



- We continue to favor the Gulf to remain quiet at least for the next 7-10 days.


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- No precipitation is expected today.
- Winds will slowly die down as the day progresses. Out through ~Noon, sustained winds of 15-20 MPH will be possible at the boarding station with gusts 20-30 MPH out of the NE. Noon – 3 PM sustained winds of 10-15 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH possible, and 4 PM and beyond features winds 5-10 MPH with gusts to 15 MPH. Winds will be continuous from the NE.
- High temperatures look to sit in the mid 70's F.
 - **Fog is not expected today.**


Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)




High Temps Today




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- No precip is expected on Monday.
- Much of Monday will feature sustained winds of 8-13 MPH with gusts to 15 MPH. Winds most of the day will come out of the ENE, however near sundown more of an ESE wind is favored.
- Monday's highs likely reach the upper 70s for most stations.
- **Not anticipating fog for Monday.**


Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)




High Temps Monday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A 10% chance of a very isolated shower exists early Tuesday afternoon, however the overwhelming majority of the day is favored to stay dry.
- Expecting a sustained wind out through Noon of 5-10 MPH at the boarding station. The afternoon hours likely holds slightly increased winds of 10-15 MPH with a few gusts 15-20 MPH possible. Wind direction will need to be refined, but favored to be out of the E with periods of ENE/ESE possible.
- A slight warming trend brings Tuesday's high temps into the lower 80s.
- **No fog in the forecast for Tuesday.**


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)






Week 1 Forecast



Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temps look to average out to near normal the next 7 days. An overall quieter stretch is favored moving forward with only a few very limited shots at light precip.



Week 2 Forecast

- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have below average temps with slightly below average risks for precip. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance.



Weeks 3/4 Forecast

- Right now, we have risks slightly above average temps and slightly below average precip for the first half of November. Tropical risks are on the lower side, but not a threat that should be 100% eliminated.
