

European Ensemble 10-days Tracks




• We continue to favor the Gulf to remain quiet at least for the next 7-10 days.


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- No precip is expected today.
- Much of today will feature sustained winds of 8-13 MPH with gusts to 15 MPH. Winds most of the day will come out of the NE, however nearing ~6-8 PM more of an ESE wind is favored. Winds continue SE/ESE into the overnight.
- Highs likely reach the upper 70s for most stations.
- **Not anticipating fog today.**


Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)






Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A 10% chance of a very isolated shower exists beyond ~1 PM, however the overwhelming majority of the day is favored to stay dry.
- Expecting a sustained wind out through ~3 PM of 8-13 MPH at the boarding station. The afternoon hours likely holds slightly increased winds of 10-15 MPH with a few gusts 15-20 MPH possible. Winds near sunrise Tuesday will turn back to the NE and continue through the day until flipping back out of the SE around ~5 PM.
- A slight warming trend brings Tuesday's high temps into the lower 80s.
 - **No fog in the forecast for Tuesday.**


Sustained Winds (8 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)




High Temps Tuesday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Similar to Tuesday, a very low end chance (~10%) of an isolated shower exists in the afternoon but most, if not all, of the day is favored to be dry.**
- **Looking at winds 3-8 MPH on Wednesday and in a variable direction thanks to the lighter nature of the winds.**
- **Highs in the lower to mid 80s are favored for our stations.**
- **Fog is not in the forecast for Wednesday.**


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)





High Temps Wednesday



Week 1 Forecast



Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temps look to average out to near normal the next 7 days. An overall quieter stretch is favored moving forward with only a few very limited shots at light precip.



Week 2 Forecast

- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have below average temps with slightly below average risks for precip. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance.



Weeks 3/4 Forecast

- Right now, we have risks slightly above average temps and slightly below average precip for the first half of November. Tropical risks are on the lower side, but not a threat that should be 100% eliminated.
