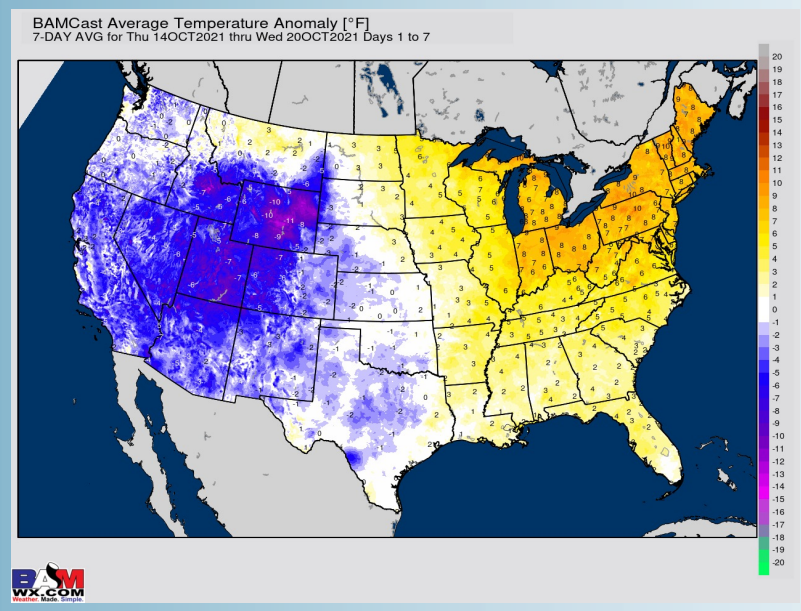
Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temps look to be average to slightly above average for this time of year, we are watching for some hit and miss rain chances this work week; however, coverage and totals look to be minimal.

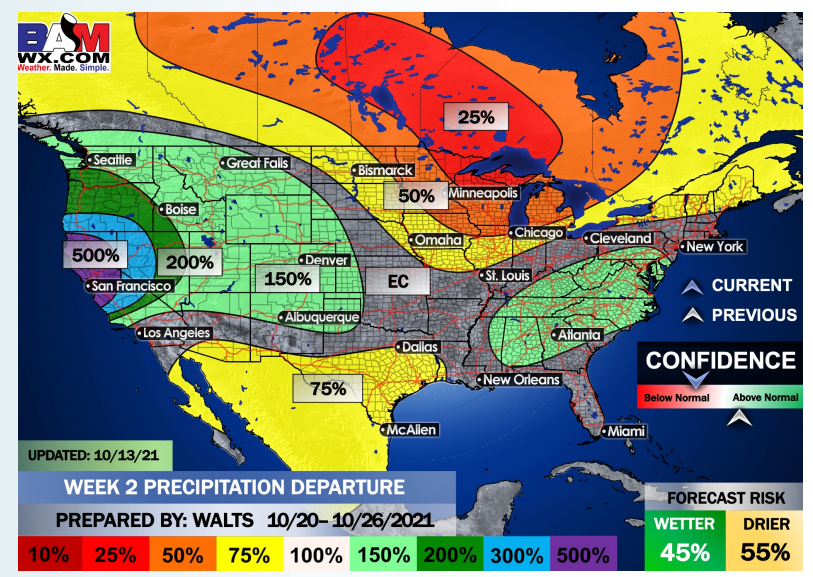
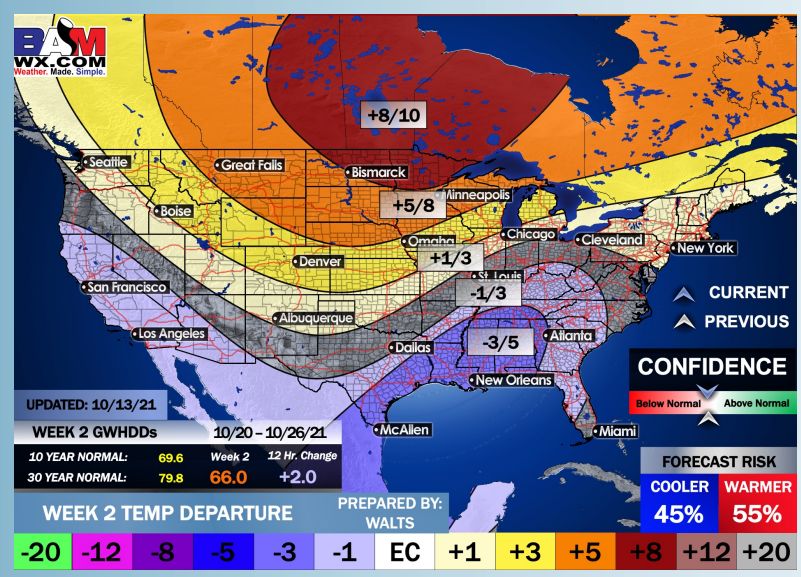
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have below average temps with slightly below average risks for precip. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance but will need to continue to monitor for potential development.

- Right now, we have risks slightly below normal temps and normal to slightly below normal precip for the weeks 3/4 period. We will continue to monitor for tropical disturbances during this time.
